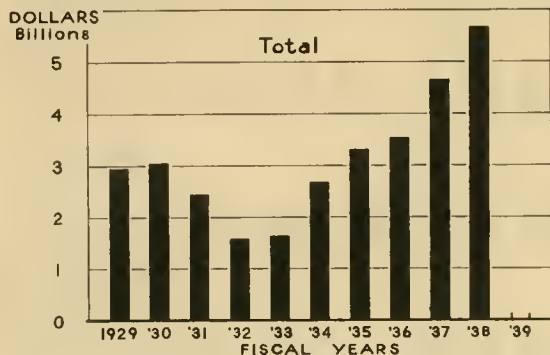

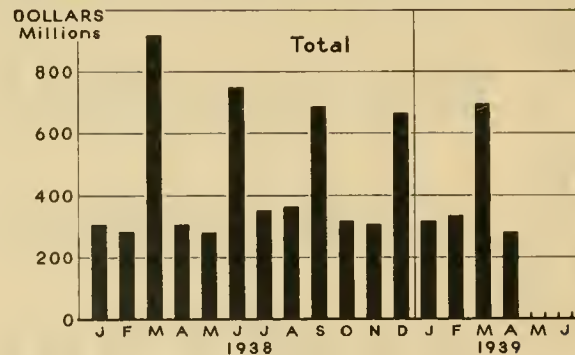

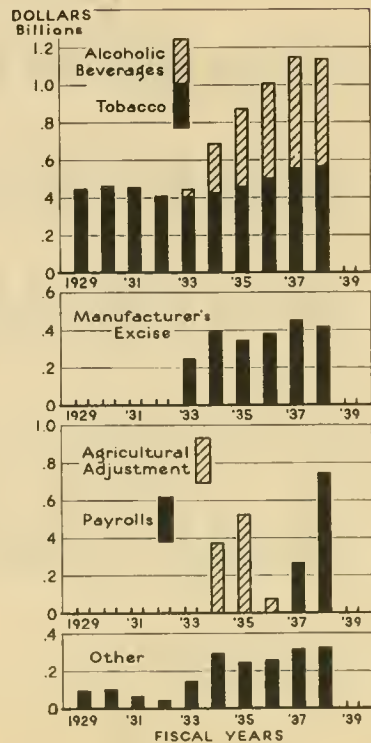
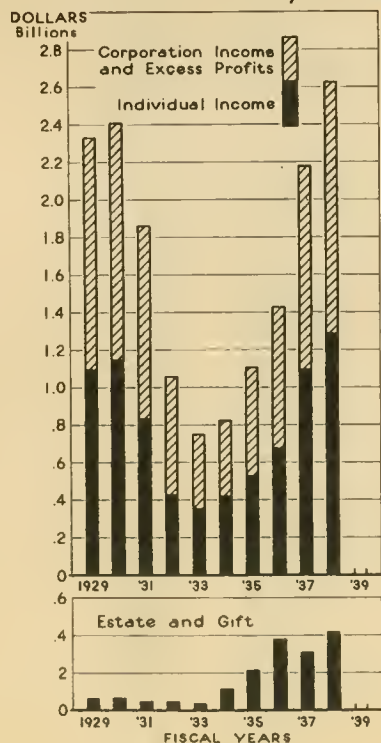
YEARLY, FISCAL YEARS 1929 TO 1938



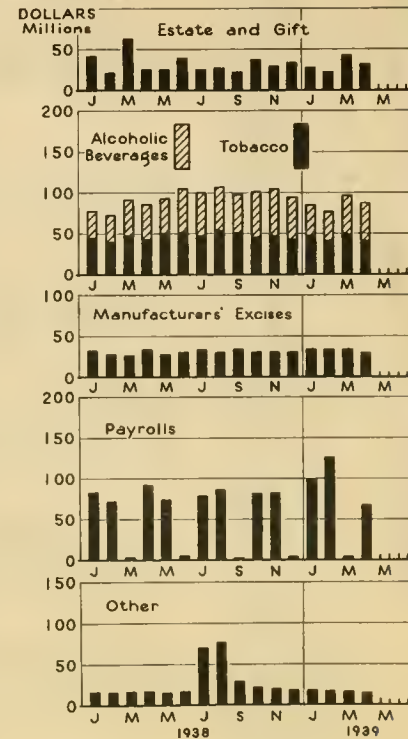
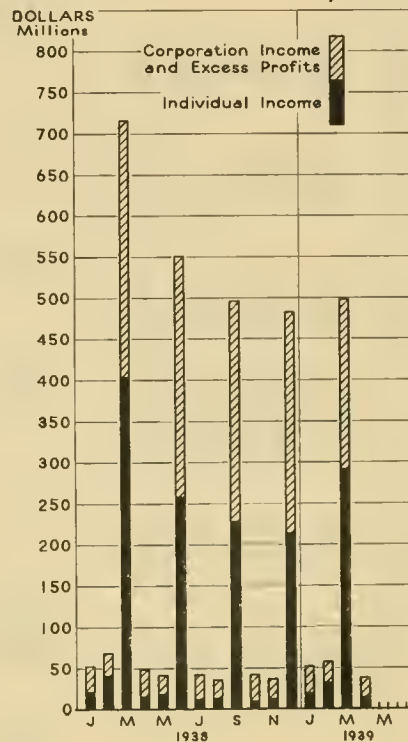
MONTHLY, JANUARY 1938 TO APRIL 1939

