

NATIONAL NEWS

CHICAGO: The 63rd National Savings Conference of the American Bankers Association will be held at the Sheraton-Chicago Hotel March 21-23.

DALLAS: Charles H. Pistor, Jr., has been elected a senior vice president and a member of the executive committee of Republic National Bank of Dallas. His appointment was effective last Tuesday.

KANSAS CITY: Henry O. Koppang, retired first vice president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, has been named vice chairman of the board and chairman of the executive committee of Mid-Continent National Bank. The new bank will open for business the first of May in a temporary building to be erected immediately north of its permanent building site at 49th and Main Streets, according to L. Allyn Laybourn, board chairman.

Joseph W. DeBord, former president of the Platte Valley State Bank, Kearney, Nebraska, has been named president of the new bank. For the past year, Mr. DeBord has been engaged in a cattle ranching operation near Centralia, Kansas.

CD's with interest higher than 4 per cent must be reported as borrowed funds to the Iowa Banking Department.

DES MOINES: Several Iowa bankers last week departed with the Iowa Development Commission Far East Trade Mission tour in an effort to develop more foreign markets for Iowa products. The tour is similar to that taken last year to Europe. Bankers were well-represented on the European tour as well.

ELDORA: Hardin County Savings Bank has announced the retirement of Frank Jackson, a 25-year employee of the bank, at the age of 94 years! Mr. Jackson, who will be 95 years of age in August, until a short time ago had been at his teller's window at the bank each and every working day. R. R. 
MORA: Dr. A. C. Peterson has been elected to the board of directors of Peoples National Bank. He was elected to succeed Wesley Rydell who recently resigned.


