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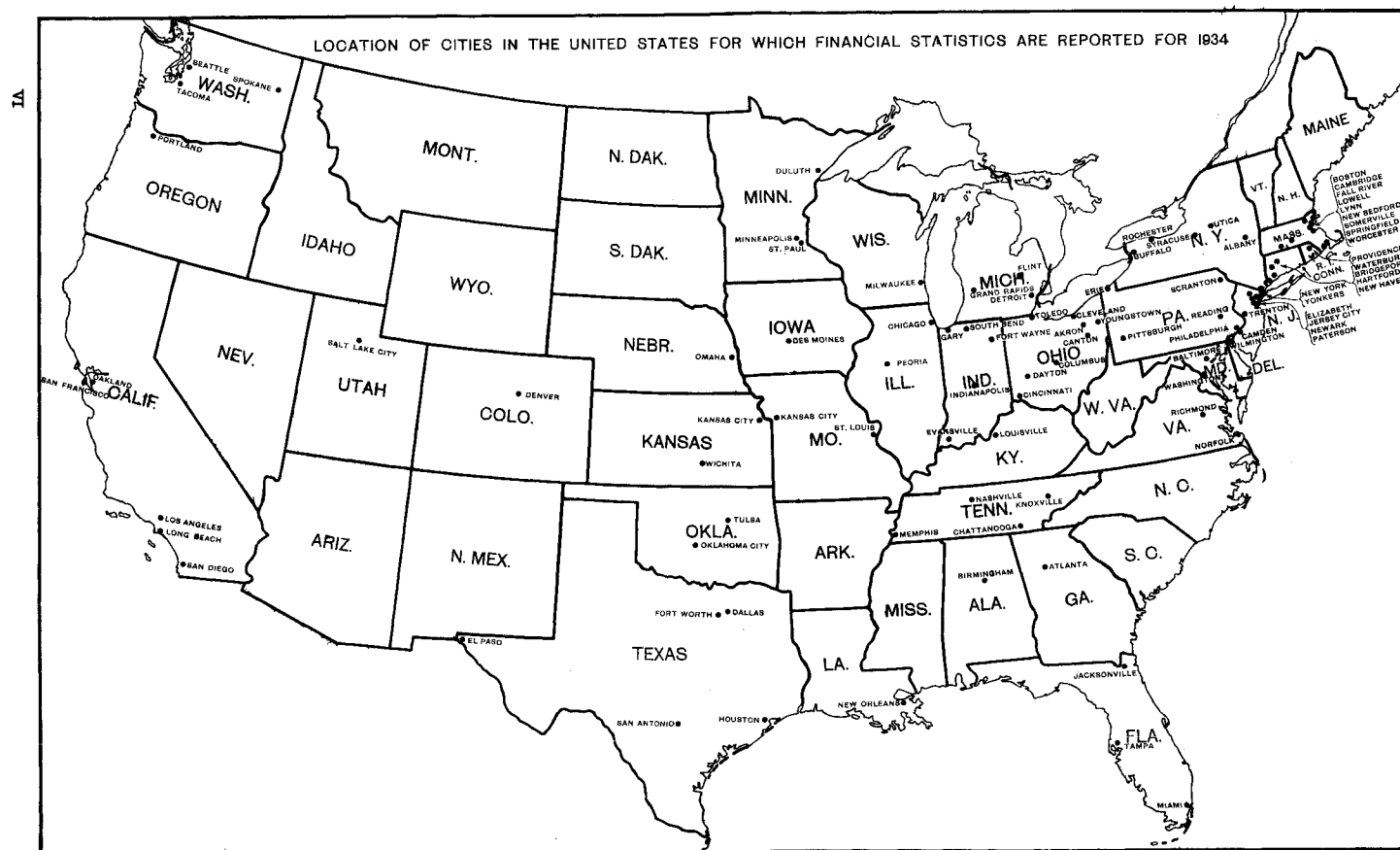
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FINANCIAL STATISTICS OF CITIES HAVING A POPULATION OF OVER 100,000: 1934

INTRODUCTION

SCOPE OF REPORT.--The present report of the Bureau of the Census is practically limited to a presentation of statistics of the financial transactions during the fiscal year 1934 of the 94 cities, each of which had a population of over 100,000, and of the financial condition of those cities at the close of the fiscal year reported. The report also presents financial data relating to the city and county of Honolulu, Hawaii.

The statistics are as accurate and as comparable as it has been feasible to compile from the records of the cities and relate to a number of subjects, the principal of which are (1) the total and per capita receipts from revenues and from the principal classes thereof; (2) the total and per capita payments for expenses, or operation and maintenance, and interest, and total outlays, and totals for each of the principal classes of expenses and outlays; (3) the total value of specified assets; (4) the total and per capita municipal indebtedness; and (5) the total assessed valuation of property subject to the general property tax, and total and per capita levies.

PURPOSE OF REPORT.--The purpose of the reports of this series is to provide information in regard to the financial administration of the cities, in such form as to be comparable, with the hope that it may be of assistance to the officials who are charged with responsibilities incident to the administration of local government and the betterment of the local communities; directly, through personal study of the reports, and, indirectly, through the interpretations and recommendations of practical students of civic affairs and of local civic bodies.

The cities of this class are responsible for the protection of the lives, property, and health of their own inhabitants, constituting almost one-third of the population of the Nation, and of many millions of persons who visit them, as well as for providing educational and recreational services, caring for the indigent, defective, and delinquent classes, and arranging for a constantly growing number of conveniences and services which are demanded by associations interested in the betterment of the several urban communities.

CITIES HAVING A POPULATION OF OVER 100,000 IN 1934.--In the tables of this report, with the exception of table 20, the cities are arranged in the order of their estimated population, and each is given a number corresponding to its position in the table. For convenience in finding the position in the table of the data for each of the cities, there is shown on page VIII a list of the cities arranged alphabetically by States, with the number assigned to each. The location of each of these cities is shown on the map of the United States on page VI.

DESCRIPTION OF GENERAL TABLES

NUMBER AND CHARACTER OF GENERAL TABLES.—The statistics of the 94 incorporated places covered by this report are presented in 20 general tables. Table 1 gives certain statistics relating to population and area. Tables 2 and 3 summarize the revenue receipts and governmental-cost payments by divisions of the city government, and make certain comparisons between those receipts and payments. Table 4 presents per capita averages, and table 5 the percent distribution of the receipts and payments shown in tables 2 and 3. Tables 6 to 10, inclusive, present detailed statistics relating to revenue receipts. Tables 11, 14, 15, and 16 give detailed statistics for governmental-cost payments. Table 12 summarizes certain groups of these payments and presents per capita averages therefor, and table 13 gives the percent distribution of these payments. Table 17 sets forth certain assets of cities. Tables 18 and 19 relate to municipal indebtedness. Table 20 presents statistics of the assessed valuation of property subject to taxation and the amounts and rates of tax levies.

GROUPS OF CITIES.—The statistical data presented in this report are arranged in three principal groups, for each of which, as well as for the entire 94 cities, totals are given. Group I includes cities having a population of 500,000 and over; group II, cities having a population of 300,000 and less than 500,000; and group III, cities having a population of 100,000 and less than 300,000. The grouping is based upon the estimated population of the city as of July 1, 1933, no later estimates having been made, except for Washington, D. C.