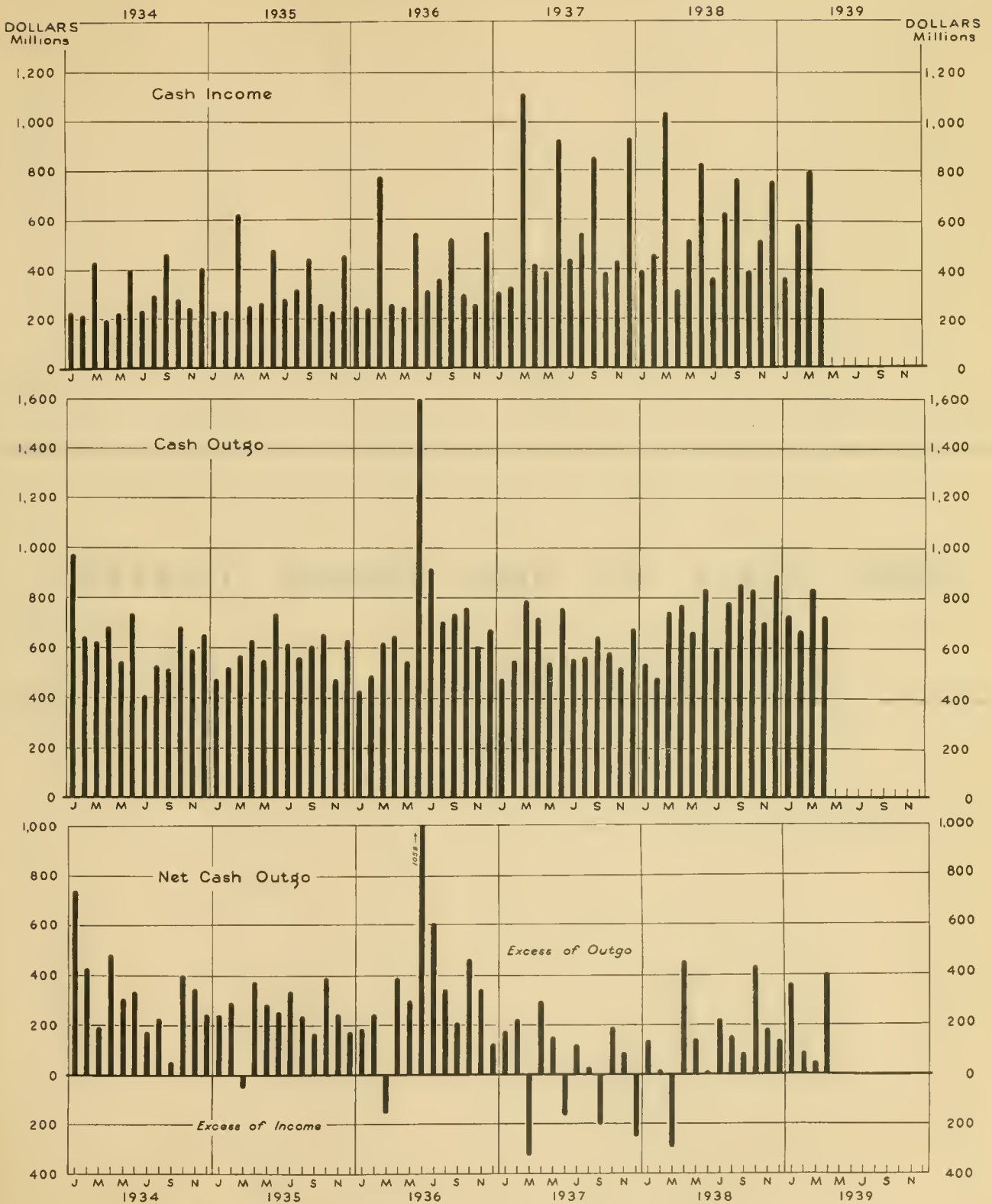

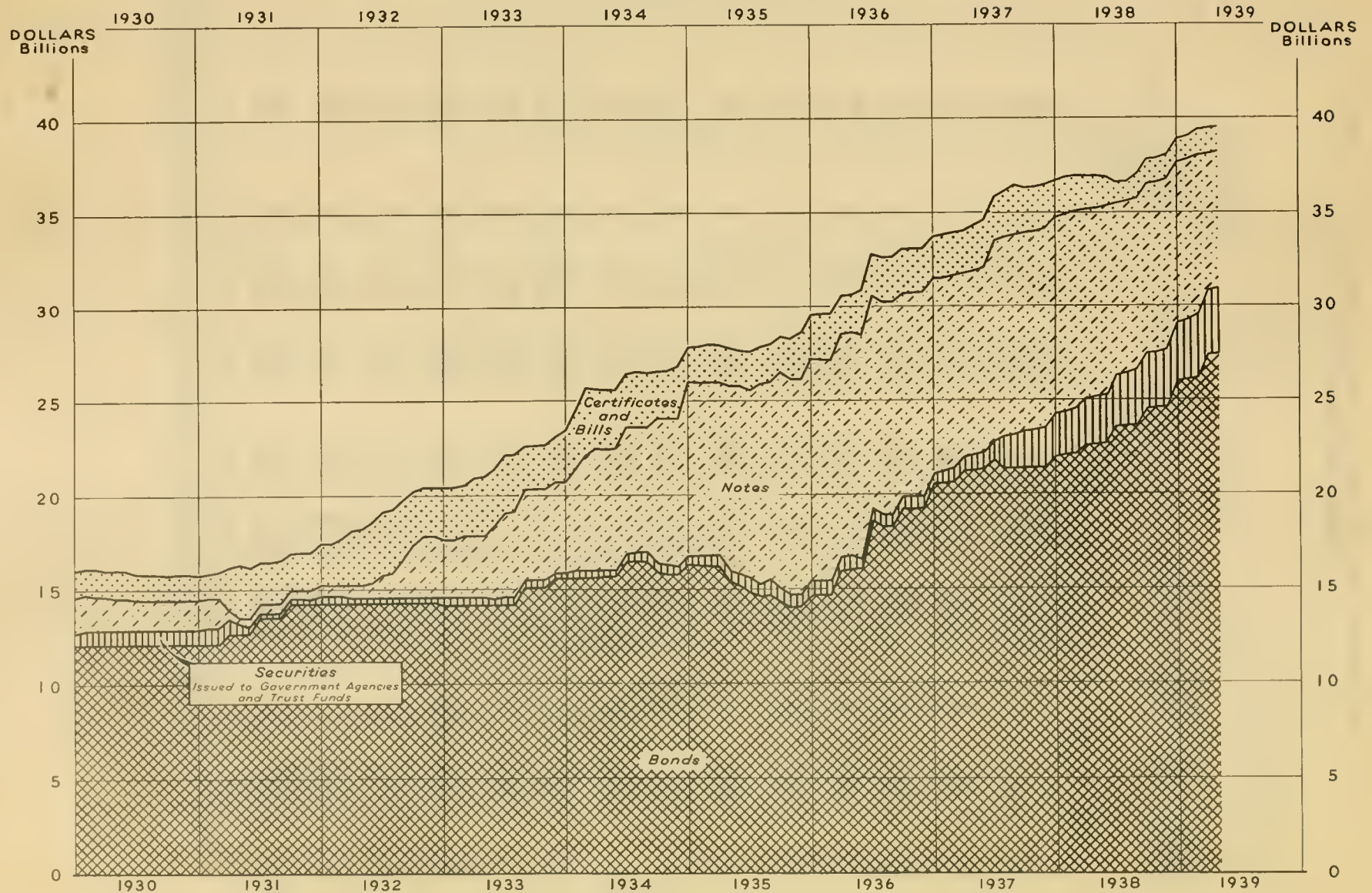






