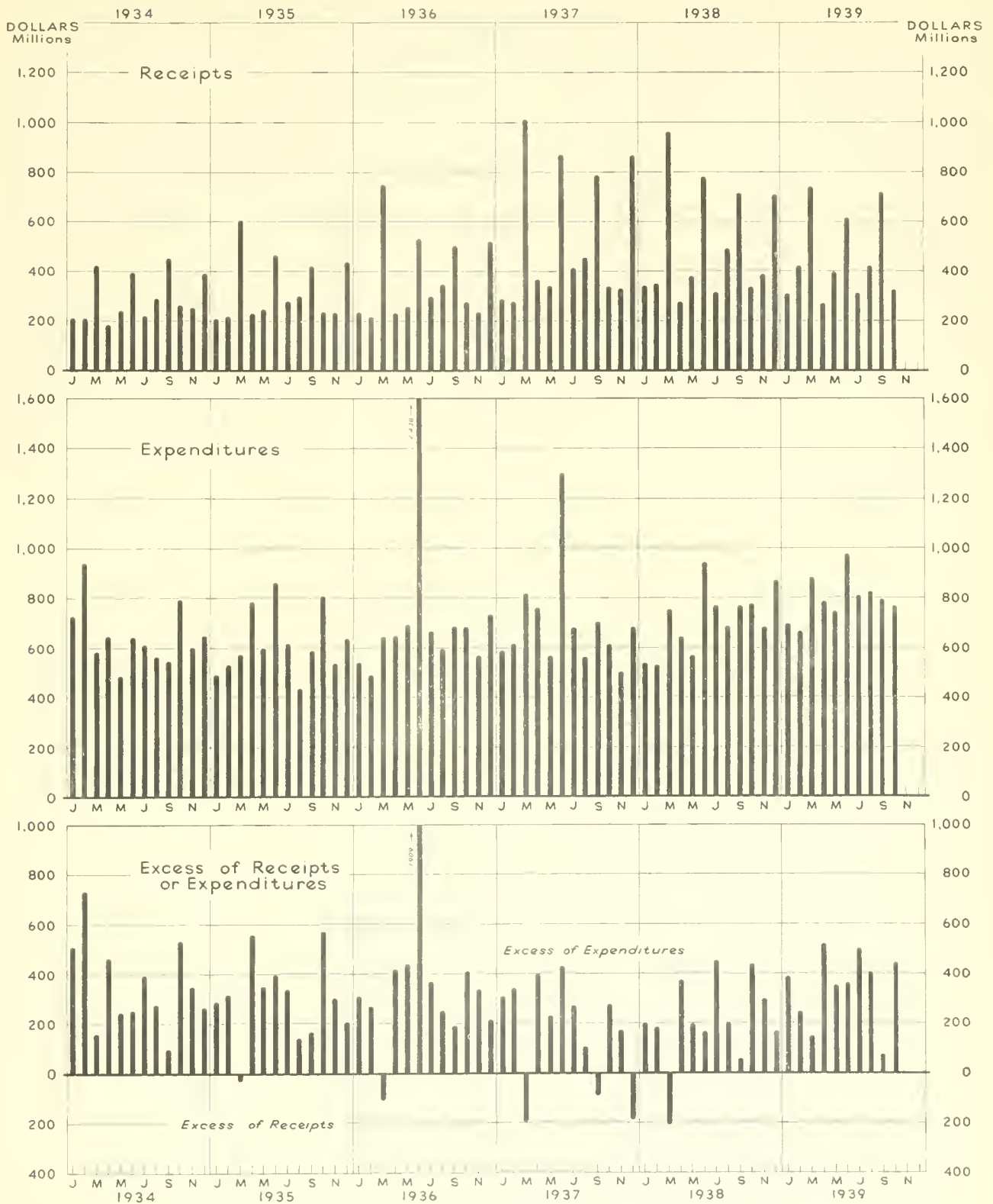

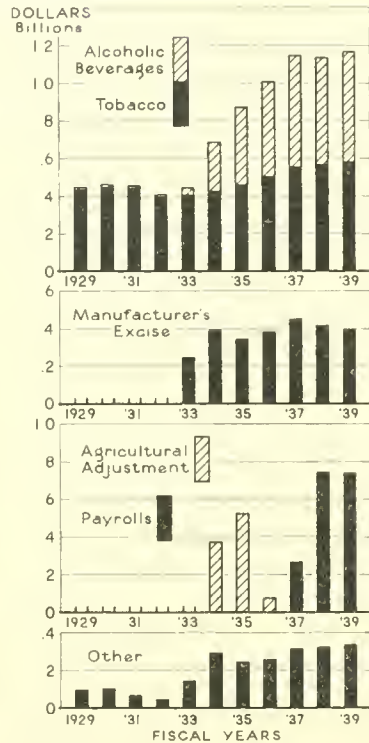
