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To print the monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators"

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Joint Economic Committee be authorized to issue a monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators," and that a sufficient quantity be printed to furnish one copy to each Member of Congress; the Secretary and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate; the Clerk, Sergeant at Arms, and Doorkeeper of the House of Representatives; two copies to the libraries of the Senate and House, and the Congressional Library; seven hundred copies to the Joint Economic Committee; and the required numbers of copies to the Superintendent of Documents for distribution to depository libraries; and that the Superintendent of Documents be authorized to have copies printed for sale to the public.

Approved June 23, 1949.

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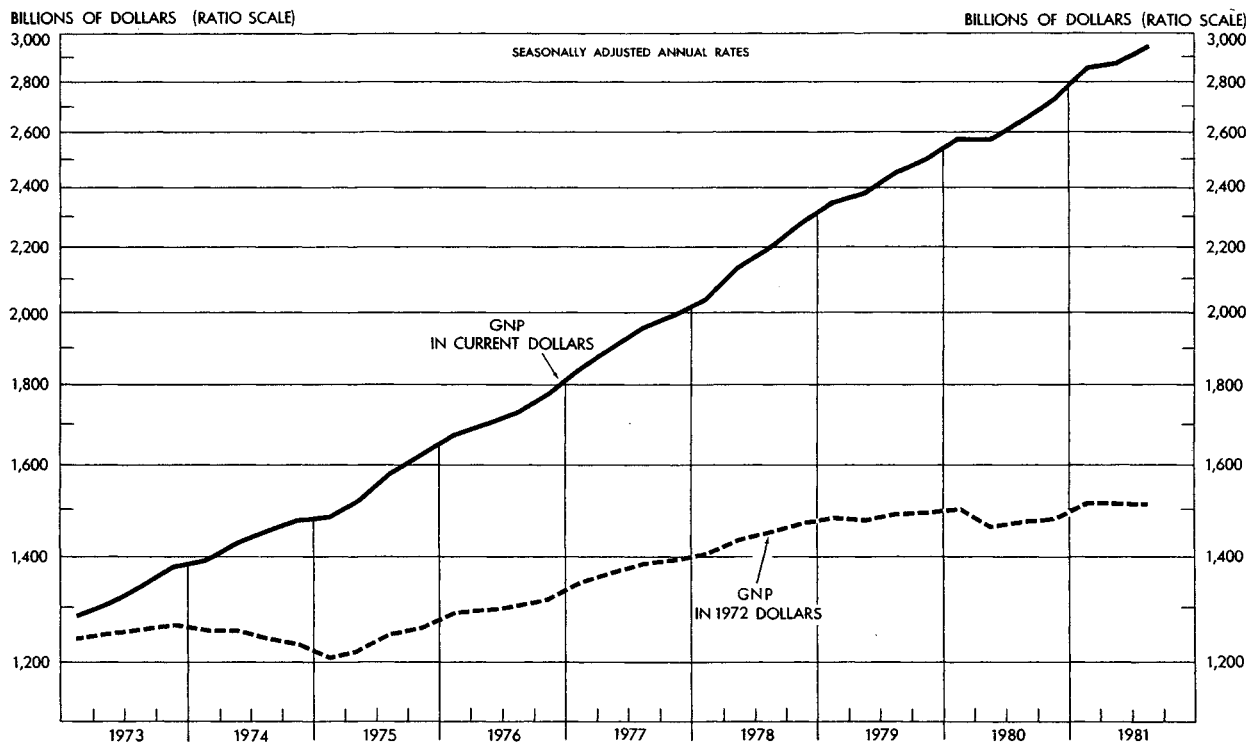

GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

According to preliminary estimates for the third quarter, gross national product rose \$61.2 billion or 8.8 percent, both at annual rates. Real output (GNP adjusted for price changes) fell 0.6 percent from the second quarter level and the implicit price deflator rose at a 9.4 percent annual rate.

