Branches in Group I perform practically all of the functions of a Federal reserve bank. Those in Group II do not carry on their own books the reserve deposit accounts of member banks in their territories, nor do they engage in some of the other more important activities of Federal reserve banks except on specific instructions from and for the account of the parent bank. For example, paper presented to branches in Group II for rediscount is transmitted to the parent bank, either with or without recommendation, though when necessary arrangements can be made for immediate credit therefor on the books of the parent bank through the use of the Federal reserve leased wire system. Apart from these principal differences, there are minor differences in the powers and functions of the branches which are brought out in the tabular statement on pages 3 to 8.

HAVANA, CUBA, AGENCIES. The Havana Agency of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston is authorized to buy and sell cable transfers, and to buy, sell, and collect prime bankers' acceptances and prime bills of exchange, but not to pay out currency except under certain specified conditions. The activities of the Havana Agency of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta are limited to currency operations and to the purchase, sale, and collection in Cuba of such bankers' acceptances and bills of exchange as have originated in or are drawn upon drawees in the sixth Federal reserve district. This agency may purchase other bills only upon request and for the account of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston.

SAVANNAH, GA. AGENCY. This agency of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta supplies the currency and coin requirements of banks in the city of Savannah, and holds in custody securities pledged as collateral to bills forwarded by Savannah member banks to the Federal Reserve bank of Atlanta for rediscount. The agency also arranges for the settlement of the clearing house balances on the books of the Federal reserve bank, by telegraphic advice to the parent bank.

GURRENCY FUNDS. The Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia maintains a supply of Federal reserve notes in Scranton and in Johnstown, Pa., to enable it to meet more promptly the currency requirements of member banks in those cities. The Federal reserve notes are held in the custody of a member bank which has deposited securities with the Federal reserve bank to protect the latter against possible losses.
