ST. LOUIS -- Thomas A. Boone has been named vice president and manager of the Louisville Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis. He had been serving as assistant vice president since 1993.

Boone began his career at the Louisville Branch in 1972 as a management trainee. Since then, he has worked in almost every area of the Branch. He holds a bachelor of science degree in mathematics from Indiana University. Boone also is a graduate of the Kentucky School of Banking and the University of Wisconsin's Graduate School of Banking.

The Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis has branches in Memphis, Little Rock and Louisville. It serves the Eighth Federal Reserve District, which includes all of Arkansas, eastern Missouri, southern Indiana, southern Illinois, western Kentucky, western Tennessee and northern Mississippi. In addition to serving as a bank for depository institutions and the U.S. government, each Reserve Bank supervises state-chartered member banks and bank holding companies, monitors economic conditions in the District and participates in formulating monetary policy.
