# REPORT OF RECONSTRUCTION FINANCE CORPORATION FOR THE THIRD QUARTER 1935

LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN, RECONSTRUCTION FINANCE CORPORATION, TRANSMITTING A REPORT COVERING THE ACTIVITIES OF THE RECONSTRUCTION FINANCE CORPORATION FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF 1937, AND FOR THE PERIOD FROM THE ORGANIZATION OF THE CORPORATION ON FEBRUARY 2. 1932, TO SEPTEMBER 30, 1937, INCLUSIVE

The Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Sir: Pursuant to the provisions of section 15 of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended, the Reconstruction Finance Corporation has the honor to submit the following report covering its operations for the third quarter of 1937, and for the period from the organization of the Corporation on February 2, 1932, to September 30, 1937, inclusive.

### OPERATIONS-THIRD QUARTER OF 1937

During the third quarter of 1937, the operations of the Corporation were as follows:

Under section 5 of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended, 28 loans were authorized, which, together with increases in loans previously approved, aggregated \$47,767,603.72, as follows: \$26,022,398.14, to banks and trust companies (including \$25,822,-398.14 to aid in the reorganization or liquidation of closed banks); \$16,742,905.58, to mortgage loan companies; \$5,000,000, to a railroad; and \$2,300, to borrowers engaged in the fishing industry.

Under section 5d of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended, the Corporation made 73 authorizations to industrial or commercial business aggregating \$5,516,850, as follows: Loans, \$4,974,000; purchases of participations, \$280,100; and agreements to

purchase participations, \$262,750.

Under section 5e of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended, 12 loans on the assets of closed banks and trust companies were authorized, which, together with an increase in a loan previously approved, aggregated \$1,860,569.81.

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Under section 201 (d), title II, of the Emergency Relief and Construction Act of 1932, five loans were authorized, which, together with an increase in a loan previously approved, aggregated \$235,205,000.

Under section 304, title III, of the act approved March 9, 1933, as amended, the Corporation made 30 authorizations. These authorizations, together with an increase in an authorization previously made, aggregated \$1,869,650, as follows: Subscriptions for preferred stock of banks and trust companies, \$1,436,000; and purchases of capital notes or debentures of banks, \$433,650.

Under section 36, title II, of the Emergency Farm Mortgage Act of 1933, as amended, 31 loans to or for the benefit of drainage, levee, irrigation, and similar districts, etc., were authorized, which, together with increases in loans previously approved, aggregated \$2,957,940.23.

Under the act approved April 13, 1934, as amended, six loans to finance the repair of damage by earthquake, flood, or other catas-

trophe, aggregating \$20,800, were authorized.

Under section 14 of the act approved June 19, 1934, as amended, which empowers the Corporation to make mining loans, etc., nine loans, aggregating \$683,000, were authorized.

Under the act approved August 24, 1935, one loan to a tax-supported public-school district, in the amount of \$579.53, was authorized.

Summarizing the foregoing, 195 authorizations were made during the third quarter of 1937. These, together with increases in authorizations previously made, aggregated \$295,881,993.29. Cancelations or withdrawals of authorizations made during the third quarter and previously aggregated \$335,912,357.87.

Disbursements during the third quarter of 1937 were \$76,373,159.88; and repayments, \$111,773,661.20. The decrease in the amount outstanding on September 30, 1937, as compared with June 30, 1937,

was \$35,400,501.32.

OPERATIONS-FEBRUARY 2, 1932, TO SEPTEMBER 30, 1937, INCLUSIVE

During the entire period from the organization of the Corporation on February 2, 1932, to September 30, 1937, inclusive, the following

were authorized:

