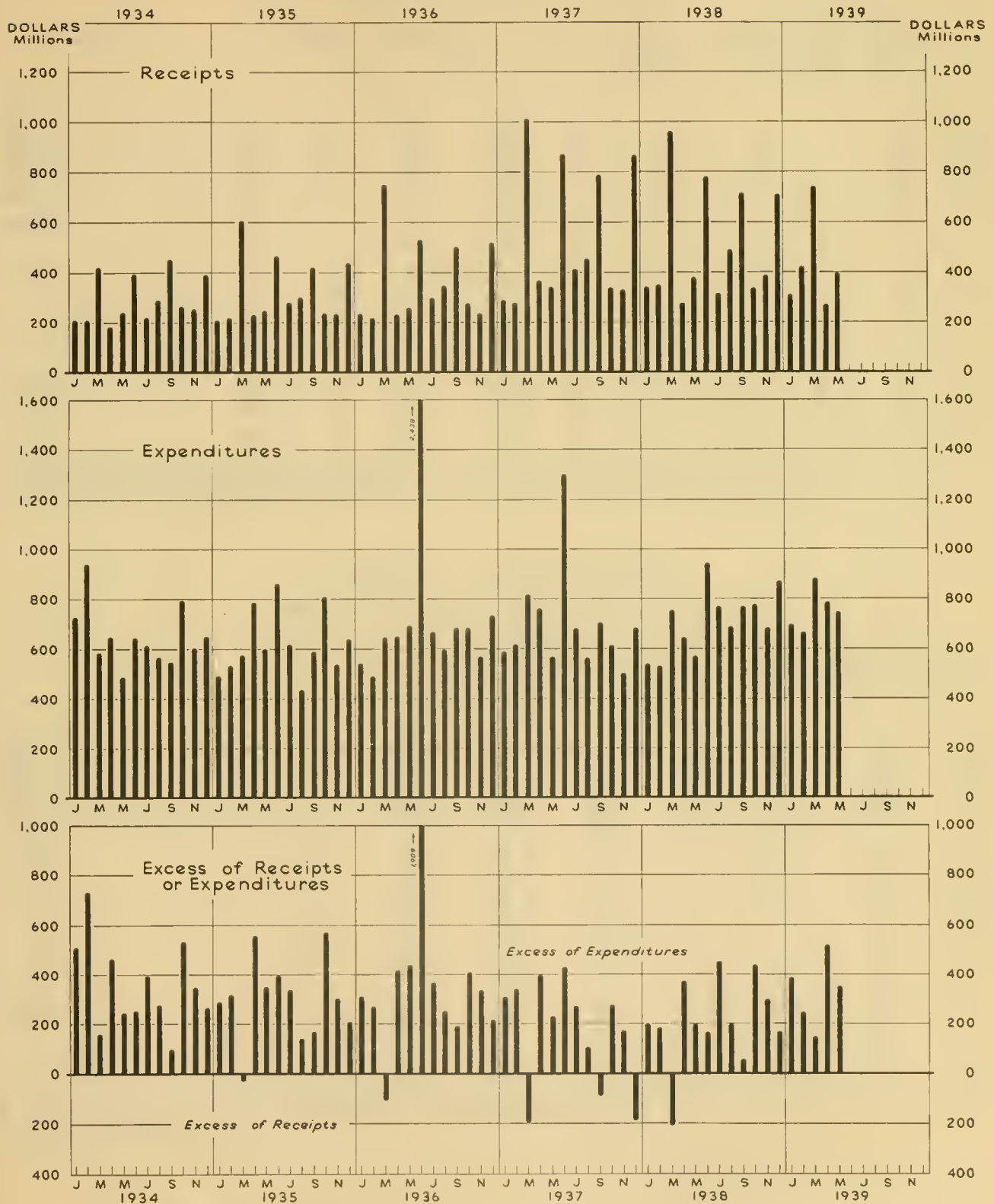

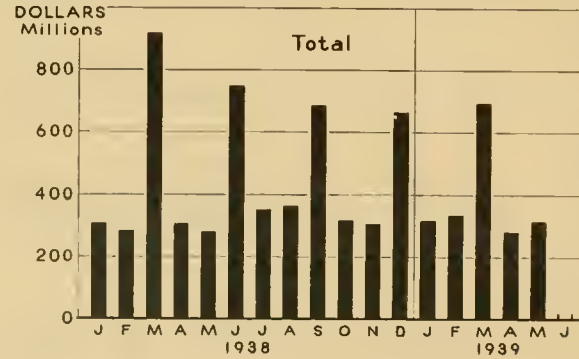

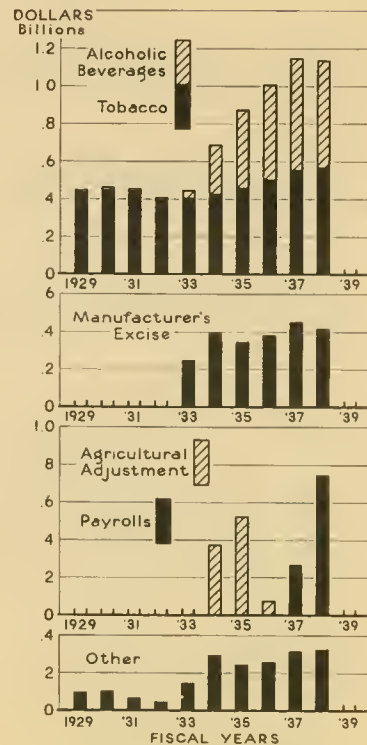
