JOINT RESOLUTION [S.J. Res. 55]

To print the monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators"

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Joint Economic Committee be authorized to issue a monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators," and that a sufficient quantity be printed to furnish one copy to each Member of Congress; the Secretary and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate; the Clerk, Sergeant at Arms, and Doorkeeper of the House of Representatives; two copies to the libraries of the Senate and House, and the Congressional Library; seven hundred copies to the Joint Economic Committee; and the required numbers of copies to the Superintendent of Documents for distribution to depository libraries; and that the Superintendent of Documents be authorized to have copies printed for sale to the public.

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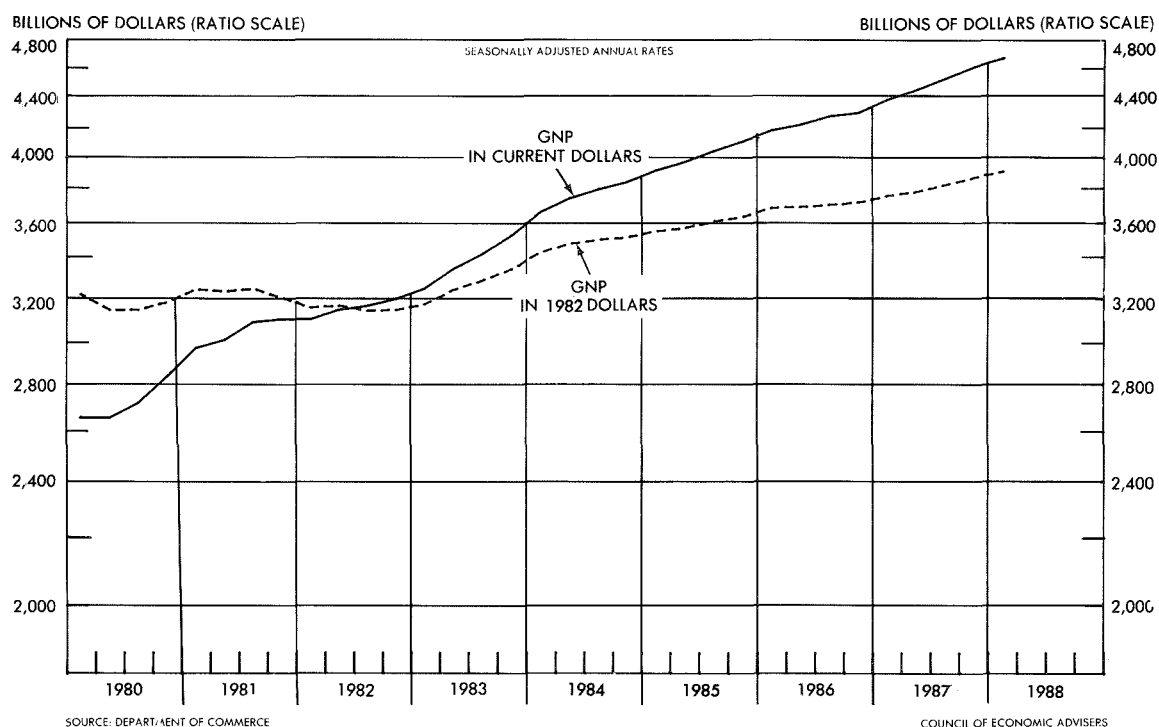
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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

In the first quarter of 1988, according to revised estimates, current-dollar gross national product (GNP) rose 5.1 percent (annual rate) or \$57.7 billion. Real GNP (GNP adjusted for price changes) rose 3.6 percent and the implicit price deflator rose 1.4 percent.

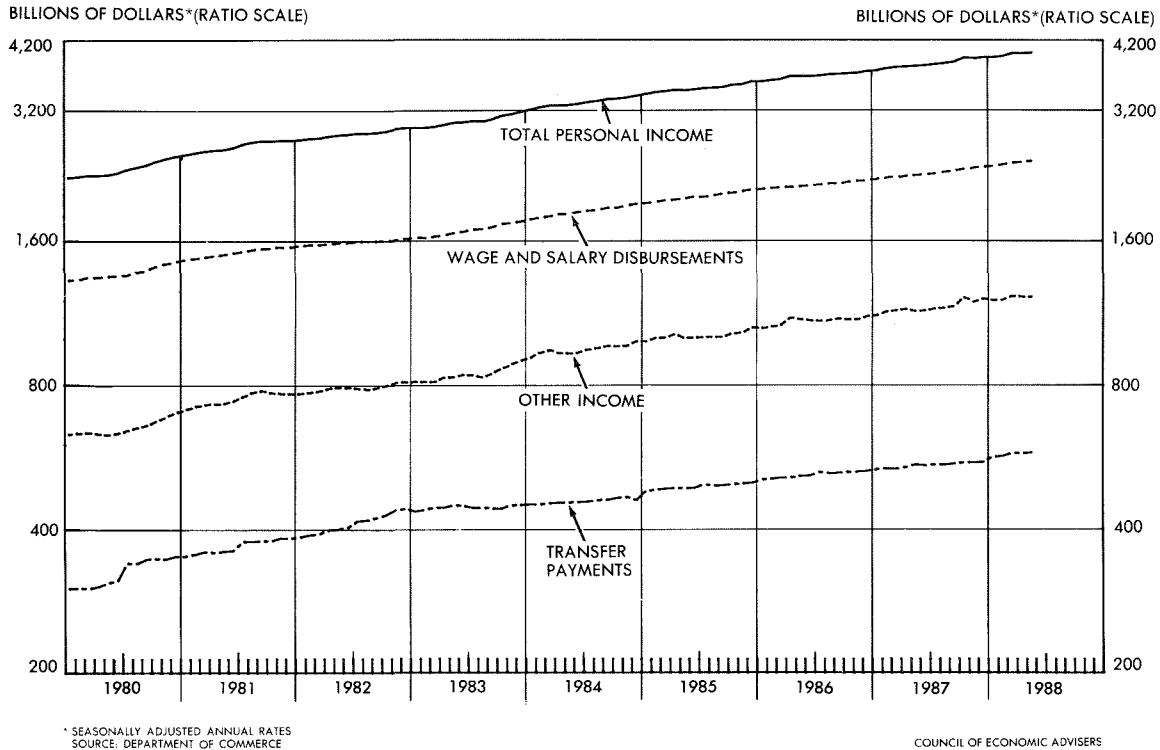

SOURCES OF PERSONAL INCOME

Personal income rose \$13.3 billion (annual rate) in May, following a rise of \$4.1 billion in April. The increases were affected by three special factors: Profit-sharing payments to employees in the motor vehicle industry and retroactive social security benefit payments in March lowered the April increase; decreases in subsidy payments to farmers lowered the increases in both May and April. Excluding these special factors, personal income increased \$16.1 billion in May and \$30.0 billion in April.