TABLE 1

YEAR OF INCORPORATION AS A CITY.—In the column under the heading "year of incorporation as a city" are given for 94 municipalities covered by the report the years in which they were organized as cities.

DATE OF CLOSE OF FISCAL YEAR.—The date shown is the close of the fiscal year of the general treasury of the city corporation, even though independent governmental districts or independently administered funds may have fiscal years which do not coincide with that of the city's general treasury.

POPULATION.—Except as indicated by footnotes, the table shows for each city the estimated population as of July 1, 1933. The estimates shown in the table are computed as follows: The estimated increase in the United States is computed each year upon the available birth, death, immigration, and emigration data. This increase is then distributed to the State according to the percent each State increase, 1920 to 1930, was of the United States increase, 1920 to 1930. Each State increase is then distributed to the counties of that State according to the percent the county increase was of the State increase, and the county increase thus obtained is distributed to the various cities in each county by the same method. Due allowance is made for any annexations or detachments of territory that may have taken place and of which the Bureau has been advised.

In separate columns is shown the population of each city as enumerated at the decennial censuses of 1930, 1920, and 1910.

The number and total population of cities having over 100,000 inhabitants at the middle of the fiscal year 1934 in each of the nine geographic divisions are shown in table I, which follows.

AREA.—The last column of the table shows, for each city, the land area subject to the administration of the city corporation on July 1, 1934.

TABLE 2

DIVISIONS OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT.—The wide diversity of municipal organization is indicated by the number of divisions employed to provide the services usually supplied by local governmental bodies. In many cities all municipal functions are administered by the city corporation, while in others the functions of local government are carried on by two or more governments as independent units, each having the power of taxation, for the purpose for which it was constituted, over all or part of the territory of the city. In all cases there is the city corporation, which is charged with the administration of all municipal functions except those intrusted to independent districts created to provide specific services for the community; the extent of authority in each case being determined by general statutes or charter enactments.

The term "county" appears as the designation of independent governmental units in 18 of the cities of groups I and II, as follows: Chicago, Ill., Detroit, Mich., Los Angeles, Calif., Cleveland, Ohio, Pittsburgh, Pa., Milwaukee, Wis., Buffalo, N. Y., Minneapolis, Minn., Cincinnati, Ohio, Newark, N. J., Kansas City, Mo., Seattle, Wash., Indianapolis, Ind., Rochester, N. Y., Jersey City, N. J., Houston, Tex., Louisville, Ky., and Portland, Oreg. The data shown for these units include percentages of the entire data for the county government. The percent in each case being based upon the ratio between the assessed valuation of the city and that of the entire county. This treatment seems desirable because of the fact that in eight of the cities of these groups, viz, New York, N. Y., Philadelphia, Pa., St. Louis, Mo., Baltimore, Md., Boston, Mass., San Francisco, Calif., Washington, D.C., and New Orleans, La., the original county organization has been merged with that of the city. The addition of the county figures, therefore, places the cities of groups I and II on a more comparable basis than would be secured without such addition. The data for cities of these two groups however, are not comparable with those for cities of group III, with the exception of those for Denver, Colo., a municipality in which the county organization is merged with that of the city. For cities with county receipts and payments, this report presents correct statements of the revenue receipts of each of the divisions of government--city corporation, county, and school or other district--so far as such moneys were received by it, whether the revenues were collected by the divisions for which they were levied or by another division.

SPECIAL TABLES FOR COUNTY CITIES.—In the tables which follow there is a presentation of revenue receipts, payments for operation and maintenance and outlays of general departments, and gross and net debt for the 18 cities which include a percentage of county data. These tables show on a separate line the total and per capita figures for the county.

The total and per capita amounts shown on the line "All other" include those for the government of the city corporation proper, for school, sanitary, park, and other independent districts practically coextensive with the cities, and are comparable with the data presented for cities in group III in the corresponding general tables.

REVENUE RECEIPTS.—Table 2 is designed to present the revenue receipts for each of the 94 municipalities, and for each independent governmental body organized for the purpose of supplying services to these local communities. The governmental units of each city, which have power to levy and collect taxes and to incur indebtedness, are shown under the heading "City, and divisions of municipal government." When the city corporation is the only governmental unit having such power, only one line is devoted to the city, the data of all funds and accounts of the city, whether under the accounting control of the auditor or comptroller or not, being shown on that line. The data for additional governmental units are shown on the line of the descriptive title of the unit. The governmental units shown in the table, with the possible exception of some of the counties, for which parts of the data are included, all exercise municipal functions.

For 33 municipalities the city corporation was the only local governmental unit.

Revenue receipts represent amounts of money or other wealth received by or placed to the credit of local governments for governmental purposes, under such conditions that they increase the assets without increasing the debt liabilities or decrease the debt liabilities without decreasing the assets. The significance of the terms employed in table 2 as designations of the several sources of revenue receipts is set forth in the paragraphs which follow.

GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES.—The general property tax is the common designation of the direct tax upon real property and upon other property when it is apportioned and levied by substantially the same methods as those employed in apportioning and levying taxes upon privately owned real property.

SPECIAL TAXES.—Special taxes are direct taxes which are assessed, levied, and collected by methods that are not generally applied to the case of privately owned real property. They include taxes upon the property of corporations levied upon the basis of the amount of corporate stock, corporate indebtedness, or of both corporate stock and indebtedness, or on any basis other than an assessed valuation applied to all property of the corporation; taxes upon savings banks and kindred corporations, which are levied in proportion to a certain specified portion of the deposits, as their excess above the value of specified investments; and taxes upon life-insurance corporations assessed upon the valuations of their policies. Special taxes also include all taxes levied upon mortgages at the time of their execution or entry of public record; inheritance taxes and taxes on incomes; taxes on investments, bonds and notes for specified periods of time, and on corporation bonds held by residents; and all specific taxes upon property, as taxes upon land at a specified amount per acre, taxes upon horses, mules, and other animals at a specified amount per head, taxes on vessels at a specified amount per registered ton, and taxes upon grain at a specified amount per bushel.

POLL TAXES.—Under the term "Poll taxes" are included all per capita taxes, uniform or graded, whether such taxes are levied as specific amounts against the persons subject thereto or as ad valorem taxes based upon an arbitrary valuation of polls or occupation.

BUSINESS AND NONBUSINESS LICENSE TAXES.—Business taxes are taxes upon business and business activities, exacted, with or without the issue of licenses, from persons natural and corporate in proportion to the volume of their business, or by reason of the business in which they are engaged.

Nonbusiness license taxes are taxes other than upon business that are exacted primarily for purposes of regulation, and are collected in connection with the issues of so-called licenses or permits, and are always levied with reference to measurable or assumed measurable benefits conferred upon or enjoyed by the licensee. They include (1) license taxes on dogs, collected from the owners in connection with the issue of licenses or permits to keep such animals for a specified time; (2) general license taxes, or licenses for nonbusiness purposes, such as licenses to use motor and other vehicles, where the license is not required because of any specific business in which they are to be used; and (3) receipts from departmental permits, other than those issued by public-service enterprises, such as marriage licenses, building permits, and permits to make sewer connections and to dig in the streets.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AND SPECIAL CHARGES.—Special assessments are compulsory contributions levied under the taxing or police power to defray the costs of specific public improvements or public services undertaken primarily in the interest of the public. They differ from the general property tax in that they are apportioned according to the assumed benefits to the property affected by the improvements, or the assumed benefits to individuals or corporations by reason of the services performed. The amounts shown in the table include all amounts received on account of assessments levied to meet such costs for street and sewer construction and maintenance, and for other improvements and services, assessed against the benefited properties or persons.