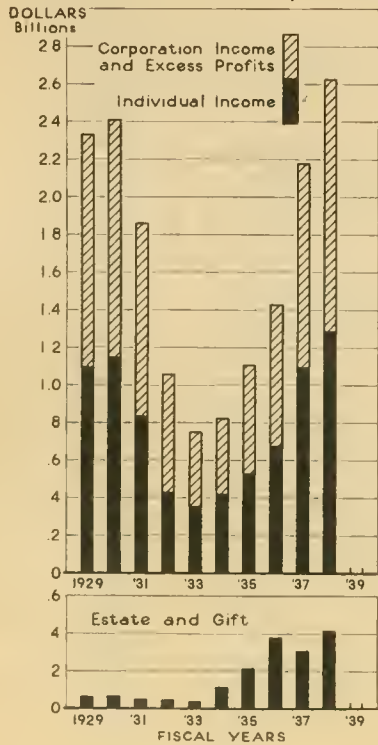
YEARLY, FISCAL YEARS 1929 TO 1938



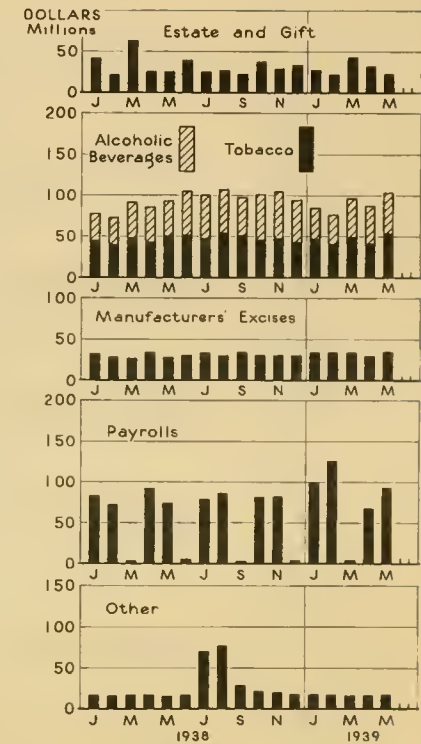