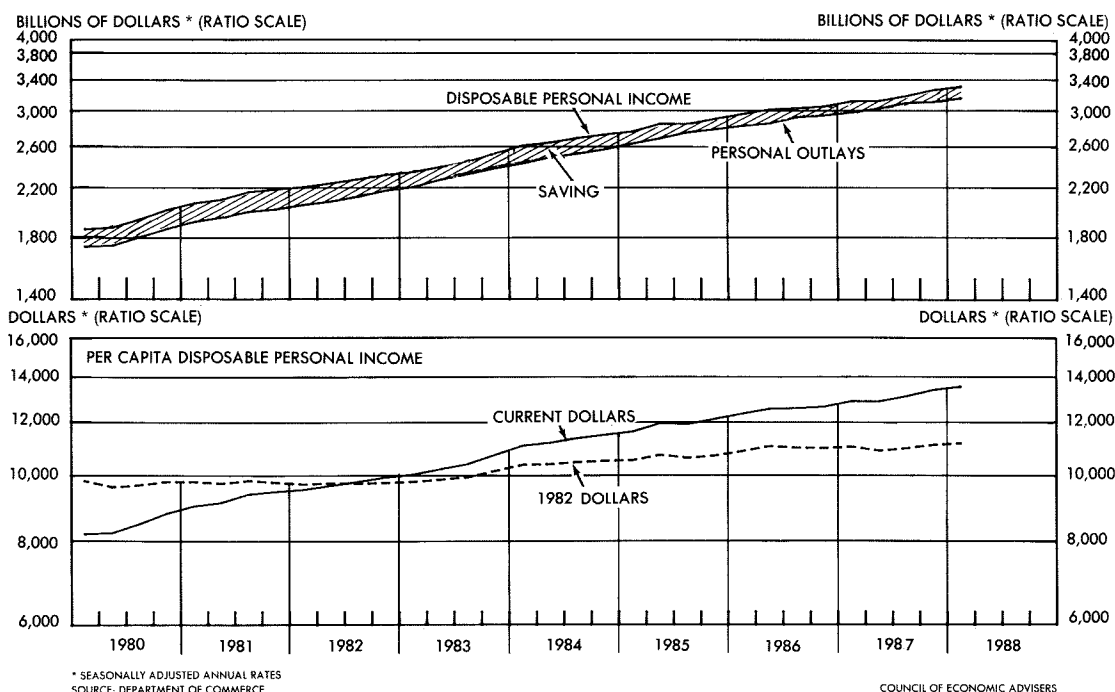

Real per capita disposable personal income rose in the first quarter of 1988.



