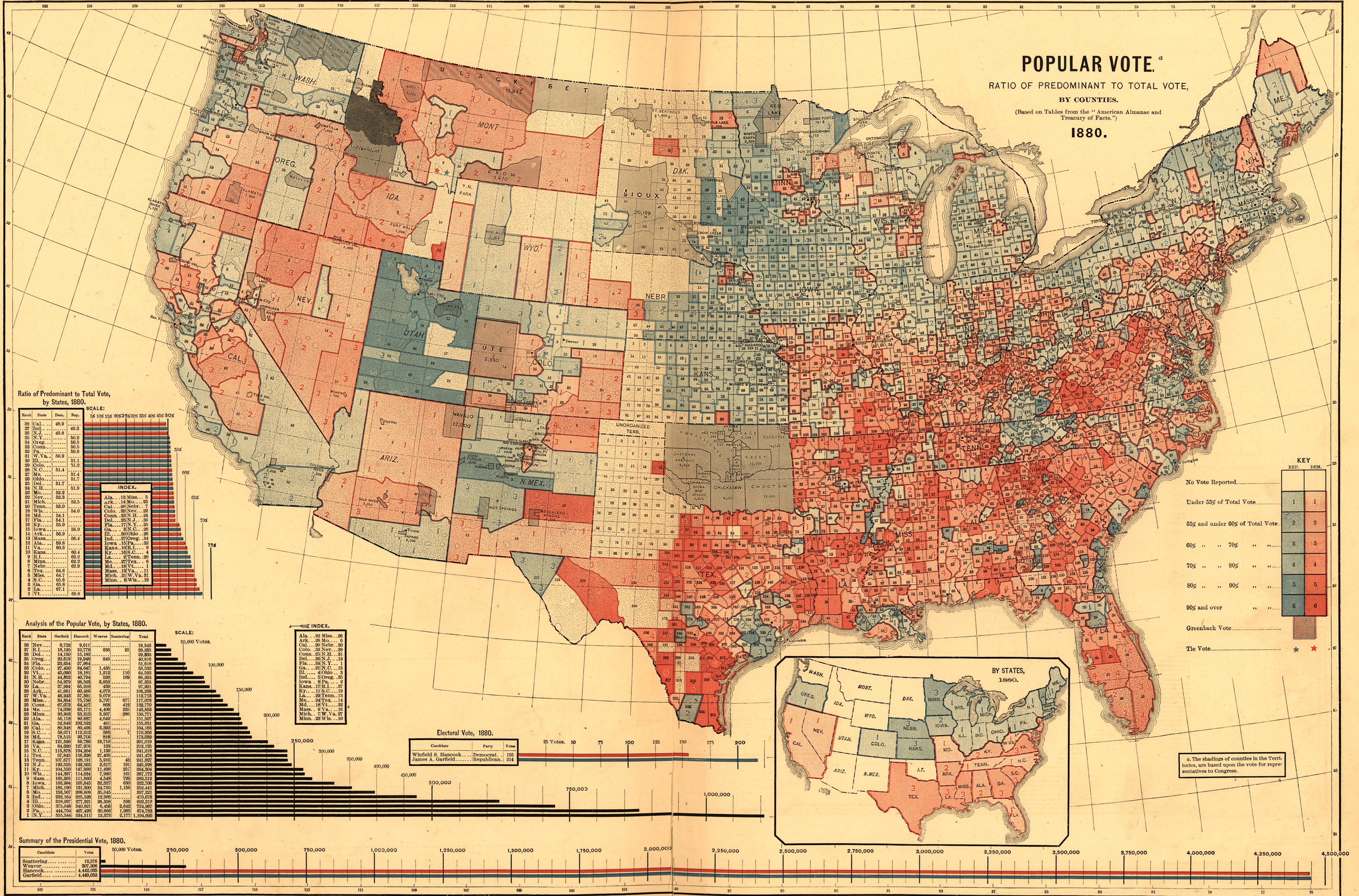

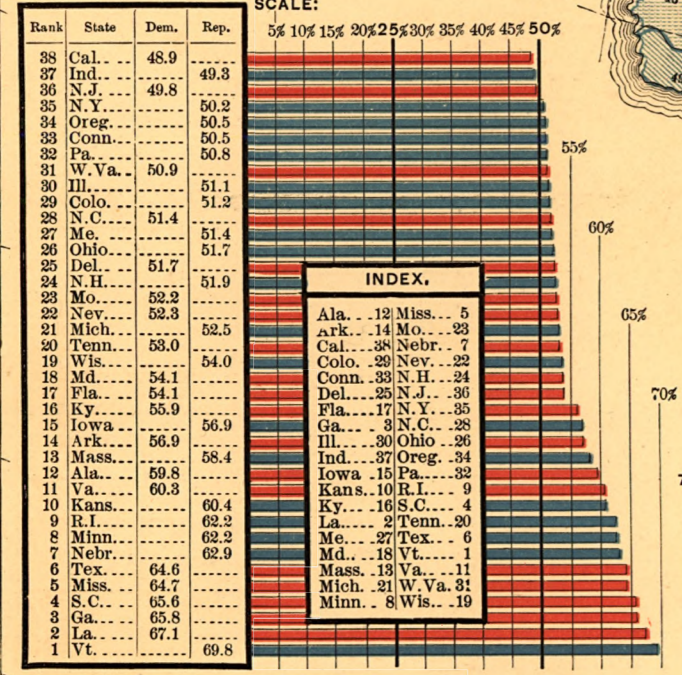
