Export of Wheat Flour, 1860-1880.

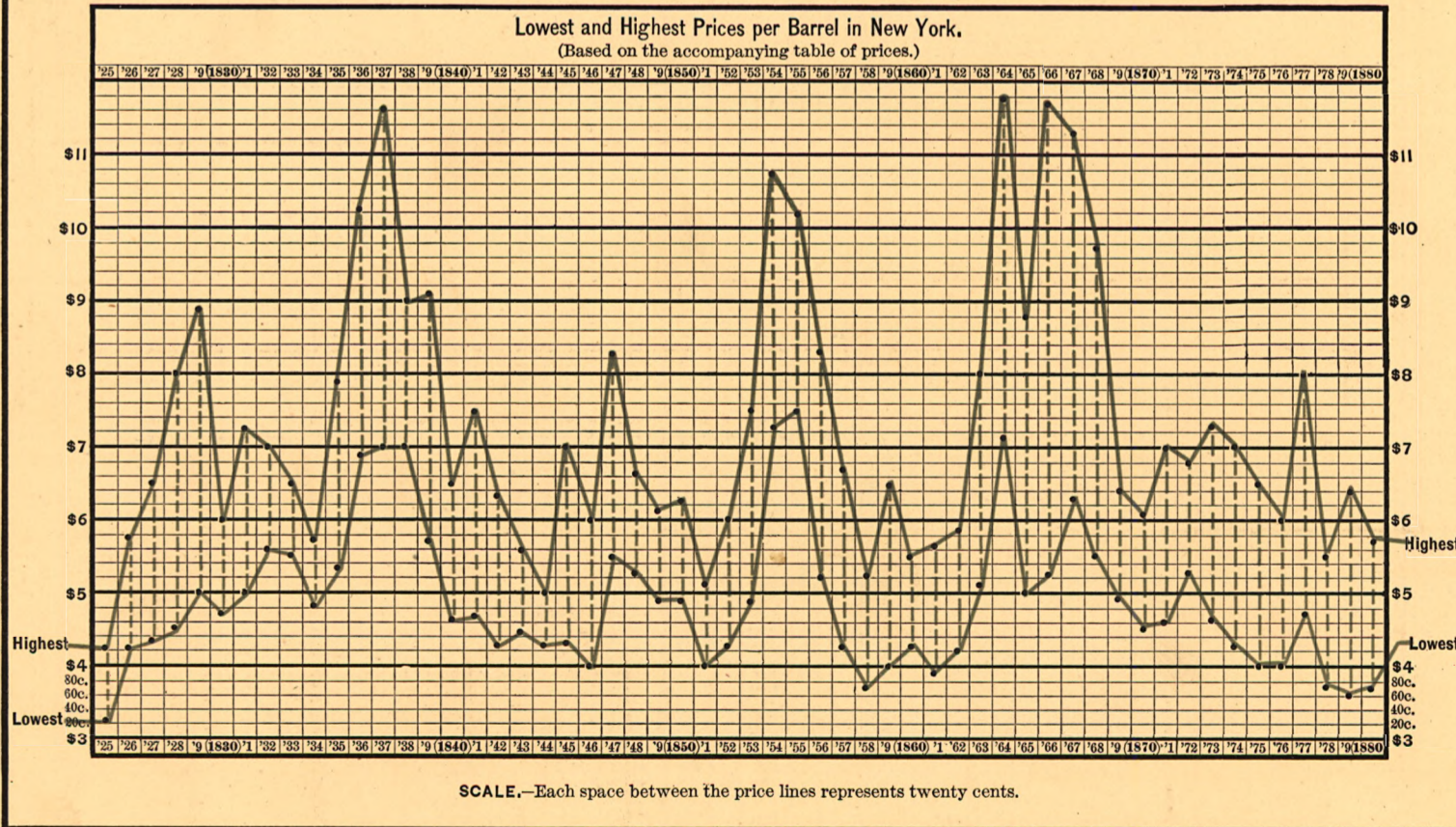

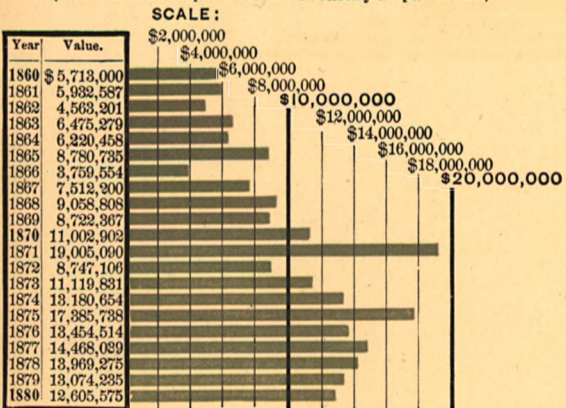

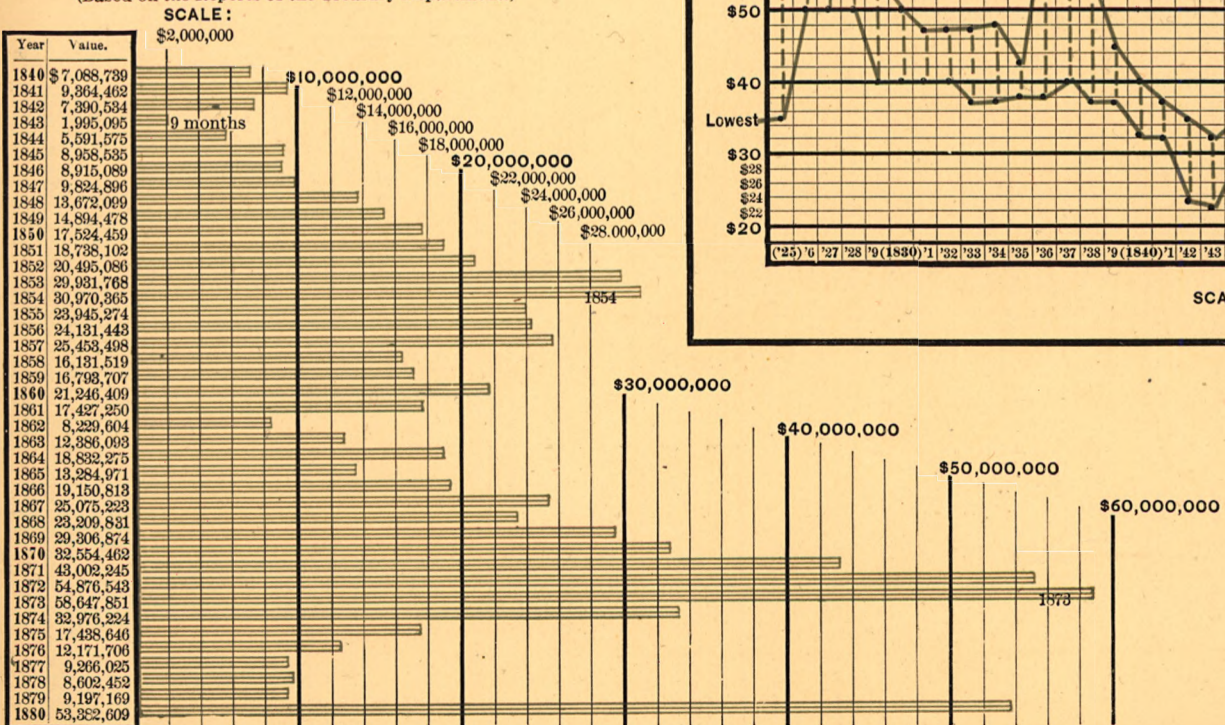