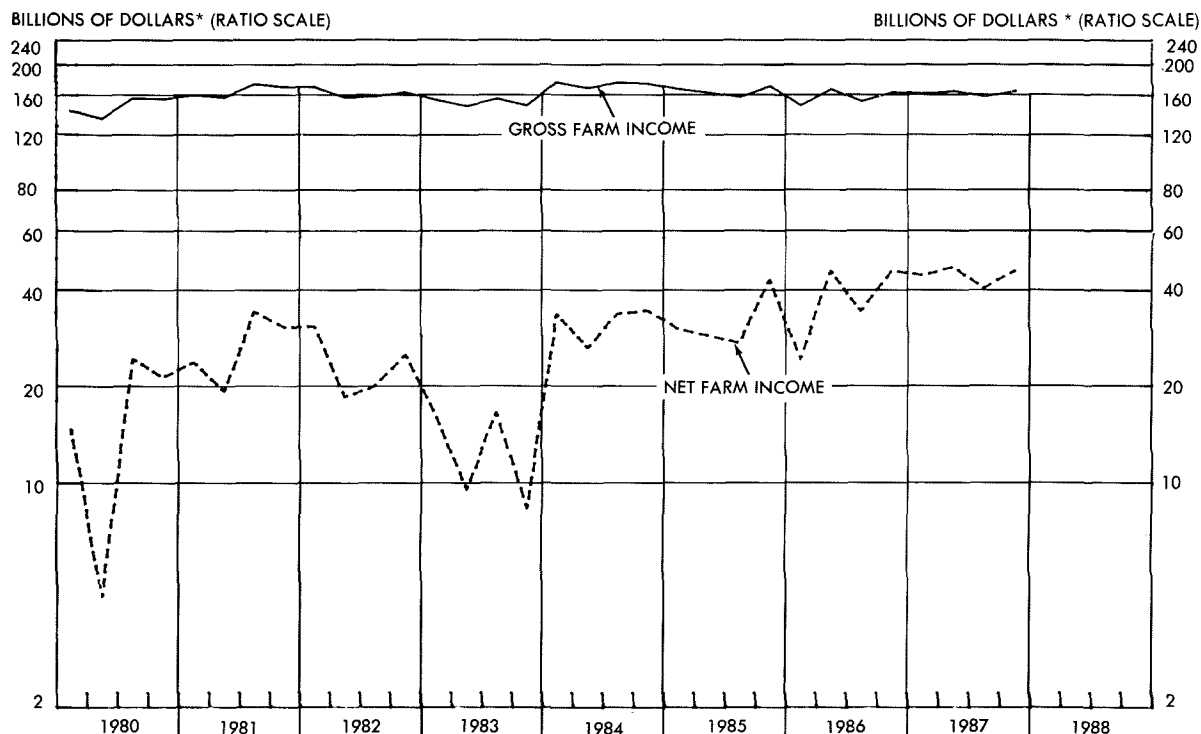

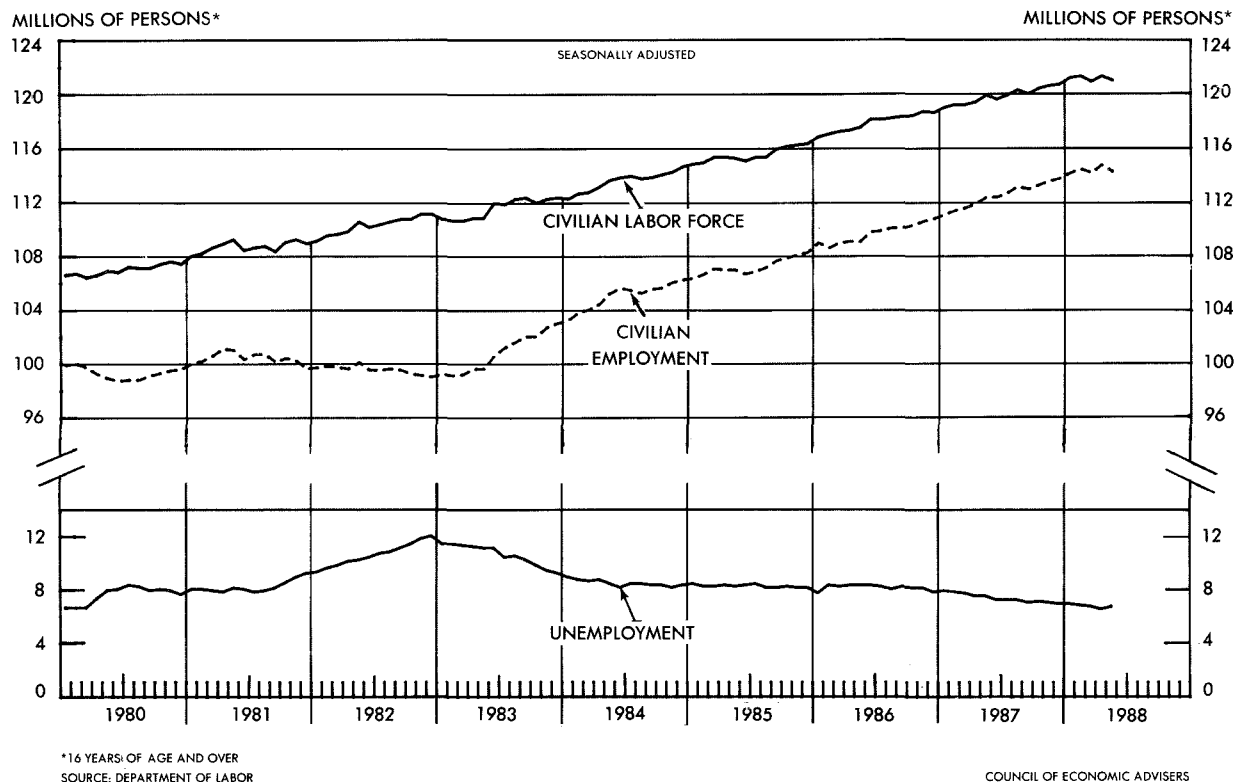

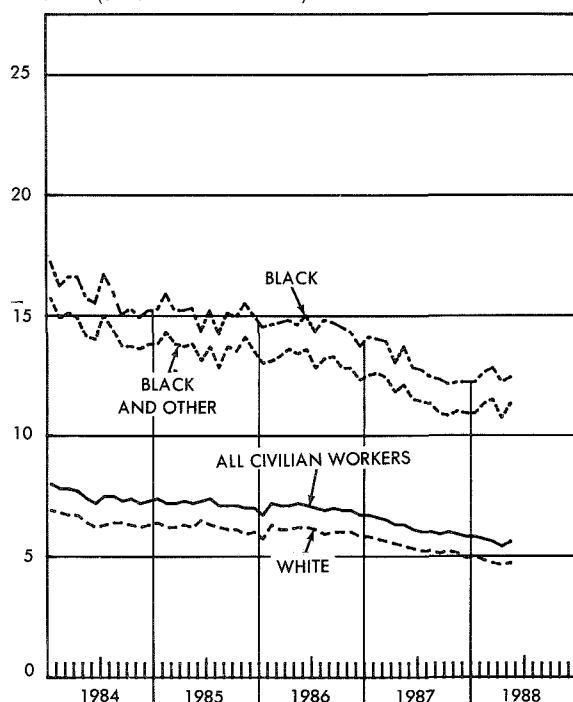

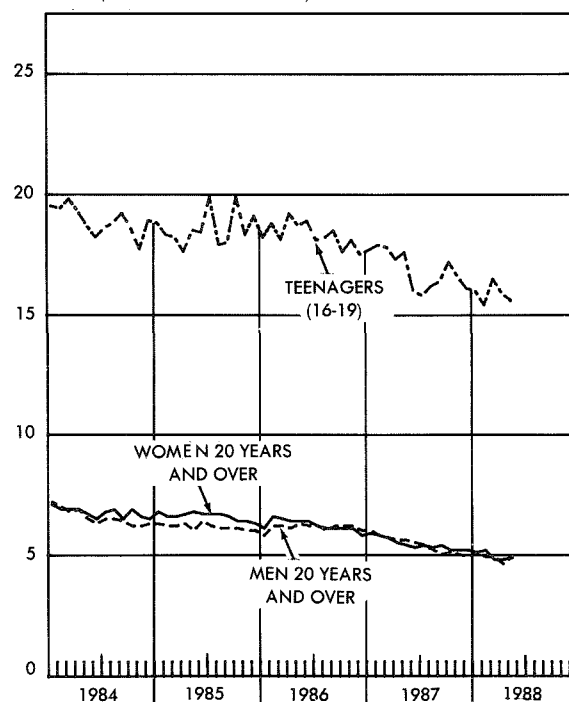
SELECTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATES

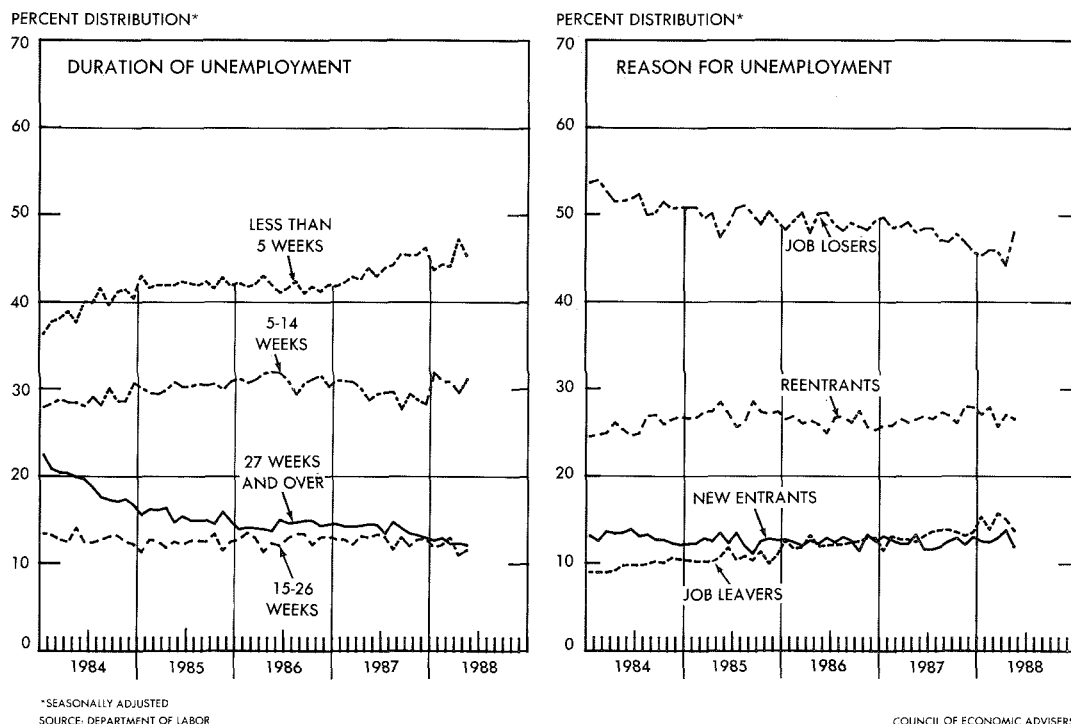

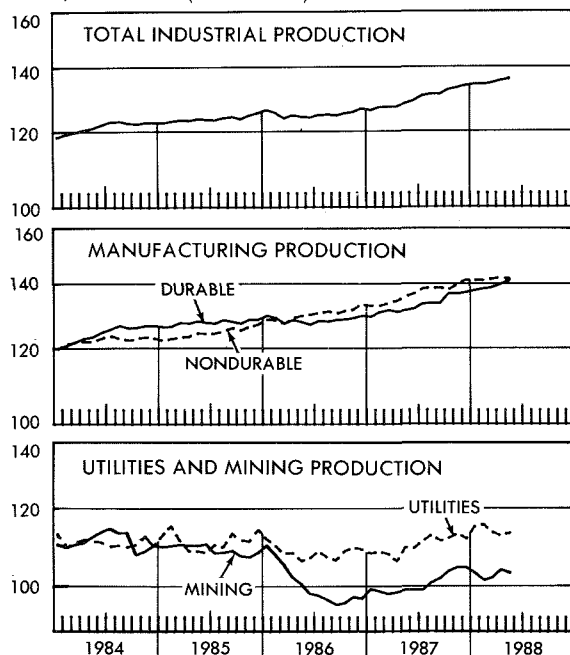

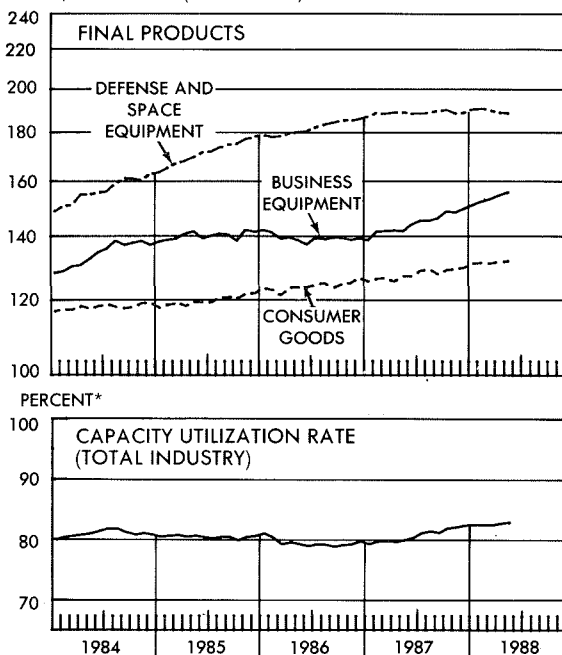
Industrial production rose 0.4 percent in May following a 0.6 percent increase in April. The index for May was 6.1 percent above its year-earlier level.

