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Council of Economic Advisers*

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Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Joint Economic Committee be authorized to issue a monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators," and that a sufficient quantity be printed to furnish one copy to each Member of Congress; the Secretary and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate; the Clerk, Sergeant at Arms, and Doorkeeper of the House of Representatives; two copies to the libraries of the Senate and House, and the Congressional Library; seven hundred copies to the Joint Economic Committee; and the required numbers of copies to the Superintendent of Documents for distribution to depository libraries; and that the Superintendent of Documents be authorized to have copies printed for sale to the public.

Approved June 23, 1949.

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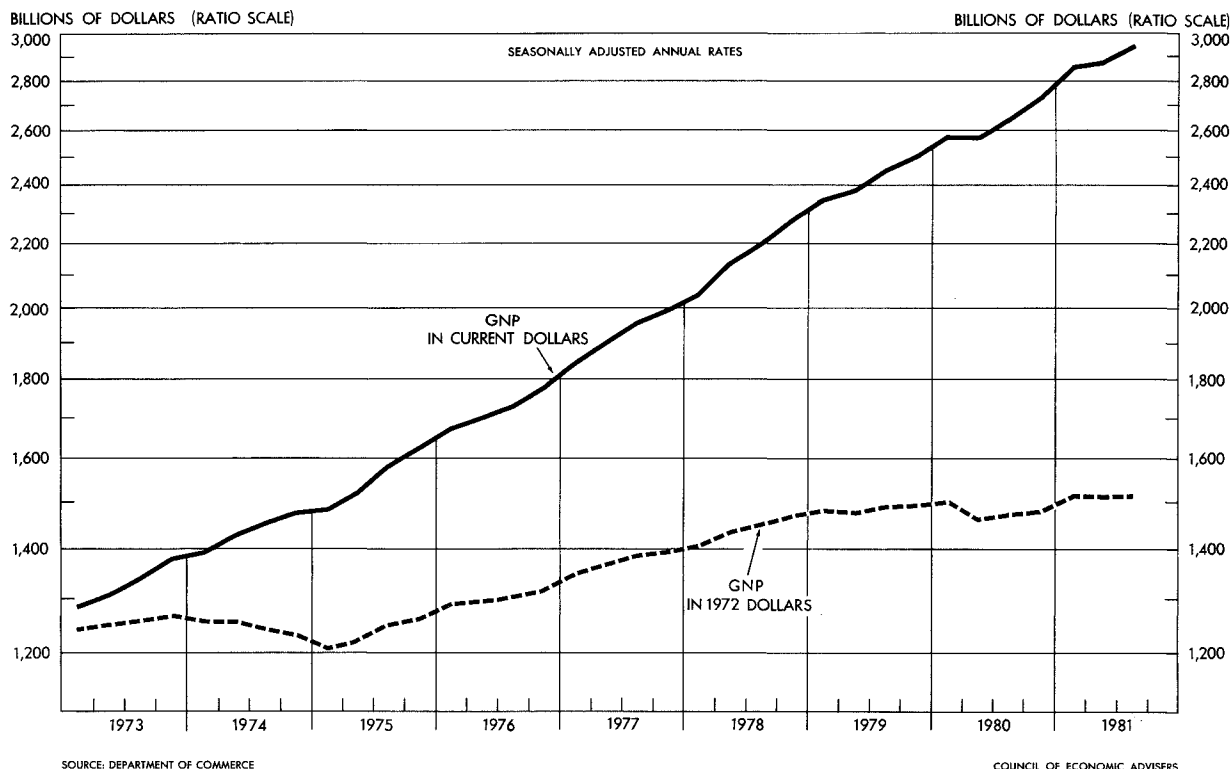

TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

According to revised estimates for the third quarter, gross national product rose \$79.2 billion or 11.4 percent, both at annual rates. Real output (GNP adjusted for price changes) rose 1.4 percent from the second quarter level and the implicit price deflator rose at a 9.9 percent annual rate.