Net Import of Iron and Steel and Manufactures, of 1840 to 1880.



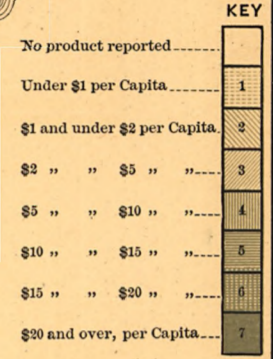
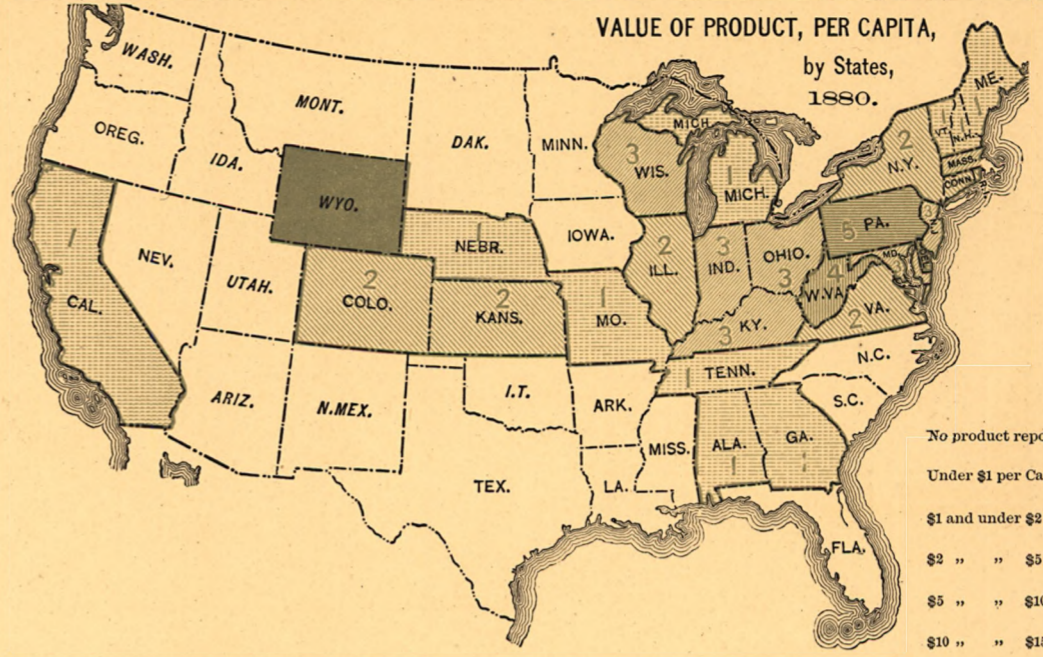
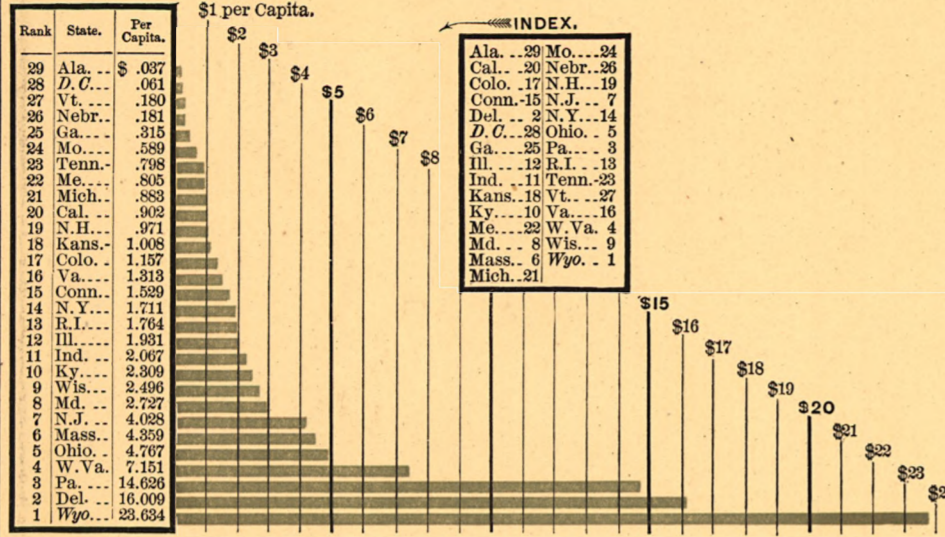