Special charges differ somewhat from special assessments. Such a charge is made where the cost of a public improvement, the payment for which is classified as an outlay, is made a charge against the benefited person or property, and the amount of the charge is the amount of the actual cost to the city of an improvement, such as the construction of a sidewalk, the charge being made against the beneficiary without any levy against others.

FINES, FORFEITS, AND ESCHEATS.—Fines are amounts of wealth exacted from individuals, firms, and corporations under the sovereign power of inflicting punishment as penalties for violation of law; forfeits are amounts accruing to governments in accordance with the terms of contracts as penalties for nonobservance of such contracts; and escheats are amounts of money or amounts received from the disposal of property the owners of which cannot be ascertained or located.

SUBVENTIONS AND GRANTS, DONATIONS, AND PENSION ASSESSMENTS.—Subventions and grants are amounts contributed by one civil division, as a State or a county, to another to aid in the support of specified functions.

Donations consist of gratuitous contributions received from private persons and corporations, the principal or income of which can be expended for municipal uses, which in most cases are designated by the donor.

Pension assessments are amounts received by or for policemen's, firemen's, teachers', or other pension or retirement funds that are contributed by the city employees as dues, percentages of salaries, or so-called assessments for the establishment or maintenance of such funds.

HIGHWAY PRIVILEGES, RENTS, AND INTEREST.—Highway privilege dues is the designation applied by the Bureau of the Census to amounts received from individuals and corporations enjoying a special privilege of using the streets and alleys of cities in providing public services, such as those furnished by street railways, subways, electric-light, telephone, or water companies, when such receipts are in the nature of compensation for the use of or privilege in the streets and are collected under the terms of the original or a subsequent franchise; also to amounts received for grants of the privilege of maintaining private sewers, drains, and vaults under the street, fruit and other stands, and other property on the sidewalk, and of extending awnings, bay and show windows, and other structures and conveniences, including signs, beyond the building line.

The receipts from rents tabulated in table 2 comprise all amounts received by the various divisions and funds of the government of the city from the rental of real property held principally or wholly for investment purposes.

Table 2 shows the total amount of interest received on revenue account by the general treasuries of the various divisions of the government of the city and by their separate funds, except such amounts as were received as interest on taxes and special assessments, which are tabulated with the receipts from revenues of those two classes.

EARNINGS OF GENERAL DEPARTMENTS.—General departments, as the term is used by the Bureau of the Census, include all departments of administration which have charge of municipal activities, except those charged with the administration of public-service enterprises, such as water-supply systems, electric-light systems, gas-supply systems, and markets. The revenue receipts of general departments are derived from fees, charges, minor sales, and allied sources. The fees and charges here included are those which represent the actual compensation for services performed. They are to be distinguished from receipts which secure for the individuals or corporations making the payments the privilege or right of doing something, such as license fees and permits, which are tabulated as receipts from business and nonbusiness license taxes. These earnings are shown by departments in table 9.

EARNINGS OF PUBLIC-SERVICE ENTERPRISES.—Under the designation "public-service enterprises" the Bureau of the Census includes those enterprises or branches of municipal service which are established and maintained by city governments for the purposes of providing the public, or the public and the city, with some utility or service, such as water, electricity, or gas.

TABLE 3

GOVERNMENTAL-COST PAYMENTS.—Under the general heading "Governmental-cost payments" of table 3 are included all costs of municipal governments, consisting of the costs of the services employed, properties constructed, purchased, or rented, public improvements constructed or otherwise acquired, materials utilized, and interest on borrowed moneys, which are incurred for protecting person, property, and health, providing social necessities and conveniences, caring for the dependent and delinquent classes, and performing other services and carrying on other activities for which those governments have authority. These costs are readily separable into three classes—expenses, or operation and maintenance, interest, and outlays. The governmental-cost payments are shown for the municipality and for each of its independent divisions in the same form as are revenue receipts, as explained in the text for table 2, page 14.

EXPENSES, OR PAYMENTS FOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE.—Municipal expenses, or payments for operation and maintenance, are the costs and losses of cities from which no permanent or subsequently convertible value is received or receivable. They are costs, exclusive of those arising from the construction or acquisition of permanent properties or improvements, which are incurred by cities and their independent divisions of govern-

ment on account of services employed, property rented, and materials utilized in connection with the maintenance and operation of government, and the management of trusts. Table 3 presents these costs separately for general departments and for public-service enterprises.

INTEREST CHARGES.—The term "municipal interest charges" is a designation of interest costs incurred by municipalities for the use of credit capital. All payments on account of such charges are shown in a single column of table 3, but in table 15 are shown the amounts paid on each class of debt.

OUTLAYS.—Municipal outlays are the costs of land and other properties and public improvements, more or less permanent in character, which are owned and used by municipalities in the exercise of their municipal functions or in connection with the business undertakings conducted by them. In the column "For outlays" is shown the aggregate of all payments for the purchase and improvement of land, the erection of new buildings, the installation and extension of water-supply systems, electric-light systems, and other enterprises, the purchase of equipment for the fire department, purchases to increase the collections of libraries, museums, and art galleries, and payments on account of all other acquisitions which add to the number and value of the permanent possessions of the municipality. Payments for outlays for the general departments are shown separately in table 16, as are also those for the principal classes of public-service enterprises.

COMPARISON OF REVENUE RECEIPTS AND ALL GOVERNMENTAL-COST PAYMENTS.—Comparisons between revenue receipts and governmental-cost payments are of the greatest significance in municipal finance. If a city is receiving more from revenue than it is paying for operation, maintenance, interest, and outlays, it has a balance which may be applied to reducing indebtedness, while if its payments for operation, maintenance, interest, and outlays are greater than its revenue receipts, the city is increasing its indebtedness. If it is realizing from revenues enough money to pay for all operating and maintenance costs and interest, but for only a portion of its outlays, it is imposing upon the future a part of the burden of paying for its permanent properties and public improvements.

In the last three columns of table 3 are shown the results of comparisons between revenue receipts and governmental-cost payments. In the first of these columns is shown the excess of governmental-cost payments over revenue receipts for each of the cities in which such payments were in excess of revenue receipts and in the second column is shown the excess of revenue receipts over governmental-cost payments for each of the cities in which revenue receipts were the greater. Of the 94 cities covered by this report, 20 made governmental-cost payments in excess of their revenue receipts and 74 realized enough from revenues to meet all their payments for operation, maintenance, interest, and outlays, and to have a balance available for paying debt.

COMPARISON OF REVENUE RECEIPTS AND PAYMENTS FOR OPERATION, MAINTENANCE, AND INTEREST.—The last column of table 3 shows the excess of revenue receipts over payments for operation, maintenance, and interest. These payments correspond approximately to the costs of a business corporation for maintenance, operating expenses, and interest, except that no allowances have been made for depreciation.

Of the 94 cities, 89 received from revenues amounts in excess of their payments for operation, maintenance, and interest.