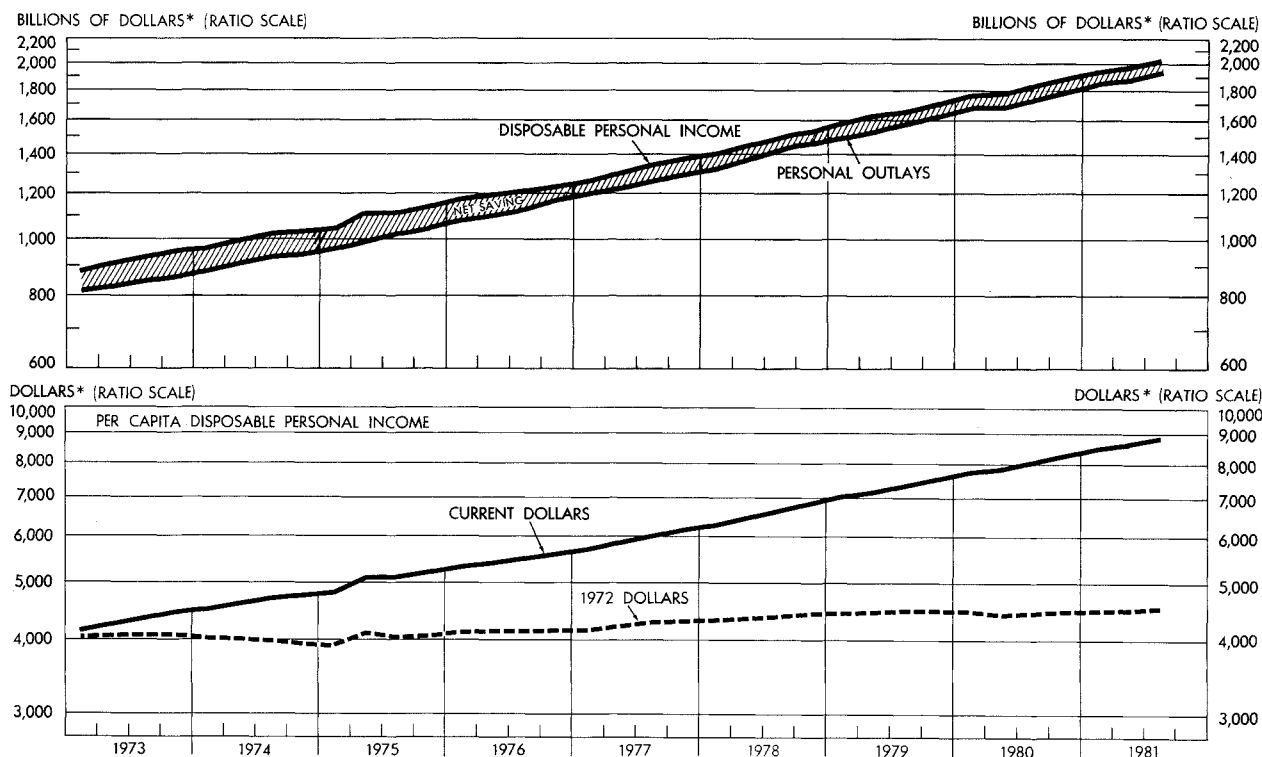

GROSS PRIVATE DOMESTIC INVESTMENT

According to revised estimates for the third quarter, business fixed investment rose \$10.5 billion (annual rate) as nonresidential construction outlays rose \$5.2 billion and producers' durable equipment purchases increased \$5.3 billion. Residential investment outlays fell \$10.2 billion. There was a \$27.5 billion increase in inventories following a \$23.3 billion increase in the second quarter.