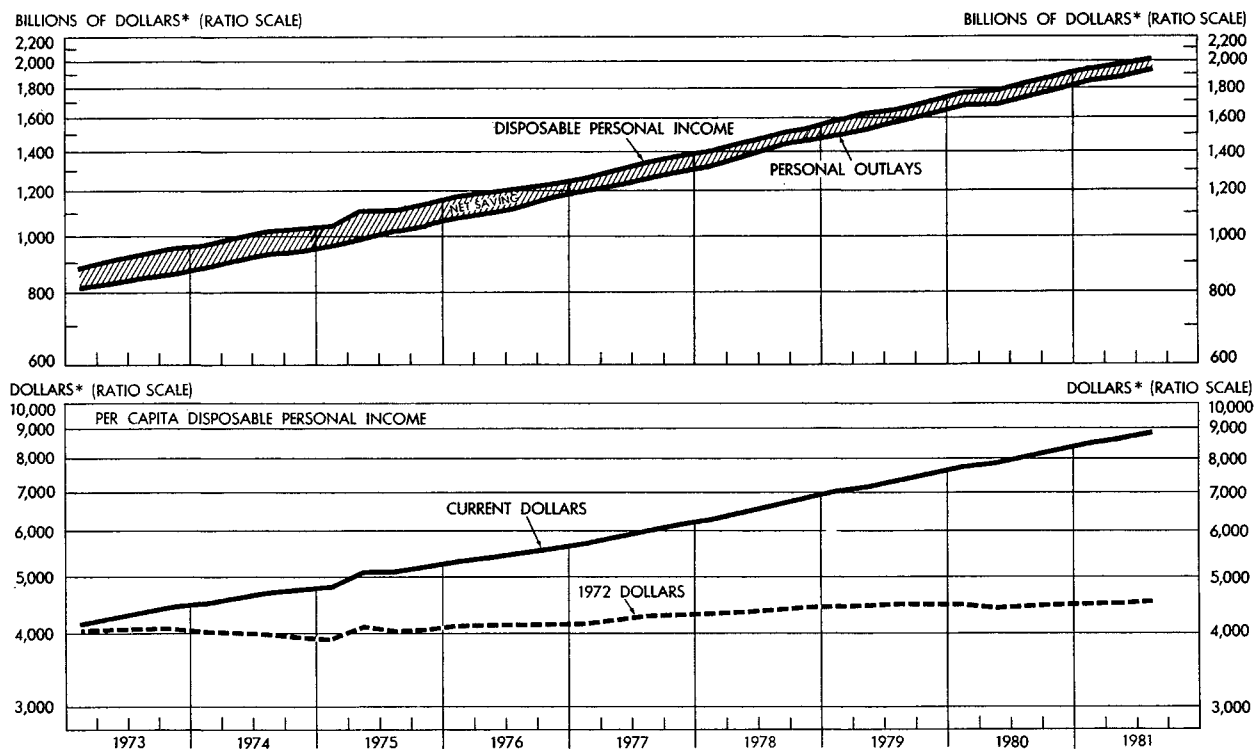

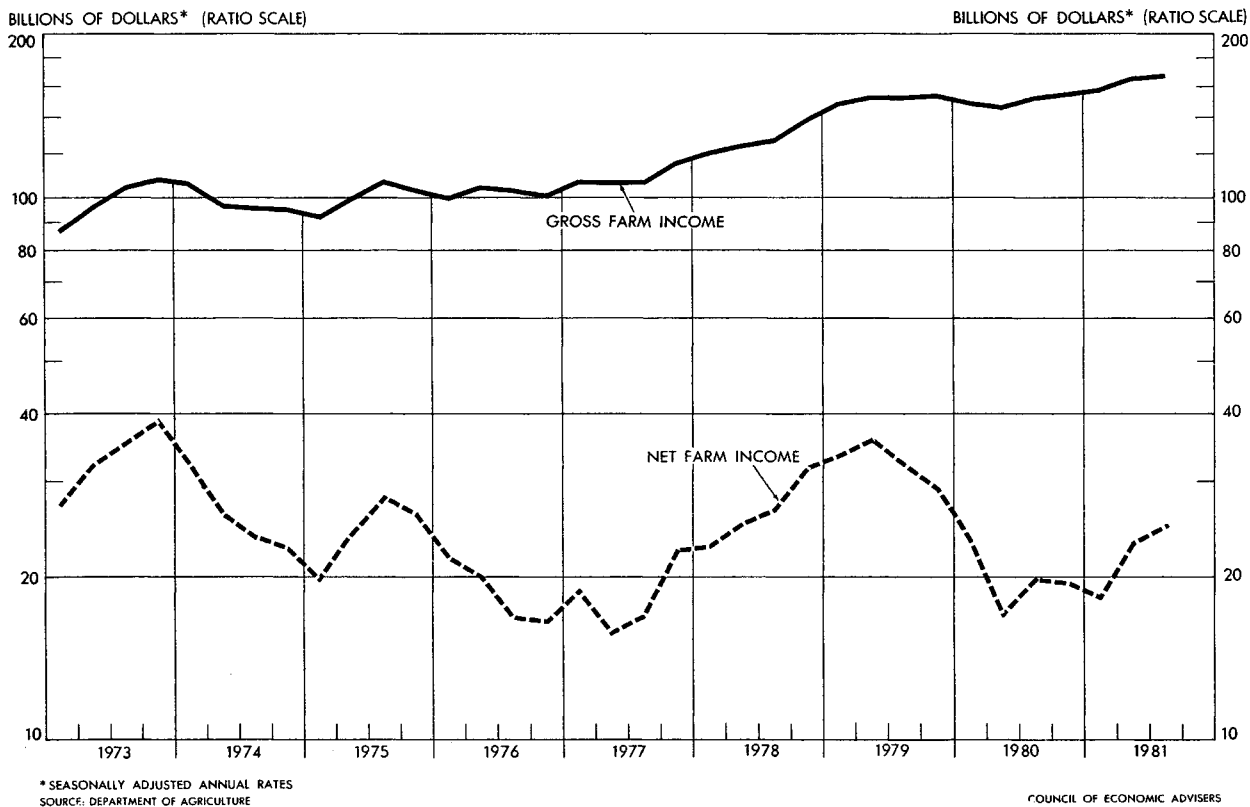

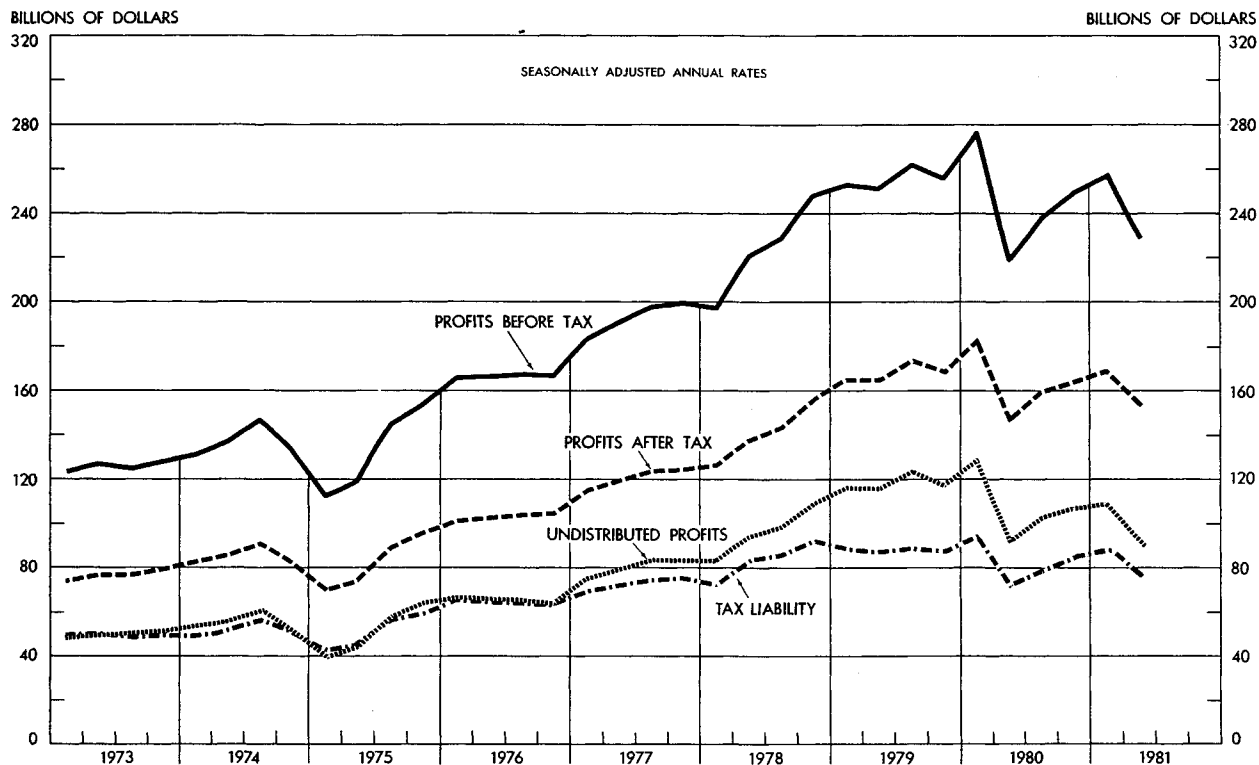

GROSS PRIVATE DOMESTIC INVESTMENT

According to preliminary estimates for the third quarter, business fixed investment rose \$6.2 billion (annual rate) as nonresidential construction outlays rose \$4.7 billion and producers' durable equipment purchases increased \$1.6 billion. Residential investment outlays fell \$9.3 billion. There was a \$17.6 billion increase in inventories following a \$23.3 billion increase in the second quarter.



