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

Treasury Financing Operations

January Certificate Maturity

A one-year issue of 7/8 percent certificates of indebtedness outstanding in the amount of \$3,134 million matured on January 1, 1948. On December 19, 1947, the Secretary of the Treasury announced the offering of a new 12-month 1-1/8 percent certificate of indebtedness in exchange, par for par, for the maturing certificates. Cash subscriptions were not received. The new certificates are dated January 1, 1948, and bear interest from that date at the rate of 1-1/8 percent per annum. Interest will be paid in full with the principal on the maturity date, January 1, 1949. The certificates were issued in bearer form only, in denominations of \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000, \$100,000, and \$1,000,000.

Reports to the Treasury on the ownership of Government securities indicate that on November 30, 1947, about 66 percent of the \$3,134 million of certificates maturing January 1, 1948, were owned by commercial banks and Federal Reserve Banks. The ownership figures for November 30 are the latest which are available for holdings of both commercial banks and Federal Reserve Banks.

Subscription books were opened on December 19 and were closed at the close of business on December 27. Four hundred million dollars of the Federal Reserve Bank holdings of the maturing certificates of indebtedness were redeemed for cash. Exchange subscriptions for the new issue amounted to \$2,592 million, leaving \$142 million to be paid in cash to holders other than Federal Reserve Banks.

Treasury Bills Retired and Refunded in December

Additional reductions in Treasury bills outstanding were made in the first two weeks of December. The four issues maturing weekly during the month totaled \$5.0 billion and the total refunded was \$4.8 billion. Each of the first two maturing issues was reduced by \$100 million. The

first three maturities were for \$1.3 billion each, and the fourth for \$1.1 billion. Bill retirements from April 17, 1947, when the first bill reduction was made, through December 26 have totaled \$1.9 billion. The average rates of discount for the four December offerings, beginning with that dated December 4, were 0.944 percent, 0.945 percent, 0.949 percent, and 0.951 percent, respectively.

Reinvestment of Proceeds of Maturing Savings Bonds

Announcement was made by the Treasury Department on December 31, 1947, that in furtherance of the campaign to increase the sale of savings bonds, individual holders of Series C-1938 savings bonds, which started to mature January 1, 1948, would be permitted to reinvest the proceeds, as they mature, in Series E savings bonds currently on sale, without regard to the \$5,000 (maturity value) annual limitation on E bond holdings. Since Series E bonds may be purchased only in the names of individuals, only those Series C-1938 savings bonds held by individuals are eligible for this privilege.

Any issuing agent qualified to cash savings bonds can accomplish this exchange by redeeming matured bonds and applying the proceeds to the purchase of new Series E bonds. Holders are permitted to reinvest any part of the proceeds of their maturing bonds to the extent of such denominational amount as the proceeds fully cover. The bonds may be exchanged also, of course, at any Federal Reserve Bank or branch, or at the Treasury Department.

The new bonds will be dated as of the first day of the month in which the matured Series C-1938 savings bonds are presented for payment. In order to preserve the continuity of the investment, holders of the maturing bonds should present them for exchange during the month in which they mature.

and the remaining \$58 million represented redemption later in the fiscal year of notes assumed to have been acquired through the Exchange Stabilization Fund payment. Accordingly, the noncash payments to the Fund are made up of \$74 million from the Exchange Stabilization Fund payment and \$950 million from the budget payment. In the case of the International Bank, a total of \$76 million was paid during fiscal 1947 - all in the form of budget expenditures. On net balance, \$416 million occurred as a noncash expenditure because of the issuance of noninterest-bearing U. S. notes. Table 5 thus shows a total of \$2,180 million (net) of such notes issued to the two institutions in the fiscal year 1947. Budget estimates show that \$916 million of these notes will be redeemed in the fiscal year 1948, thereby increasing cash expenditures.

Statutory Limitation on the Public Debt and Guaranteed Obligations

Section 21 of the Second Liberty Bond Act, as amended, provides that the face amount of obligations issued under authority of that Act, and the face amount of obligations guaranteed as to principal and interest by the United States (except guaranteed obligations held by the Secretary of the Treasury), shall not ex-

ceed in the aggregate \$275 billion outstanding at any one time. Obligations issued on a discount basis, and subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the owner, are included in the statutory debt limitation at current redemption values.

