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Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Joint Economic Committee be authorized to issue a monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators," and that a sufficient quantity be printed to furnish one copy to each Member of Congress; the Secretary and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate; the Clerk, Sergeant at Arms, and Doorkeeper of the House of Representatives; two copies to the libraries of the Senate and House, and the Congressional Library; seven hundred copies to the Joint Economic Committee; and the required numbers of copies to the Superintendent of Documents for distribution to depository libraries; and that the Superintendent of Documents be authorized to have copies printed for sale to the public.

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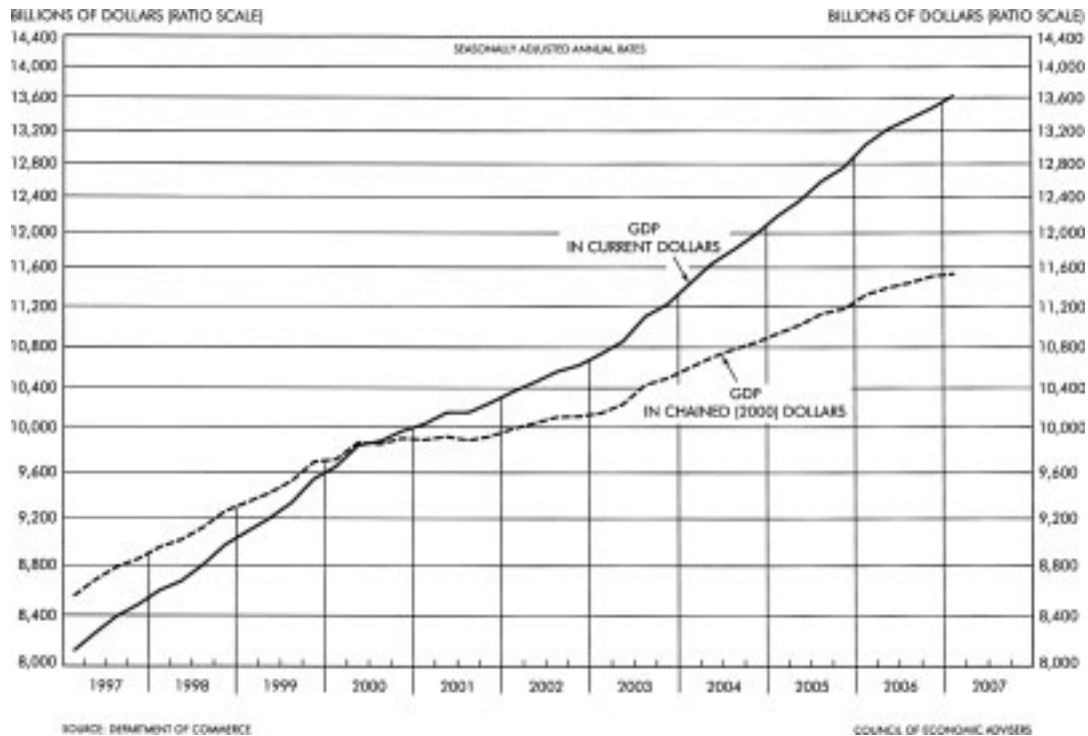
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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

In the first quarter of 2007, according to revised estimates, current-dollar gross domestic product (GDP) rose 4.9 percent (annual rate), real GDP (GDP in chained 2000 dollars) rose 0.7 percent, and the implicit price deflator rose 4.2 percent.