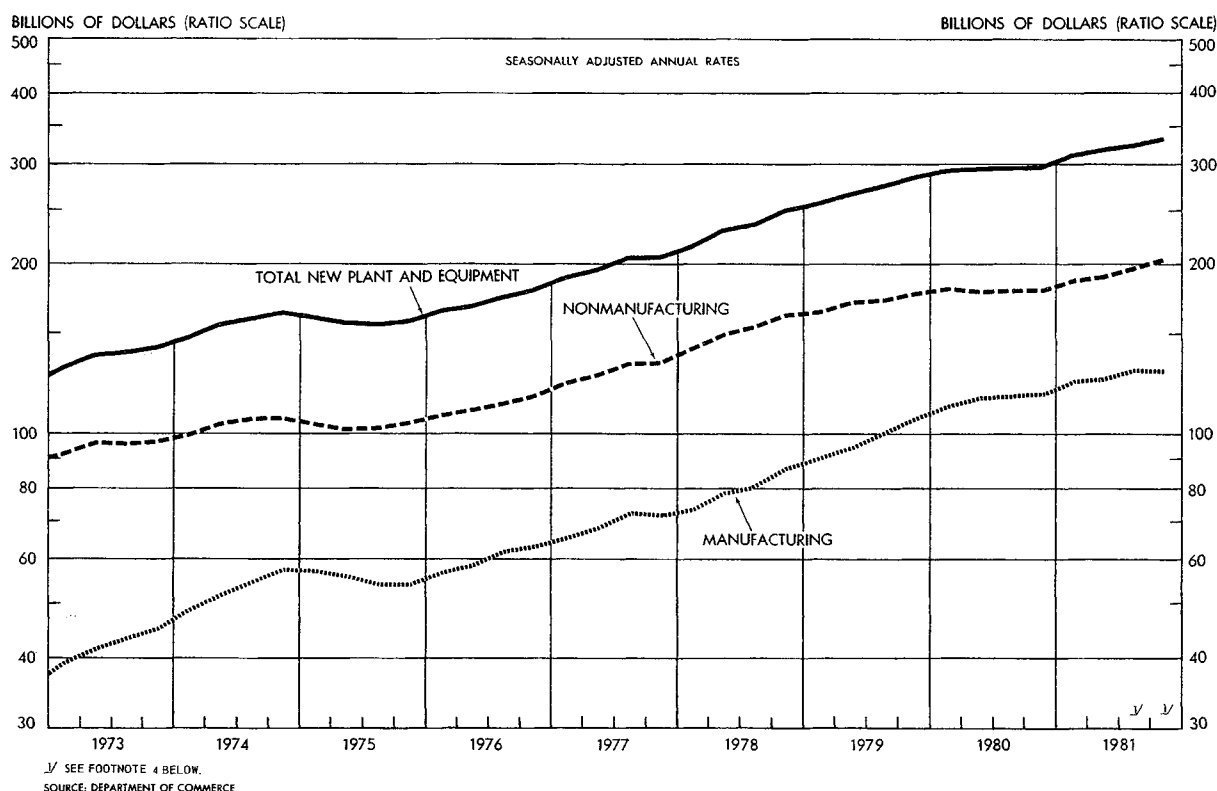

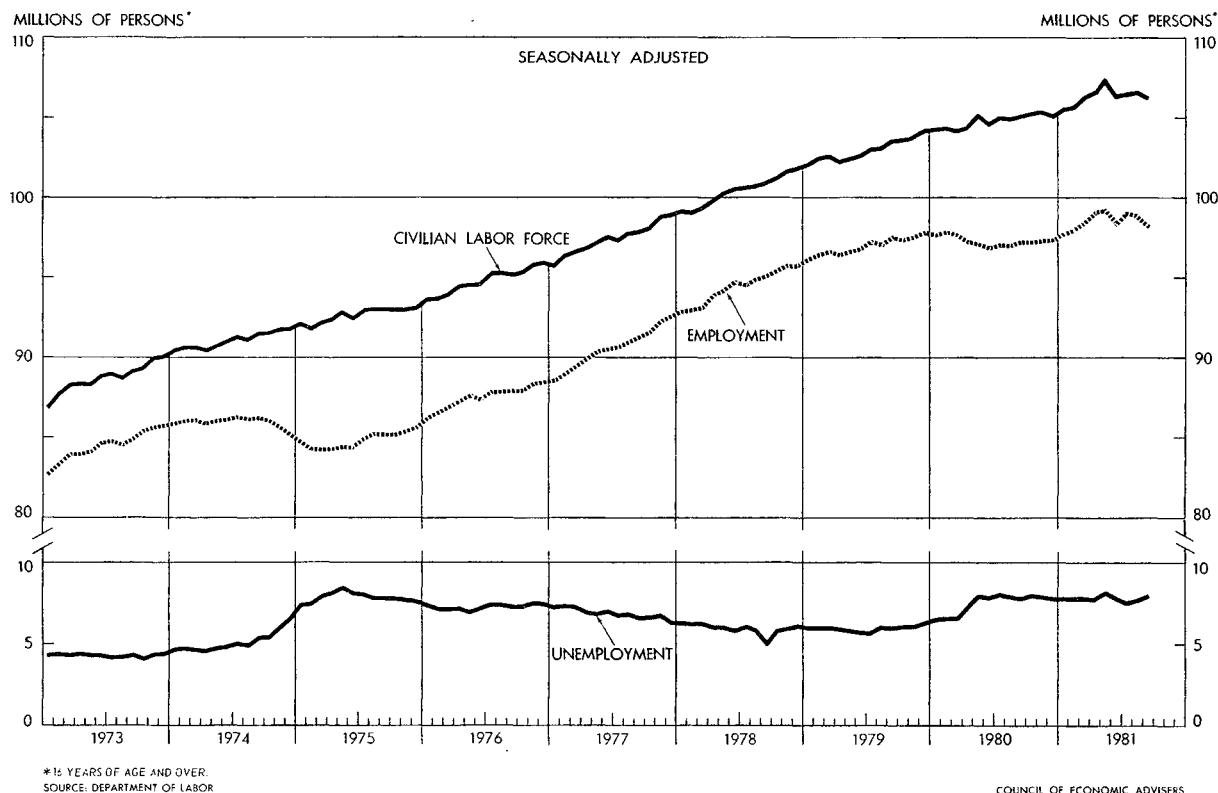

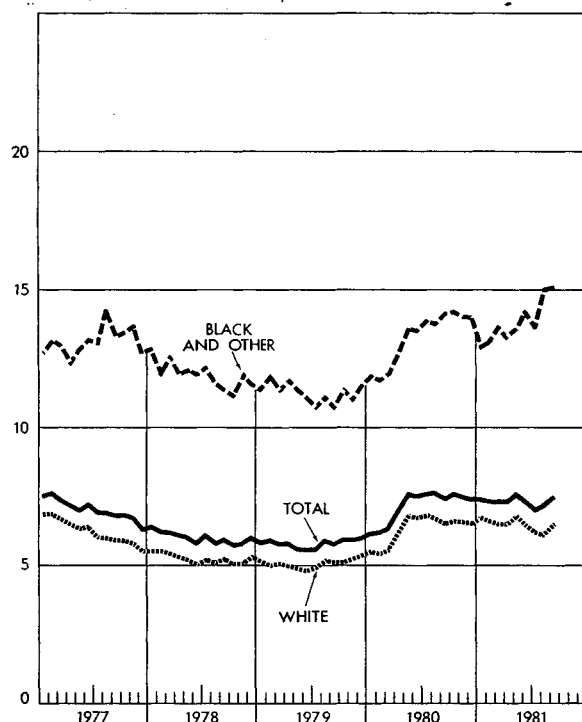

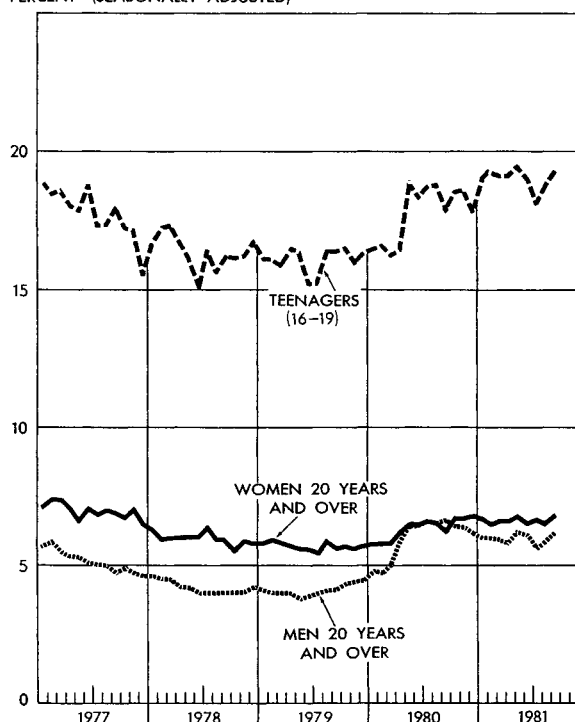

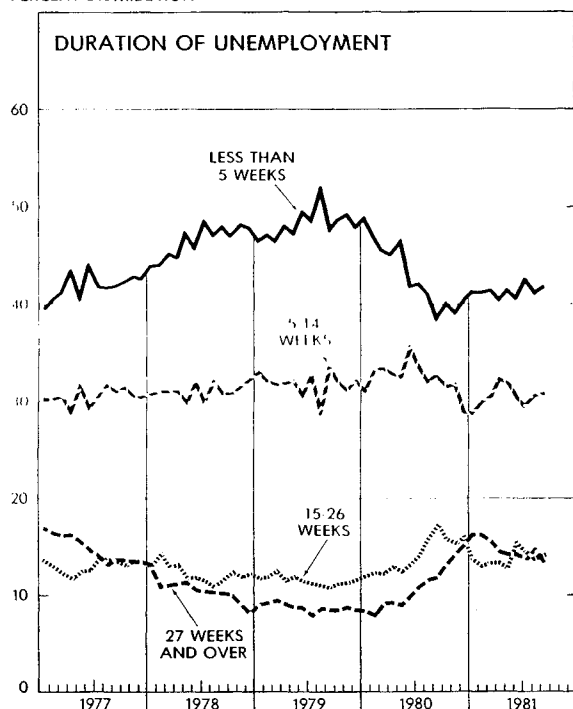

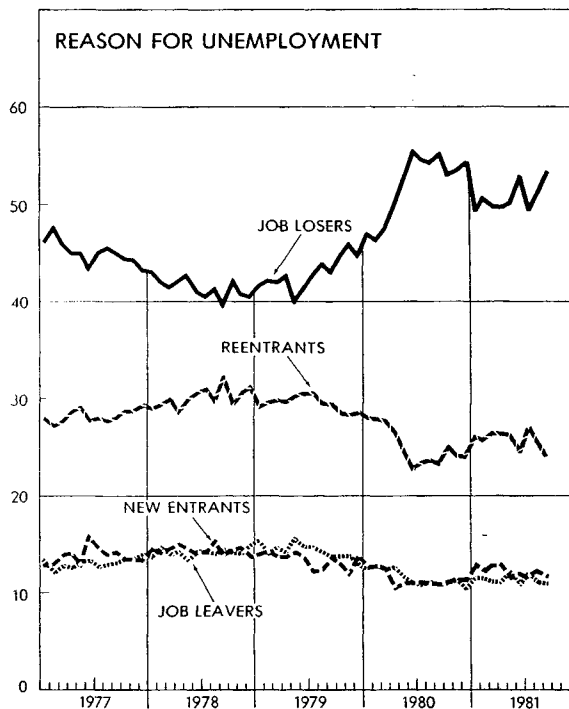
In September, the percentage of unemployed persons who had been out of work for less than 15 weeks rose, and the percentage out of work for 15 weeks or more fell.