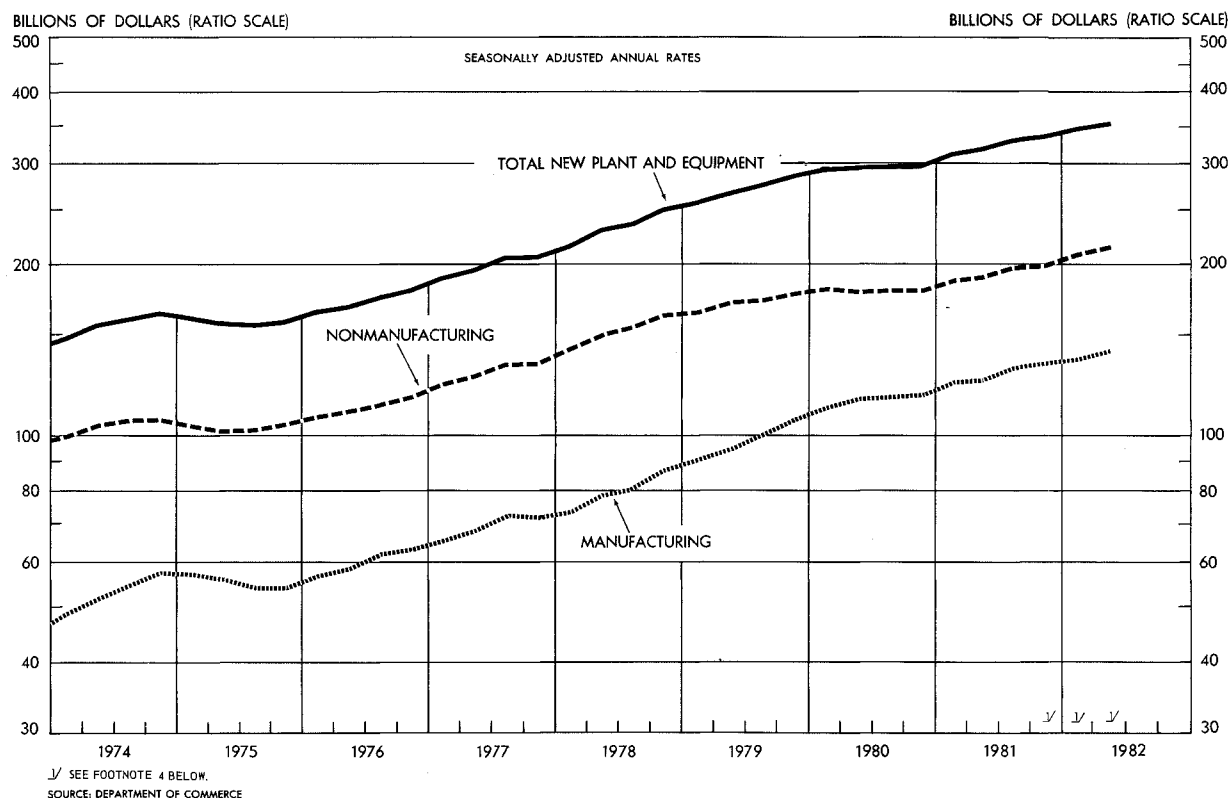

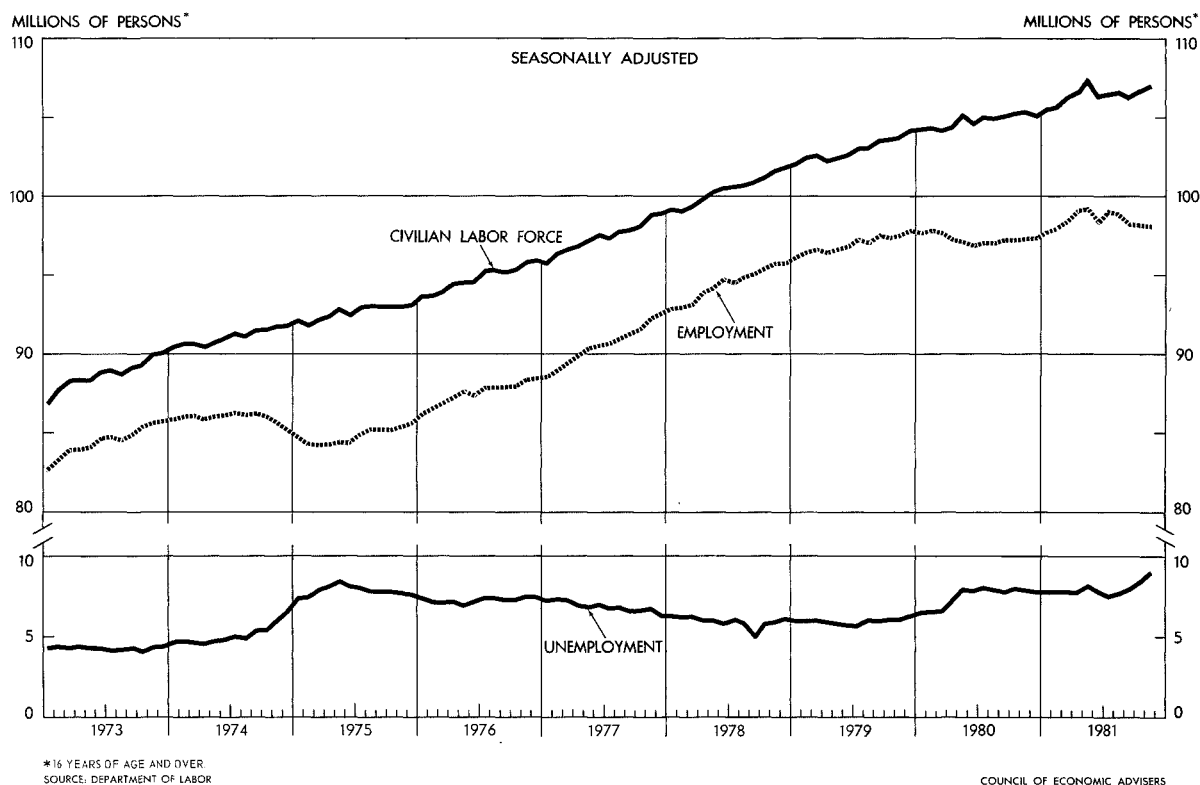

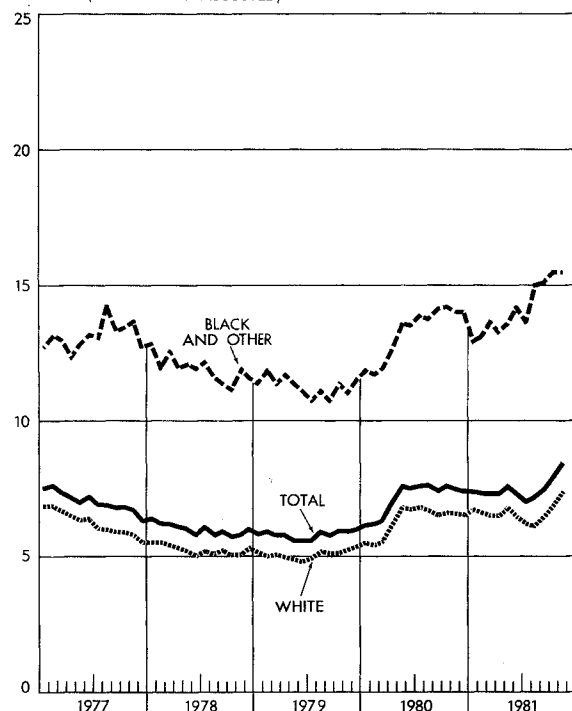

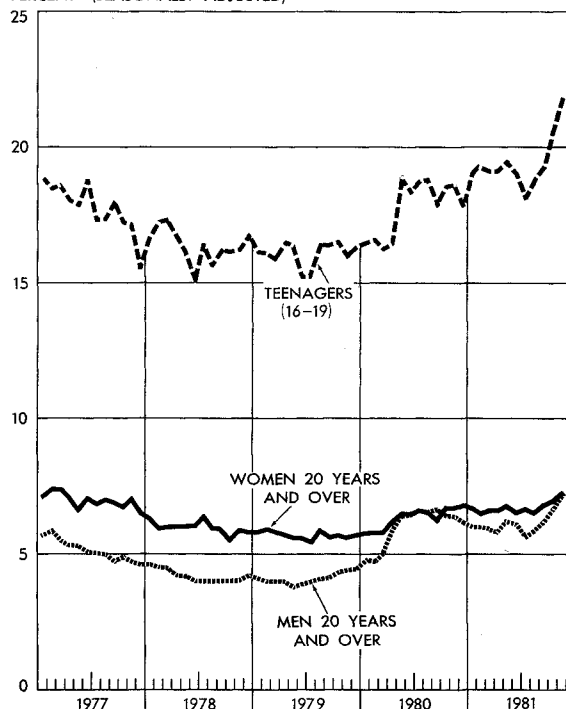

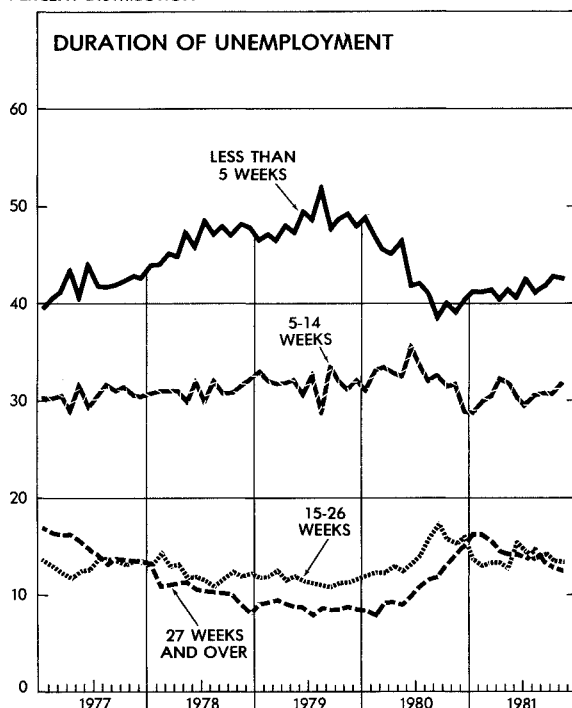

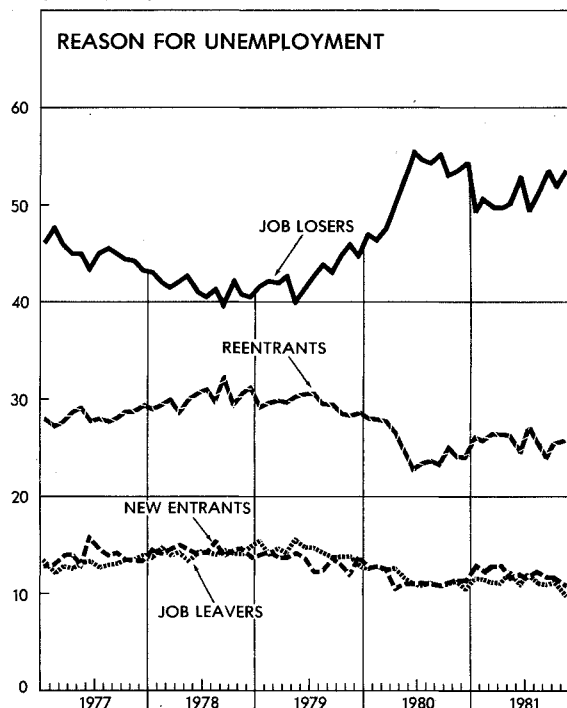
In November, the percentage of unemployed persons