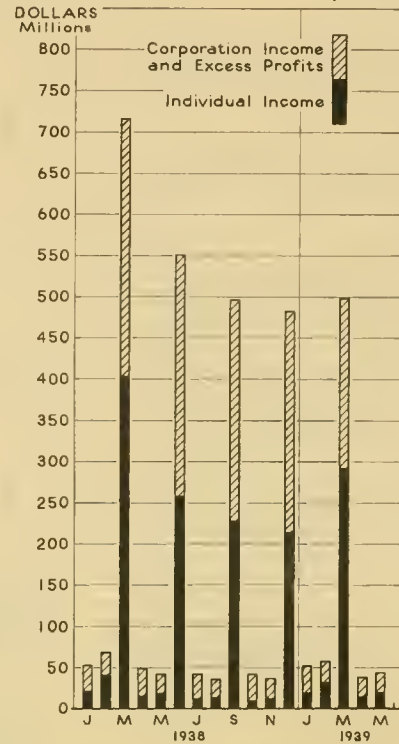
MONTHLY, JANUARY 1938 TO MAY 1939

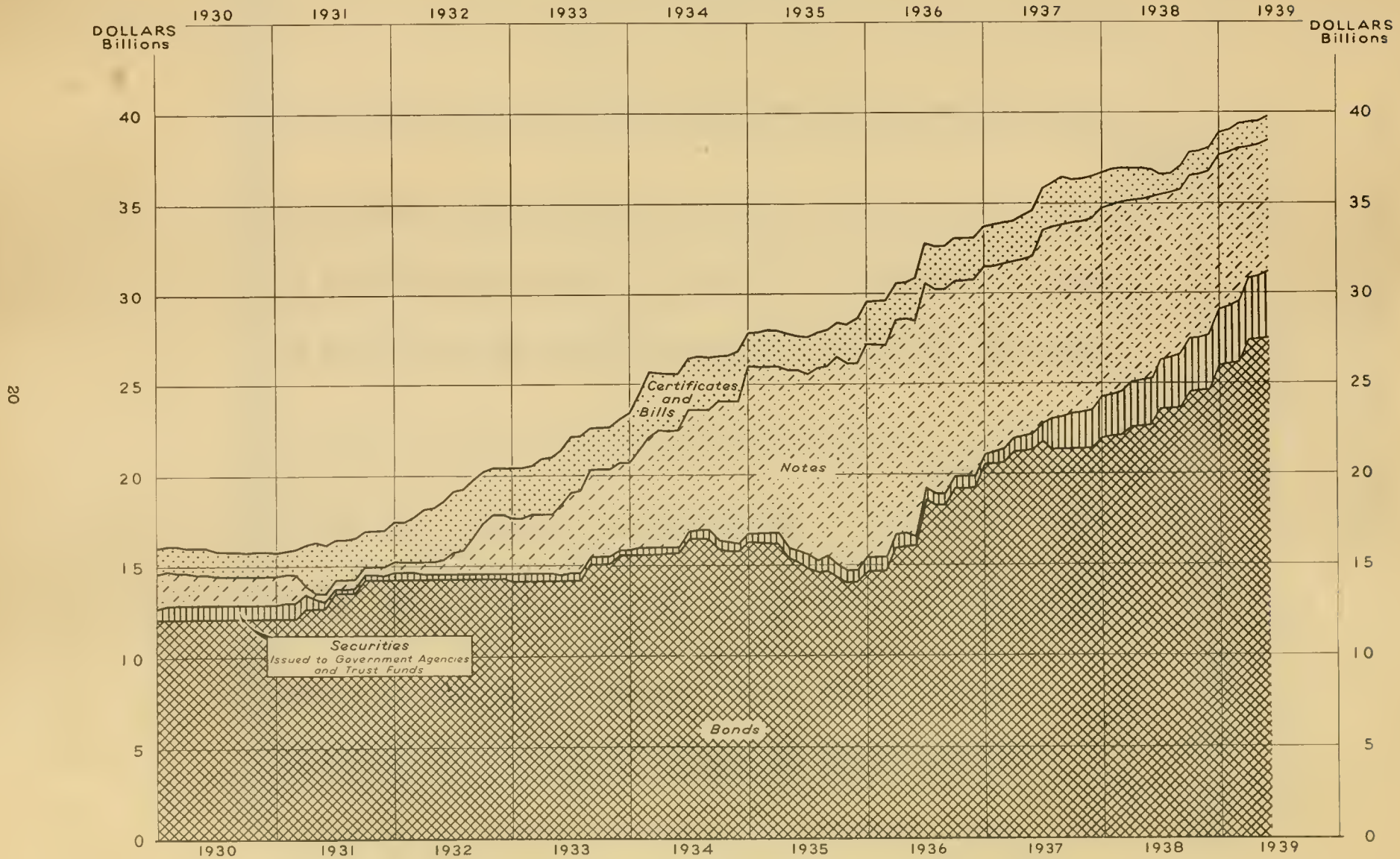