NET AND TRANSFER REVENUE RECEIPTS AND GOVERNMENTAL-COST PAYMENTS.—The totals of tables 2 and 3 include both actual receipts and payments, or receipts from and payments to the public, and nominal or transfer receipts and payments, or amounts received by one department, fund, or account, as payments by another.

In table VI the total revenue receipts of table 2 and governmental-cost payments of table 3 are separated into net, or actual, and transfer receipts and payments.

The amounts shown in the preceding table as transfer receipts and payments comprise (1) service transfers, which are amounts paid as costs of operation and maintenance or outlays by one department or enterprise to another from which it receives services or the use of quarters; and (2) interest transfers, which represent payments made by the city corporation or a division of the city to one of its funds on account of interest on municipal securities held by that fund. Of the transfer receipts reported, \$52,676,404 were interest transfers, and \$9,245,486 were service transfers. Of the total transfer payments, \$52,682,092 were interest transfers, and \$9,261,518 were service transfers.

TABLE 4

PER CAPITA REVENUE RECEIPTS AND SPECIFIED GOVERNMENTAL-COST PAYMENTS.—The per capita receipts and payments of table 4 are based on the absolute amounts shown in tables 2 and 3. The most significant figures of the table are those for the three groups of cities arranged according to population. They show that the per capita receipts and payments tend to increase with the size of the cities. The population upon which the per capita amounts are based is the estimated population of the city as of July 1, 1933, no later estimates having been made, except for Washington, D. C.

PERCENT DISTRIBUTION OF REVENUE RECEIPTS AND GOVERNMENTAL-COST PAYMENTS.—Table 5 shows for the several cities and for the three groups of cities the percent which the receipts from each of the classes of revenue constitute of the total revenue receipts

and the percent which the payments for each of the classes of governmental costs—operation and maintenance, interest, and outlays—constitute of the total of such payments, the figures for operation and maintenance being shown under two heads, "Operation and maintenance of general departments" and "Operation and maintenance of public service enterprises." The percentages are in all cases computed upon the basis of the receipts and payments shown in tables 2 and 3.

PROPORTIONAL DISTRIBUTION OF REVENUE RECEIPTS, BY DIVISIONS OF THE GOVERNMENTS OF CITIES.—An examination of table 2 discloses the fact that the proportion of revenues received from property taxes is much greater, as a rule, for city corporations in cities having a single division of government than in those having two or more divisions, while the relative contributions by special assessments are larger in the cities having more than one division of government. Independent divisions of the city government seldom receive revenue from special assessments. The school districts, as a rule, receive a larger proportion of all revenues from subventions than are received by any other division of government. But for 1934 the amounts received as subventions by the city corporations are in excess of those received by the school districts. This is due to the increased grants for unemployment relief.

PERCENT RELATION OF REVENUE RECEIPTS TO GOVERNMENTAL-COST PAYMENTS.—Of the total revenue receipts of the 94 cities covered by this report, 88.8 percent was required for meeting payments for operation and maintenance, 13.0 percent was required for meeting interest payments, and the remainder, 18.2 percent, was available for outlays or other purposes.

The last five columns of table 5 show the percent of governmental-cost payments applied on operation and maintenance of general departments, operation and maintenance of public-service enterprises, interest, and outlays, and the percent of the total governmental costs that were represented by revenue receipts. For 74 of the 94 cities the revenue receipts were greater than the governmental-cost payments, while for the remaining 20 cities the revenues were not sufficient to meet the costs of the year for operation, maintenance, interest, and outlays.

TABLE 6

RECEIPTS FROM THE GENERAL PROPERTY TAX.—The receipts of the several cities from the general property tax is shown on table 6 in three columns. The first column gives the total amount collected in each of the several cities, the second, the amount collected as part of the original levy, and the third, the amount received as penalties and interest on deferred payments.

RECEIPTS FROM SPECIAL TAXES.—In the text for table 2 will be found a discussion of the character of taxes classified as *special*. In table 6 receipts from special taxes are shown under two heads, "Property" and "All other." The amounts received from the different classes of special property taxes are shown in table VII, which follows.

RECEIPTS FROM POLL TAXES.—In some cities poll taxes are assessed at a fixed amount per capita; in others the polls are graded according to the occupation of the individual and are assessed at the rate for the general property tax. All receipts from per capita taxes, whether uniform or graded, are included in the column headed "Poll taxes." Poll taxes amounting to \$2,139,876 were reported in 1934 by 37 of the 94 cities located in 11 States.

RECEIPTS FROM BUSINESS TAXES.—In 1934 the revenue derived from business taxes, exacted with or without the issue of licenses, amounted to \$91,788,516, a relatively small percentage of the total revenues. Of this amount, more than 30 percent was received from alcoholic beverage permits.

RECEIPTS FROM NONBUSINESS LICENSE TAXES.—The receipts from nonbusiness license taxes are tabulated in three columns, the headings of which are fairly descriptive of the classes of revenue included under each.

Some of the cities not reporting receipts from dog taxes collected such taxes for the States, receiving back a portion of the same as subventions, receipts from which are included in table 7. In other cities dogs are assessed as property, and receipts from taxes on dogs are included with general property taxes.

The term "general license taxes" is used to designate the taxes exacted with the granting of all licenses under general statutes or ordinances, other than dog licenses and business licenses. The tax on motor vehicles forms the most important item among receipts of this class.

RECEIPTS FROM SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AND SPECIAL CHARGES.—Receipts from special assessments and special charges constitute but a small portion of revenue receipts for the cities as a whole, but in a few instances they constitute the largest single item of revenue, with the exception of general property taxes. Special assessments and special charges constitute a large item of revenue for the majority of cities.

Special assessments for operation and maintenance were reported for 38 cities and aggregated \$3,740,126.

Special assessments and special charges for outlays were reported by 90 cities, with a total of \$56,876,533. They were collected in the majority of cities for the construction of sewers, paving, curbing, and sidewalks; but in some cities for the grading and widening of streets, the building of retaining walls, bridges, and viaducts, and for park improvements.

RECEIPTS FROM FINES, FORFEITS, AND ESCHEATS.—The text discussion of table 2 presents definitions of these terms. With the exception of receipts from court fines and forfeits, the amount of revenue from these sources is for most cities comparatively small.

TABLE 7

RECEIPTS FROM SUBVENTIONS AND GRANTS.—The total amount received as subventions and grants from other civil divisions was \$329,540,001. Because of increased grants for unemployment relief, subventions for education did not, as in years previous to 1933, constitute the major portion of the amounts received from other civil divisions, the proportion for education being 34.3 percent of the total.

RECEIPTS FROM DONATIONS.—The receipts from donations from private individuals and corporations, given in table 7 are arranged in three classes: Those for (1) operation and maintenance, (2) outlays, and (3) principal of public trust funds.

Receipts for operation and maintenance include donations for the benefit of schools and libraries, parks and other recreational purposes, hospitals and health departments, for charities, and for pensions.

Receipts for outlays represent contributions to the city for the purchase or construction of educational and recreational facilities, of hospital equipment, drinking fountains, and of memorials to heroes.

Receipts for establishing or adding to the principal of public trust funds were reported by numerous cities and were for such purposes as policemen's, firemen's and teachers' retirement, park, school, library, or hospital endowment, and relief of poor.

RECEIPTS FROM PENSION ASSESSMENTS.—Receipts from pension assessments are reported by all but four of the cities and are arranged in four classes, the largest contributions being from school employees.

