#### Treasury Financing Operations.

### September-October Certificate and Note Maturities

On August 9, the Sacretary of the Treasury announced as a further anti-inflationary move the raising of the rates on new short-term Government securities. The Sacretary stated his intention to offer a one-year 1-1/4 percent certificate in exchange for the two issues of 1 percent certificates and the 1 percent Treasury notes maturing October 1, and to offer a 1-3/8 percent Treasury note maturing April 1, 1950, in exchange for the four and one-half year 1-1/2 percent Treasury notes maturing on September 15. It was stated also that the rate of interest on Treasury savings notes would be adjusted and made effective on the new issue available September 1.

The announcement stated further that the 2-1/2 percent partially tax-exempt Treasury bonds maturing in the amount of \$451 million on September 15, 1948, would be paid off in cash. The Secretary said also that there would be no change in the Government's policy with regard to the long-term Treasury bonds.

Subscription books for the 1-3/8 percent Treasury notes were opened September 1 and were closed at the close of business on September 3. Subscriptions were invited at par, in exchange for the 1-1/2 percent Treasury notes maturing September 15, 1948. The new notes were dated September 15, 1948, and bear interest from that date at the rate of 1-3/8 percent per annum, payable on a semi-annual basis on April 1 and October 1, 1949, and April 1, 1950. They will mature April 1, 1950, and will not be subject to call for redemption prior to maturity. The notes were issued in bearer form only in denominations of \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000, \$100,000, and \$1,000,000.

Reports to the Treasury on the ownership of Government securities indicate that on July 30, 1948, about 73 percent of the \$3,748 million of the 1-1/2 percent notes maturing September 15 were owned by Federal Reserve Banks and reporting commercial banks, and about 75 percent of the \$451 million of the 2-1/2 percent bonds maturing September 15 were owned by reporting commercial banks. The ownership figures for July 30 are the latest which are available for holdings of commercial banks. Subscriptions for the new 1-3/8 percent notes totaled \$3,596 million, leaving \$152 million to be paid in cash.

#### Call of 2 Percent Treasury Bonds of 1948-50

On August 13, the Secretary announced that all outstanding 2 percent Treasury bonds of 1948-50, dated December 8, 1939, are called for redemption on December 15, 1948. The announcement stated that holders of these bonds may, in advance of the redemption date, be offered the privilege of exchanging all or part of their called bonds for other interest-bearing obligations of the United States, in which event public notice will hersafter be given.

#### Treasury Savings Notes, Series D

Details of the new Treasury savings notes, Series D, which became available for purchase on September 1, 1948, and the ending of the sale of Treasury savings notes, Series C, at the close of business August 31, were announced by the Treasury on August 18.

The new notes of Series D will be dated as of the first day of the month in which purchased, will mature three years thereafter, and will be issued at par. Interest on the notes will accrue each month from month of issue, on a graduated scale, the equivalent yield if held to maturity being approximately 1.40 percent per annum. The amount of accrual each month on each \$1,000 principal amount of notes, from month of issue to month of maturity, follows:

The Secretary also announced that the period during which the new notes may not be submitted for cash redemption has been decreased from aix months to four months from month of issue.

Like Series C, the new notes of Series D will be available for use in payment of income, state, and gift taxes imposed by the Internal Revenue Code and assessed against the owner of the notes or his estate. If not presented in payment of taxes, and except for those in the names of banks that accept demand deposits, the notes of Series D will be redeemable at par and

accrued interest, either at maturity or during and after the fourth calendar month after the month of issue. If inscribed in the name of a bank that accepts demand deposits, the notes will be accepted at par and accrued interest in payment of taxes, but redeemed for cash at or before maturity only at the purchase price, or par.

had been resumed in July, were continued in August. The four issues maturing during the month totaled \$4.0 billion and the amount refunded was \$3.6 billion. Each new issue, beginning with that dated August 5, was \$100 million less than the amount of that maturing. The average rate of discount on the first two issues was 0.997 percent, on the third was 1.066 percent, and on the fourth, 1.072 percent.

The Treasury Survey of Ownership covers securities issued by the United States Government and by Federal agencies. The banks and insurance companies included in the Survey account for approximately 95 percent of such securities held by all banks and insurance companies in the United States. Data were first published for March 31, 1941.

Information on the distribution of ownership by types of banks and insurance companies is published each month. Additional information showing the holdings of commercial banks distributed according to Federal Reserve member-bank classes and nonmember banks is published for June 30 and December 31.



The figures in this column are not cumulative; as the amount of bullion held changes, the potential seigniorage thereon changes.

Information relating to capital movements between the United States and foreign countries is presented in four sections. Section I contains the principal types of data on capital movements by years from 1935, and ourrently by months. Each type of data is then broken down into its chief components in the same chronological detail.

Section II supplies a geographic breakdown by principal countries for recent months. The total net capital movement is given first and then the principal categories are shown separately. In addition, at this point, the total outstanding claims on and liabilities to foreign countries are each presented.

Section III presents details with respect to capital movements and short-term claims and liabilities as of the latest month for which the data are available.

Section IV contains data for recent months on outstanding contracts of banks for forward purchases and sales of foreign exchange.

The data in these four sections are based on reports filed each month by banks, bankers, and brokers throughout the United States. The reports are collected, ohecked, and tabulated by the twelve Federal Reserve Banks. The totals are then forwarded to the Treasury Department for consolidation and publication.

Publication of detailed figures on capital movements was discontinued between the March 1942 and the November 1945 issues of the "Treasury Bulletin", but data omitted during that period were supplied in the November 1945 issue and supplement.