# COMPOSITION OF INTEREST-BEARING PUBLIC DEBT OUTSTANDING

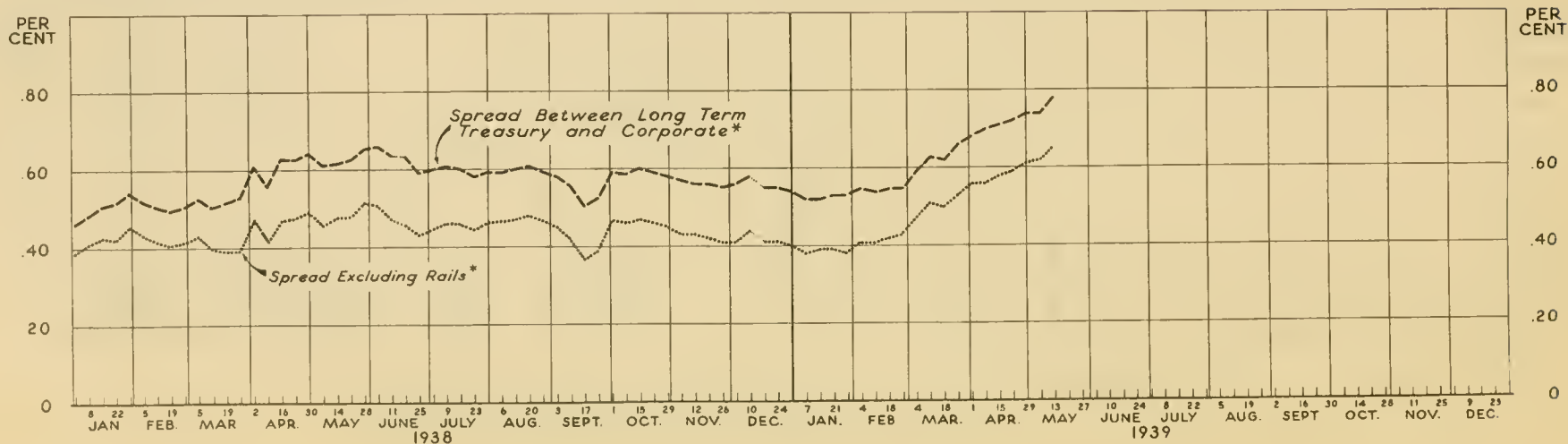
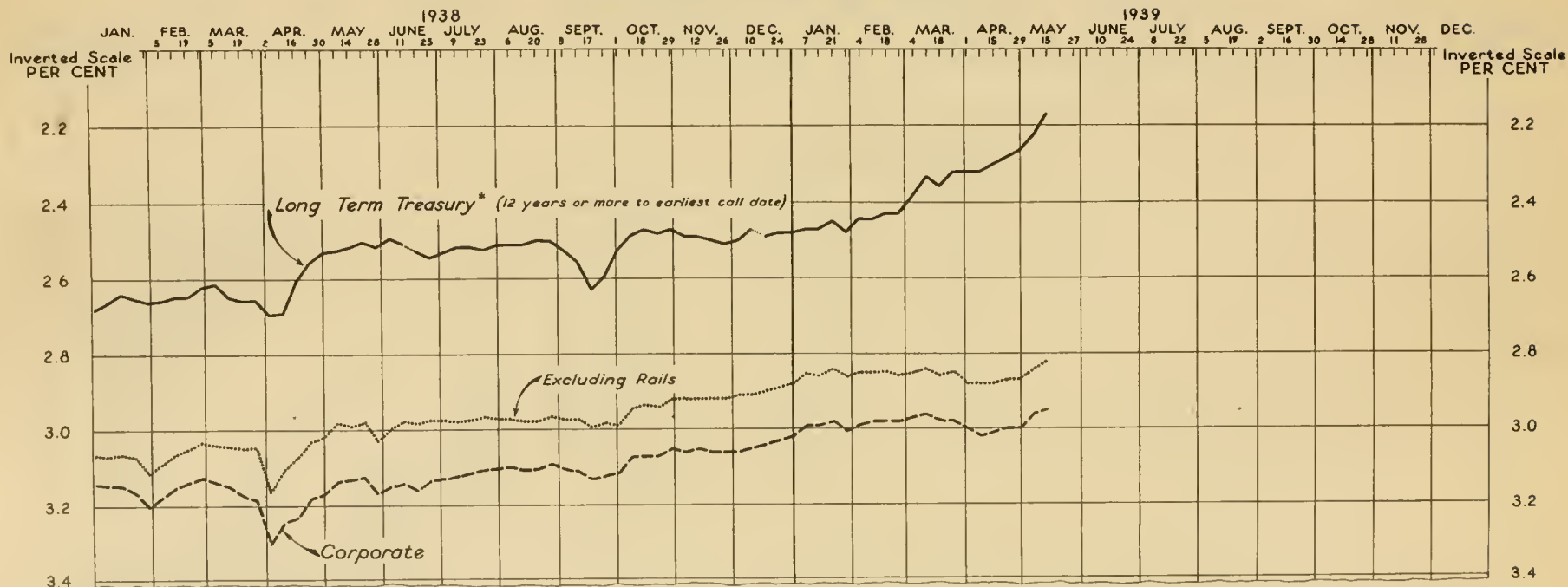