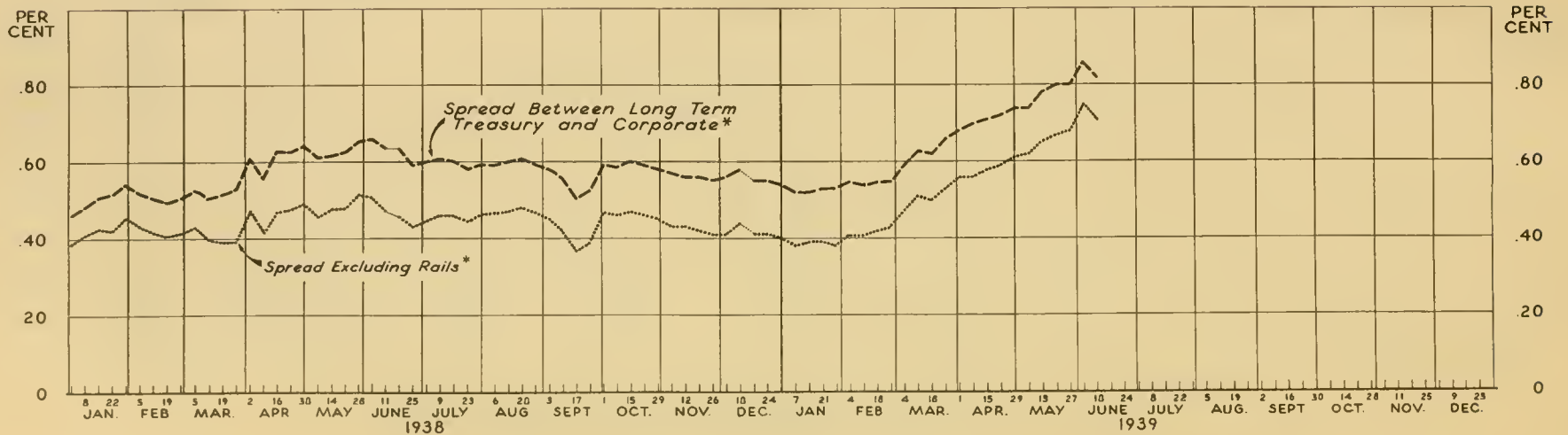
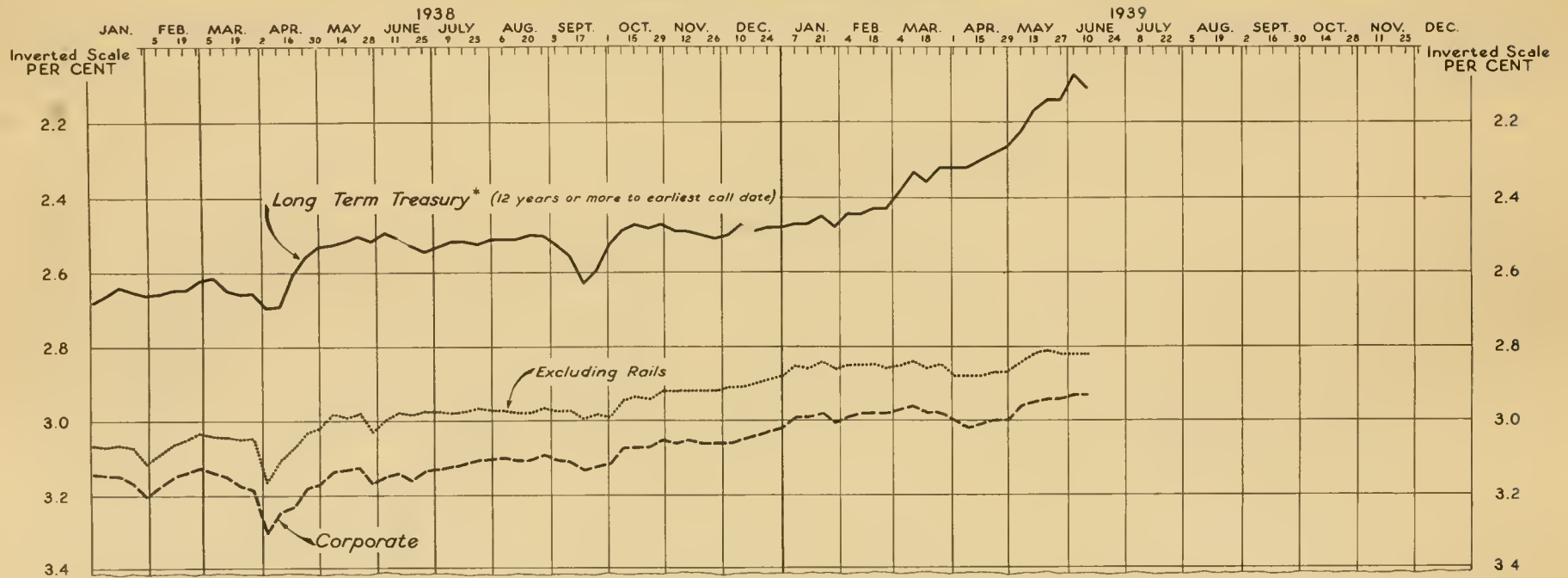