TABLE 8

RECEIPTS FROM HIGHWAY PRIVILEGES.—Among the receipts from highway privileges are those from steam and street railroads for the privilege of using the streets for the transportation of freight or passengers, and those from electric light and power companies, water, telegraph, and telephone companies, and heat distribution and refrigeration companies for the privilege of placing wires, pipes, poles, and other equipment in, under, over, or across the streets, incident to the conduct of their business of furnishing public utilities. Under this heading are included, also, amounts received by the cities for such privileges as to maintain vaults under the sidewalk, to use portions of the street for storing building materials, and to extend awnings or show windows beyond the building line.

RECEIPTS FROM RENTS OF INVESTMENT PROPERTIES.—The receipts from rents tabulated in table 8 comprise all amounts collected as compensation for the use of lands or other property not employed for general departmental purposes. These receipts are separated into three classes—those from the properties of sinking funds, public trust funds, and those from all other properties.

RECEIPTS FROM INTEREST.—Table 8 includes all interest receipts of the general treasury and of the separate funds of the cities covered by this report except (1) receipts of interest on taxes and special assessments, and (2) receipts of accrued interest on original loans.

The first column of the interest section of table 8 shows the total revenue receipts from interest; that is, the total receipts from interest, less receipts in error later corrected by refund payments, and accrued interest on original sales of debt obligations. These revenue receipts are arranged in four groups—those received by sinking funds, by public trust funds, by investment funds, and from investments, and those received on current deposits. With the interest here tabulated are the receipts of sinking funds, public trust funds, and investment funds that were paid by the divisions of the city government to these funds as interest on their debt obligations held as investments. The aggregate of such interest transfer receipts was \$52,676,404, of which \$26,042,446, or 49.4 percent, was reported by New York, N. Y. If this aggregate be deducted from the total interest receipts there remains \$14,343,894 which is the actual interest, or that received from the public by the 94 cities in 1934.

TABLE 9

CHARACTER OF RECEIPTS TABULATED AS FROM GENERAL DEPARTMENTAL EARNINGS.—American municipalities realize considerable amounts of revenue from fees, charges, rents, sales, and allied sources. The revenues from these sources are what economists call *contractual* as distinguished from *compulsory* revenues, tabulated in tables 2 and 3 as taxes, special assessments, and fines. They involve the exchange of equivalents by which cities receive cash in return for a benefit granted in the form of service, rents, or objects sold.

The receipts of the general departments from *fees* and *charges* include all amounts received by the cities as compensation for services rendered to the payers by the

general departments of the cities, whether the services were clerical in character, the compensation for which is called "fee", or were other than clerical the compensation for which is called a "charge."

As receipts from *rents* there are included in table 9 only amounts received for the use of real property employed principally for departmental uses.

As receipts from *sales* there are included receipts from the sale of discarded equipment and materials where the payments for replacement and renewal are classified as for maintenance. Similar sales on outlay account are classified as nonrevenue receipts.

Certain receipts from sources other than those above described are classed as departmental, the principal item being amounts received as insurance to cover losses by fire in cases where the repair of fire damages is charged to maintenance. Receipts from insurance where the repair of damages is charged to outlay are classified as offsets to outlays, or nonrevenue receipts.

CLASSIFICATION OF GENERAL DEPARTMENTAL RECEIPTS.—The total amount of receipts from fees, charges, rents, sales, and allied sources is shown in this report, and also its distribution to the divisions of government by which the services were rendered. These divisions correspond to the classification employed in tabulating the general departmental payments for operation and maintenance, and outlays, as given in tables 11 and 16.

TABLE 10

PUBLIC-SERVICE ENTERPRISES.—In the text of table 2 will be found a definition of the term *public-service enterprise* as used by the Bureau of the Census.

The statistics of municipally operated public-service enterprises are for most cities defective because of the fact that their accounts are not completely segregated, and the enterprises are not credited with all the revenues arising from their activities nor debited with all the payments chargeable to them. For example, they may not be credited with the interest earned on their funds on current deposit nor charged with the interest on their bonds. And in many cases they are not credited for utilities furnished or services rendered by them to the various departments and to other public-utility enterprises of the city.

RECEIPTS OF PUBLIC-SERVICE ENTERPRISES.—The receipts shown in table 10 for the different classes of public-service enterprises include all revenue receipts of these enterprises recorded in the city books, with the exception of interest on current deposits.

The amounts reported in the column headed "All other" were received principally from ferries, toll bridges, street railways, gas-supply systems, radio stations, harbor towage and pilotage, land development, and farms.

TABLE 11

PAYMENTS FOR EXPENSES, OR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, OF GENERAL DEPARTMENTS.—In table 11 are presented statistics showing payments for the operation and maintenance of the various cities during 1934 for objects or purposes other than the operation and maintenance of public-service enterprises, which are classified by the Bureau of the Census as *expenses* of general departments. Such payments constitute by far the most important class of payments for the costs of municipal governments, comprising 69.2 percent of the total payments for governmental costs, as shown in table 5. They are given in table 11 in sufficient detail to show the relative expenses of the several departments and branches of work in each city and to provide data for comparing the expense payments for a given object in one city with the corresponding payments in other cities.

These payments are arranged in nine general groups or divisions to each of which is given a specific designation, and the payments recorded in each of these divisions are subdivided according to specific purpose. In making comparisons of the data for individual cities from table 11 it should be noted that while the payments shown for the main groups of departments or divisions are fairly accurate, and hence comparable, those for some of the individual objects of expenditure are less exact. For example, a large number of cities made payments in 1934 for checking the spread of tuberculosis and for the care of patients suffering from that disease. An effort was made to include all payments of this class among those of the health department as part of the total payments for the prevention and cure of communicable diseases. For most cities all of these payments are tabulated as for the health department, but in several cases some of them are included with payments for outdoor poor relief and for hospitals.

IMPERFECT STATEMENTS OF EXPENSES, OR PAYMENTS FOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE.—In the last column of several of the divisions of table 11 are tabulated payments that could not be distributed to any one of the more specific columns of the division, owing to imperfect local accounts.

PAYMENTS CLASSIFIED AS MISCELLANEOUS.—In most instances the column headings of this division reveal clearly the nature of the payments tabulated under each. Under the heading "Unclassified" are tabulated those payments that are not assignable to any specific classification of any of the divisions. The amounts included in the column "Undistributed" are, with few exceptions, those which with perfect accounting for statistical reports would be distributed to the various other columns of the table. The amounts so tabulated represent (1) undistributed payments for incidental operating plants which are sometimes referred to as municipal service enterprises, such as electric-light plants, heating plants, and garages; and (2) incidental operating plants not classified as municipal-service enterprises, and such other payments for accounts with departments of supplies, purchasing agent, insurance, printing, advertising, and similar accounts as cannot be distributed.

EXCEPTIONAL PAYMENTS BY MASSACHUSETTS CITIES.—The State of Massachusetts has established for the benefit of a number of cities and towns certain metropolitan districts in and about Boston for the purchase and improvement of parks and for the construction and maintenance of sewers and waterworks. The cities and towns benefited are charged with the costs of maintaining the properties and public improvements acquired, including the interest on loans made by the State for the original outlays, and are required to make contributions to the State sinking fund for the redemption of the debt incurred by the State for their benefit. Other payments to the Commonwealth of the same general nature are those for the abolition of grade crossings.