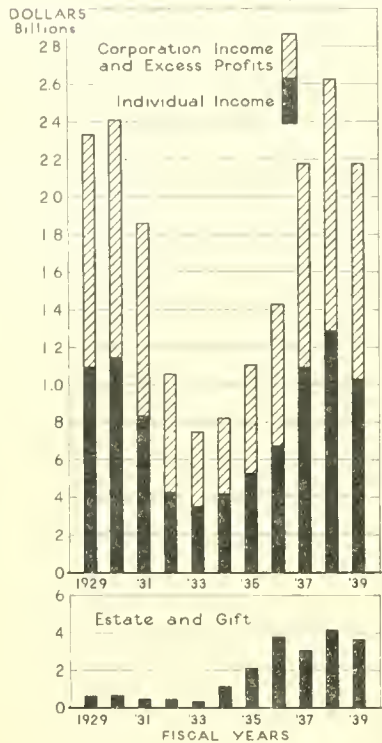
YEARLY, FISCAL YEARS 1929 TO 1939



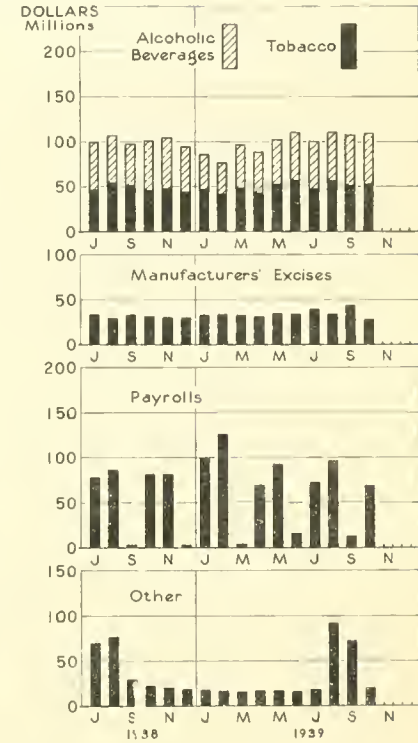
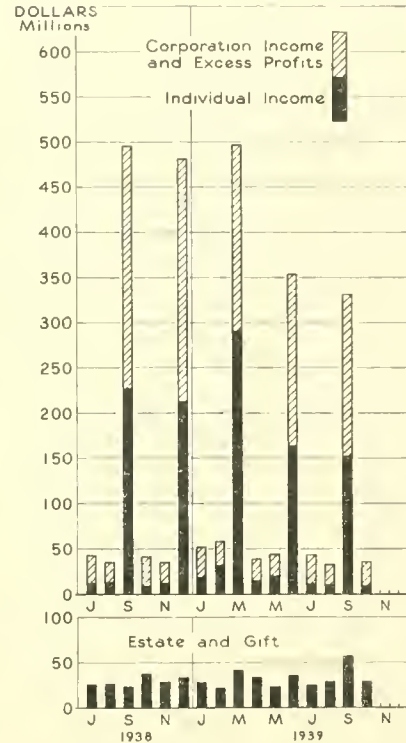