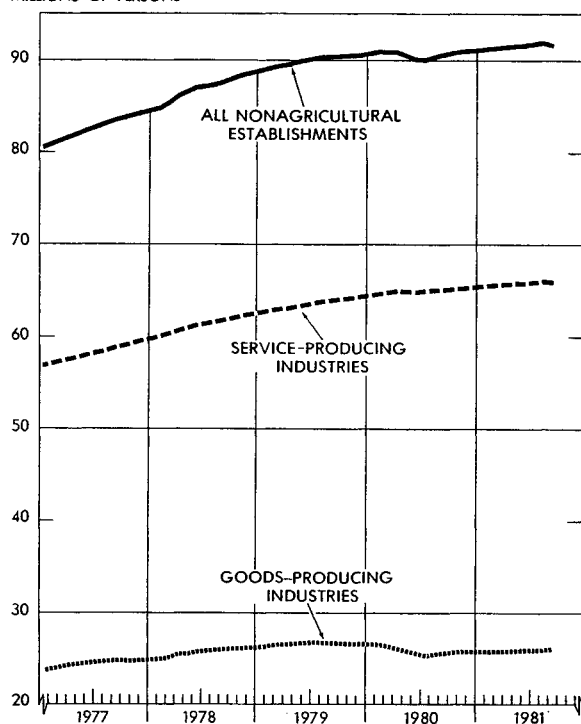

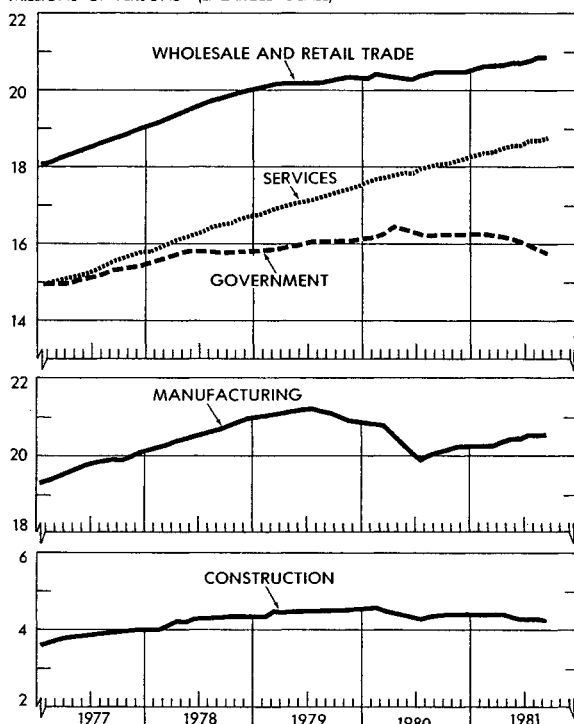

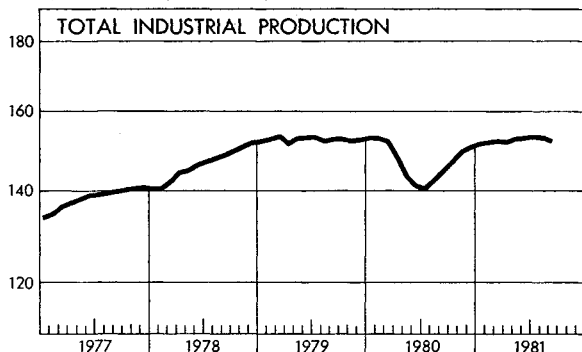

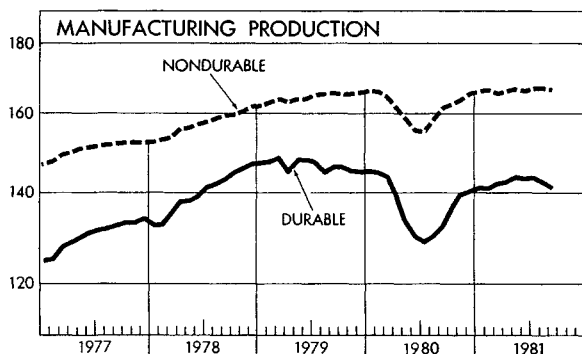
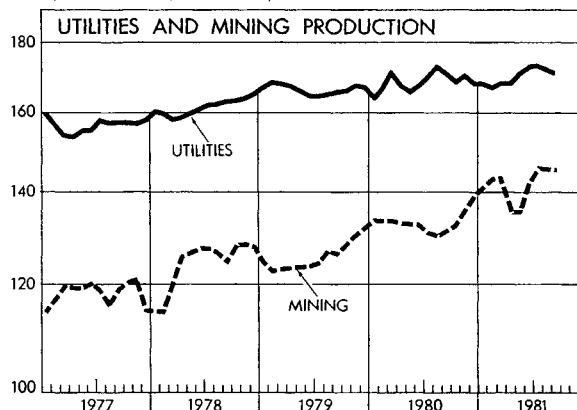
INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND CAPACITY UTILIZATION

Industrial production fell 0.8 percent in September following a decrease of 0.3 percent in August. The index for September was 5.3 percent above the year earlier level.

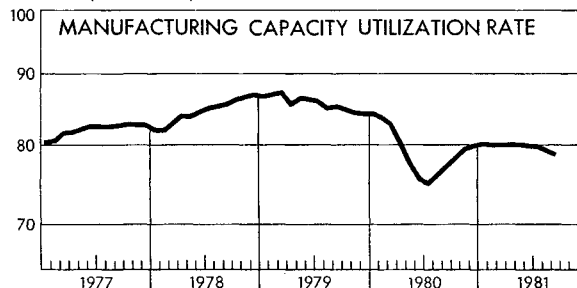
INDEX, 1967=100* (RATIO SCALE)