TABLE 12

PAYMENTS FOR EXPENSES, OR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, OF THE PRINCIPAL GENERAL DEPARTMENTS—TOTAL AND PER CAPITA.—In table 12 are presented the governmental-cost payments, total and per capita, for operation and maintenance of all departments other than public-service enterprises, arranged in most cases according to nine main groups of municipal departments, offices, and accounts, but in a few cases showing separately the payments for the more important individual departments, such as police and fire departments and schools.

PAYMENTS FOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE INCREASING WITH POPULATION OF CITIES.—Group I shows the highest per capita figures for all payments included in the table, groups II and III following in the order named. The figures for individual cities of the different groups show striking variations because of the factors other than population which influence operation and maintenance payments.

The per capita payments for general governmental operation and maintenance in cities of group I and II are larger than they otherwise would be because of the fact that New York, N. Y., Philadelphia, Pa., St. Louis, Mo., Baltimore, Md., Boston, Mass., San Francisco, Calif., Washington, D. C., and New Orleans, La., exercise all the executive and judicial functions usually possessed by counties. To secure comparability between the payments for all general governmental functions in these cities and in other cities of groups I and II which exercise no county functions, certain percentages of the payments for operation and maintenance of county governments of the other cities of groups I and II are combined with the city payments, as has been explained in the discussion of table 2, page 2.

TABLE 13

PERCENT DISTRIBUTION OF PAYMENTS FOR EXPENSES, OR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, OF THE PRINCIPAL GENERAL DEPARTMENTS, BY OBJECT OF PAYMENT.—Table 13 shows, by principal divisions of the general departmental service, the percent distribution of the payments for expenses, or operation and maintenance, other than those for public-service enterprises. This distribution represents broadly the relative importance of the principal classes of payments for the several cities and groups of cities.

For nearly all cities a larger percentage was reported for schools than for any other purpose shown in the table. Although the per capita payments for schools, as shown in table 12, increase with the size of cities, they do not increase as rapidly as other per capita expenses; hence the percentages represented by payments for schools, as given in table 13, are greater for the cities of group III than for those of group I.

TABLE 14

PAYMENTS FOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC-SERVICE ENTERPRISES.—The nature of these enterprises has been explained in the text discussion of table 2.

The water-supply system is the most important public-service enterprise operated by American cities. Of the 94 municipalities included in this report 84 reported water-supply systems, and the payments for operating them amounted to \$61,558,193. The revenue receipts for these enterprises, as disclosed in table 10, was \$170,440,054, or more than double the operating costs.

A number of Massachusetts cities in the vicinity of and including Boston obtain water for their respective systems from the metropolitan water system, which is operated by the State, all costs of construction, extension, and maintenance being annually apportioned by the State among the various cities and towns benefited.

TABLE 15

PAYMENTS FOR INTEREST ON CITY DEBTS.—The interest payments of table 15 are classified as payments for interest on (1) funded and floating debt, (2) special assessment loans, and (3) other debt, including revenue loans and miscellaneous debt obligations. They are all exclusive of payments made in error and later repaid to the city and of payments of interest which balance amounts previously received as accrued interest on the original issue of city debt obligations.

The amounts included in this table in the column headed "All other" and "Other divisions" are given in detail for the various divisions of the city governments in the column headed "Interest" in table 3. Of the total amount of interest payments, 83.6 percent was reported for city corporations, 7.2 percent for independent school districts and 9.2 percent for other independent divisions, including certain counties in groups I and II.

The aggregate of all interest payments was \$352,886,046. Of this amount, \$52,682,092 or 14.9 percent, represents transfers or amounts of money paid by the various divisions of the governments of the cities as interest on city securities held by the sinking funds, investment funds, and public trust funds.

From the classification of interest according to the kind of debt obligation on which paid, it appears that 88.0 percent of the total interest payments was on funded and floating debt, 4.2 percent on special assessment loans, and 7.7 percent on revenue loans and miscellaneous debt obligations.

The interest on special assessment loans is seldom paid from collections of property taxes or similar revenues, but from special assessments, such assessments being collected in a number of annual or semiannual installments, each one of which includes an amount for meeting the interest on the bonds for the amortization of which the installment is collected.

EXCEPTIONAL PAYMENTS FOR INTEREST BY MASSACHUSETTS CITIES. — In the discussion of table 11 attention is called to certain payments by Massachusetts cities to the Commonwealth for the maintenance of sewer, park, and water-supply systems that have been constructed for the benefit of the city of Boston and the adjoining municipalities, and the further payments to the State to reimburse it for payments of interest on loans which were made to finance the construction or acquisition of the systems. Similar payments of interest are made to the State on the advances made by it in financing the cost of changes required for the abolition of grade crossings, and such interest payments are included in table 15 on the lines for the several cities.

TABLE 16

PAYMENTS FOR OUTLAYS.—The payments for outlays presented in table 16 comprise the amounts paid by the several cities for the acquisition and construction of more or less permanent properties and public improvements, including payments for additions made to those previously acquired or constructed, but exclusive of payments in error and of payments offset by receipts from the public on outlay account, the most important of which are derived from sales of real property and from insurance adjustments. These excluded payments and the counterbalancing receipts are classified as non-governmental-cost payments and nonrevenue receipts.

The governmental-cost payments for outlays of the 94 cities reported amounted to \$304,404,746. The increase in net debt, as shown in table 18, was \$22,230,985. The governmental-cost payments for outlays, therefore, exceeded the increase in net debt by \$282,173,761.

This shows that for the 94 cities as a whole the increase in net debt during the year amounted to 7.3 percent of the governmental-cost payments for new properties and public improvements. Comparisons made in years prior to 1925 were based on increase in gross debt.

TABLE 17

AMOUNT OF SPECIFIED ASSETS AT CLOSE OF YEAR.—Table 17 shows, for each city, the assets at the close of the year reported of the sinking, public trust, and investment funds as recorded in the books of the several divisions of the government of the municipality, whether the funds were administered by the principal financial officer or by separate boards or commissions; it shows, also, the cash held by the general administrative funds at the close of the year. All cash on hand at the close of the year except that which was held in private trust funds is shown in the four columns. The data for real property and securities are shown only in table 17. The valuation shown

for the investments of the funds are the book values. The figures for real property may represent its cost to the fund or its valuation at a recent appraisal. The data for securities are usually carried on the records of the fund at their face value, profits and losses being recorded only when the securities are disposed of; but if for any city they were reported at cost or at their market value on the last day of the fiscal year, those valuations were used in compiling the table.

ASSETS IN SINKING FUNDS.— The sinking funds maintained by cities and their independent divisions are of two distinct classes, those with and those without investments, the distinction depending largely upon the method of distributing the loads to be carried by these funds. The sinking funds with investments are established and maintained primarily for the redemption of long-term bonds at maturity, the purpose of converting a part of the cash accumulation into securities being to augment the income of the funds by the amount of the excess of the interest on the securities purchased over the amount that would be secured on ordinary bank deposits to the amount equaling the purchase price of the securities. The sinking funds without securities are maintained primarily for the amortization of debt obligations by purchase before their maturity, or for the redemption of serial or other bonds maturing in practically equal amounts each year, the purposes of the funds usually being accomplished without the accumulation of assets in large amounts.