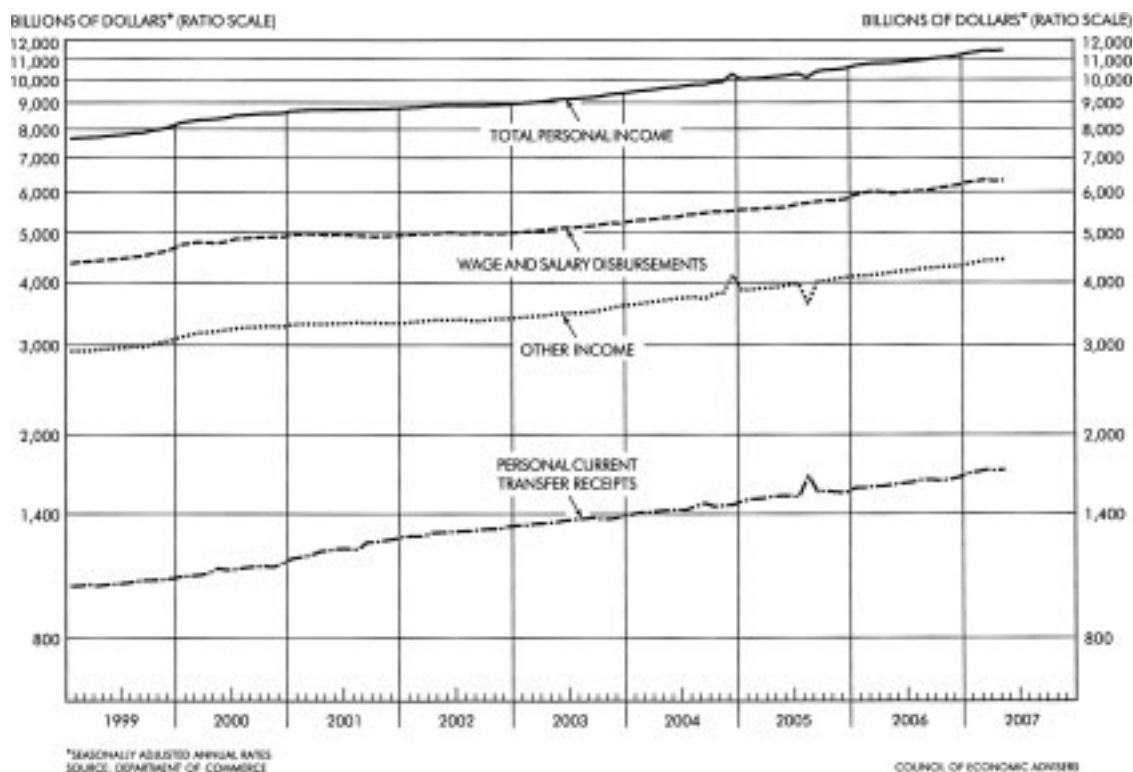

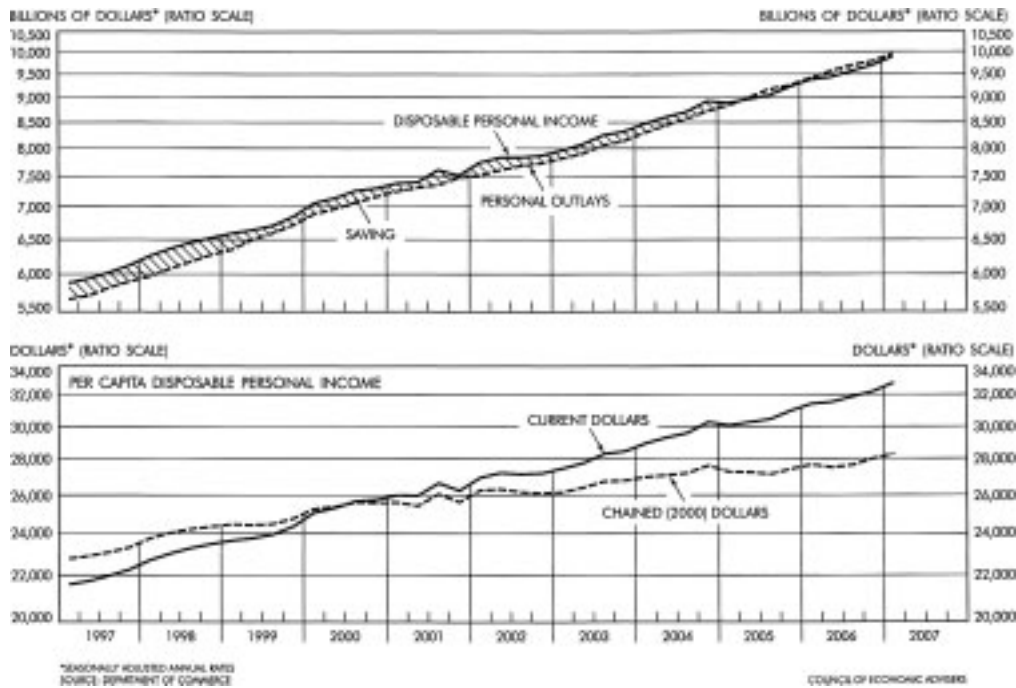

According to revised estimates, per capita disposable personal income in chained (2000) dollars rose at an annual rate of 3.9 percent in the first quarter of 2007.