MONTHLY, JULY 1938 TO OCT. 1939

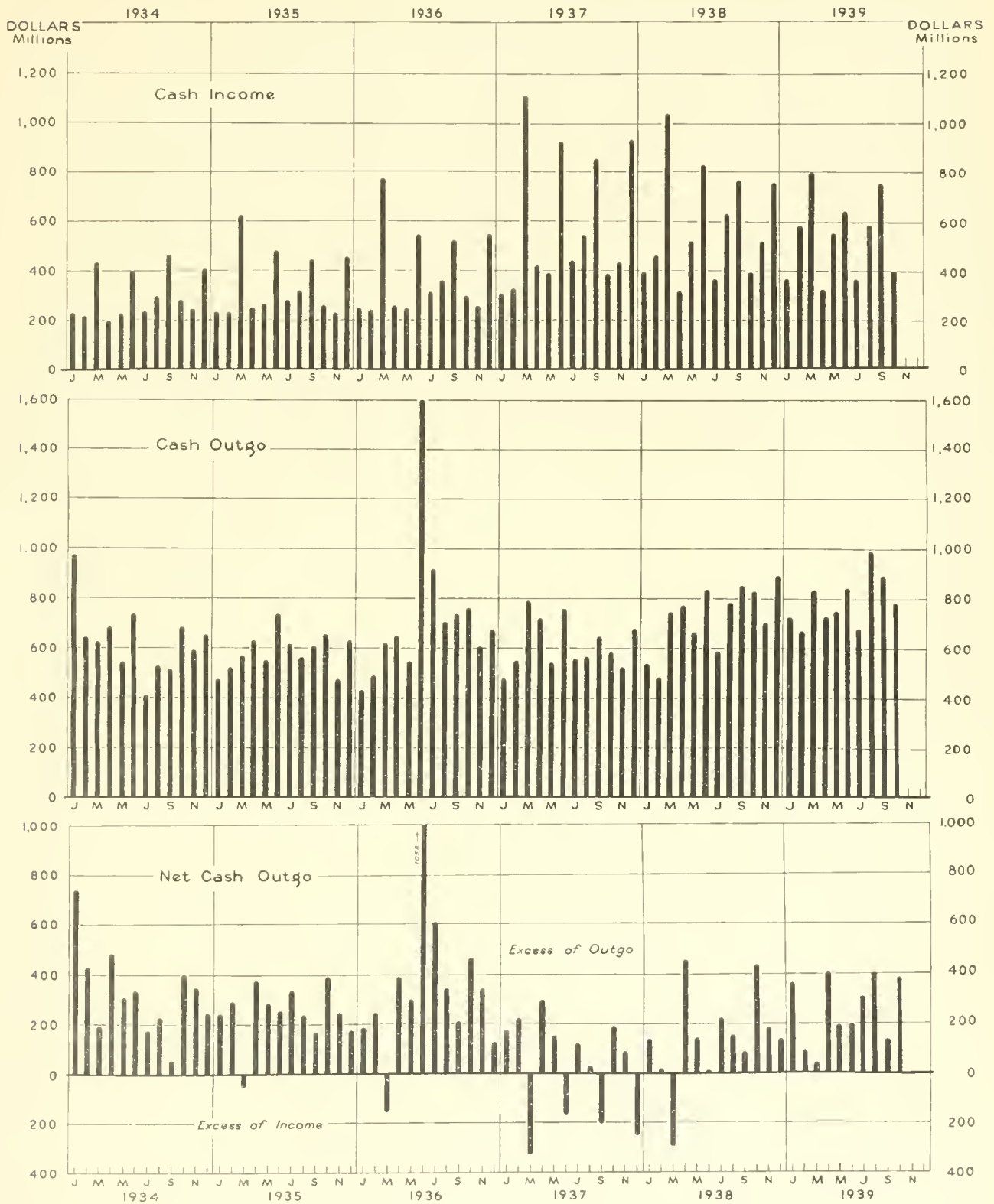