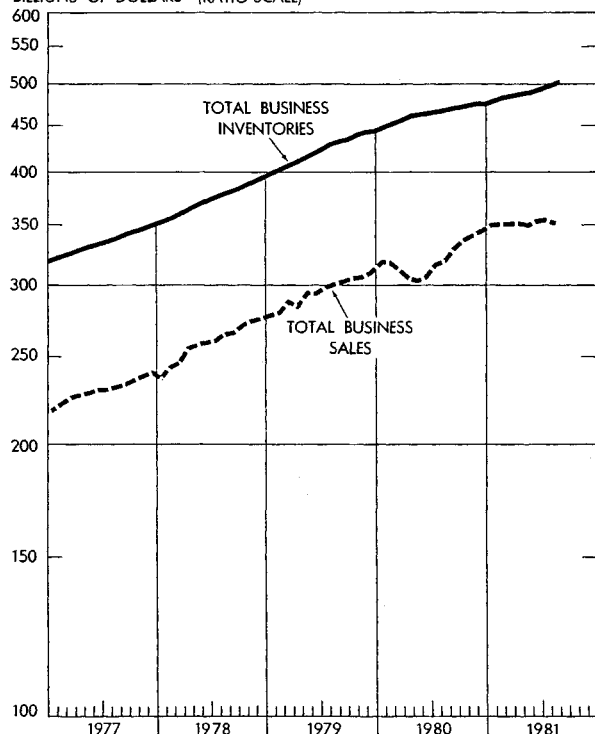

BUSINESS SALES AND INVENTORIES—TOTAL AND TRADE

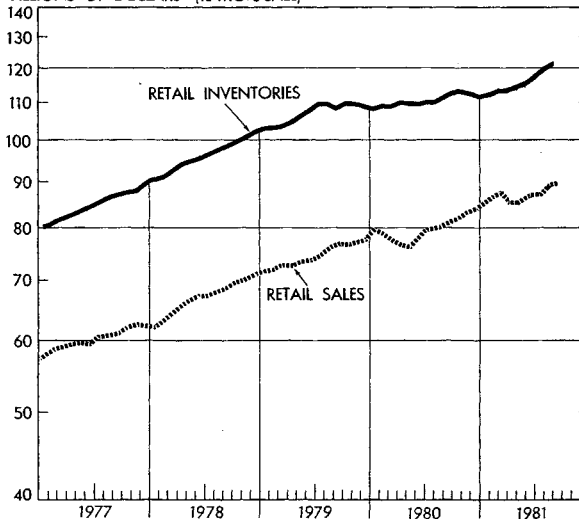

BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

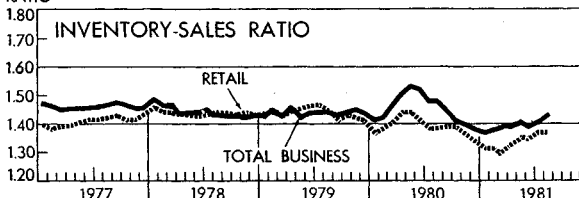

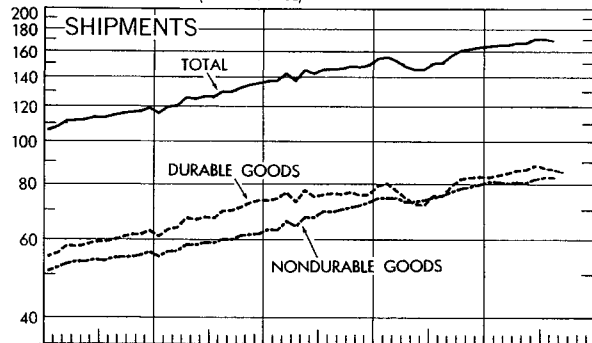

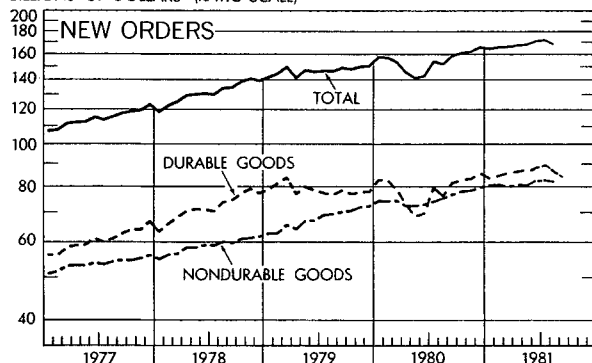
MANUFACTURERS' SHIPMENTS, INVENTORIES, AND ORDERS

BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

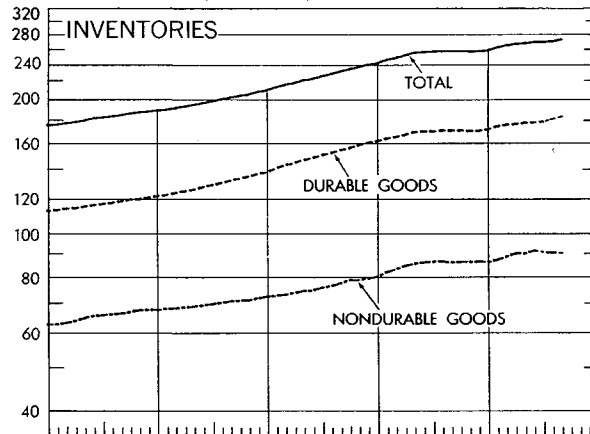


BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

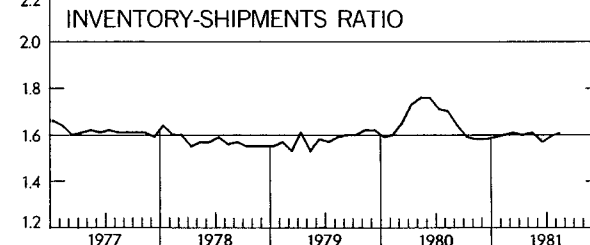

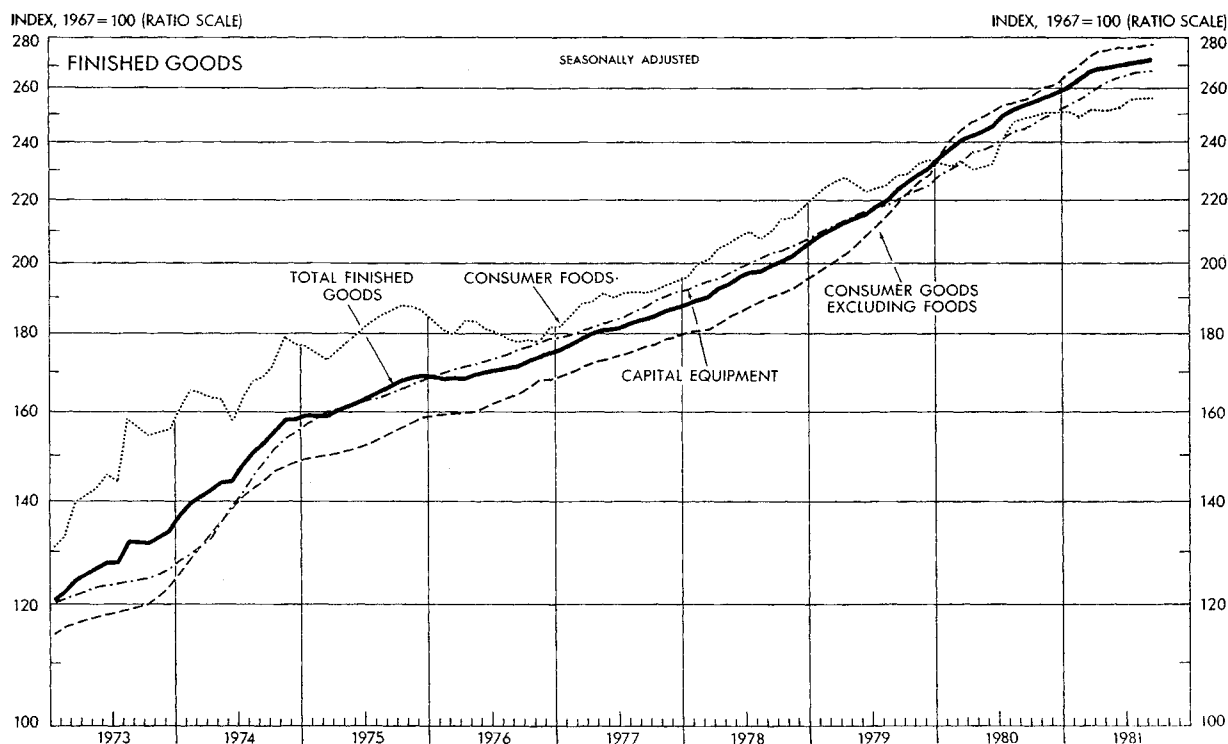

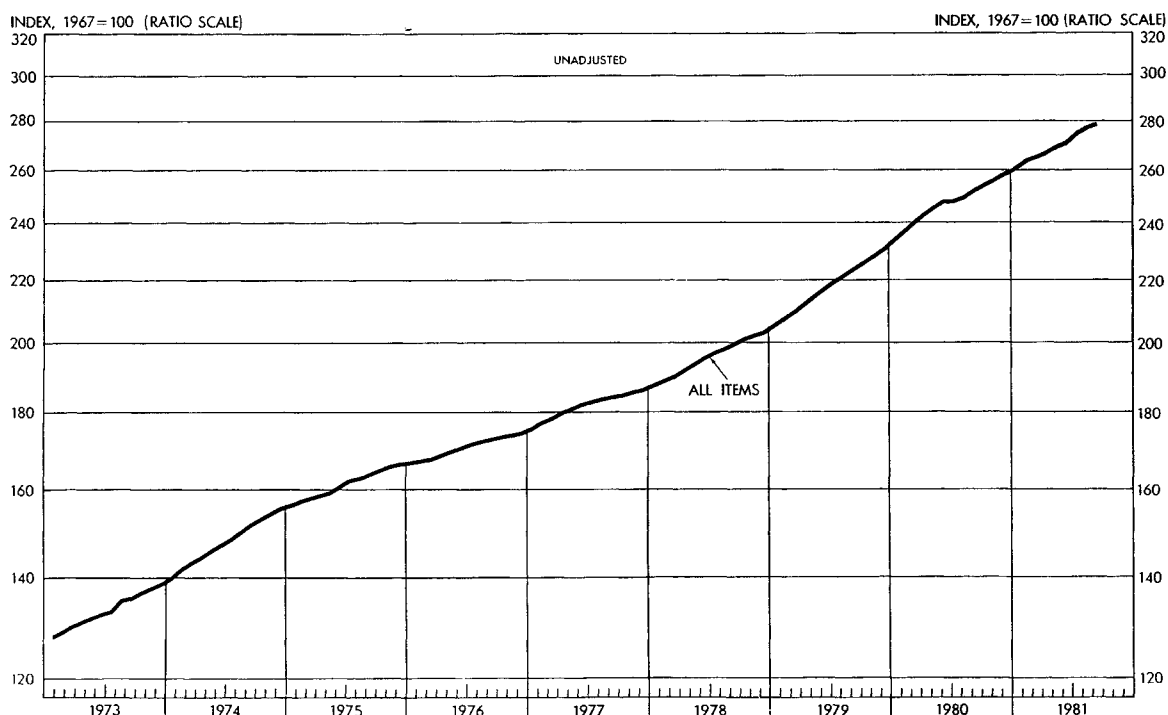

In September, the consumer price index for all urban consumers rose 1.2 percent, seasonally adjusted (1.0 percent unadjusted). Food and beverage prices were up 1.0 percent, seasonally adjusted, and energy prices were up 0.2 percent, not seasonally adjusted.