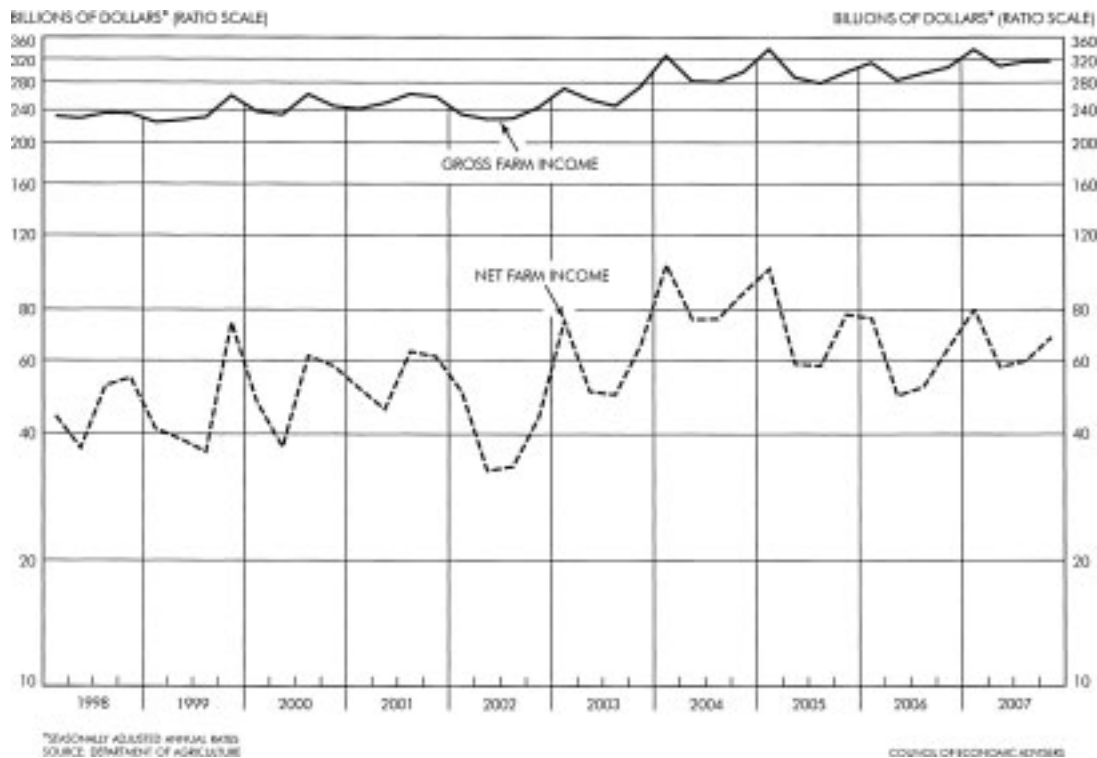

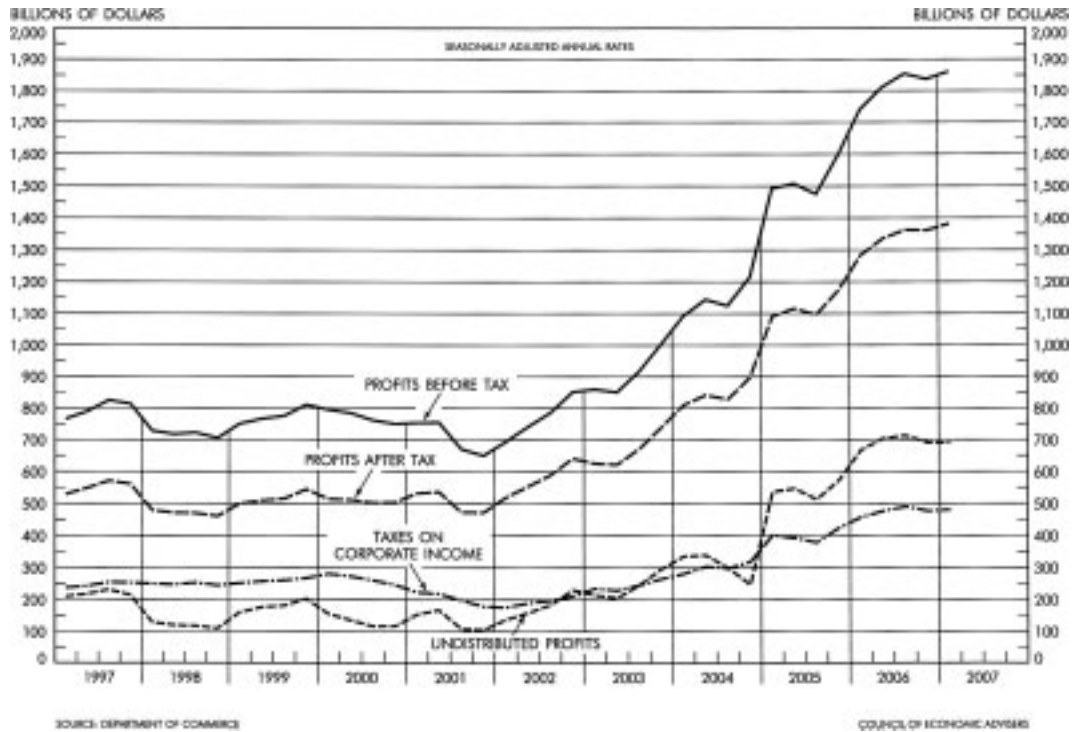

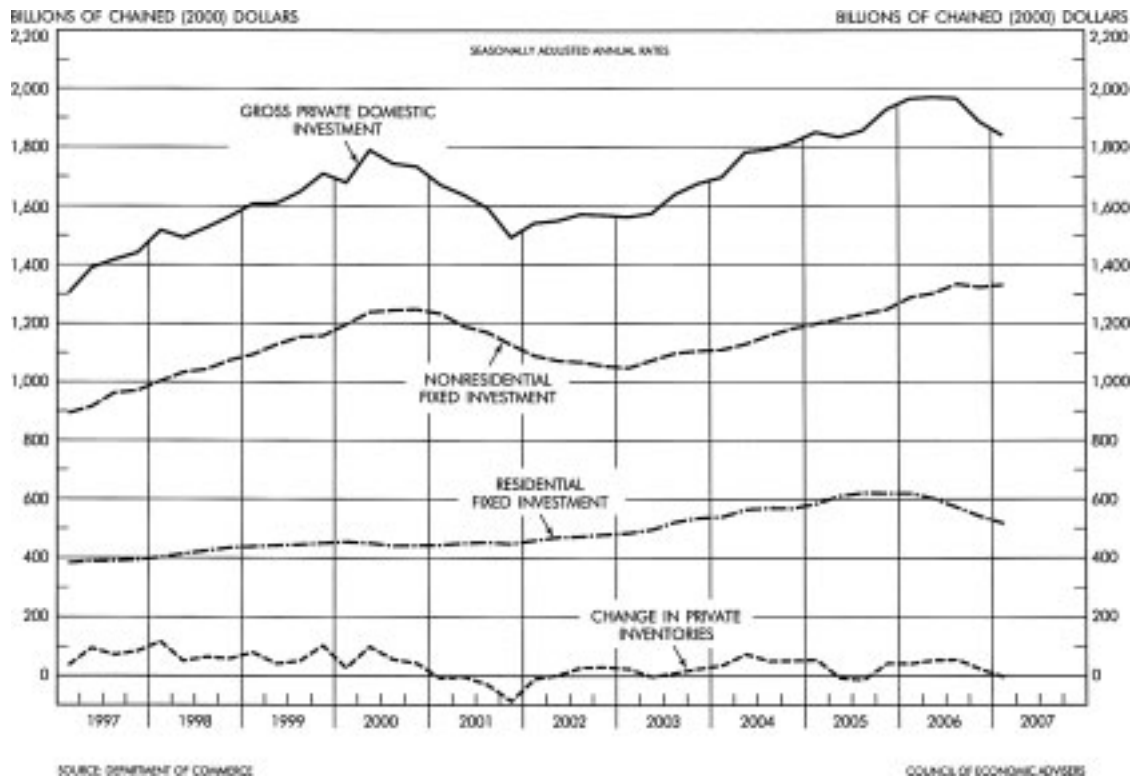

REAL GROSS PRIVATE DOMESTIC INVESTMENT

In the first quarter of 2007, according to revised estimates, nonresidential fixed investment in chained (2000) dollars rose \$8.6 billion (annual rate) and residential investment fell \$22.6 billion. There was a decrease of \$4.2 billion in inventories following an increase of \$22.4 billion in the fourth quarter.