Under section 5 of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act. as amended, 19,515 loans to 9,127 institutions, aggregating \$4,593,-056,320.72, were authorized, as follows: \$2,515,033,250 to 7,361 banks and trust companies (including \$1,180,809,621.35 to aid in the reorganization or liquidation of closed banks); \$147,243,932.50 to 1,012 building and loan associations (including \$25,141,957.84 to receivers of closed building and loan associations); \$103,006,858.28 to 133 insurance companies; \$536,780,591.36 to 412 mortgage loan companies; \$642,967.80 to 7 credit unions; \$399,636,000 to 12 Federal land banks (including \$193,618,000 representing refinancing of loans previously made by the Corporation to Federal land banks for different individual amounts, but in the same aggregate amount); \$24,221,-572.68 to 26 joint-stock land banks; \$9,250,000 to 8 Federal intermediate credit banks; \$6,120,867.59, to 20 agricultural credit corporations; \$178,840,452.48 (rediscounts) to 12 regional agricultural credit corporations and their branches; \$14,758,827.88 to 20 livestockcredit corporations; \$643,597,795 to 75 railroads (including \$18,946,708 to railroad receivers and \$5,719,252 to trustees of railroads); \$26,089.27 to 7 processors or distributors to pay processing taxes; \$13,087,715.88

to a State fund created for the purpose of insuring repayment of deposits of public moneys; and \$809,400 to 21 borrowers engaged in the fishing industry.

Under section 5c of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act. as amended, four subscriptions for capital stock of two mortgage-

loan companies, aggregating \$26,250,000, were authorized.
Under section 5d of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended, 2,482 authorizations to 2,210 industrial or commercial businesses, aggregating \$161,974,356.62, were made as follows: Loans in the amount of \$140,937,333.73 to 1,839 businesses; purchases of participations in the amount of \$13,532,029.16 in loans to 251 businesses; and agreements to purchase participations in the amount of \$7,504,993.73 in loans to 120 businesses.

Under section 5e of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act. as amended, 148 loans, aggregating \$17,056,561.99, on the assets of

147 closed banks and trust companies, were authorized.
Under the Emergency Relief and Construction Act of 1932, as amended, 823 authorizations to 333 applicants, aggregating \$2,305,-891,352.85, were made as follows: Under section 1, title I, \$300,000,000 was made available to 42 States and 2 Territories for purposes of relief and work relief; under section 201 (a), title II, as amended, loans or contracts aggregating \$399,217,487.36 were authorized to 176 applicants for self-liquidating projects, and loans aggregating \$10,450,232.20 were authorized to 6 applicants for financing the repair or reconstruction of buildings damaged by earthquake, fire, tornado, or cyclone in 1933; under section 201 (c), title II, loans aggregating \$53,370,955.22 were authorized to 3 applicants for the purpose of financing sales in foreign markets of agricultural surpluses; and under section 201 (d), title II, loans aggregating \$1,542,852,678.07 were authorized to 104 applicants to aid in financing the carrying and orderly marketing of agricultural commodities and livestock, produced in the United States (including authorizations of \$1,457,248,664.99 to the Commodity Credit Corporation).

Under section 304, title III, of the act approved March 9, 1933, as amended, 8,555 loans on and subscriptions for preferred stock, and purchases of capital notes or debentures, of 6,832 banks and trust companies, aggregating \$1,285,444,839, were authorized, as follows: Loans secured by preferred stock of 272 banks and trust companies, \$23,274,755; subscriptions for preferred stock of 4,094 banks and trust companies, \$831,057,634; and purchases of capital notes or debentures

of 2,893 banks and trust companies, \$431,112,450.

Under section 5, title I, of the Agricultural Adjustment Act of 1933. as amended, two loans to the Secretary of Agriculture to acquire cotton, aggregating \$23,500,000, were authorized. Of this amount

\$20,200,000 was canceled.

Under section 1 of the act approved June 10, 1933, as amended, 1 subscription for, and 11 loans on, the preferred stock of 10 insurance companies, aggregating \$34,375,000, were authorized, as follows: Loans secured by preferred stock of 9 insurance companies, \$34,275,-000; and a subscription for preferred stock of 1 insurance company, \$100,000.

Under section 36, title II, of the Emergency Farm Mortgage Act of 1933, as amended, 902 loans to or for the benefit of 617 drainage, levee, irrigation, and similar districts, etc., aggregating \$136,389,291.08,

were authorized.