RATIO OF PREDOMINANT TO TOTAL VOTE,

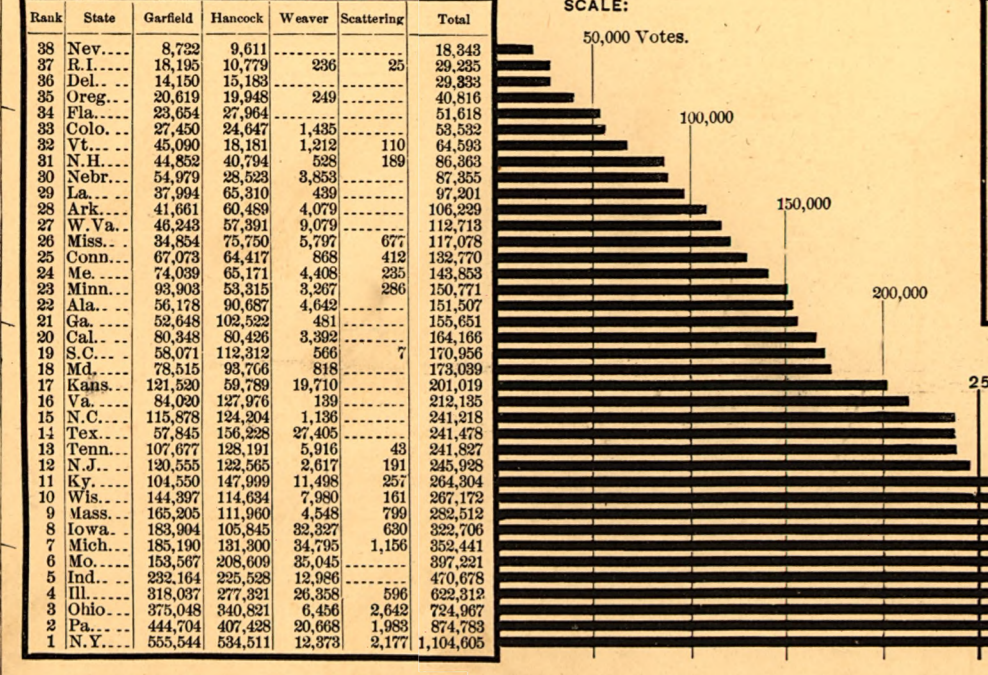

by States, 1880.