Yields Based on Saturday Quotations

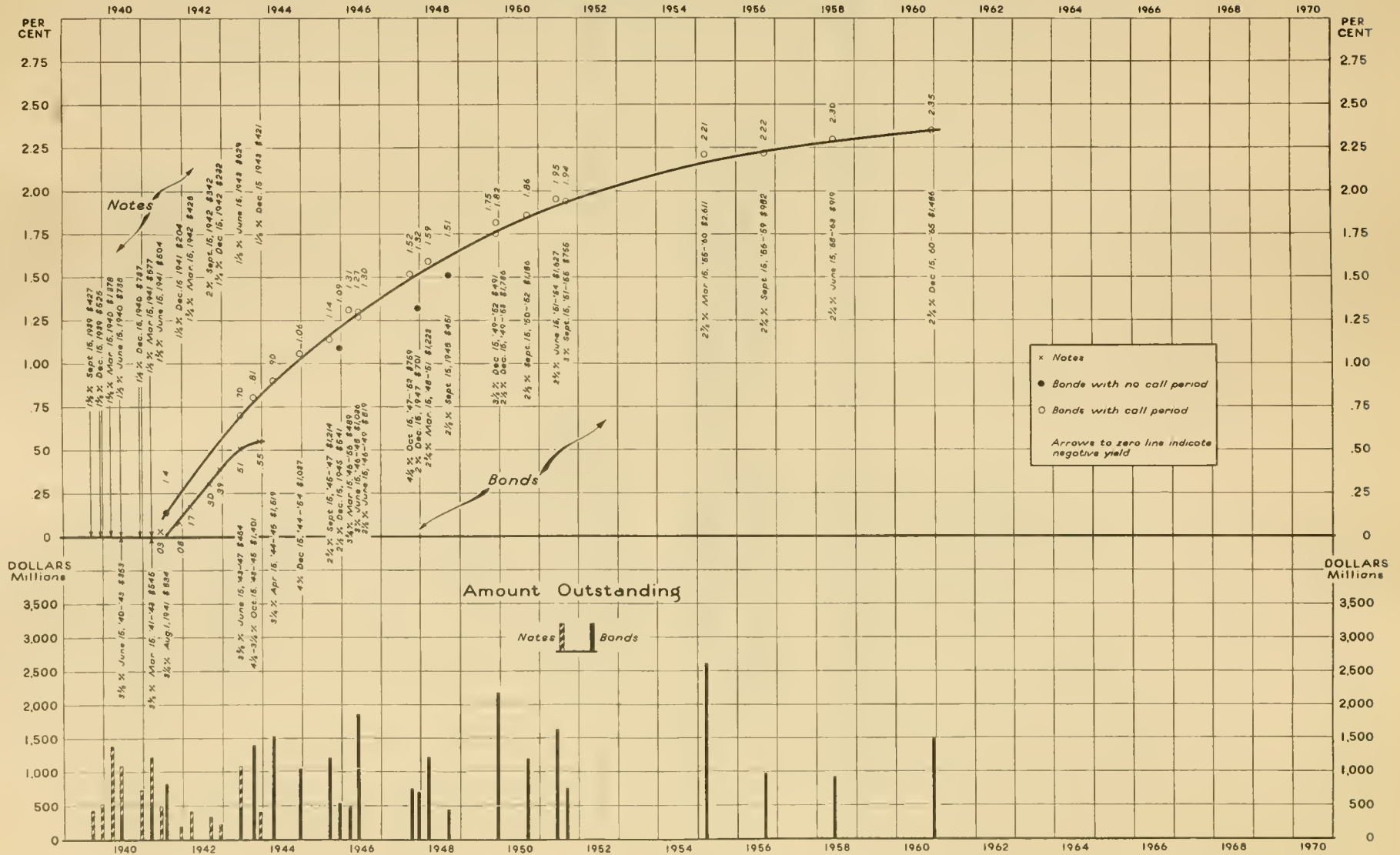