who had been out of work for 5-14 weeks rose, and the percentage out of work for shorter and longer periods fell.

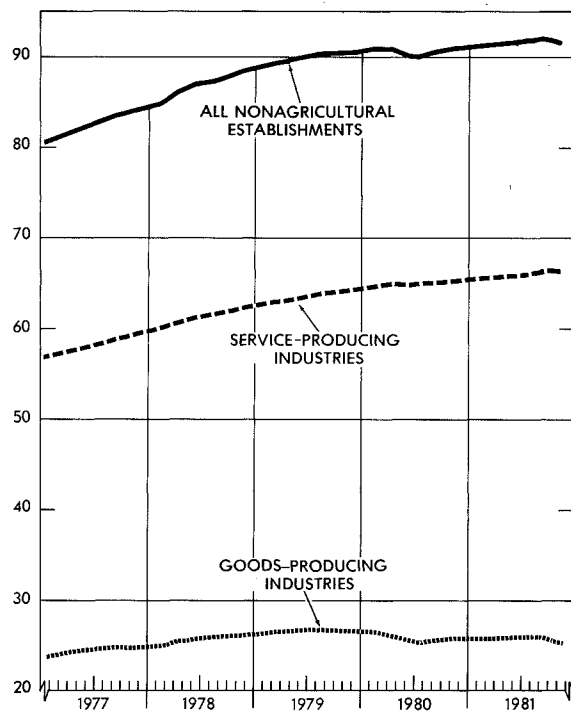

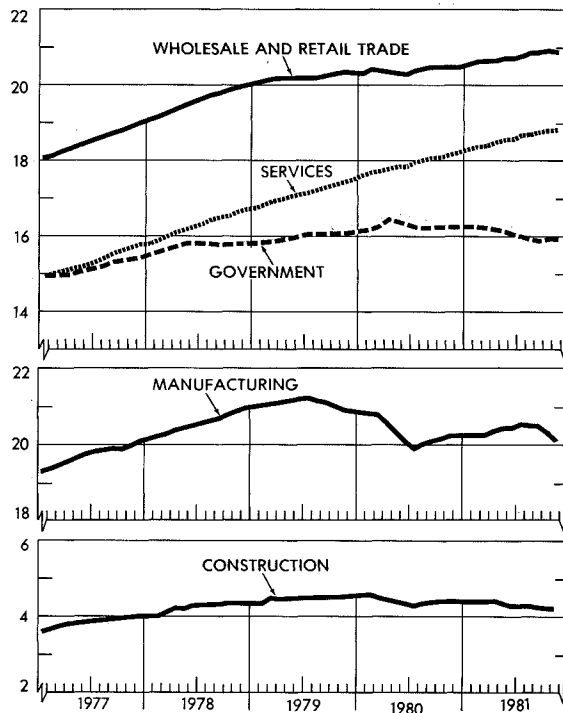
In November, total nonagricultural employment as measured by the payroll survey fell by 235,000.

