# Area Banks Announce Credit Card Systems

A new wave of bank charge activity is currently sweeping across the *Northwestern Banker* area.

The most recent announcement came late last week from the Twin Cities where the formation of the Central States Bank Card Association was completed by 11 Twin Cities banking organizations for the purpose of issuing a common bank credit card.

Earlier announcements were: Marquette National, Minneapolis-appointment as a fullylicensed agent for BankAmericard in Minnesota, North Dakota and South Dakota.

Omaha National, U.S. National of Omaha and National Bank of Commerce of Lincoln-anformation in midnounced September of MidAmerica Charge Card Association to operate in the Great Plains area. This is affiliated with MASTER CHARGE, which originated on the west coast and has national interchange capabilities among banks. Solicitation of Nebraska banks begins today (September 30) and solicitation among Iowa began September 20. banks

Spokesmen for Omaha National and U. S. National said their sign-up of banks across Iowa is substantially ahead of projections.

First National, Omaha – appointment as a fully-licensed agent for BankAmericard in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota.

Central National B&T, Des Moines-affiliated with Bank-Americard through First National of Omaha as of September 26. Central National has signed the three Brenton banks in Des Moines, Plaza State Bank and East Des Moines National.

Colorado National, Denverfully-licensed agent for Bank-Americard and has signed extensive number of banks in Mountain States and Western Nebraska.

Commerce Trust, Kansas City-fully-licensed agent for BankAmericard and has signed extensive number of banks in its trade area.

Approximately 350 banks now have joined or signed letters of intent to join BANKMARK, the new credit card system of banks, James E. Brown, president of BANKMARK and senior vice president of Mercantile Trust Company, St. Louis, has announced.


Mr. Brown said City National Bank and Trust Company of Kansas City, First National Bank of Kansas City and Commercial National Bank of Kansas City, Kansas have joined BANKMARK and approximately 100 banks in western Missouri and eastern Kansas have indicated that they plan to become members.

## IOWA NEWS

DES MOINES: Beginning September 27, 1968 the Central National Bank and Trust Company will offor the BankAmericard credit card in Iowa.

B. C. Grangaard, chairman and president of Central National Bank, announced an arrangement with the First of Omaha Services Corporation and the First National Bank to offer BankAmericard in this area.

Mr. Grangaard also announced an arrangement whereby the following Des Moines banks also will be offering the Bank Americard: The Plaza State Bank, Merle Hay Shopping Center; East Des Moines National Bank; and the following Brenton Banks: National Bank of Des Moines; Northwest Des Moines National Bank; and the South Des Moines National Bank.

In addition to the many Des Moines merchants who will honor the BankAmericard, it can be used at more than 210,000 locations all across America, even around the world. This is the first charge card operation of its kind in Iowa. BankAmericards will generally be available to customers of the Central National Bank and the other banks listed and to the people in Polk County on application.

banks were at odds last week on their prime interest rates.


Chase Manhattan Bank, the second largest, announced a  $\frac{1}{2}$  reduction in its prime rate to 6%. First National City Bank, New York's largest and the second largest in the country, announced a  $\frac{1}{4}$  reduction to  $\frac{6}{4}$ .

A number of major banks across the country quickly followed the lead of First National City Bank, with the  $\frac{1}{4}$ % reduction. A few smaller banks went along with Chase Manhattan with the  $\frac{1}{2}$ % reduction. National City Bank in Minneapolis, for example, by dropping its prime rate to 6% on September 18.