ASSETS IN PUBLIC TRUST FUNDS.— Public trust funds are established by cities and their independent divisions for the purpose of conserving and administering moneys and other forms of wealth that come to them by donation, bequest, or otherwise, under such conditions that the recipient becomes a trustee charged with the administration of the fund and with disbursements from it or from income derived from its principal for designated public uses. The usual purposes for which these funds are created are the support of educational activities in schools and libraries, of health and hospital services, care of the poor, and pensions for employees of the cities and their independent divisions. Table 17 shows the amount of the assets of these funds under three heads—"Cash", "City securities", and "Other investments."

ASSETS IN INVESTMENT FUNDS, AND MISCELLANEOUS INVESTMENTS.—Under the heading "Assets in investment funds, and miscellaneous investments" are shown all assets of funds other than sinking and trust funds and all interest-bearing securities and investments other than those of the funds mentioned, including real property used for purposes other than those of the departments and enterprises of the cities and their independent divisions. Although the term "investment fund" is seldom employed by city officials, it seems to be an appropriate designation for funds of the class here described. The value of real property incidentally acquired and yielding little or no income is included as miscellaneous investment. In some instances the assets in investment funds consist of bonds or stocks acquired by the city in consideration of financial aid or grants to railroads or other public-service corporations; in a few instances they consist of real property held for securing rents or for the profits that may result from an increase in value; in other cases they consist of bonds or mortgages received in exchange for real property and held as investments awaiting maturity or a favorable market.

In most cities reporting investment funds or investments the invested assets are comparatively small, and in some instances they are held only temporarily while awaiting a favorable opportunity for the city to dispose of them, when the proceeds are to be turned over to the general treasury. In some cities permanent funds have been established to enable the cities to carry their own fire risks on municipal buildings, an amount equal to the premiums usually charged by insurance companies being set aside each year for the creation of a fund from which fire losses may be paid as they occur. Some of these insurance funds are built up by the annual appropriation of considerable sums until the assets reach a prescribed amount. Such funds are usually invested in profitable securities and are here classed as investment funds. Funds provided for the purchase, construction, or equipment of buildings or other permanent properties of the municipality which are invested during the period of accumulation are also treated as investment funds. Table 17 shows the amount of assets of all such funds as are described above, including those of the city corporation and those of all independent divisions of government which constitute parts of the governing organizations of the municipalities.

CASH IN GENERAL TREASURY AND GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDS.— General administrative funds, as the term is here used, are all funds administered by the city and its independent divisions of government, except the sinking, public trust, investment, and private trust funds. The cash shown in table 17 as belonging to the general treasury and general administrative funds at the close of the year is presented in two columns, so as to show separately the amounts held in private trust accounts.

The cash and other assets belonging to private trust funds are omitted from this presentation of the assets of municipalities for the reason that the obligations on private trust accounts, of which these assets constitute a part, are no longer included in table 18 as an item in the gross debt of the cities.

TABLE 18

GROSS AND NET INDEBTEDNESS OF CITIES.— Table 18 shows both the gross and net indebtedness at the close of the year reported for all cities of over 100,000 population. The term "gross indebtedness" is here used as the designation of the aggregate of all outstanding debt obligations, and the term "net indebtedness" is used as the designation of the total of the amounts representing the funded and floating debt, less the assets of sinking funds accumulated for their amortization. Sinking-fund assets accumulated for the amortization of special-assessment debt, where they could be identified as such, were excluded from the calculation.

INDEBTEDNESS CLASSIFIED BY GOVERNMENTAL UNIT BY WHICH INCURRED. — The table shows separately the gross debt of the city corporations and of the independent school districts, while the total debt of other governmental units is shown in a single column. Included in the data appearing in the column headed "Other governmental units of city" are parts of the debts of the counties in which certain cities of groups I and II are located. The object sought to be attained by their inclusion is stated in the text for table 2. There is included, also, the debt or a percentage of the debt of such other independent divisions of municipal government as park, sanitary, port, water, and improvement districts.

INDEBTEDNESS CLASSIFIED BY CHARACTER OF OUTSTANDING DEBT OBLIGATION.— The indebtedness of the municipalities is classified by character of obligation under four principal headings: "Funded or fixed", "Floating", "Special assessment bonds and certificates", and "Current." Current indebtedness is classified under two subheadings: "Revenue bonds and notes" and "Warrants."

In years previous to 1925 current debt carried a third subheading, "Obligations on trust account." But inasmuch as but few cities recognize these obligations as part of their indebtedness, such amounts are no longer included in the totals of gross debt. And, as has been noted in the text discussion of table 17, the assets belonging to private trust funds, which are an offset to obligations on private trust account, have been eliminated from the statement of the assets of the cities. The kinds of debt included under each of the major headings are described in the paragraphs which follow.

FUNDED OR FIXED INDEBTEDNESS.— Funded or fixed debt includes all debts evidenced by formal instruments which have a number of years to run and for the amortization of which no assets other than those of sinking funds have as yet been specifically authorized or appropriated. The debts of this class are called corporation stock, bonds, certificates, serial notes, serial bonds, and mortgages.

FLOATING INDEBTEDNESS.—Floating debt includes (1) all debts evidenced by revenue bonds, warrants, and accounts payable, to be redeemed from the levies of a succeeding year; (2) all debts evidenced by short-term bonds to be redeemed from the proceeds of long-term obligations; (3) all final judgments against the city, outstanding at the close of the year; and (4) all indebtedness to public trust funds and private trust funds due to the conversion to general public uses of all or a part of the money or other property received for creating public trust funds or permanent private trust funds, where the city assumes the annual payment of interest on the amounts so converted without issuing to the funds its formal bonds or certificates of indebtedness.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT INDEBTEDNESS.— Special-assessment loans include all so-called bonds, certificates, and other short-term obligations issued or incurred with the understanding that they are to be paid wholly or in part from the proceeds of special assessments.

CURRENT INDEBTEDNESS.— Under the general term "current" are included the debts of all kinds except those described above as funded, floating, and special assessment. They are shown in the table under the two heads described below.

REVENUE BONDS AND NOTES.— Revenue loans include all interest-bearing short-term obligations, other than so-called serial bonds, that have a fixed date of redemption or are made payable at a date in the discretion of the city from the proceeds of a levy made, or to be made, in the year of their issue. These obligations are popularly known as revenue bonds, revenue loans, anticipation tax loans, anticipation tax warrants, temporary loans, and interest-bearing warrants. Overdrafts upon banks by the various divisions and funds of the city are classified as revenue loans.

WARRANTS.—Under the heading "Warrants" are tabulated all noninterest-bearing warrants, orders, and audits in the nature of warrants outstanding at the close of the year, except those specifically called tax warrants or anticipation tax warrants.

INDEBTEDNESS CLASSIFIED BY CREDITOR.— Under this general heading the total gross debt included in table 18 is separated into two classes, that which was owing (1) to the public, and (2) to city funds with investments. In the column headed "City funds with investments" is included the par value of all city securities held by sinking, public trust, and investment funds. Of the total debt, \$1,384,625,191, or 16.3 percent,

Bonds issued under such terms as local improvement, street improvement, and general improvement have, so far as possible, been tabulated under the more descriptive headings of the table, and only when such tabulation was impossible have they been tabulated as for "combined or unreported purposes."