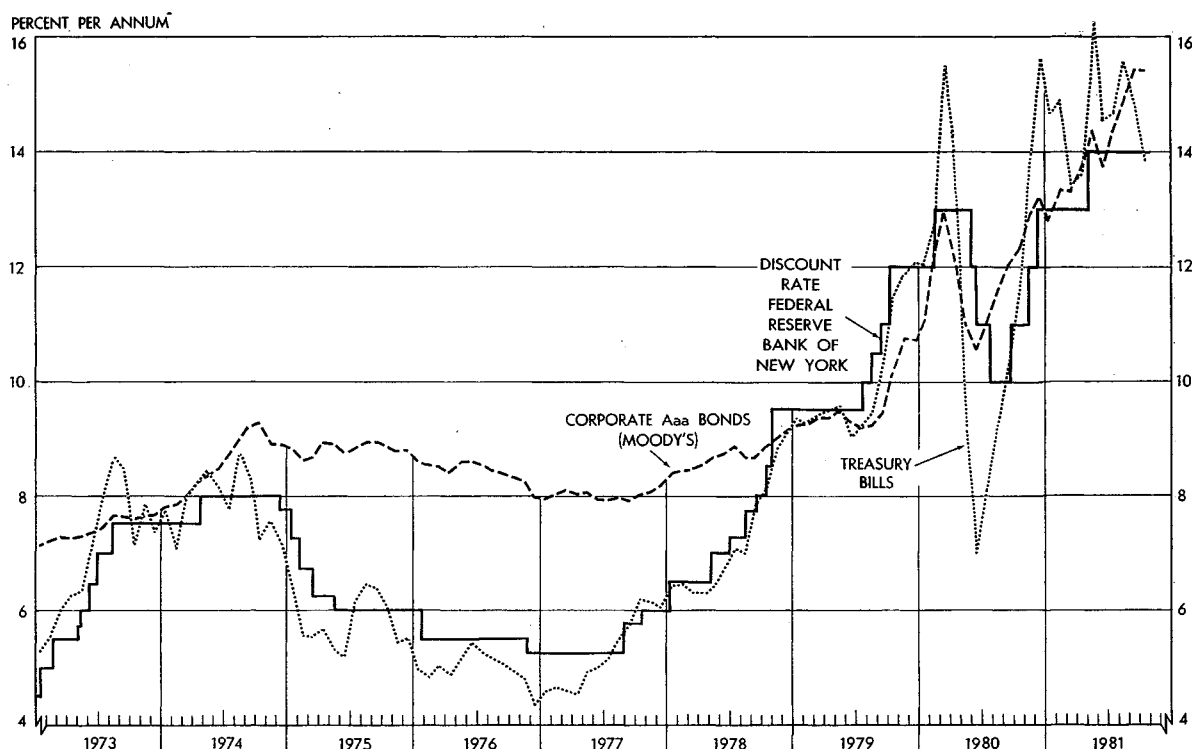

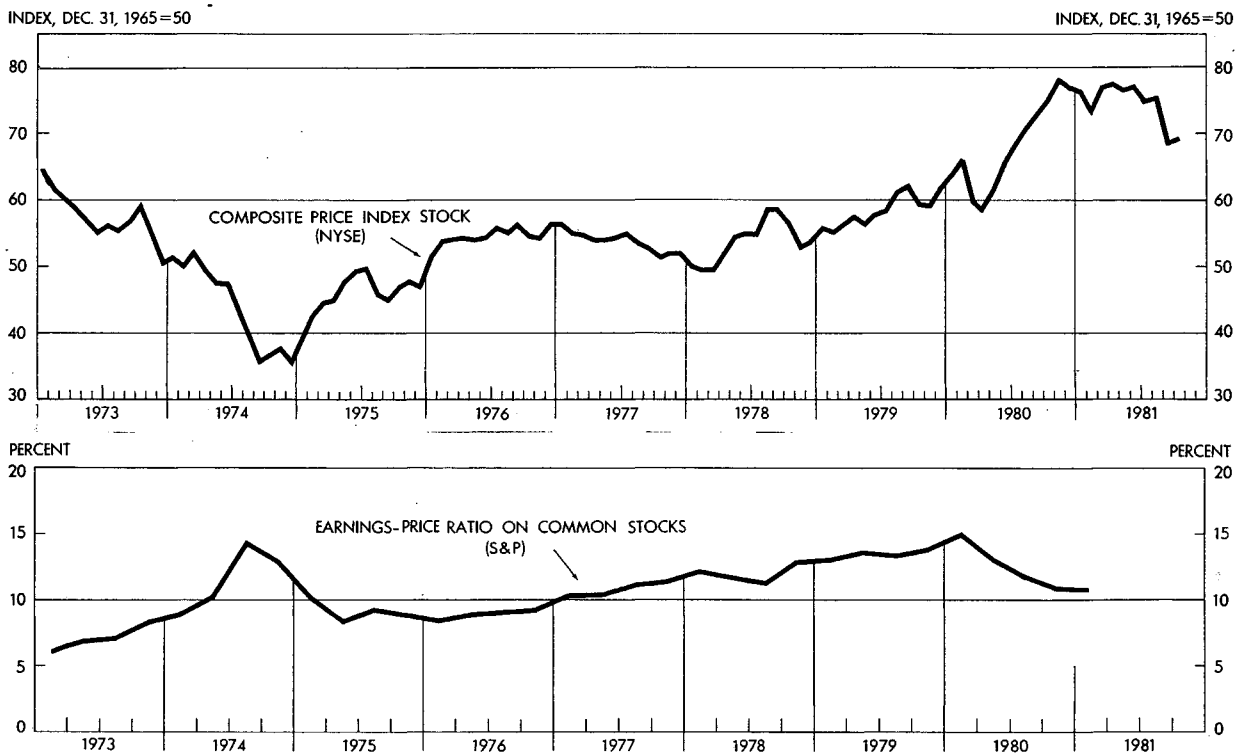

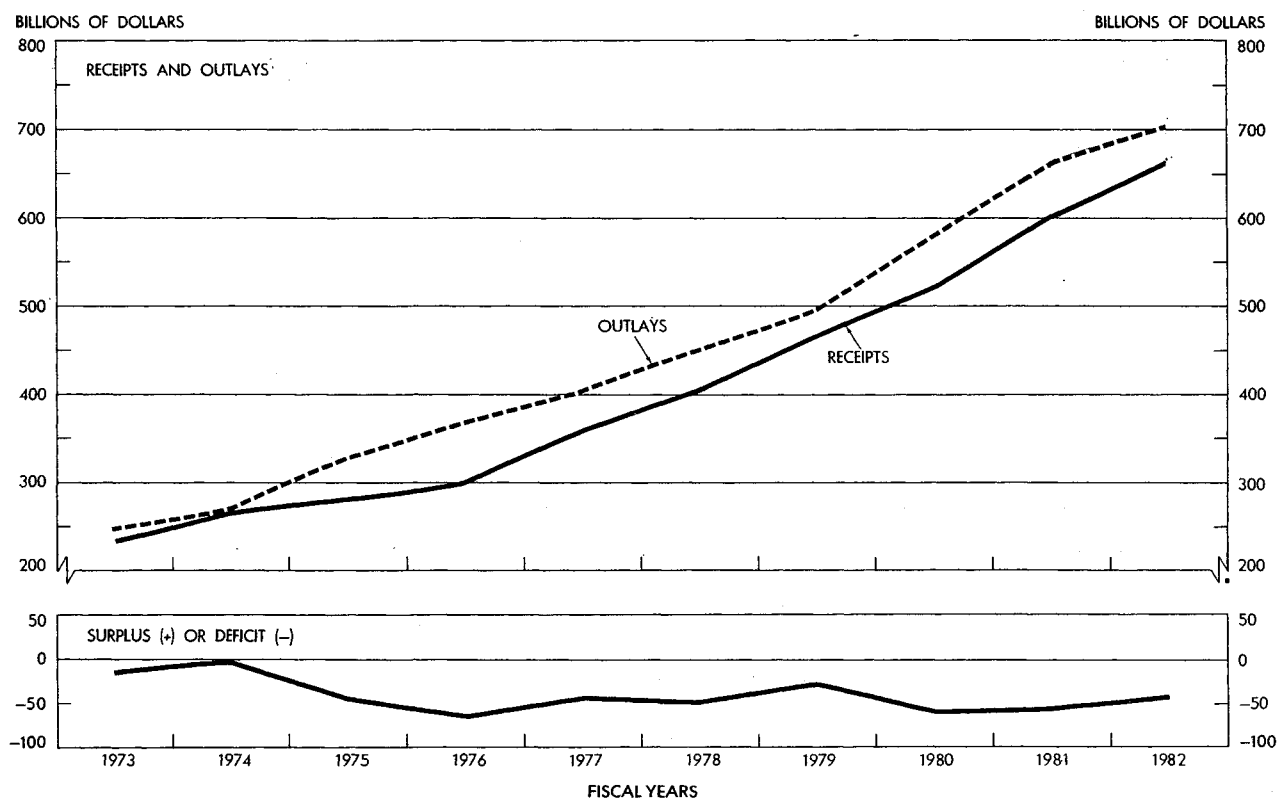

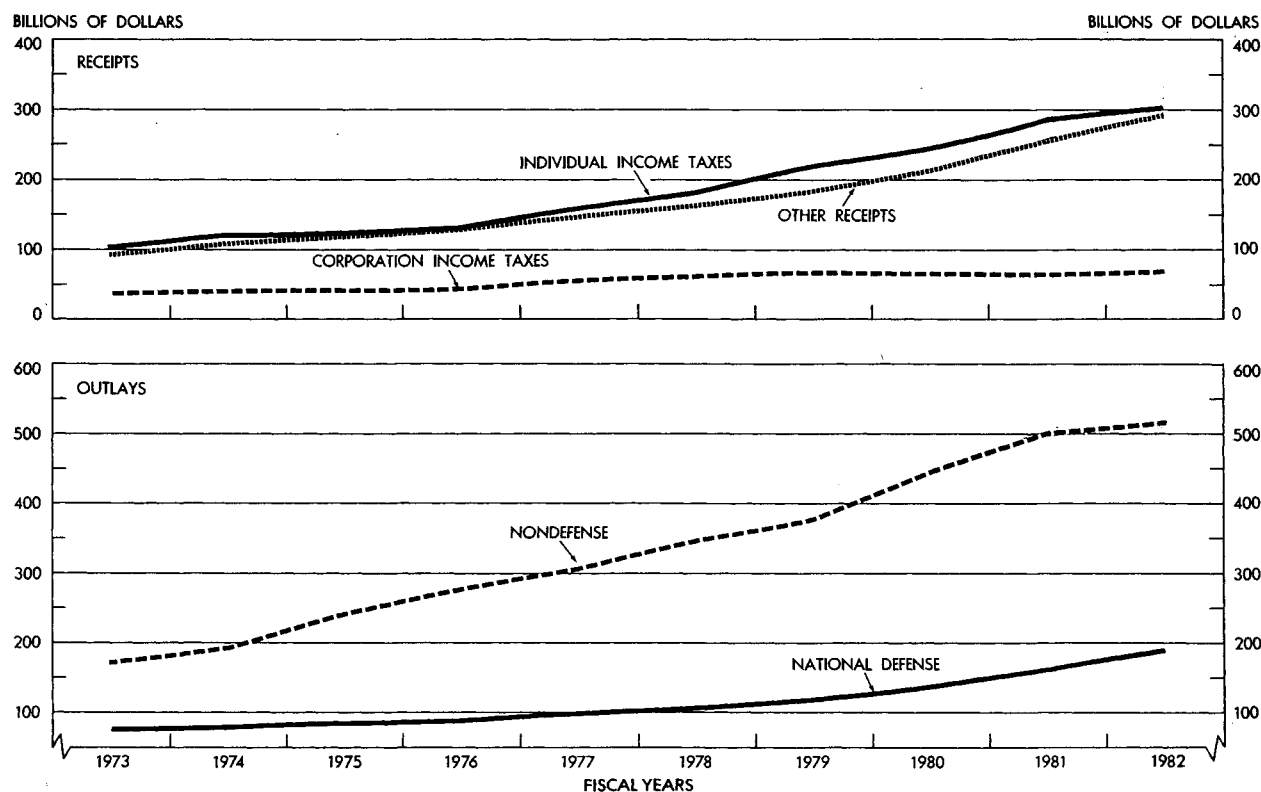

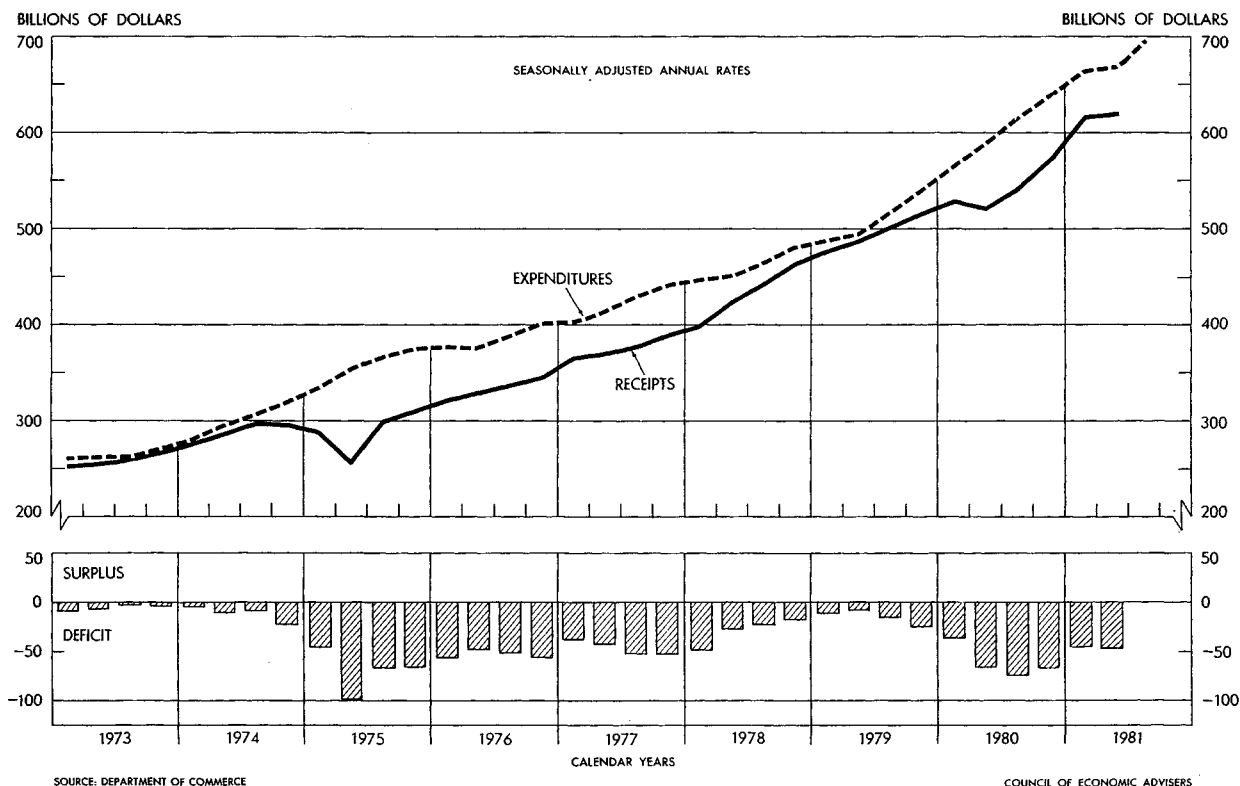