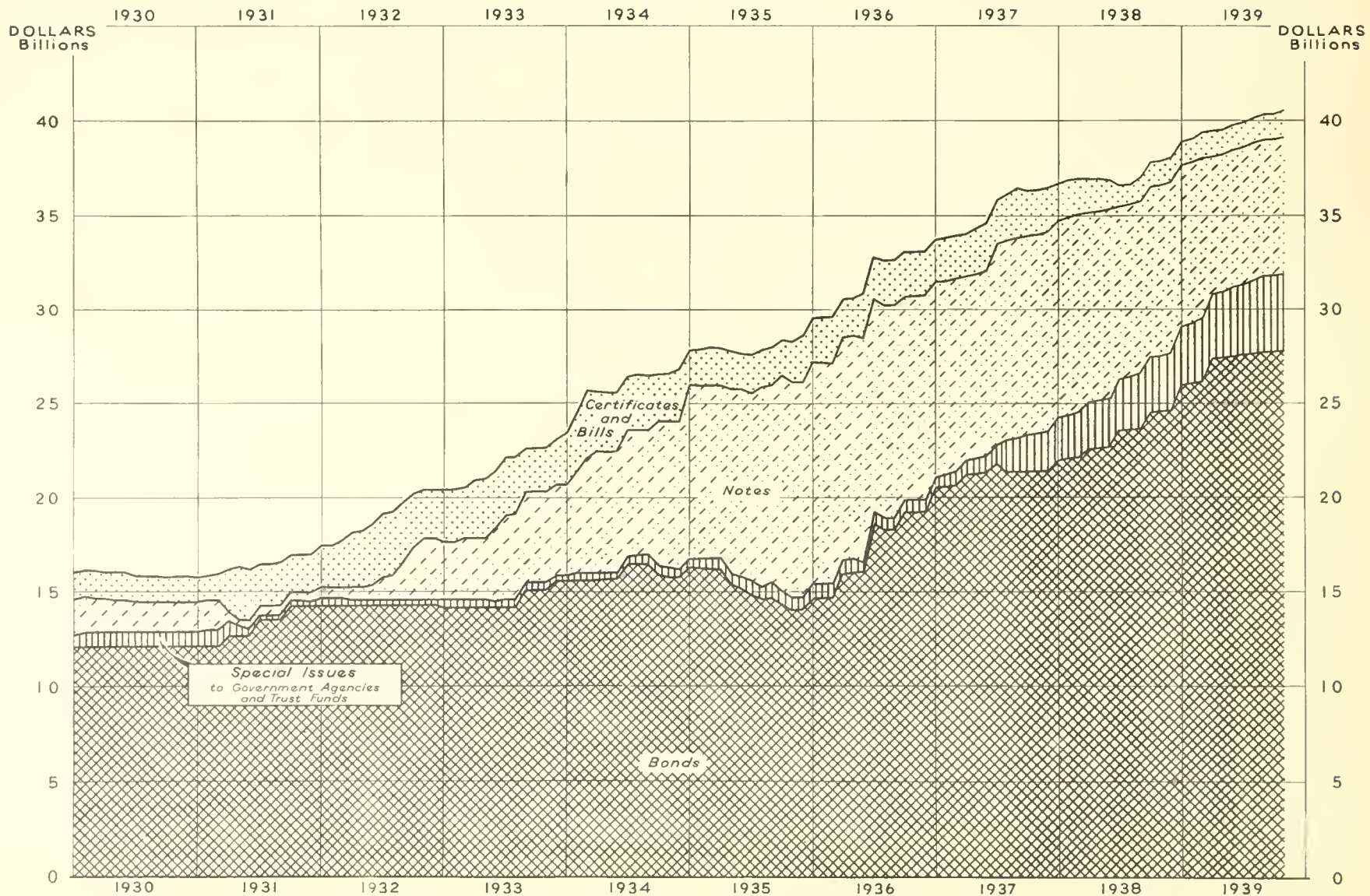

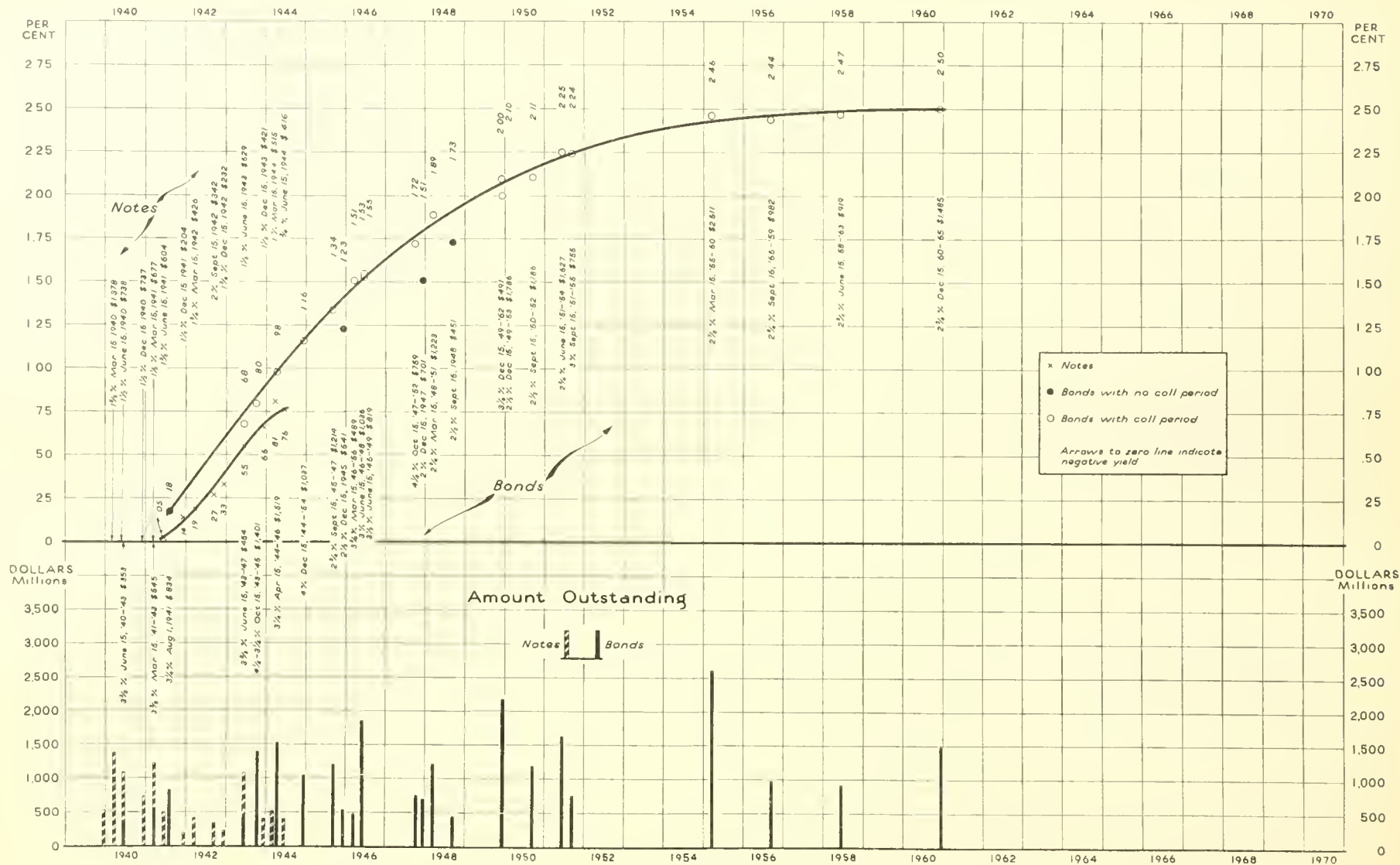