Under the act approved April 13, 1934, as amended, 702 loans to 667 borrowers to finance the repair of damage by earthquake, flood, or other catastrophe, aggregating \$5,784,688.75, were authorized.

Under section 14 of the act approved June 19, 1934, as amended, 129 loans to 115 borrowers engaged in the business of mining, milling, or smelting of ores, etc., aggregating \$11,030,500, were authorized.

Under section 16 of the act approved June 19, 1934, as amended, one loan of \$22,500,000 for the purpose of payment of teachers' salaries

was authorized. Of this amount \$200,000 was canceled.

Under the act approved August 24, 1935, 27 loans to 26 tax-supported public-school districts or other similar public-school authorities in charge of public schools, aggregating \$2,006,800, were authorized.

Under section 3 (a) of the Rural Electrification Act of 1936, one loan

in the amount of \$46,500,000 was authorized.

Summarizing the foregoing, authorizations aggregating \$8,671,759,711.01 were made during the period from February 2, 1932, to September 30, 1937, inclusive. Of this amount, \$1,737,683,535.71 was later withdrawn or canceled, and \$6,387,559,150.06 was disbursed. Repayments amounted to \$4,394,583,782.29, leaving \$1,992,975,367.77 outstanding on the books of the Corporation at the close of September 30, 1937.

In addition, the Corporation had outstanding on September 30, 1937, agreements to make authorizations, totaling \$167,073,334.65

upon the performance of specified conditions.

### REGIONAL AGRICULTURAL CREDIT CORPORATIONS

Under section 84 of the Farm Credit Act of 1933, as amended, with the approval of the Governor of the Farm Credit Administration, the Corporation, during the third quarter of 1937, authorized reductions in the capital of five regional agricultural credit corporations, as follows: The Regional Agricultural Credit Corporation of Fort Worth, Tex., from \$1,250,000 to \$450,000; of Minneapolis, Minn., from \$8,100.000 to \$6,300,000; of Sioux City, Iowa, from \$900,000 to \$500,000; of Spokane, Wash., from \$1,800,000 to \$800,000; and of Wichita, Kans., from \$1,800,000 to \$800,000.

This Corporation was advised in September 1937 that the Farm Credit Administration, pursuant to authority contained in the Farm Credit Act of 1937, had ordered and effected the consolidation of six regional agricultural credit corporations, the names and outstanding

capital stock of which are as follows:

and that the Governor of the Farm Credit Administration had granted a charter to the Regional Agricultural Credit Corporation of Washington, D. C., to receive the assets and assume the liabilities of the foregoing consolidated regional agricultural credit corporations.

In this connection, the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, in September 1937, authorized the release of the stock certificates evidencing the capital of the regional agricultural credit corporations so consolidated upon delivery to this Corporation of a stock certificate evidencing the capital stock of the Regional Agricultural Credit

Corporation of Washington, D. C., in the face amount equal to the aggregate face amount of the certificates of stock to be released.

### PAYMENTS TO THE SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY

Under section 2 of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended by section 6 (f) of the Federal Home Loan Bank Act, and pursuant to the request of the Secretary of the Treasury, the Corporation during the third quarter of 1937 paid \$1,000,000 to the Secretary of the Treasury to enable him to make payments upon stock of Federal home loan banks subscribed for by him. This made a total of \$121,514,000 so paid through September 30, 1937.

## SECURITIES PURCHASED FROM FEDERAL EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATION OF PUBLIC WORKS

Under the Emergency Appropriation Act, fiscal year 1935, approved June 19, 1934, the Corporation during the third quarter of 1937, agreed to purchase \$1,905,700 net face amount of marketable securities from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, to be held and collected or sold at a later date.