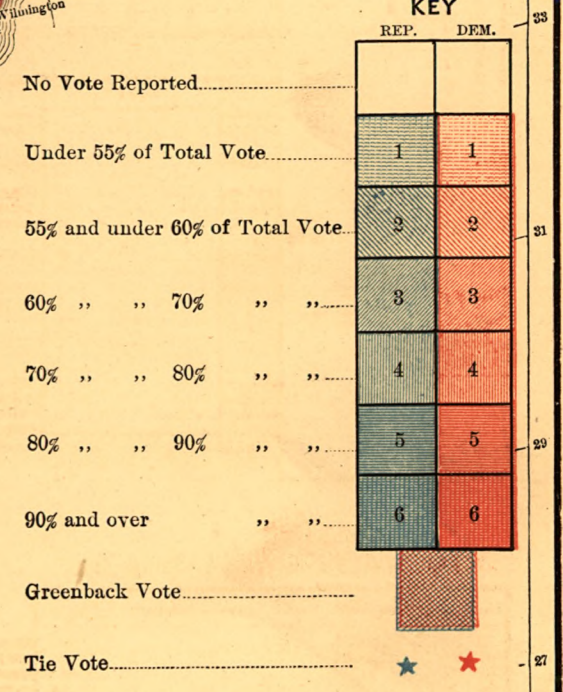
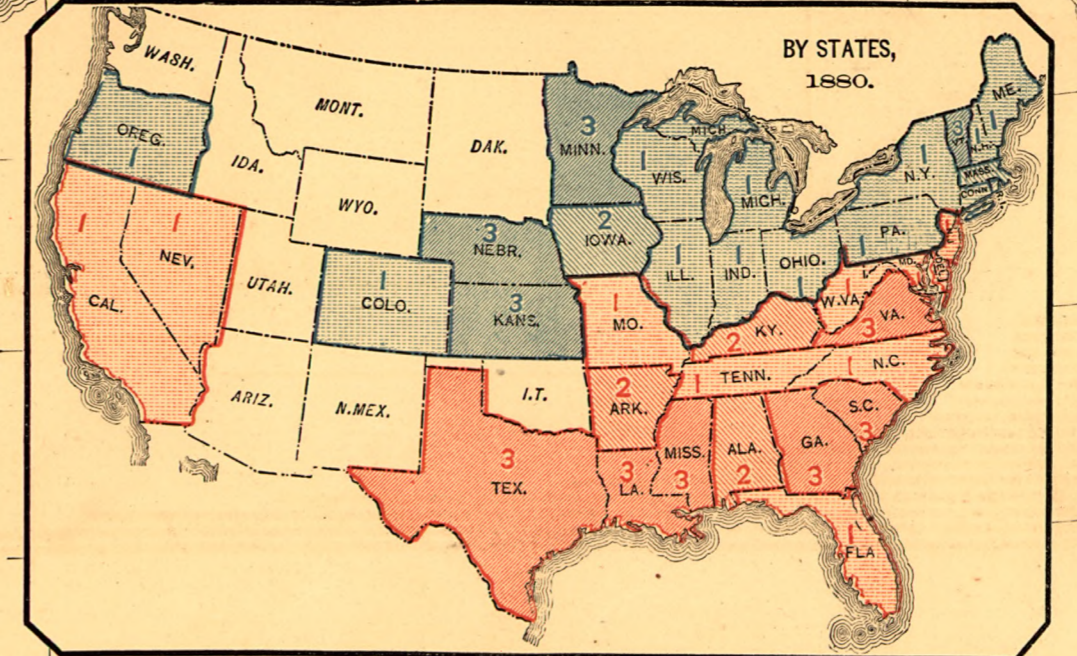
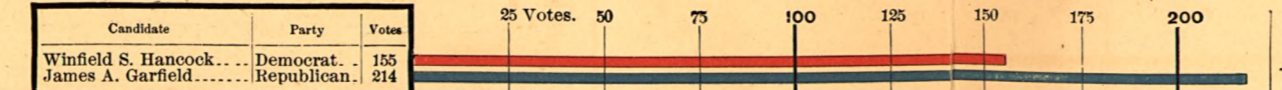

