St. Louis Fed's Louisville Branch Promotes Mattingly

ST. LOUIS, Mo. -- Gerard Mattingly, manager of check and data processing for the Louisville Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, has been promoted to operations officer.

He began his career with the Louisville Branch in 1978 as a mail clerk. He has a bachelor of science degree in business administration and a master's degree in business administration, both from the University of Louisville.