Sales and Redemptions of United States Savings Bonds

United States savings bonds were first offered for sale in March 1935. Series A-D were sold from March 1935 to April 1941. Series E, F, and G bonds have been on sale since May 1, 1941. For information on the terms and conditions of these bonds, see "Treasury Bulletin" issues for December 1947, page 31, and October 1935, pages A-4 and A-5. Sales and redemptions data by States are published at the end of each calendar and each fiscal year after June 30, 1947. Sales by denominations are also published semi-annually after December 31, 1947.

In the following tables sales figures are quoted at issue price, and redemptions and amounts outstanding at current redemption values. Amounts of Series G outstanding are quoted at par. Matured bonds which have been redeemed are included in the figures on redemptions. Matured bonds outstanding are reflected in the interest-bearing debt until all bonds of the series have matured, when they are transferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased.

Sales and Redemptions of Treasury Savings Notes

Treasury savings notes have been issued in three series: series A from August 1, 1941, through June 22, 1943; series B from August 1, 1941 through September 12, 1942; and series C on continuous sale since September 14, 1942. For details concerning terms and conditions, investment yields, and tax payment or redemption values of series C notes, see "Treasury Bulletin" for October 1945, pages A-4 and A-5. For similar information regarding series A and B notes, see "Annual Report of the Secretary of the Treasury" for 1942, pages 207 and 220. For sales and redemptions of series A and B notes by fiscal years

and months, see "Treasury Bulletin" for February 1946, pages 42 and 43.

In the following tables sales and redemptions of Treasury savings notes are shown at par value. Matured notes redeemed (either for cash or for tax payment) are included in the figures on redemptions. Matured notes outstanding are reflected in the interest-bearing debt until all notes of the series have matured, when they are transferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased, in accordance with the practice of the Daily Treasury Statement.

**Treasury Survey of Ownership of Securities Issued by the United States
and by Federal Agencies, November 30, 1947**

The Treasury Survey of Ownership covers securities issued by the United States Government and by Federal agencies. The banks and insurance companies included in the Survey account for approximately 95 percent of such securities held by all banks and insurance companies in the United States.

Information on the distribution of ownership by types of banks and insurance companies is published each month. Additional information showing the holdings of commercial banks distributed according to Federal Reserve member-bank classes and nonmember banks has been published at less frequent intervals. Currently,

this information is published for June 30 and December 31.

The Survey began with data for March 31, 1941, which appeared in the "Treasury Bulletin" for May of that year. Revisions of data on insurance companies for May 31, 1943, and prior months appeared in the November 1943 issue; reclassification of data on banks for the period November 30, 1943, through February 29, 1944, appeared in the May 1944 issue; and revisions of data for September 30, 1944, appeared in the February 1945 issue.







**Capital Movements Between the United States and Foreign Countries,
and Net Position in Foreign Currencies**

This chapter on Capital Movements between the United States and Foreign Countries and Position in Foreign Currencies is divided into four main groups. Section I of Capital Movements, the Historical Summary, contains data regarding capital movements by the principal types of data, and by years from 1935, and currently by months. Each type of data is then broken down into its chief components in the same chronological detail.

Section II supplies a geographic breakdown by principal countries on a monthly basis. The total capital movements are given first and then the principal categories are shown separately. In addition, at this point, the total outstanding claims on and liabilities to foreign countries are each presented.

Details with respect to capital movements and short-term claims and liabilities are presented in Section III as of the latest month for which the data are available.

The last group contains monthly data regarding the

net position in foreign currencies of United States banks and brokers, their outstanding foreign exchange contracts, and purchases and sales of foreign exchange, both spot and forward.

These data are based on reports filed each month by banks, bankers, and brokers throughout the United States. The reports are collected, checked, and tabulated by the twelve Federal Reserve Banks. The totals are then forwarded to the Treasury Department for consolidation and publication.