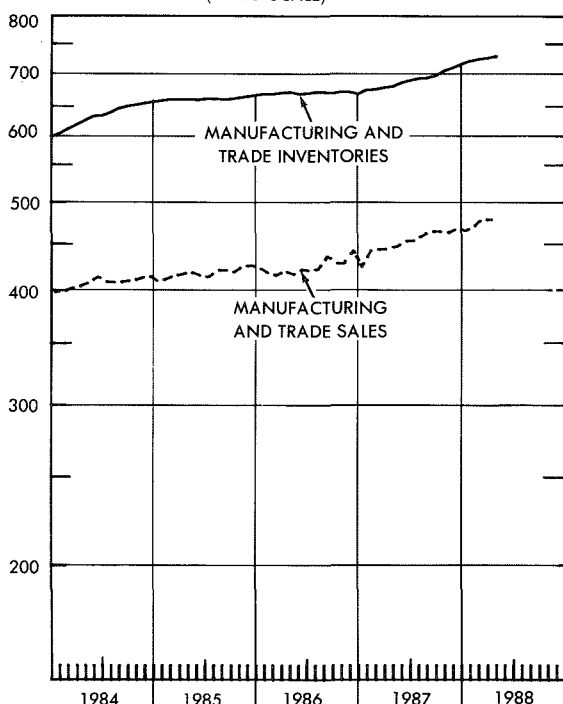

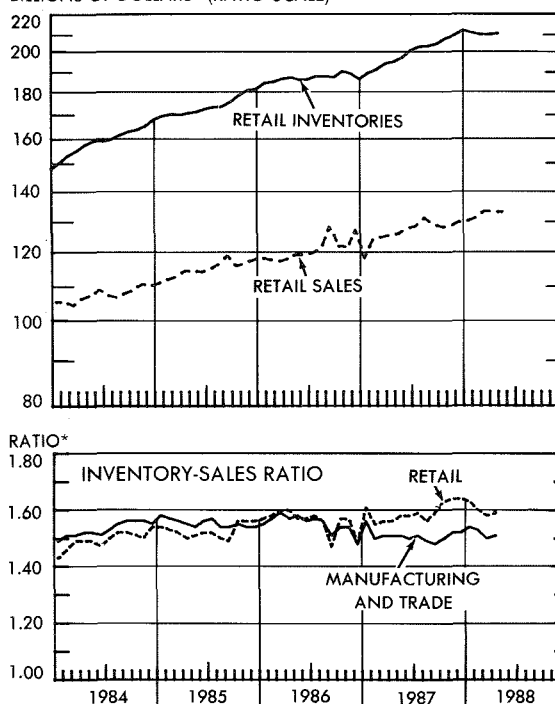

BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

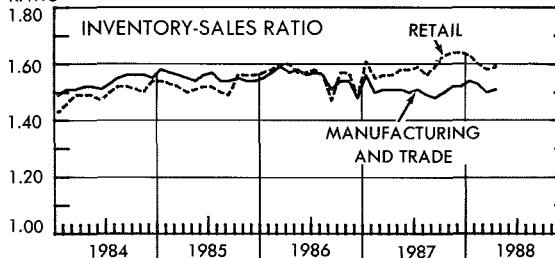

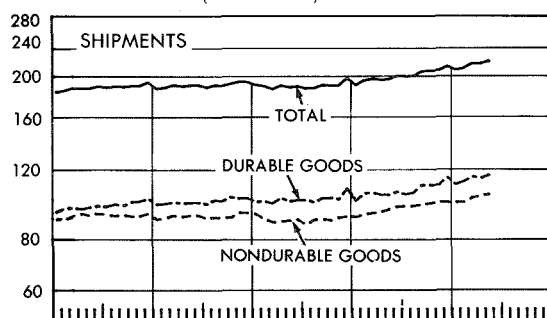

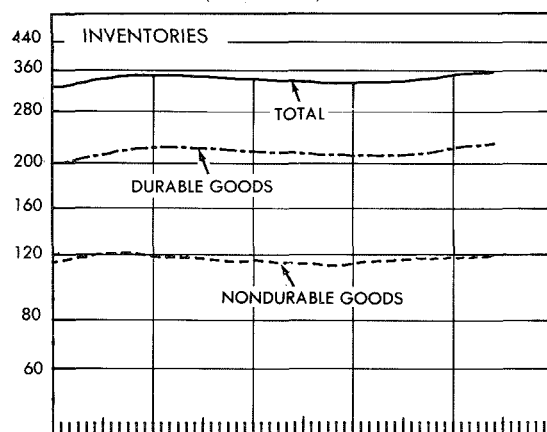
MANUFACTURERS' SHIPMENTS, INVENTORIES, AND ORDERS

In May, manufacturers' shipments, inventories, and unfilled orders rose; new orders fell.

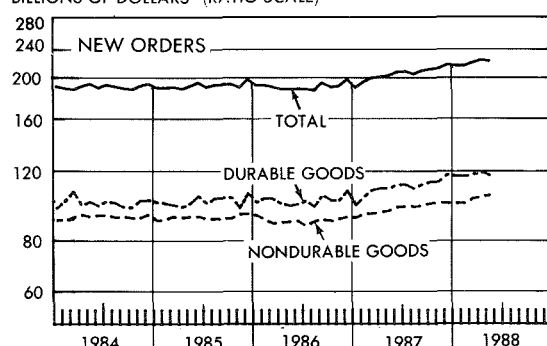
BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)



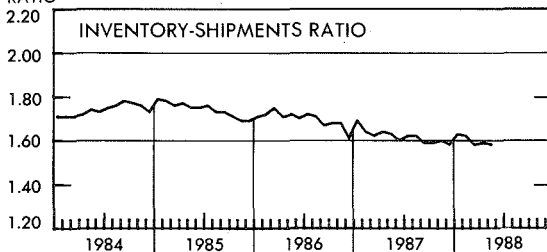
BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