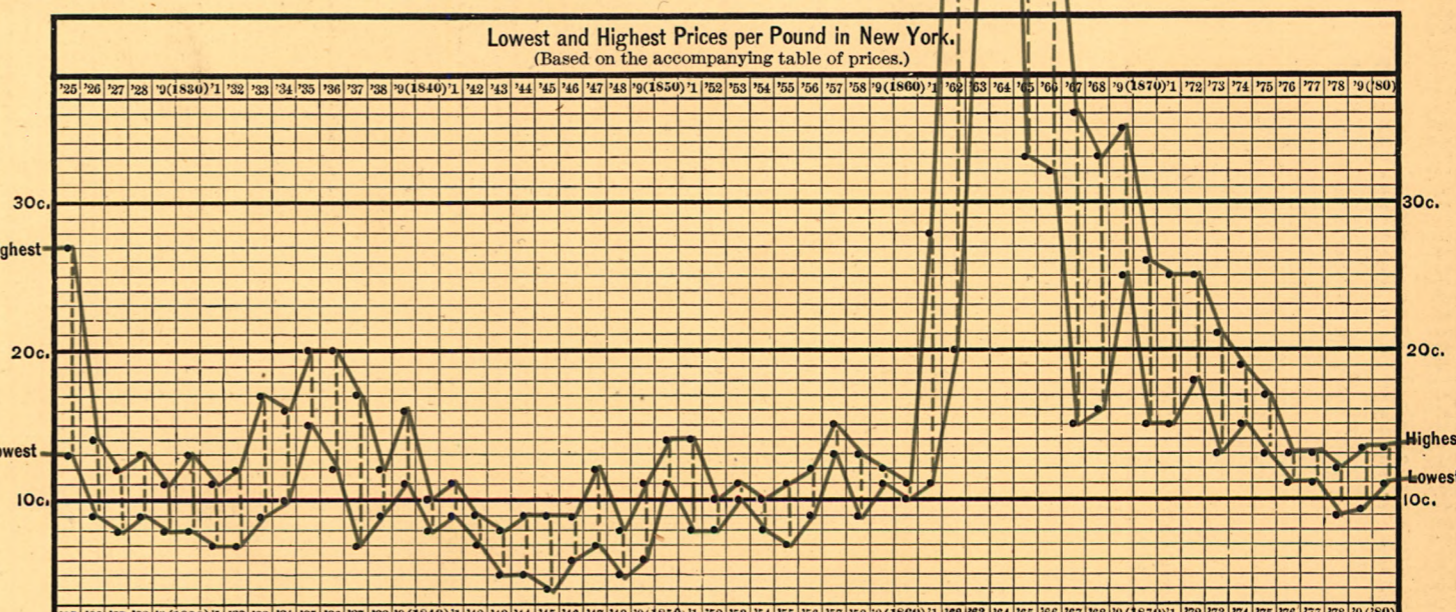