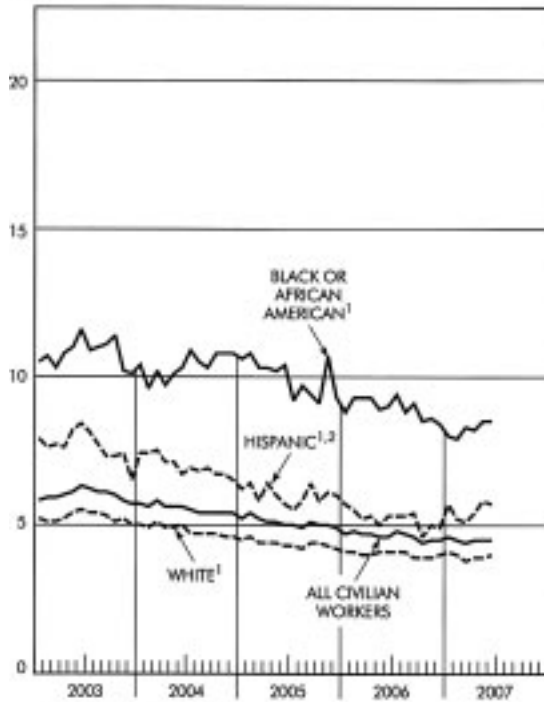

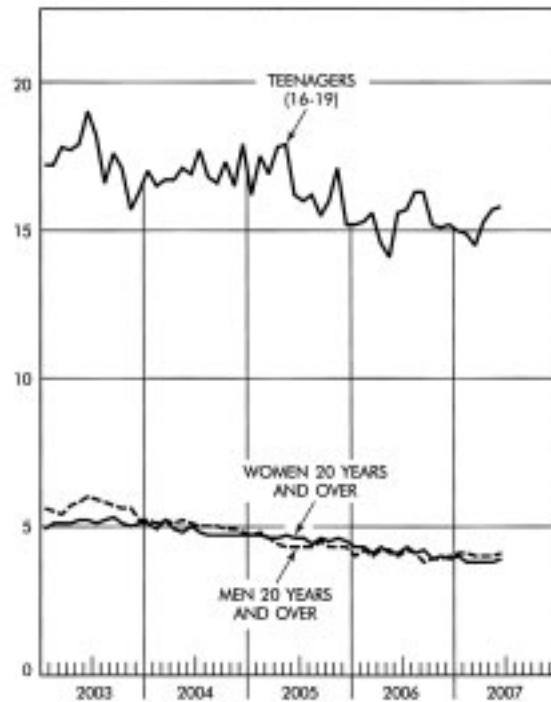

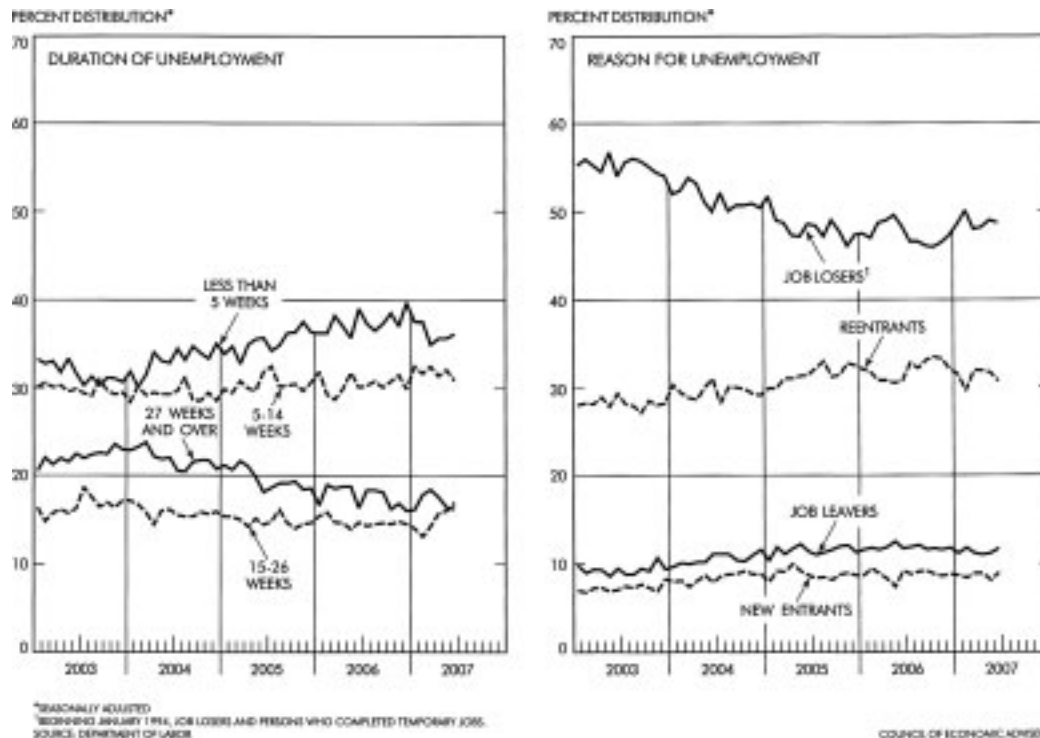

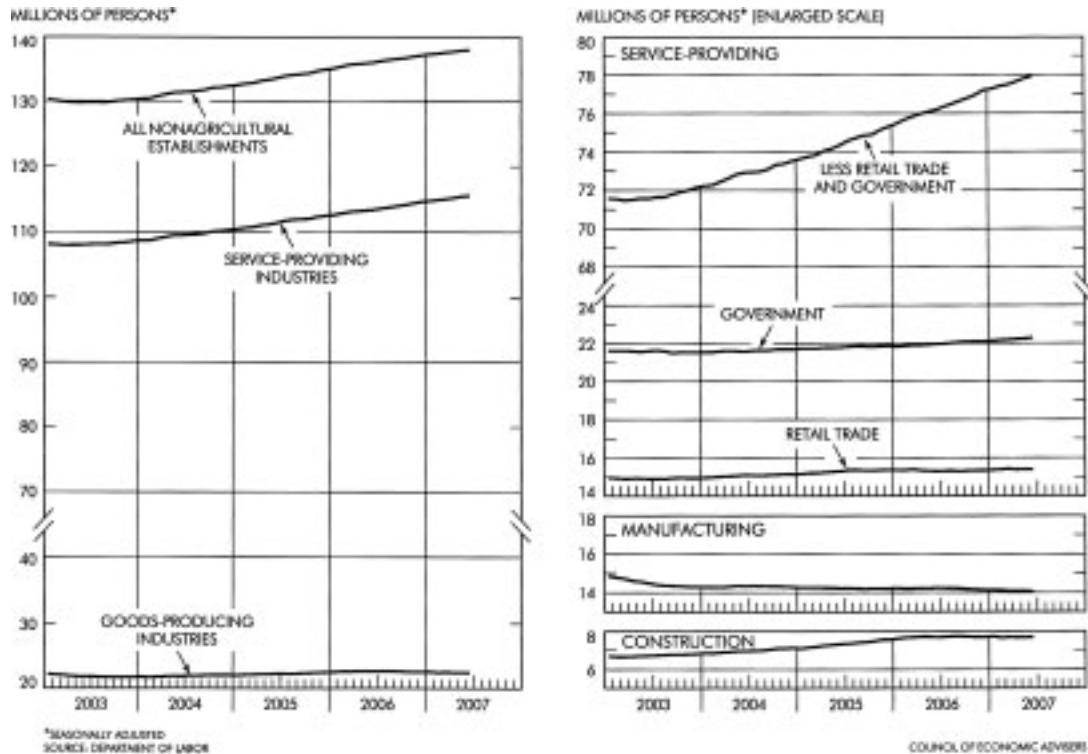

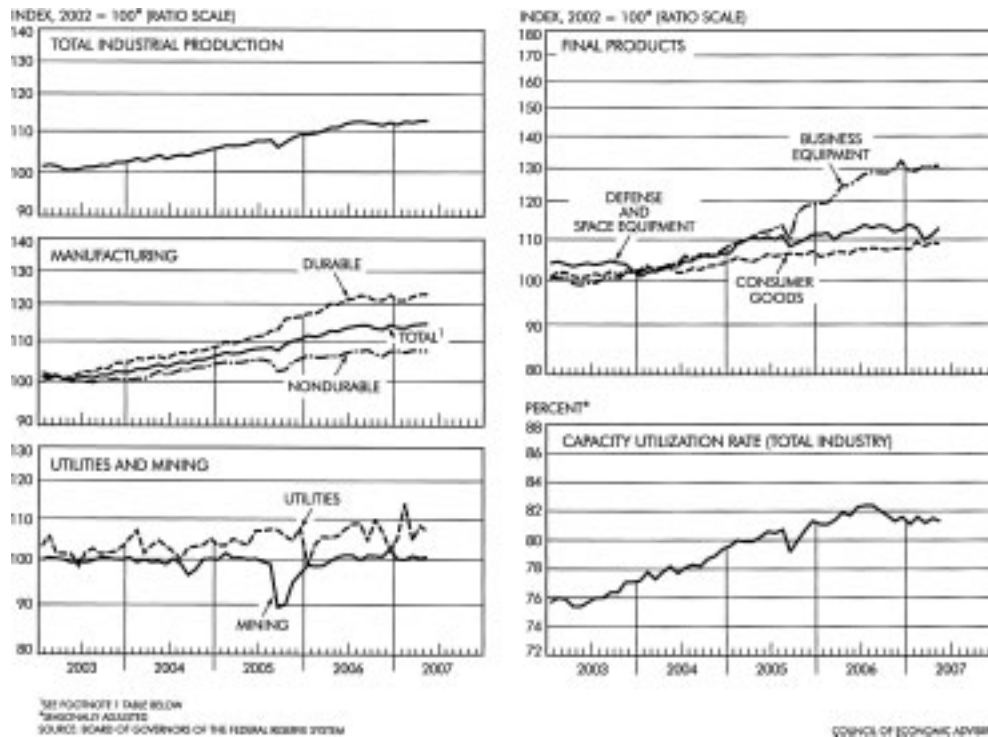