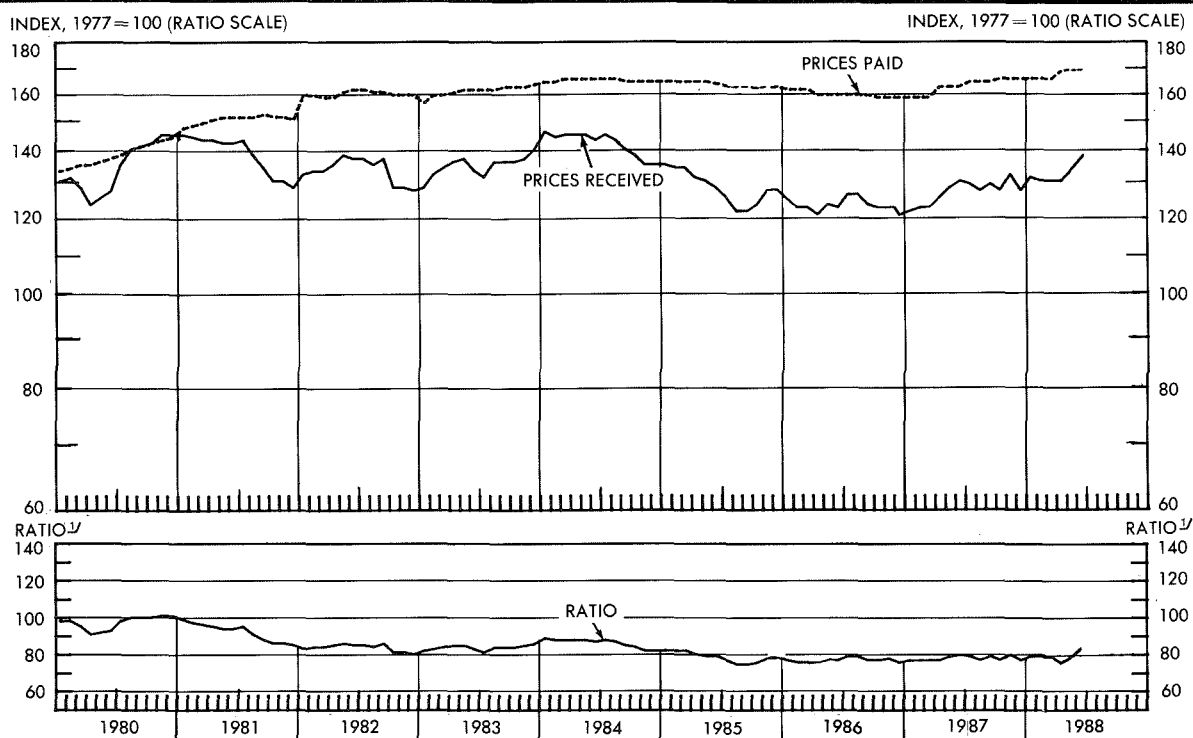

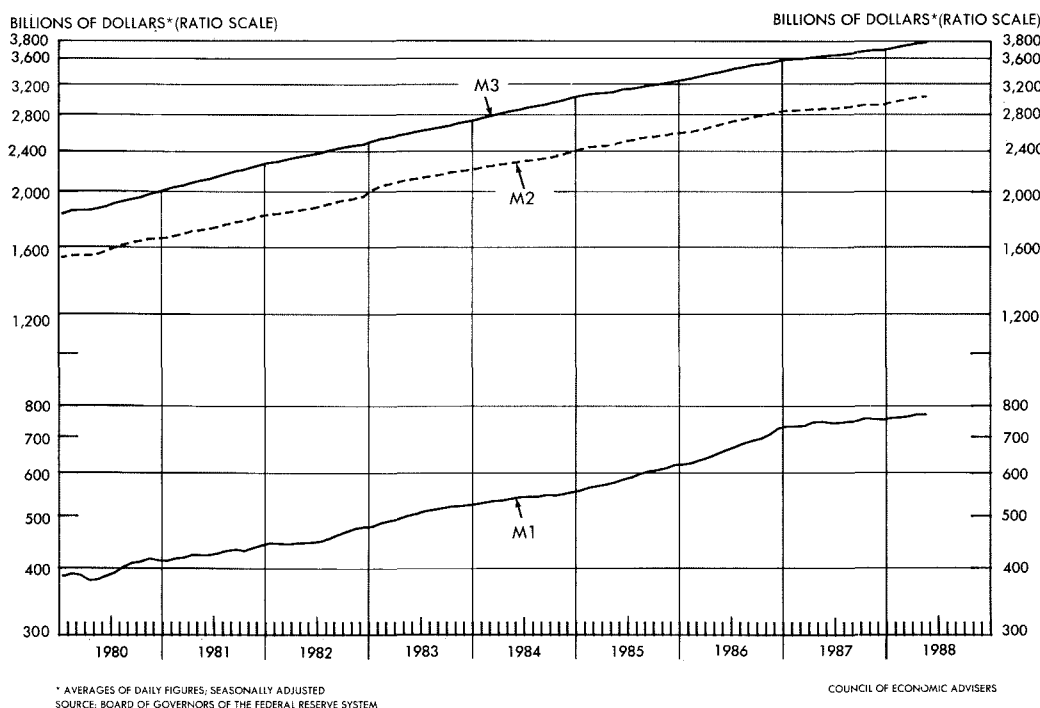

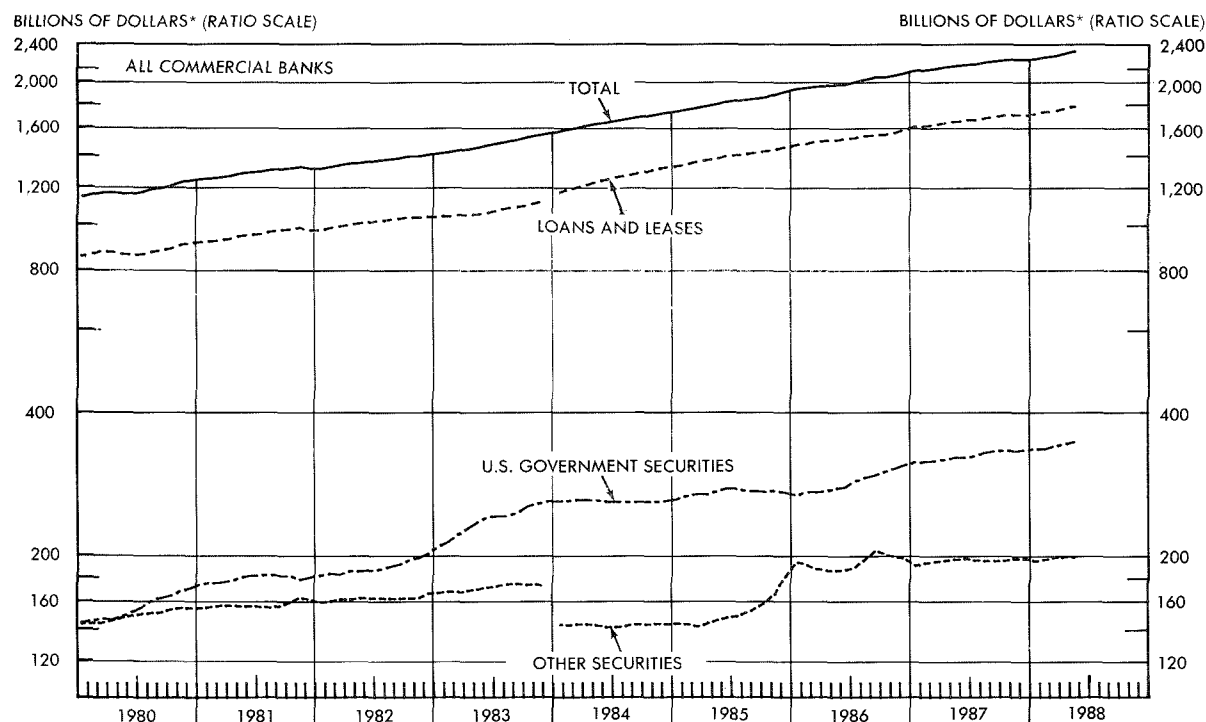

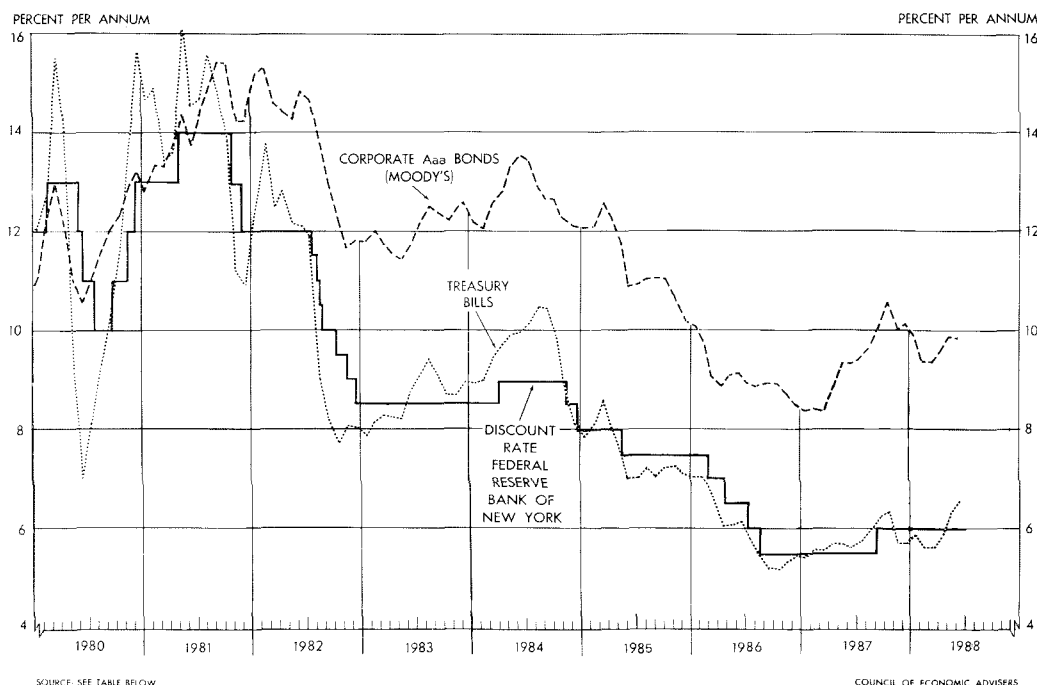

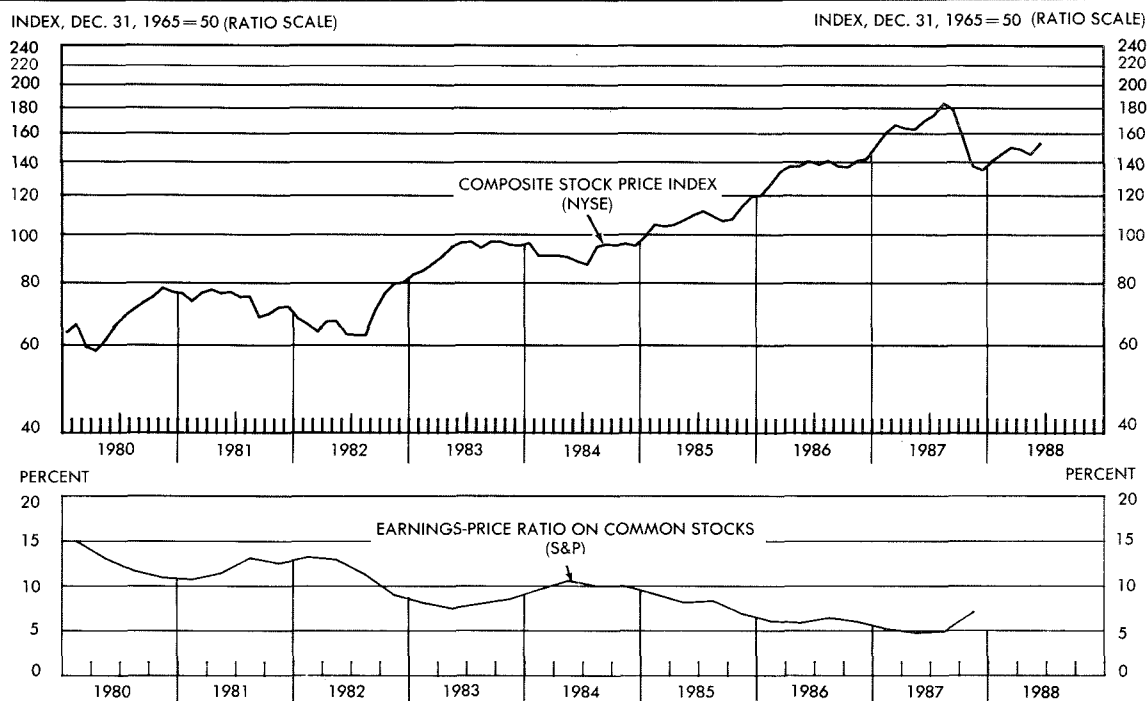

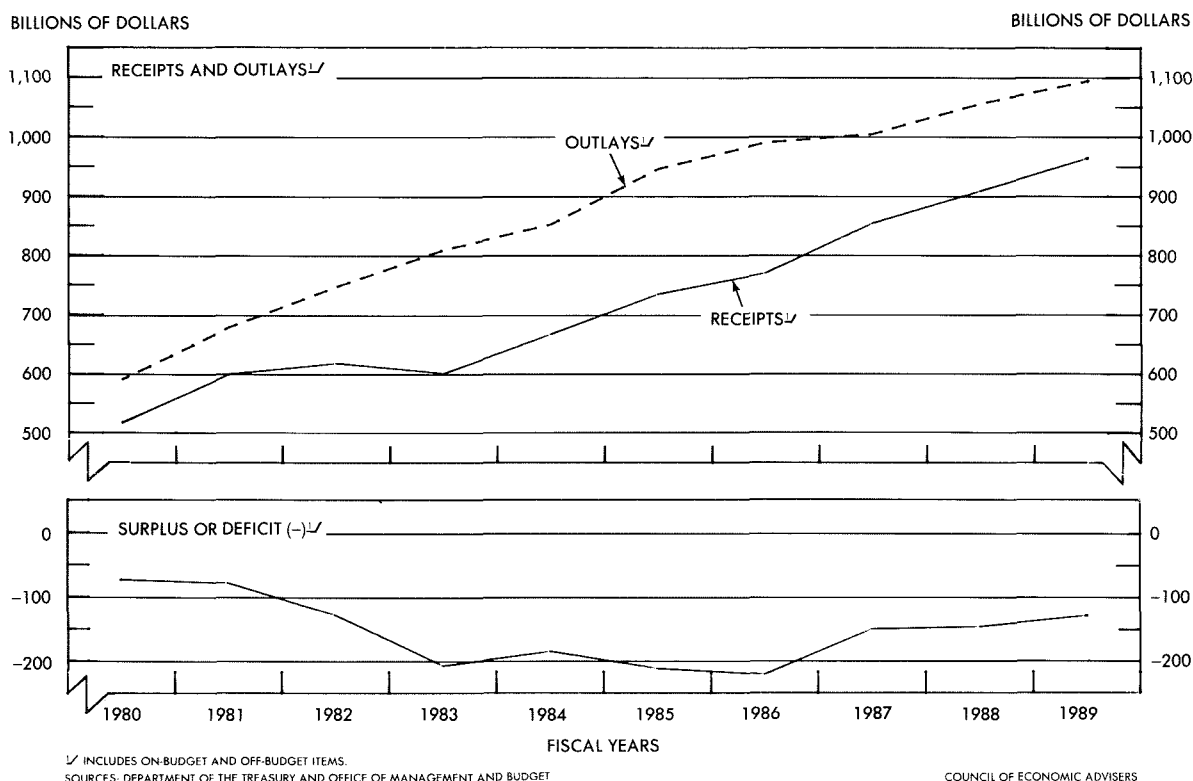