Issues of bonds described as "refunding" or "funding" have been classified according to the purpose of the original or replaced loan, if these purposes could be discovered without a too extended search of the earlier records. Whenever the purpose of the original issues was not disclosed the amounts of refunding and funding bonds have been tabulated as for "combined or unreported purposes."

The amounts shown in the column "Refunding" are an exhibit of obligations issued to redeem funded debt obligations and those in the column "Funding" are an exhibit of obligations issued to redeem judgments, revenue loans, warrants, and other temporary obligations.

TABLE 20

ASSESSED VALUATION OF PROPERTY.— The valuations given in table 20 are those of property which is subject to the general property tax for the uses of the divisions of the governments of the cities covered by this report and of property within these cities that is subject to taxation for uses of the State, county, and minor civil divisions. In certain cities the city valuations differ somewhat from the valuations on which State and county taxes are levied. This difference results largely from the fact that certain classes of property, especially property of corporations, are in certain States subject to State and county taxation, but the valuation of such property does not appear in the report of property taxed for city purposes. In some instances the assessed valuation of an independent division of the government of a city, such as a school, or park district, differs from that of the city corporation. These differences are due to (1) difference in the areas of the city corporation and the independent division, the independent divisions in certain cities including territory outside the city limits, while in others they include only a portion of the territory within the cities; or (2) different bases of assessment, where the city makes an assessment of property for its own levy, while the independent district through its own board of assessors makes an independent assessment of the same property.

In examining the figures of table 20 relating to assessed valuations it should be noted that those on a line designated as for city, State, county, or other civil divisions represent the assessed valuation of the property within the territory included in the jurisdiction of the city corporation, and which is subject to taxation for the maintenance of that corporation. The figures on a line for one of the divisions of the government of a city represent the assessed valuation of the property located within the limits of a city corporation subject to taxation for the maintenance of such division, as appraised at the assessment made for the purpose of such division, whether it is the same as or different from that made for city corporation purposes.

The table gives separately for the city corporation and each independent taxing division the valuation of all property in the division subject to the general property tax. (Definitions of the general property tax and special property taxes are given in the text for table 2.)

The classification of property belonging to railroads, telegraph companies, and a number of similar corporations varies in the different States. In some States such properties are classified as real, in some as personal, in others as both real and personal, and in still others they are given a separate classification. Where such property is given a separate classification and is taxed for city purposes the valuation given it is shown in the table under the heading "Other property", under which heading are also tabulated those property and franchise valuations of corporations for which the details secured were insufficient for a more complete tabulation.

TOTAL AND PER CAPITA TAX LEVIES.— The amounts given in the last column under the general heading "Levy" on the lines for the several divisions of the government show for the individual cities and for the groups of cities the total and per capita levies of the general property tax. These per capita figures furnish a fairly comparable measure of the tax burden resting upon the inhabitants of the various cities here reported and should be considered in connection with the other per capita figures of this report given in tables 4, 12, and 18.

It will be observed that for the cities of California, Delaware, Illinois, Ohio, Oklahoma, and Pennsylvania there is no line shown for "Government of State." In these six States there was no levy of the general property tax for State purposes.

TAX RATES.— The rates of levy for the general property tax per \$1,000 of assessed valuation are given for each of the several divisions and independent subdivisions of government.

In the case of cities in which taxes are levied at two or more rates in different divisions of the city or on different classes of property in the same division of government, the figures shown in table 20 for the city as a whole represent average rates based on the total levy and the total assessed valuation of property within the corporation, the specific rates of levy for the various divisions of the government or classes of property of such cities being given in table IX.

was held by the three classes of funds mentioned. In the column headed "The public" is included the par value of all other city debt obligations outstanding.

INDEBTEDNESS CLASSIFIED BY PURPOSE FOR WHICH INCURRED.— A third classification of table 18 segregates debt obligations of cities into debts incurred for (1) the purposes of general departments and municipal service enterprises, and (2) the purposes of public service enterprises and investments. The revenues derived by most cities from public service enterprises and investments are sufficient to meet the interest accruing on debts of this class. These debts, as a rule, do not rest as burdens upon the general taxpayers, but are paid from revenues derived from those specially benefited.

INCREASE DURING THE YEAR IN TWO CLASSES OF DEBT AND IN SINKING-FUND ASSETS.— Under the general title "Increase during the year in—" there are given under descriptive headings the increase in (1) the total funded and floating debt, (2) the sinking-fund assets, and (3) the net debt. Of the 94 cities covered by this report, 50 showed decreases during the year in net debt, but the aggregate increase in net debt for the year was \$22,230,985.

PER CAPITA INDEBTEDNESS.— In the columns headed "Per capita" there are given the per capita of (1) the total gross debt, (2) the gross debt incurred for general departments and municipal service enterprises, (3) the gross debt incurred for public service enterprises and investments, and (4) the net debt. The figures given in the column referred to under (1) are, in the case of each city, the sum of those given in the columns referred to under (2) and (3). No segregation of net indebtedness corresponding to that given of gross indebtedness was practicable.

The terms "net indebtedness" and "net debt" as here used differ materially from the use of the terms in some of the preceding reports for cities having a population of over 30,000. In the reports for the years 1902 to 1908, inclusive, the Bureau of the Census applied the term "net debt" to the total outstanding obligation of cities, less the amount of sinking-fund assets. The net debt so computed seldom represented the actual net debt because the computation did not take account of the assets of cities provided for the redemption of current debt, which for those years included special-assessment bonds and certificates, revenue bonds and notes, warrants and trust liabilities.

Recognizing this fact, the Bureau of the Census in its report for fiscal years subsequent to 1908 applied the terms "net funded and floating debt", "net indebtedness", and "net debt" to the difference between the gross funded and floating debt and those sinking-fund assets which had been specifically provided for the amortization of such debt. In computing the net indebtedness for the years 1912 and 1913, the total sinking-fund assets were deducted from the gross funded and floating debt, but for all years other than those noted above such assets of sinking funds as were provided for the amortization of special-assessment debt were excluded from the calculation.

INCREASE OF INDEBTEDNESS WITH SIZE OF CITIES.— The per capita figures of table 18 for the three groups of cities, classified according to population, are reproduced in the statement which follows:

TABLE 19

FUNDED, FLOATING, AND SPECIAL-ASSESSMENT INDEBTEDNESS, CLASSIFIED BY PURPOSE FOR WHICH INCURRED.— Table 19 presents a summary of that portion of the total city indebtedness to which, in the text description of table 18, has been given the designation "funded and floating debt", and "special-assessment bonds and certificates", classified according to the reported purpose for which the outstanding obligations were issued.

The classification for many cities is more or less imperfect, owing to the methods of recording debt in the financial books of those cities. The classes of debt obligations by purpose for which issued that are most accurately shown for all cities are those for the water-supply and lighting systems.

CITIES WITH TWO OR MORE TAX RATES.—In the majority of cities all sections and all property subject to the general property tax are taxed at the same rate. In a number of cities, however, this tax is levied at different rates, either in different sections or upon different classes of property. So far as the data collected were sufficiently definite to make the needed exhibit, such data have been arranged in table IX, which follows, so as to show for each portion of the city or class of property in the cities last referred to the assessed valuations of the property taxes at each rate and the amount of taxes levied at such rates.
