

Bankers Committee Attacks Urban Crisis

The nation's banking industry has identified "four major factors that lie at the heart of the urban crisis" and announced the launching of an organized attack on the problems.

"Poor housing, inadequate education and training for jobs, discrimination in employment and limited opportunities for minority small businessmen are the problems to be solved," said J. Howard Laeri, president of the American Bankers Association, in announcing the formation of a 42-member Bankers Committee on Urban Affairs.

Mr. Laeri, who is vice chairman of First National City Bank, New York, made the announcement in Boca Raton, Fla., at a recent meeting of the Association of Reserve City Bankers, a group drawing its membership from banks in the Federal Reserve cities.

Heading the committee on urban affairs is Donald M. Graham, vice chairman of the board of Continental Illinois National Bank & Trust Co. of Chicago, a member of the ABA's Economic Policy Committee. The committee will be staffed by a fulltime executive secretary and has retained a consultant widely known for his work in urban problems. In addition, a nineman resource panel drawn from universities, government and groups concerned with urban affairs has agreed to advise the committee.


MINNEAPOLIS: The Northwestern National Bank has initiated a free checking service for all customers with a \$100 minimum balance in their checking accounts.