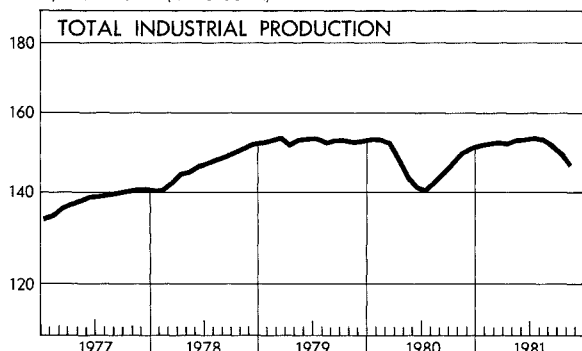

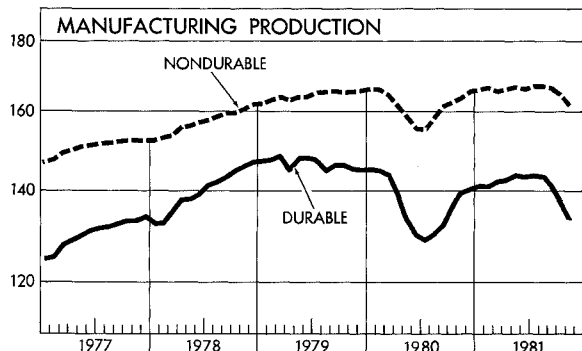
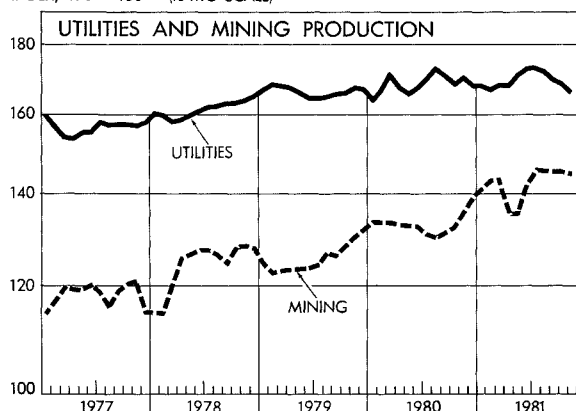
INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND CAPACITY UTILIZATION

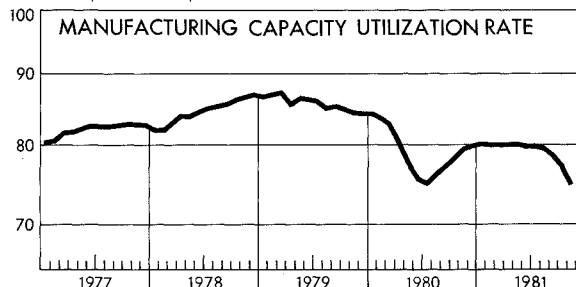
INDEX, 1967=100* (RATIO SCALE)

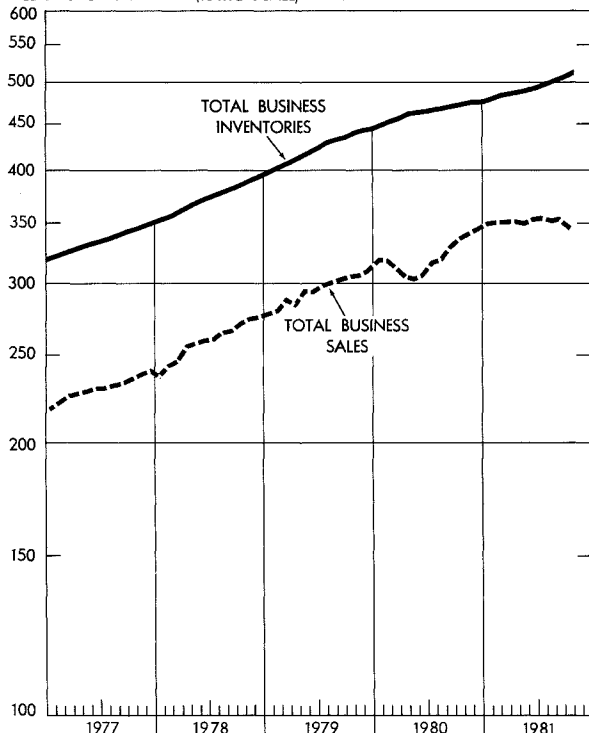

BUSINESS SALES AND INVENTORIES—TOTAL AND TRADE

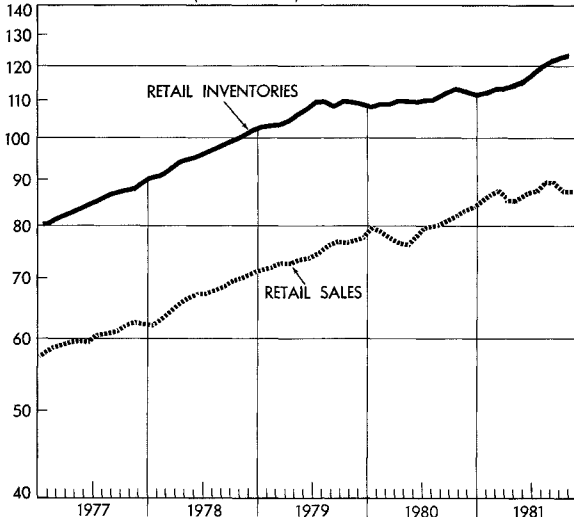

BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)