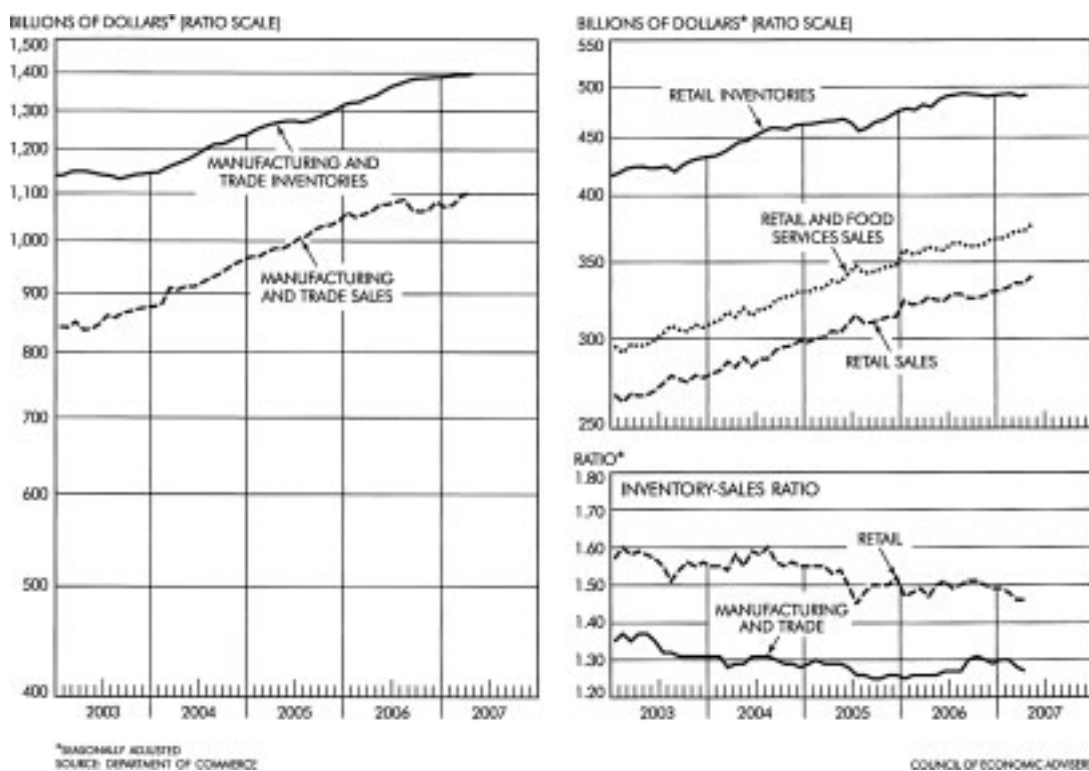

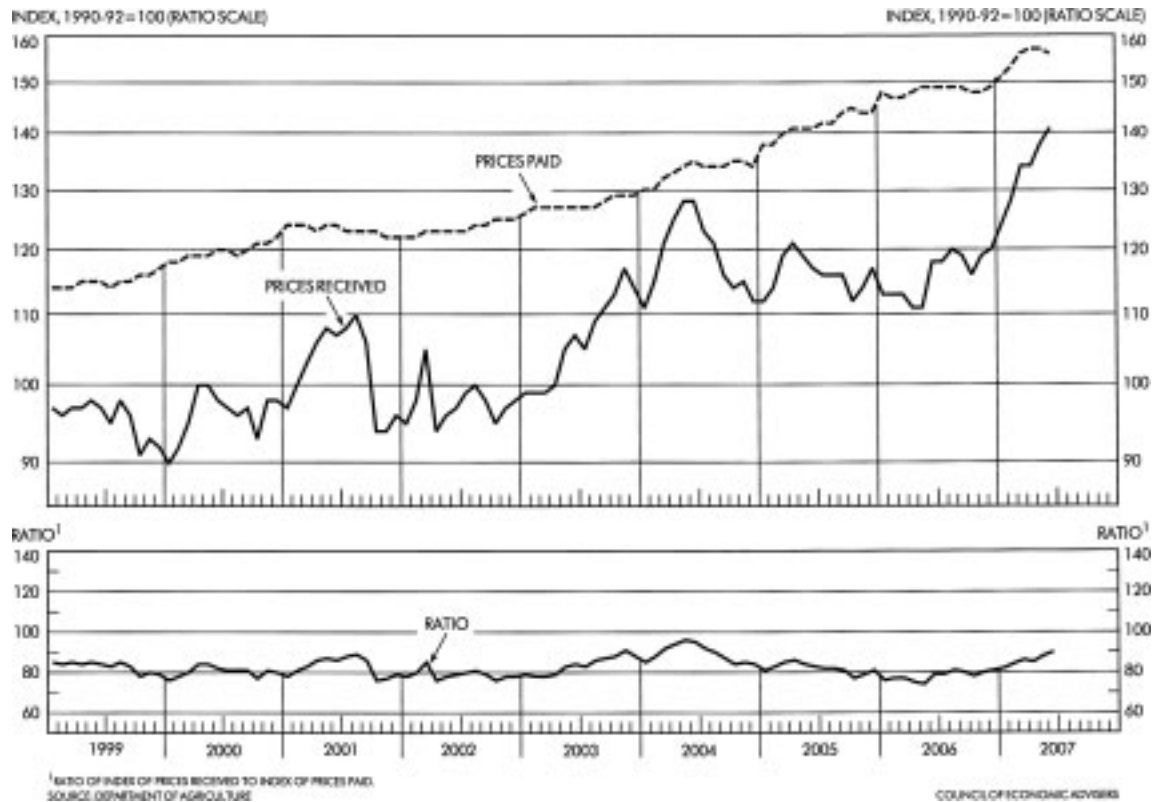

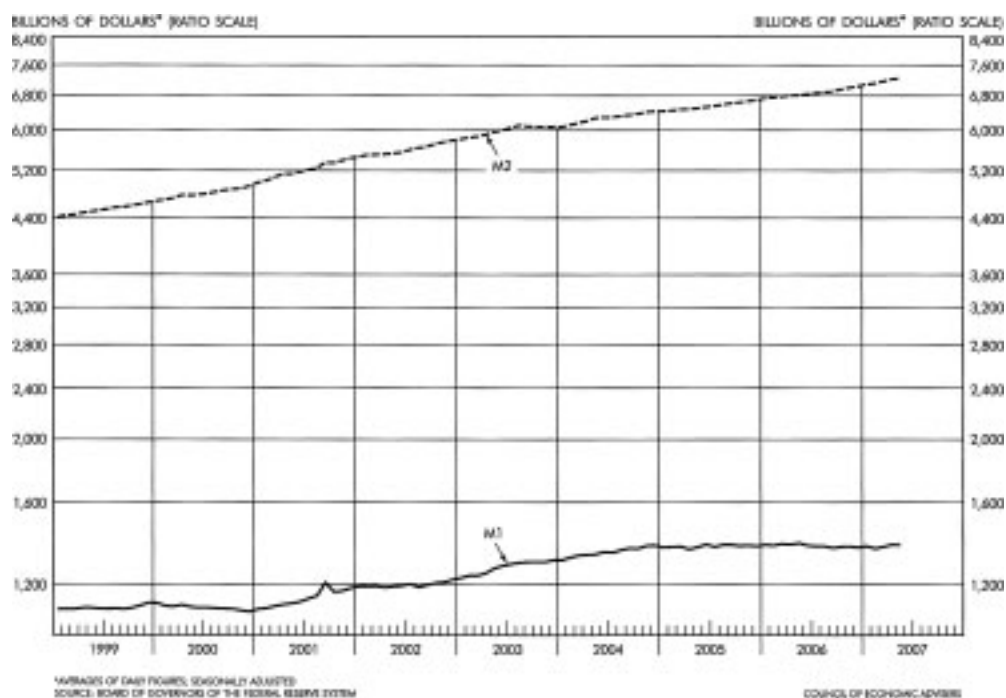

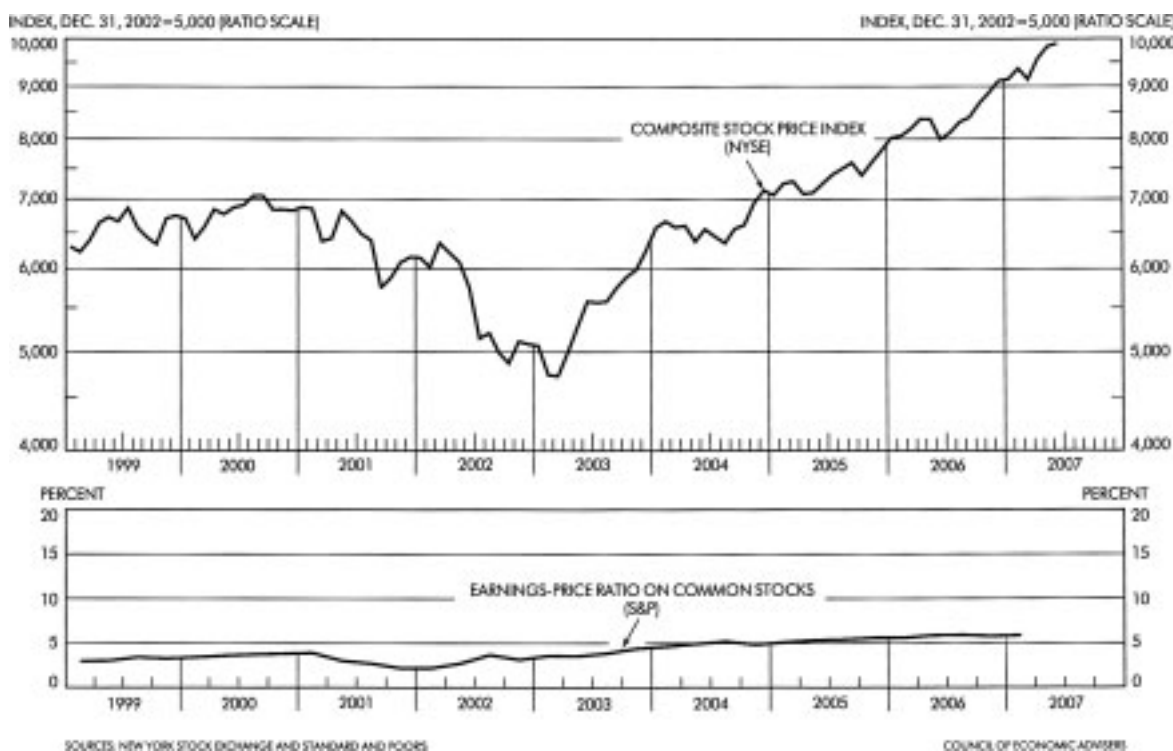