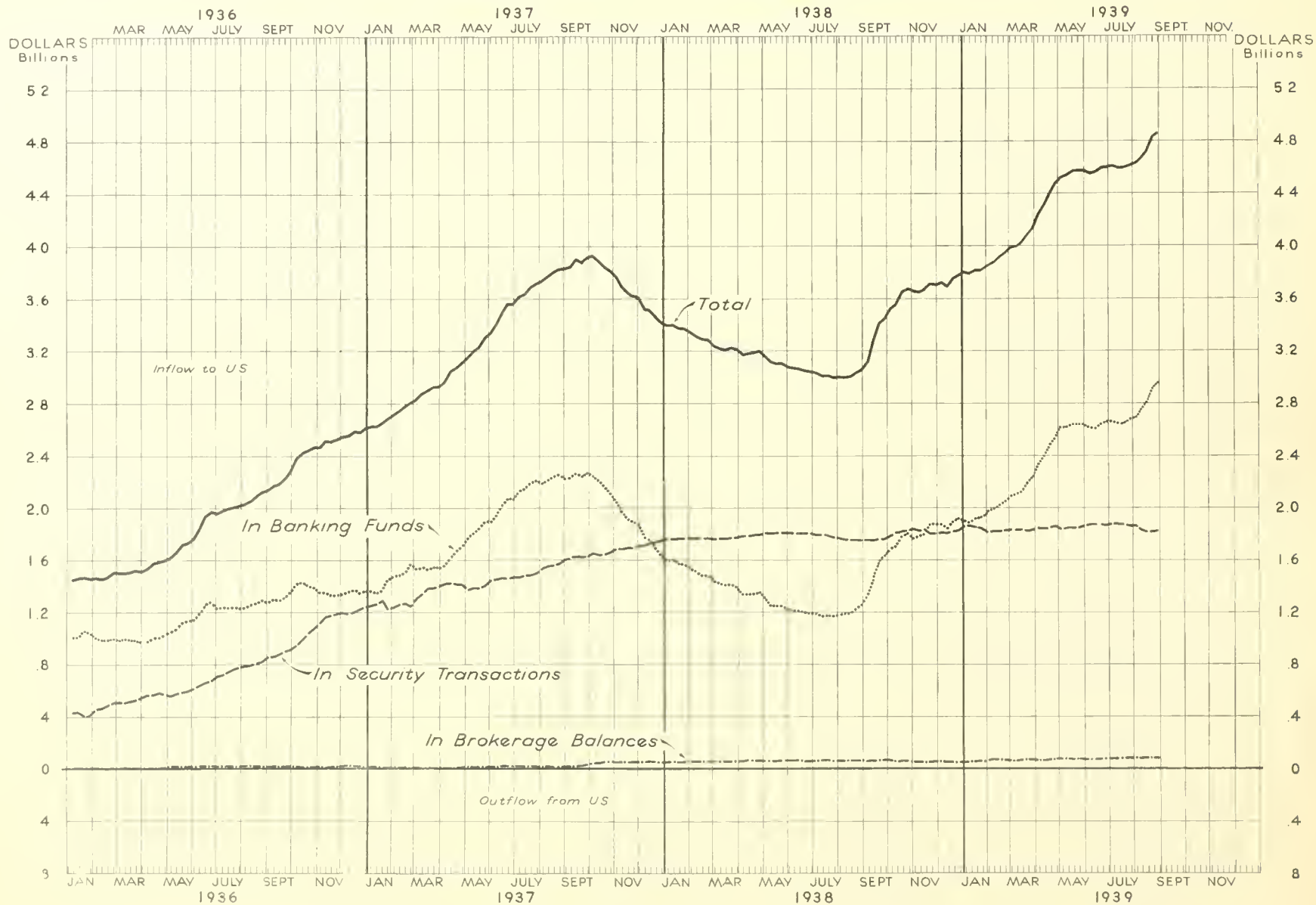

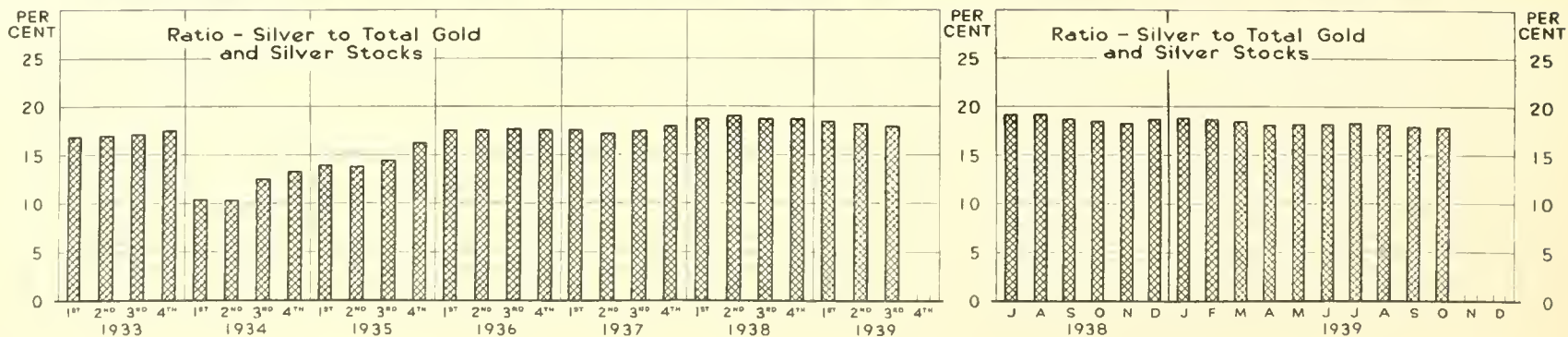