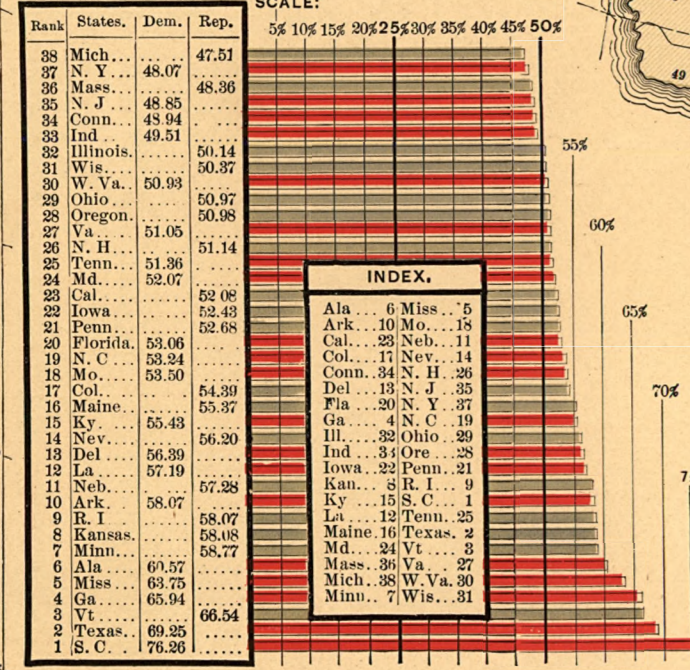

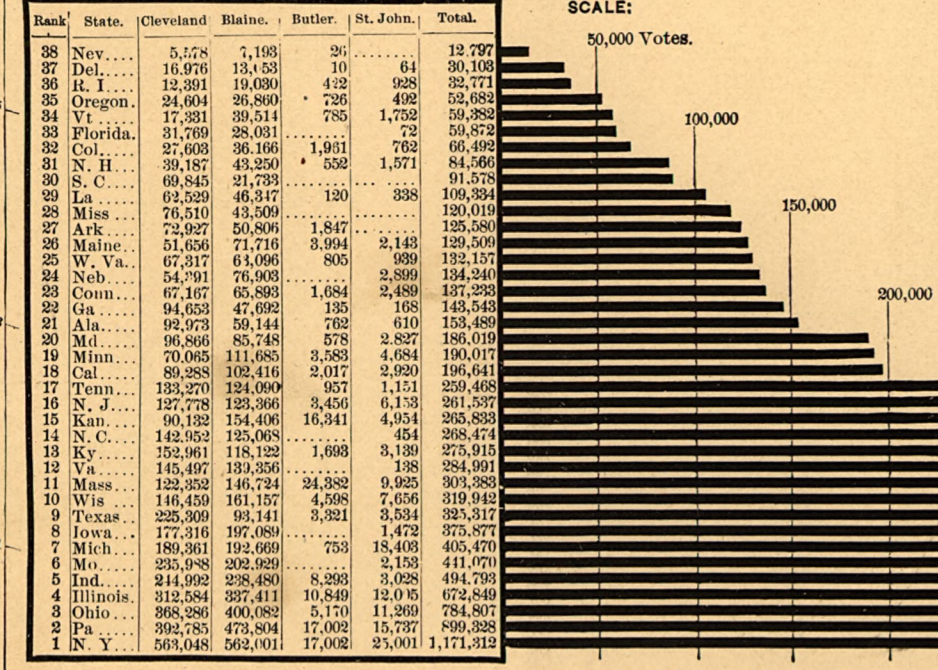
Ratio of Predominant to Total Vote, by States, 1884.