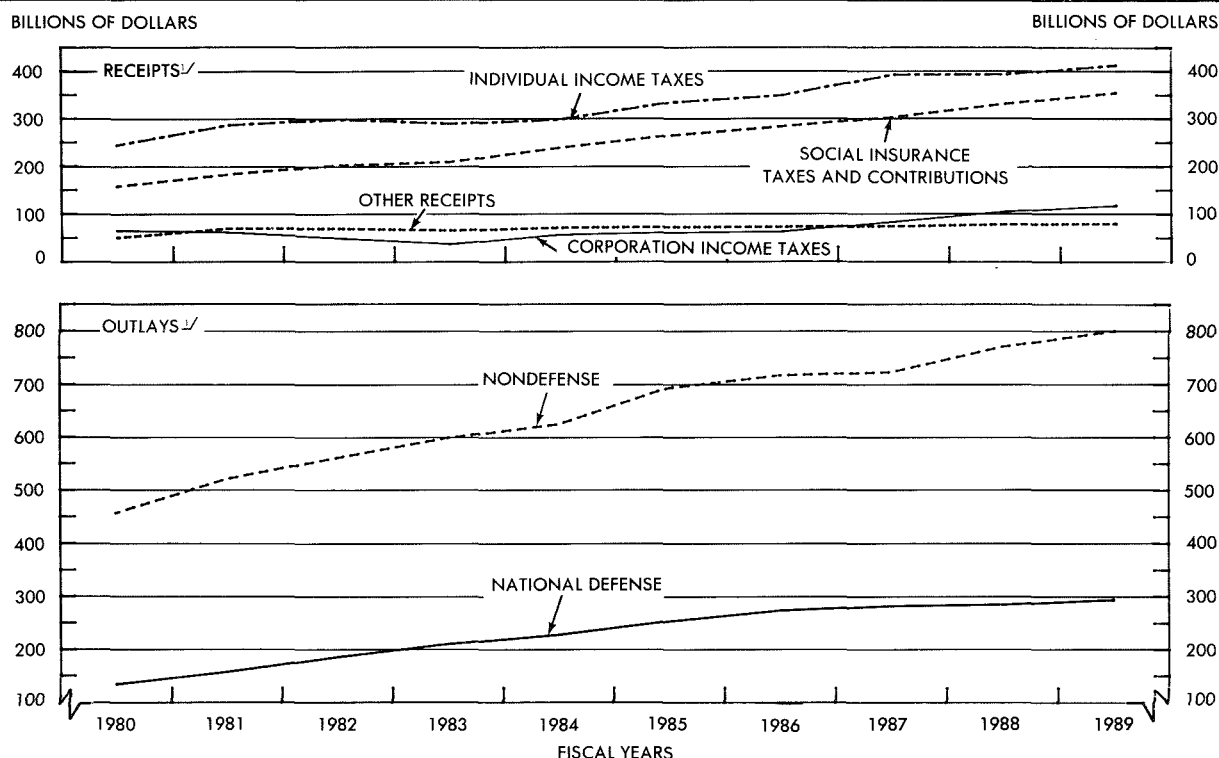

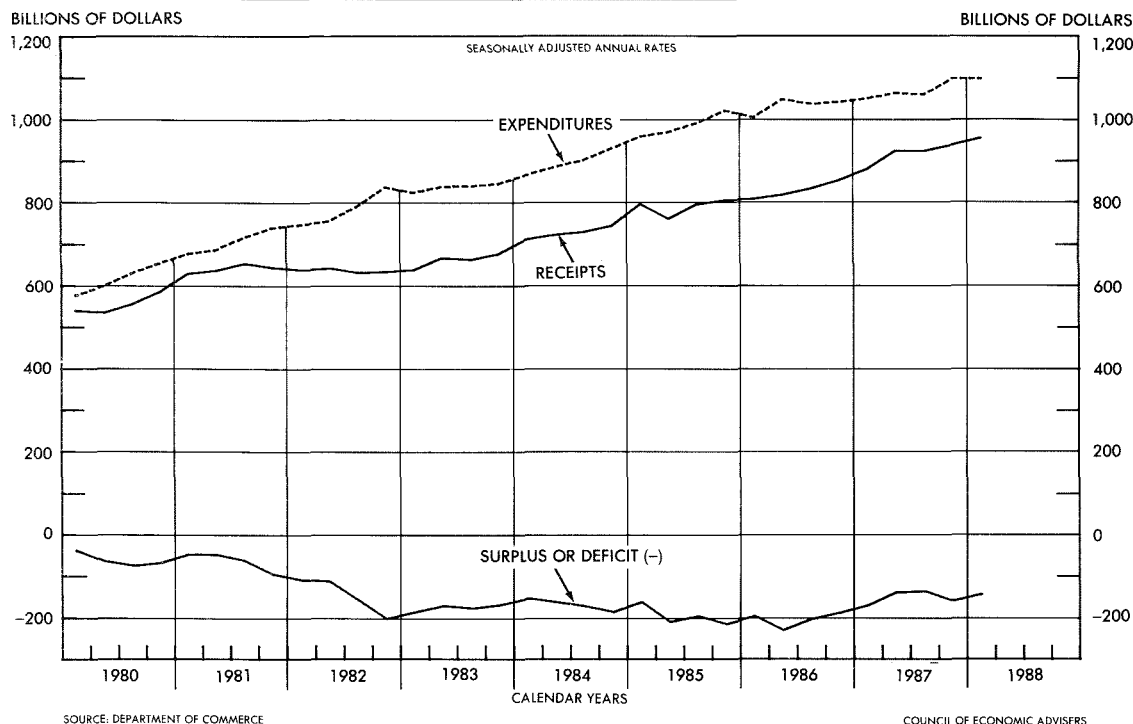

In the capital accounts, claims on foreigners reported by U.S. banks decreased \$17.4 billion in the first quarter of 1988, compared with an increase of \$23.5 billion in the fourth quarter of 1987. Liabilities to foreigners and international financial institutions reported by U.S. banks, excluding Treasury securities, decreased \$16.0 billion in the first quarter, compared with an increase of \$29.8 billion in the fourth quarter.