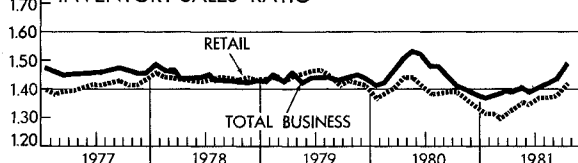

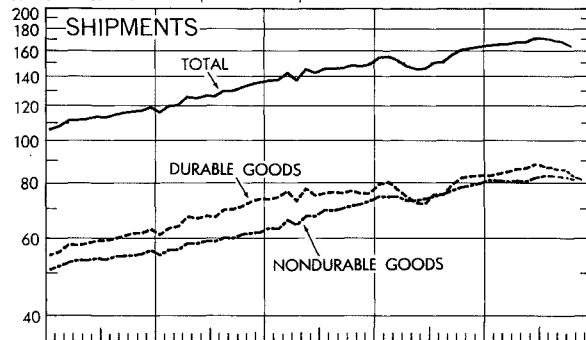

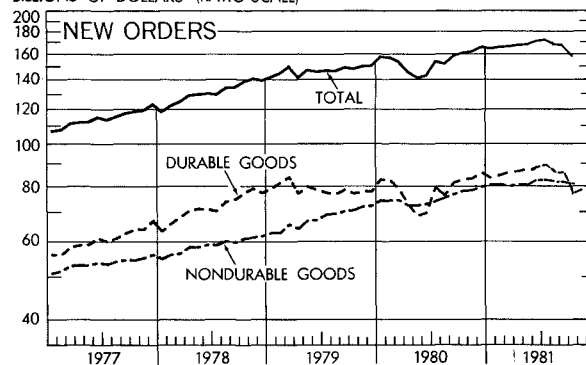

BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

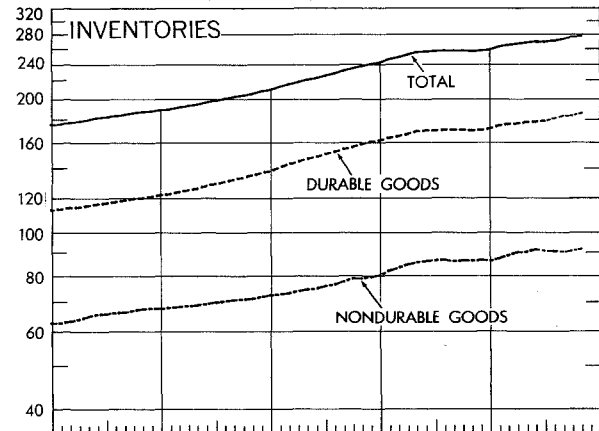


BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

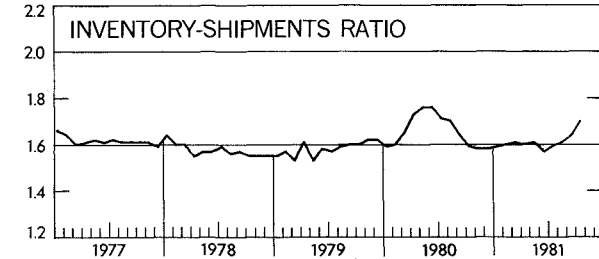

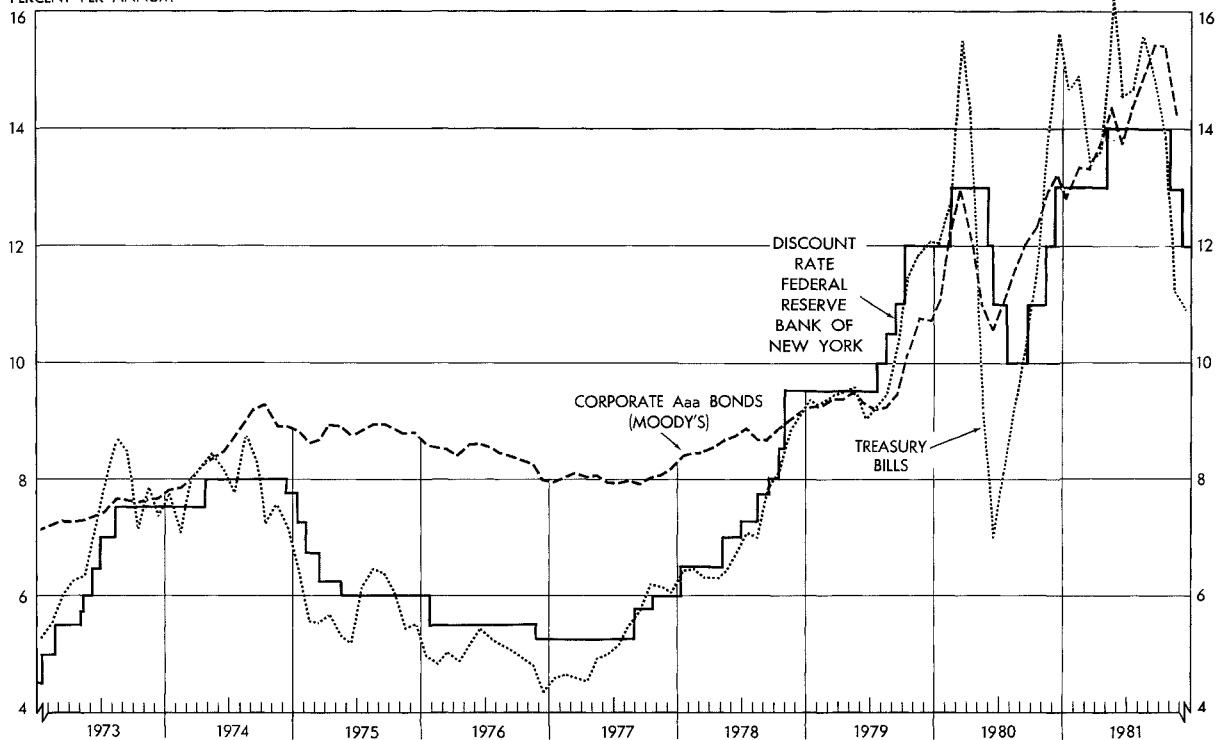

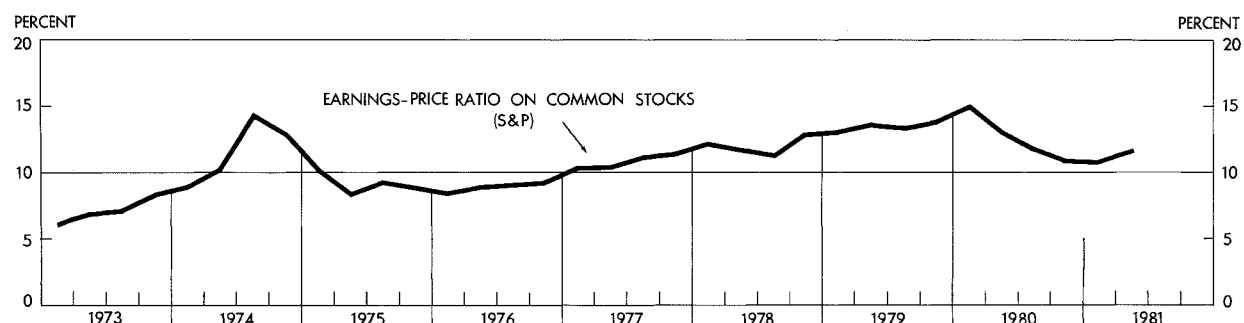
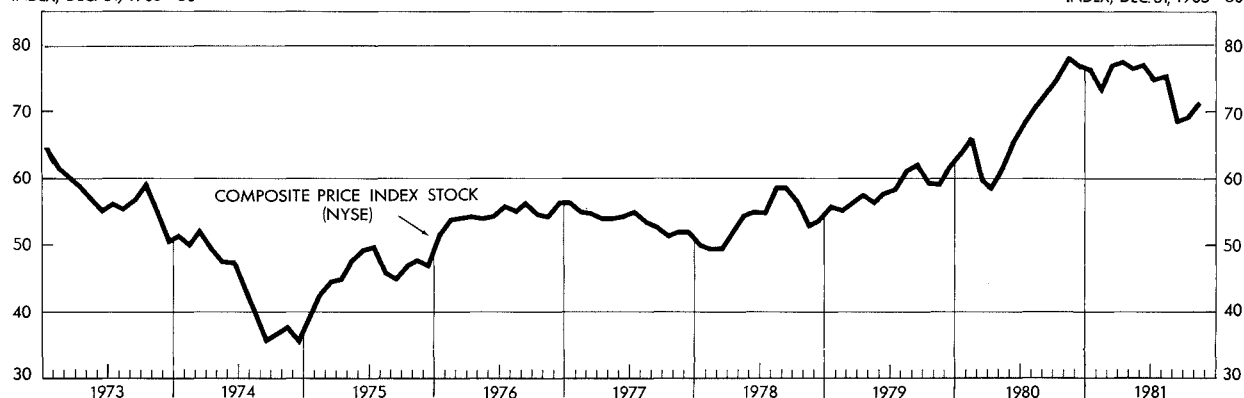