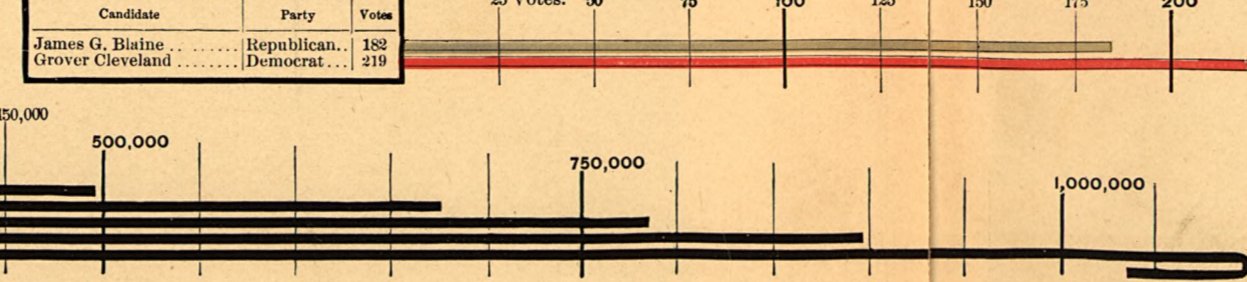

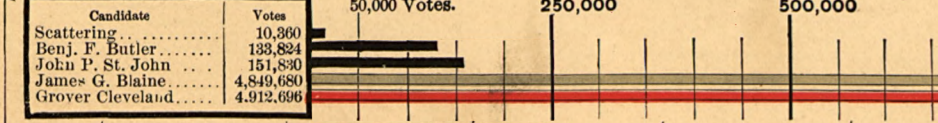

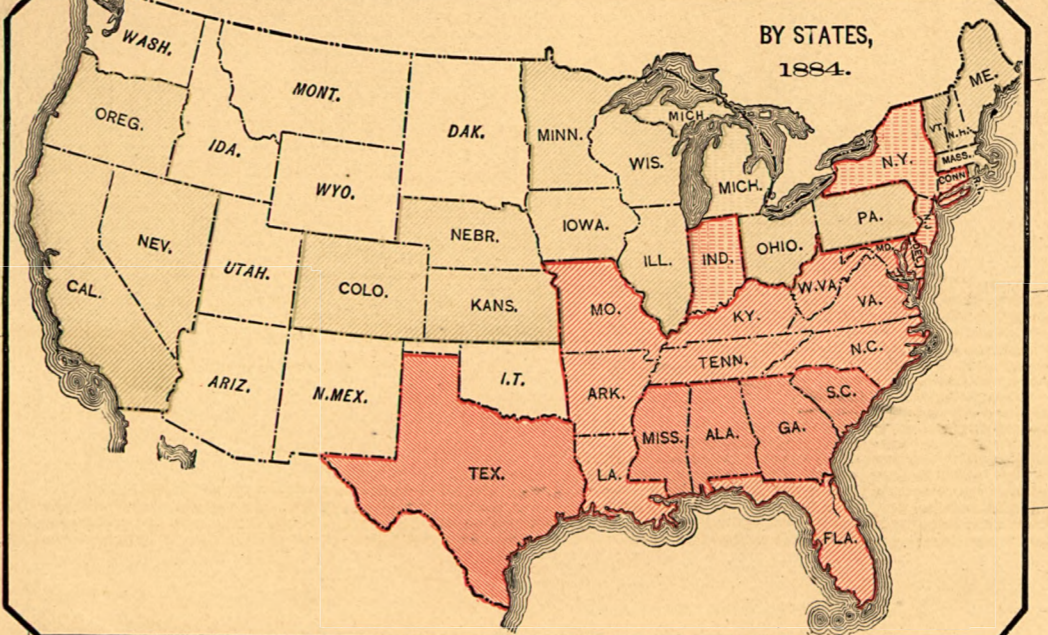

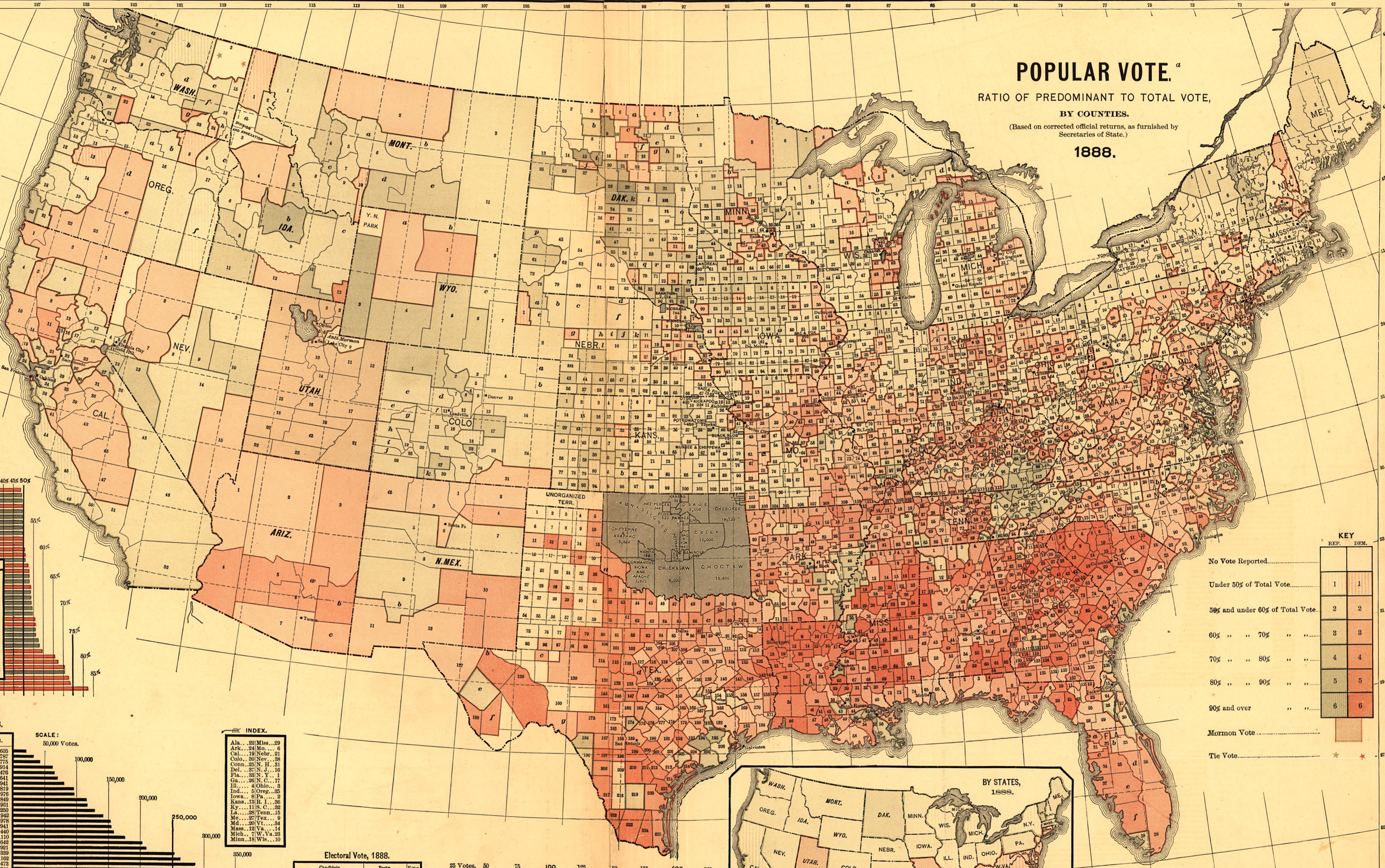

RATIO OF PREDOMINANT TO TOTAL VOTE,

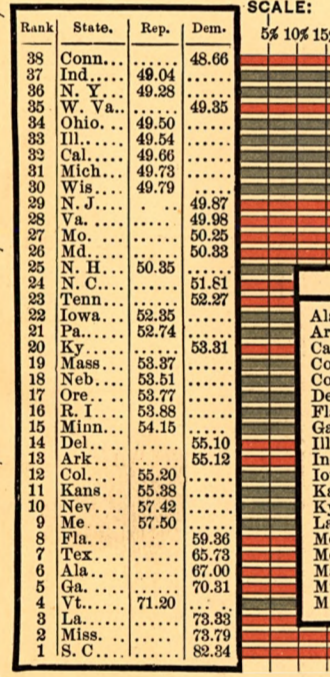

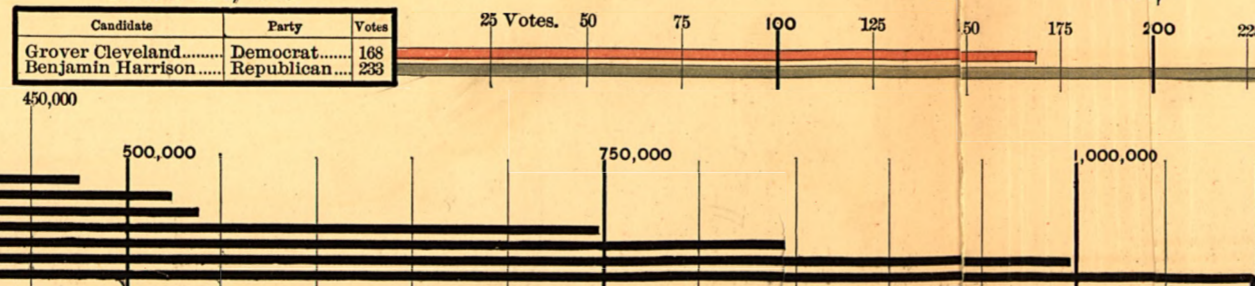

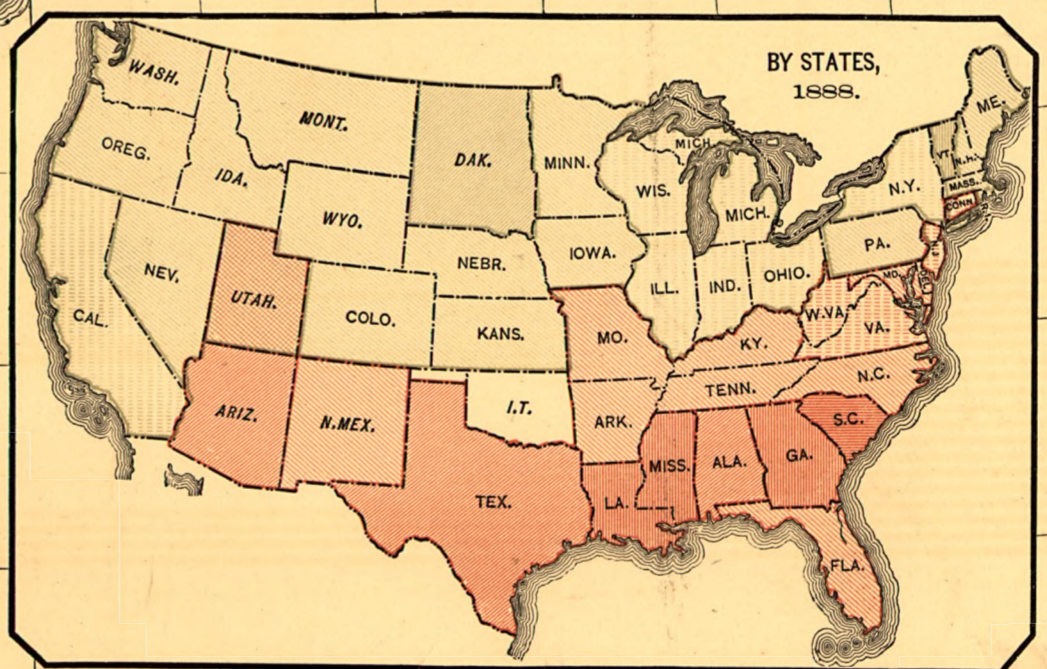

NOTE—These maps and charts are based on the corrected official returns except as noted below. In the case of eighteen states, the county vote (as at first furnished) when correctly added, did not give the reported state totals. The attention of the respective Secretaries of State was called to these discrepancies. The prompt acknowledgment from fourteen states resulted in the correction of about two hundred errors. The other four states have failed to respond, which leaves the slight discrepancies of a single vote in Florida, two votes in Ohio, and the more important ones of 1,107 in Arkansas, and 2,000 in Texas.
