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[Public Law 120—81st Congress; Chapter 237—1st Session]

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To print the monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators"

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Joint Economic Committee be authorized to issue a monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators," and that a sufficient quantity be printed to furnish one copy to each Member of Congress; the Secretary and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate; the Clerk, Sergeant at Arms, and Doorkeeper of the House of Representatives; two copies to the libraries of the Senate and House, and the Congressional Library; seven hundred copies to the Joint Economic Committee; and the required numbers of copies to the Superintendent of Documents for distribution to depository libraries; and that the Superintendent of Documents be authorized to have copies printed for sale to the public.


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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

According to preliminary estimates for the second quarter of 1982, gross national product rose \$51.9 billion or 7.1 percent, both at annual rates. Real output (GNP adjusted for price changes) rose 1.7 percent, annual rate, and the implicit price deflator rose at a 5.3 percent annual rate.



Personal income rose \$8.7 billion (annual rate) in June following a rise of \$18.4 billion in May. Wages and salaries rose \$2.1 billion in June, compared with an increase of \$12.9 billion in May. Personal interest income rose \$3.8 billion in June and transfer payments \$0.8 billion.



INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND CAPACITY UTILIZATION

Industrial production fell 0.7 percent in June following declines of 0.6 percent in May and 1.1 percent in April. The index for June was 9.5 percent below the year earlier level.



U.S. INTERNATIONAL TRANSACTIONS

The balance on current account shifted to a surplus of \$1.2 billion in the first quarter from a deficit of \$0.9 billion in the fourth quarter of 1981. A decrease in the merchandise trade deficit, to \$6.1 billion from \$9.2 billion, more than accounted for the shift.



U.S. INTERNATIONAL TRANSACTIONS—Continued

In the private capital accounts, U.S. claims on foreigners reported by U.S. banks increased \$34.7 billion in the first quarter of 1982, compared with a \$42.7 billion increase in the fourth quarter of 1981. Much of the increase, \$25.1 billion, reflected activity of International Banking Facilities (IBFs), which were authorized in December 1981.