From June 19, 1934, to September 30, 1937, inclusive, the Corporation purchased from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works securities having a par value of \$501,529,421.47. Of this amount, securities having a par value of \$400,014,934.29 were sold at a premium of \$12,097,384.91 (including securities having a par value of \$59,645,724.82 sold to issuers prior to maturity at a premium of \$327,375.74). Securities having a par value of \$15,893,122 purchased from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works were subsequently collected at maturity, and securities having a par value of \$85,621,365.18 were held at the close of business September 30, 1937. In addition, the Corporation had agreed to purchase at par, to be held and collected or sold at a later date, such part of securities having an aggregate par value of \$99,354,000 as the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works is in a position to deliver from time to time. Of this \$99,354,000, purchases of securities authorized amount to \$84,556,000, and agreements to purchase securities upon the performance of specified conditions amount to \$14,798,000.

### PAYMENTS TO THE FEDERAL HOUSING ADMINISTRATOR

Under section 4, title I, of the National Housing Act approved June 27, 1934, the Corporation during the third quarter of 1937 paid \$4,500,000 to the Federal Housing Administrator. This made a total of \$55,621,074.55 so paid through September 30, 1937.

### DISASTER LOAN CORPORATION

Under the act approved February 11, 1937, as amended, creating a Disaster Loan Corporation with nonassessable capital stock, and empowering it to make such loans as it may determine to be necessary or appropriate because of floods or other catastrophes in the years 1936 or 1937, the Corporation during the third quarter of 1937, subscribed and paid for \$2,000,000 of the capital stock of Disaster Loan

Corporation. This made a total of \$8,000,000 so subscribed and paid for through September 30, 1937.

### NOTES OF THE RECONSTRUCTION FINANCE CORPORATION

During the third quarter of 1937, the Corporation sold \$5,000,000 series L-3 note; \$20,000,000 series L-4 notes to the Secretary of the Treasury; and \$125,366,000 series K notes; redeemed its series L-2 note to the extent of \$130,000,000; redeemed and canceled \$15,000,000 of its series L-4 notes; and \$84,878,000 of its series H notes.

As of September 30, 1937, there were outstanding \$3,781,122,666.67

The Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of 1935, approved Apr. 8, 1935, provides: "That in order to provide relief, work relief, and to increase employment by providing for useful projects, there is hereby appropriated, \* \* \* to be used in the discretion and under the direction of the President, to be immediately available and to remain available until June 36, 1937, \* \* not exceeding \$500,000.000 in the aggregate of any savings or unexpended balances in funds of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation \* \* ." \$300,000,000 has been disbursed by the Corporation under these provisions of the act.

Sec. 2 of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended, provides that "in order to enable the Secretary of the Treasury to make payments upon stock of Federal home loan banks subscribed for by him in accordance with the Federal Home Loan Bank Act, the sum of \$125,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for such purposes, is hereby allocated and made available to the Secretary of the Treasury \* \* \* " The amount of such stock subscribed for by the Secretary of the Treasury is \$124,741,000.

See 4-b of the Home Owners' Loan Act of 1933 provides that to enable the Secretary of the Treasury the sum of \$200,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary. In addition to loans and other authorizations reflected on the statement of condition, the Corporation has approved in principle, upon the performance of specified conditions, loans in the amount of \$148,636,834.65 and purchases of preferred stock and debentures in the amount of \$3,638,500. The Corporation has also agreed to purchase from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works at par and accrued interest such part of securities having aggregate par value of \$14,798,000 as may be available for delivery.

Under the provisions of sec. 5 (b) of an act approved June 16, 1934 (Public, No. 362, 73d Cong.), the Corporation is required to purchase adebentures or other obligations of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, upon its request, up to but not exceeding \$250,000,000. The Corporation has not been called upon to purchase any such obligations.

This statement of condition does not take into consideration expenditures incurred but not paid by the Corporation at the close of business Sept. 30, 1937, nor income of regional agricultural credit corporations whose capital stock was subscribed by the Corporation.

Addendum to statement of condition as of the close of business, June 30, 1937, which appeared in the report for the second quarter of 1937: In addition to the amount of loans which the Corporation had approved in principle upon the performance of certain specified conditions, as stated in a feotonote to the statement of modition as of the close of June 30, 1937, the Corporation during the second quarter of 1937 agreed to make a loan to a trust company in the amount of \$16,000,000 subject to the performance of certain specified conditions. This commitment, however, was canceled in September, 1937.