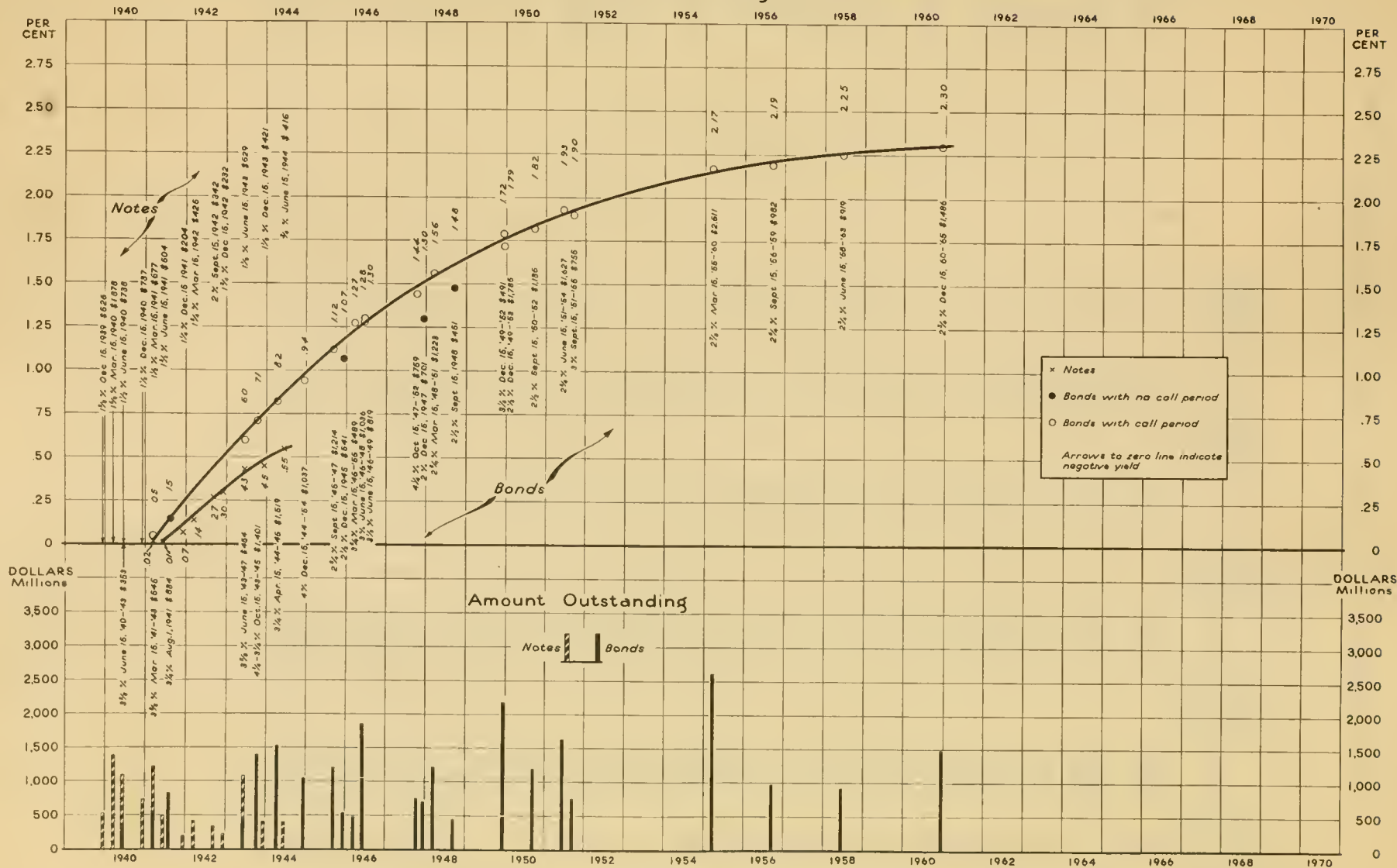
Yields Based on Saturday Quotations

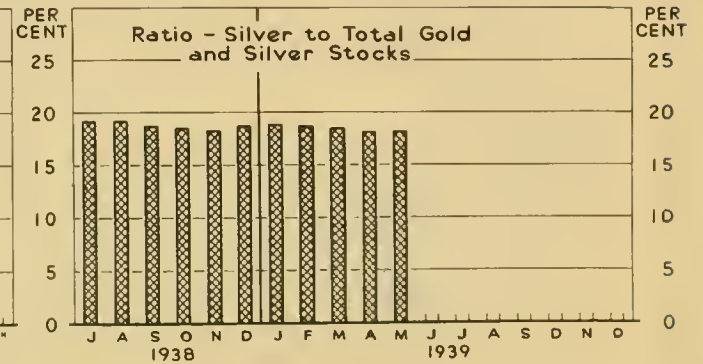
