


RANK OF STATES IN POPULATION AT EACH UNITED STATES CENSUS.


Notes.


TOTAL DOMAIN, SETTLED AREA, AND DENSITY OF POPULATION.

The Original Thirteen States, in Order of Rank in Population at the Census of 1880.







EXPLANATORY.

The color bars printed over the names of cities, indicate their relative population at each census. The arrow-head denotes the first entrance of a city into the list, and the arrow-head its final appearance and exit, owing either to a lack of the requisite population or to its incorporation with another city. The lists for 1880 and previous decades, include all cities of over five thousand population, while the subsequent lists embrace the forty most populous cities at each census.