FEDERAL SECTOR, NATIONAL INCOME ACCOUNTS BASIS

In the second quarter, Federal receipts rose \$3.6 billion (annual rate) from the first quarter level and expenditures rose \$4.2 billion, yielding a deficit of \$47.2 billion, \$0.6 billion higher than the deficit in the first quarter. In the third quarter, according to preliminary estimates, expenditures rose \$28.3 billion; receipts data are incomplete.

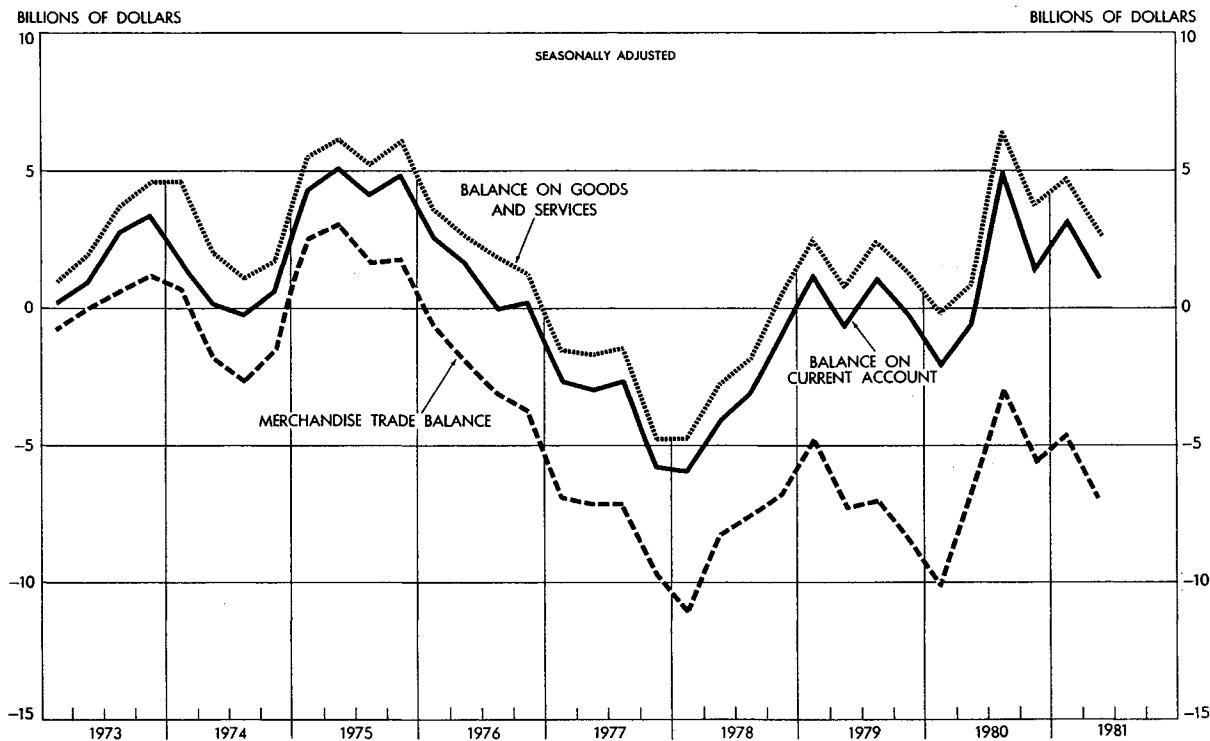

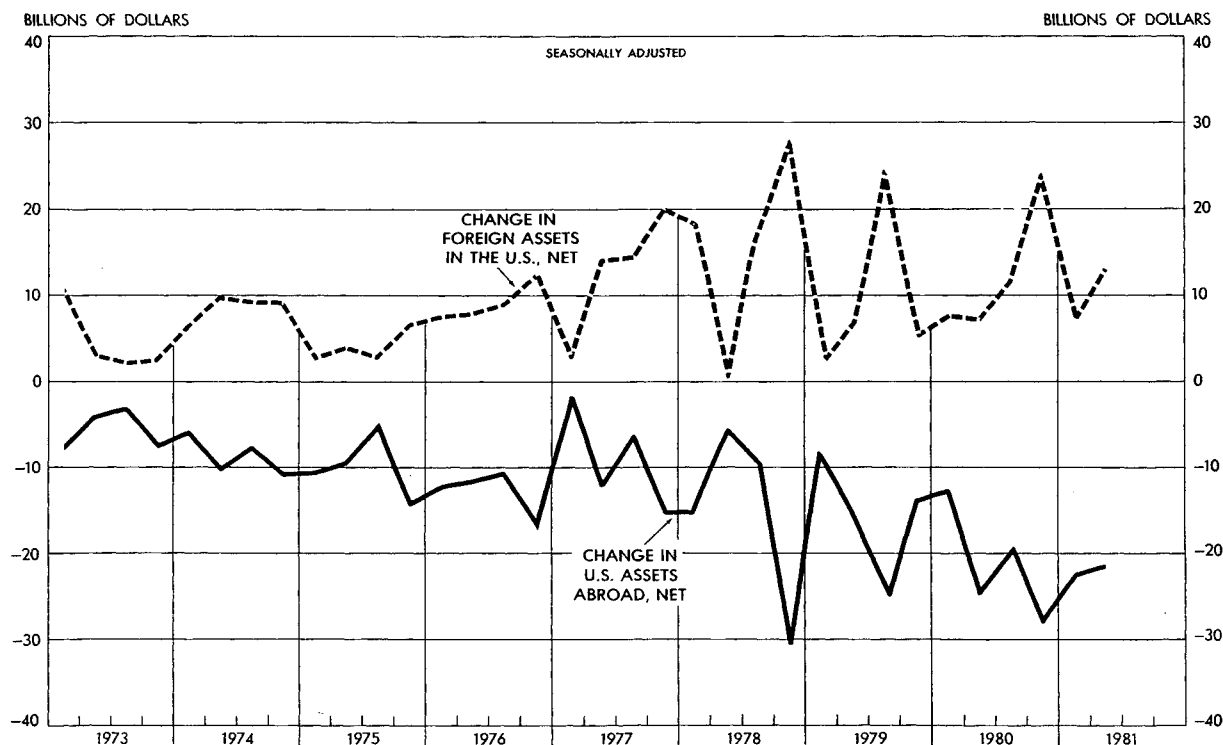
