The Marine List.

Extract from the Log-book of the privateer KEMP, arrived at Baltimore.

"Sailed from Wilmington, N. C. Nov. 29. Dec. 2, was chased by a frigate conveying 9 sail. Same day, boarded the Spanish ship Donna Isabella, from Havana for Hamburg. Next day was attacked by the above convoy in regular order of battle—threw the enemy into confusion, took four of them, and ordered them in. We had 76 men and boys, and 10 guns—the enemy's force was 41 guns and 143 men.—Dec. 4, proceeded to Wilmington with 65 prisoners. 7th, sent up in a sloop 50 prisoners. 10th,

spoke ship Princess, prize to the Kemp—9th another. 14th, heard of the loss of our prize ship Roselk, valued at 180,000 dolls. Jan. 29, went to sea, the Midas in co. Feb. 8, after 40 minutes close engagement, captured a brig of 10 guns and 42 men, and ordered her in—our loss one killed and 2 wounded. 10th, put our prisoners on board a Swedish ship for Amelia. 15th, put 2 prisoners on board the Russian ship Felix Oeta, from Havre for Havana. 16th, in sight of Antigua, was chased by a man of war brig and a ship. 17th, saw Guadaloupe, anchored and watered, and board-

ed a French ship from Havre.—19th, captured the schr. Yankee Lass, formerly Am. privateer, and ordered her in.—Next day, captured and ordered in, schr. Resolution, Allen.—25th, was chased by a frigate.—March 2, saw Porto Rico, and ordered not to land by a boat from the shore. Same day took an Eng. sloop, and put 5 men on board her. Same day, watered at Augadilla, and landed 9 prisoners. 4th, the sloop came in and we gave her up. 5th, anchored under Moona, but soon proceeded. 7th boarded Swedish schr. Maria for St. Barts. 9th, spoke schr. Eliza, for do. took out an

American in distress. Same day, boarded schr. Eliza Rogers, for St. Thomas, under Indigene colors. 10th, captured ship Otway, from Liverpool for Jamaica, manned her, and took out a cargo of dry goods, muskets, &c. 13th, proceeded in co. with our prize for the U. S. 25th, spoke schr. Ocean, from Baltimore for Havana, and was informed of the Peace.

The schr. Russell, Vibberts, arrived at N. Bedford, from Canton, spoke March 27, off Martha's Vineyard, a Spanish sloop from Havana for Boston, and received the first news of Peace. The Rambler, Edes, arrived at Canton in 121 days from Boston, captured four prizes on her passage out, had one detained by the Portuguese at Macoa; but had realized about 60,000 dollars of the proceeds of the other prizes.

The schr. Surprise, Barstow, containing the crew of the U. S. sloop of war Erie, sailed from this port on the morning of the 3d inst. At half past 6 o'clock the same day, she struck on Barnagat Shoals. At half 12 o'clock, wind fresh from S. E. she bilged. Part of the passengers and crew took to the boat, and were picked up by the Virginia Ann, from Fredericksburg. The rest, 130 in number, were left on the wreck, and it is feared have perished.

The ship Minerva, Captain Williams, on Monday last, off the Capes of the Delaware, spoke a vessel, supposed to be a frigate, armed en flute, a prize to the Constitution.

The brig South Boston, Scott, from Charleston to France, was taken and carried into Bermuda, where the vessel and cargo sold for \$40,000, and proceeded for Liverpool.

The ship Missouri, 8 days from this port for New-Orleans, was at anchor off Charleston bar, on the 29th ult.

The schooner Dispatch, Cooper, from Baltimore, was upset on the 30th ult. in Rebellion Roads, by a sudden flaw of wind. The people were saved by the active exertions of Lieut. Mork, of the cutter Boxer. The schr. while drifting, was secured alongside of the Rufus King—was righted, and has arrived at Charleston.

The schr. Mason's Daughter, from Halifax, March 13th, arrived at Portsmouth N. H. on Friday evening last, having been obliged, by the severity of the weather to put into a bay near cape Sables.

The schr. Dove, from Halifax to Baltimore, has put into Arguyle.

The U. S. brig CHIPPEWA, was launched at Warren, R. I. on the 25th ult. She is to be commanded by Lieut. Geo. C. Reed.

The brig Calypso, from Baltimore for the West Indies, put into Norfolk, on the 30th ult. leaky.

The hermaphrodite privateer brig Ludlow, Capt. Mudge, of Kennebunk, 6 guns and about 50 men, ar. at Portsmouth on the 2d inst. from a cruise—captured nothing—she sailed from Kennebunk in January and from Marblehead 26th of the same month. When seven days out, sprung aleak, which increased to such a degree that it was with difficulty she could be kept afloat, and prevented her chasing any vessels.

The British ship Elizabeth, from England via Bermuda bound to Halifax, laden with salt and dry goods, was cast away on the Little Hope, near Liverpool, N. S. on the 27th ult. and totally lost, with her cargo... crew all saved.

The letter-of-marque Hyder Ali, late of Boston, taken by the Owen Glendower frigate, in the Indian Ocean, made the following captures previous to her falling in with the frigate: May 4, off Sumatra, Br. brig Favourite, Ayton, from Calcutta for New South Wales, cargo teas and dry goods; ordered for America, [retaken.] May 7, brig Jupiter, Torick, of Madras, cut out of Labonagee, with part of a cargo of pepper; given up, after taking out the property. May 10, captured at Tramone roads, (coast of Sumatra,) ships Betsey, Bennet, and Mary Allen, of Calcutta; Salamania, —, of Bombay; and brig Junia, Prince, of Tappanolly; the two former (with cargoes of pepper, gum benzion and opium,) were ordered for America—[re-taken.] The Salamania, being only in ballast, was given up; as was the Junia, after having her cargo of dry goods taken out. May 27, captured, off Prince of Wales Island, two junks belonging to that place, laden with pepper, teas, beetle-nuts, China ware, sugars, and gum benzion; took out the property and gave them up.

The British sloop of war Morgiana, arrived at Newport, on the 1st inst. from Bermuda, with prisoners.

The British ship Ann, Ashford, prize to the privateer Ultor, came in last evening. She was from St. Domingo bound to Liverpool, with a cargo of mahogany and fustic; captured March 13, about 30 miles to the leeward of St. Domingo.—The Ultor, on her cruise, made the following captures: Off Oronoko, British schr. Perseverance, from Grenada for Demarara, and burnt her. Off Nevis, Br. brig John, from Martinique for Antigua—burnt her. Brig Marietta, from Dublin for St. Kitts; took out two bales of linens, and burnt her.