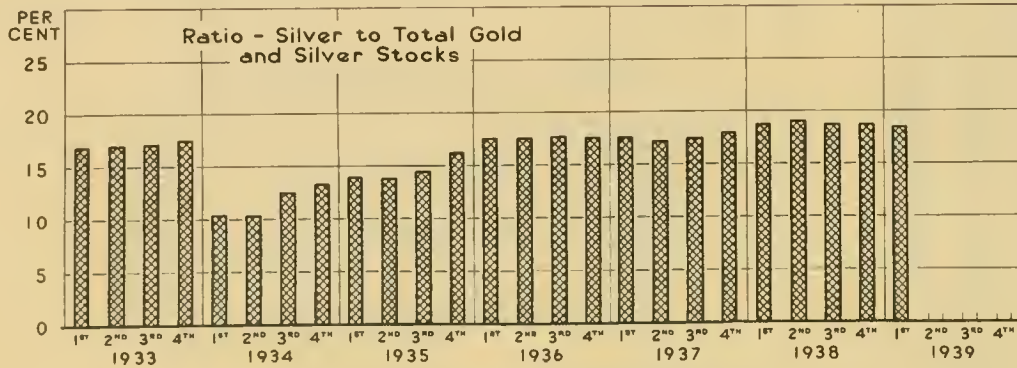
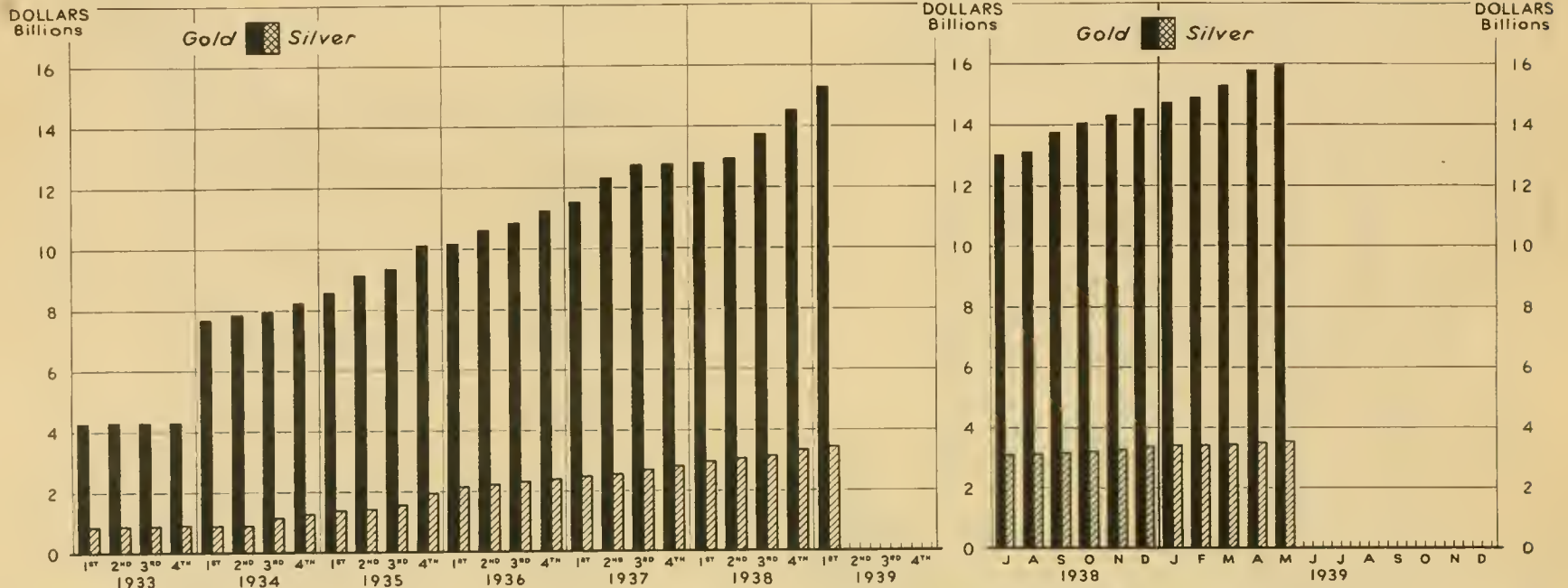
MONETARY STOCKS OF GOLD AND SILVER IN U.S.