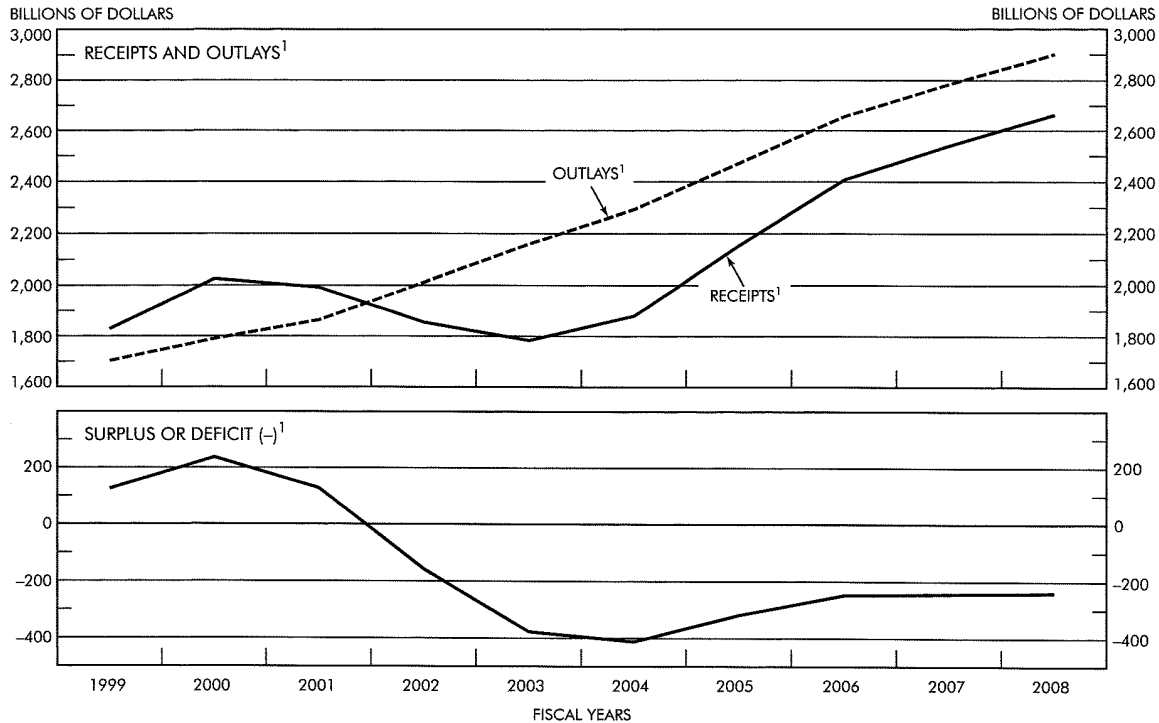

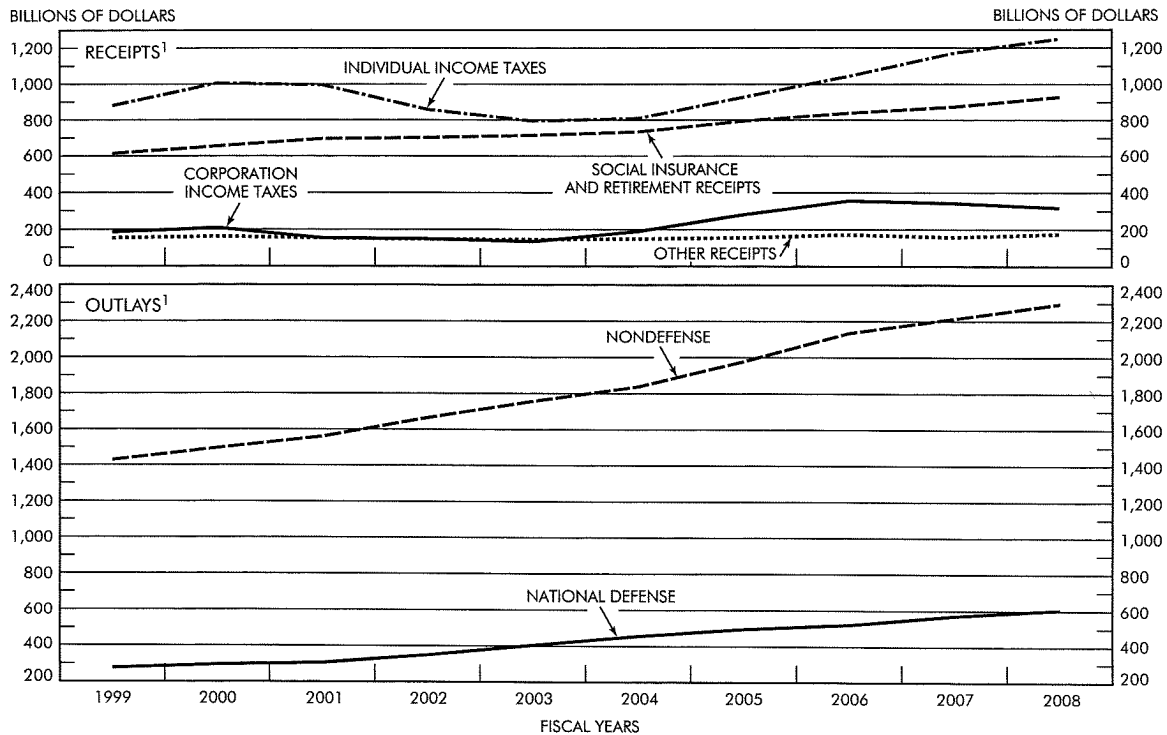

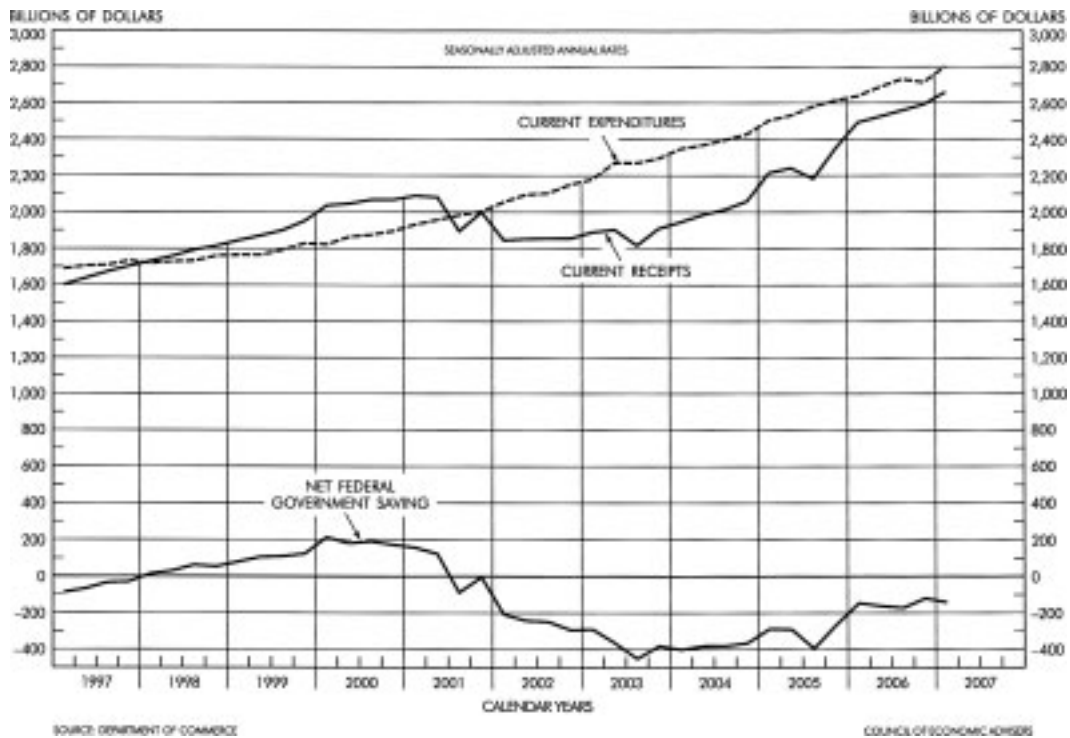

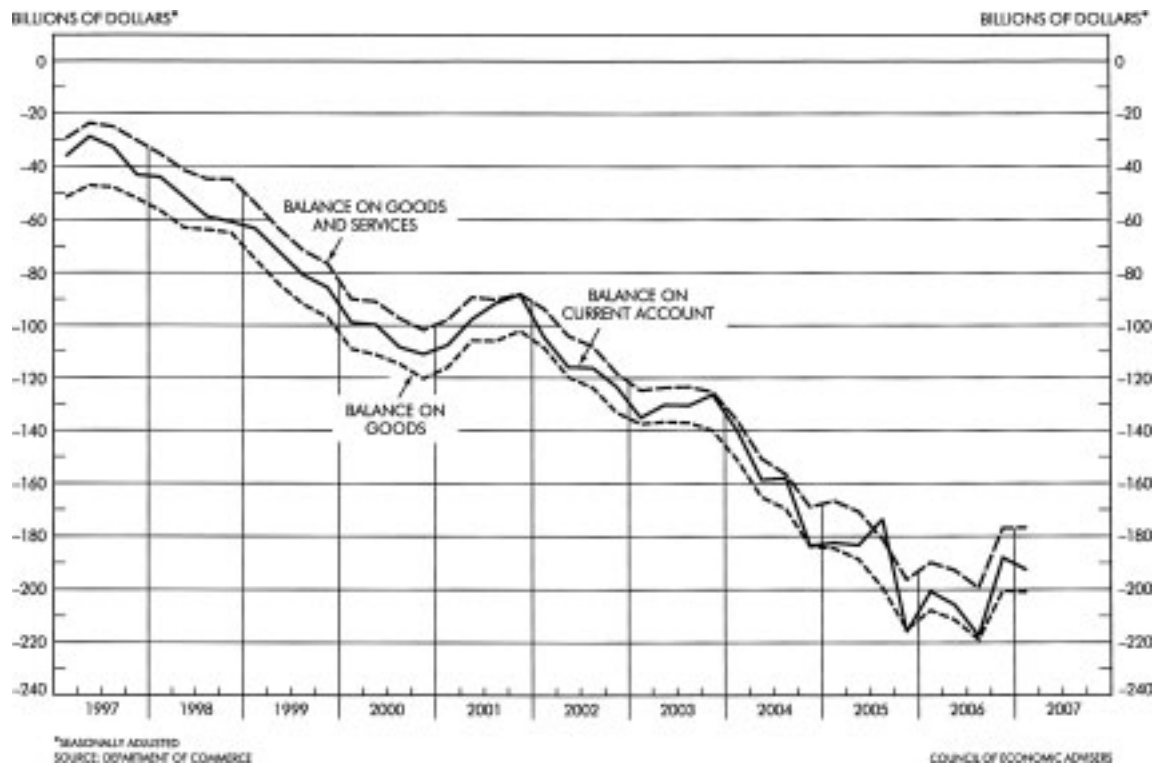

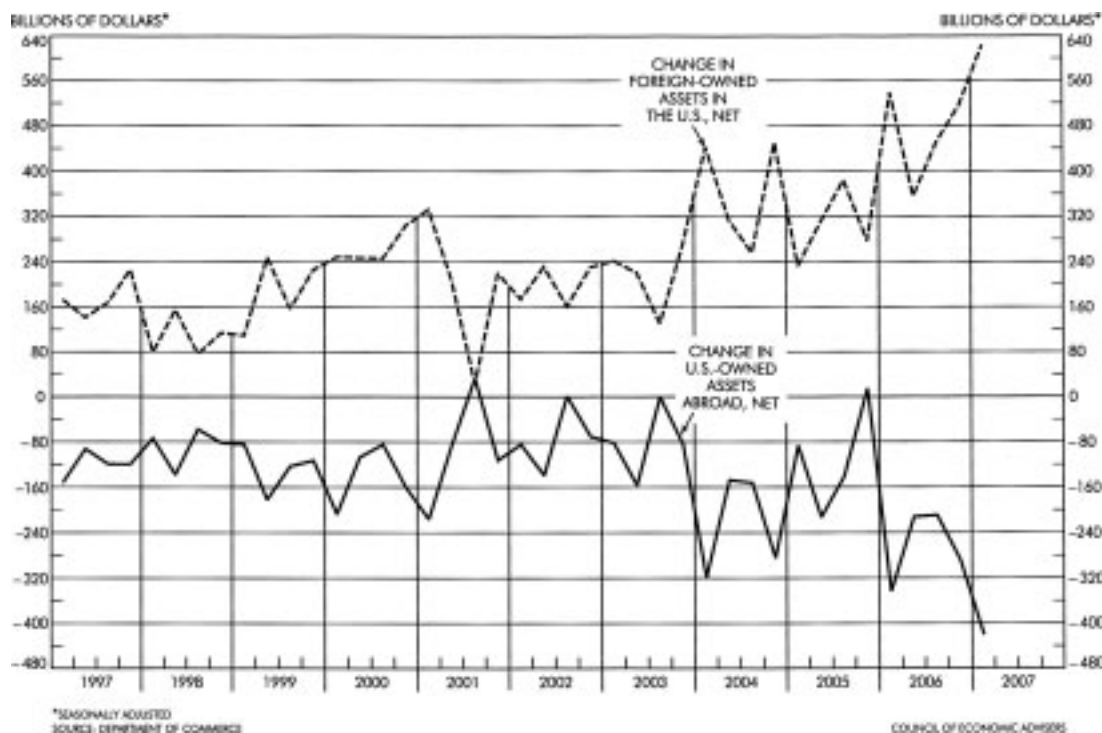

In the financial account, U.S. claims on foreigners reported by U.S. banks increased \$233.0 billion in the first quarter of 2007, following an increase of \$123.9 billion in the fourth quarter. U.S. liabilities to private foreigners reported by U.S. banks, excluding Treasury securities, increased \$203.8 billion in the first quarter, following an increase of \$172.3 billion in the fourth quarter.