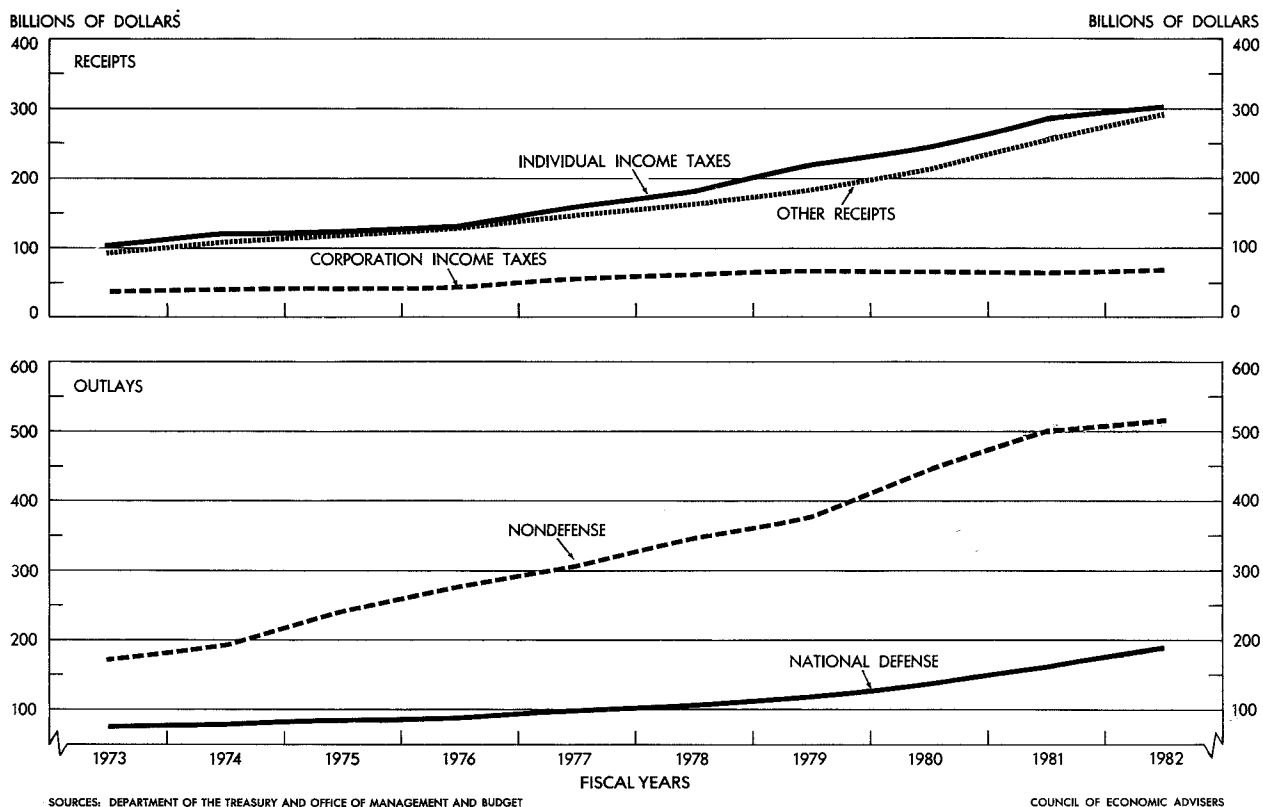

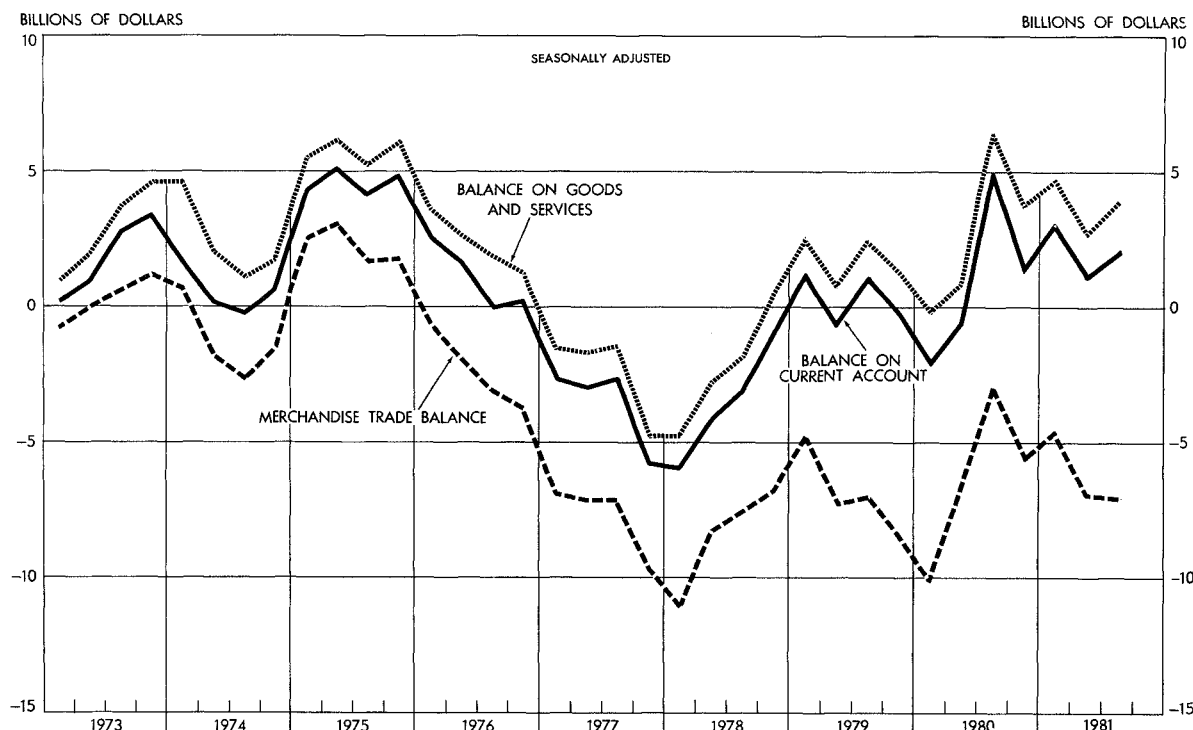

In the third quarter, the merchandise trade deficit increased slightly to \$7.0 billion from \$6.9 billion in the second quarter. The current account registered a surplus of \$2.1 billion, up from \$1.1 billion in the second quarter.

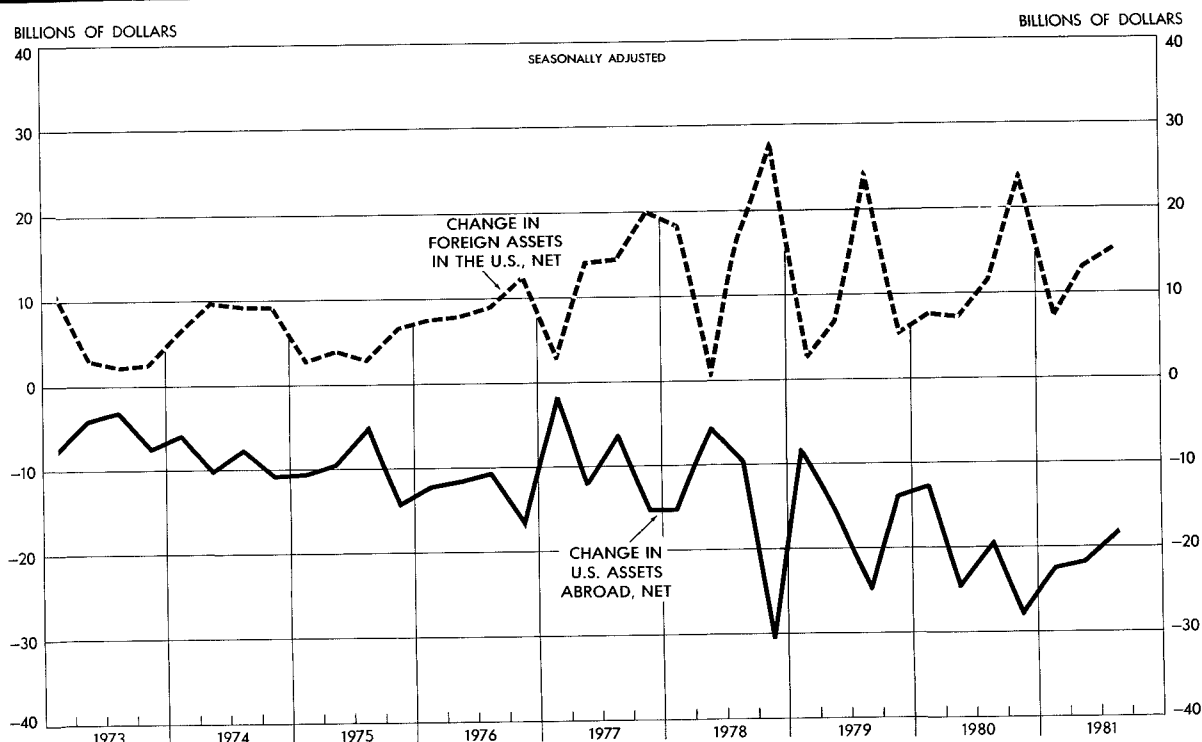
