## Treasury Financing Operations

## September-October Certificate and Note Maturities

On August 9, the Saoretary of the Treasury announoed as a further anti-inflationary move the raiaing of the rates on new ahort-term Government seouritiea. The Sacretary atated bia intention to offar a one-yaar l-1/4 parcant cartifloata in axohange for the two $18 a \operatorname{se}$ of 1 percent oartificates and the 1 peroant Treasury notes maturing Ootober 1 , and to offar a $1-3 / 8$ peroent Treaaury note maturing April 1, 1950, in exohanga for the four and one-half yaar $1-1 / 2$ paroant Treasury notea inaturing on saptemoer 25 . It was statad alao that the rata of intarest on Trasary sav--Ings notes would be adjusted and made affeotive on the new $188 u$ avallabla saptember 1.

The announoement etated further that the 2-1/2 paroent partially tax-8xampt Tressury bonds maturing in the amount of $\$ 451$ million on Saptembar 15 , 1948, would be pald off in cash. The Saoretary sald also that there yould be no ohange in the Govarnment's polloy with regard to tho long-tari Treasury bonds.

Subaoription books for the $1-3 / 3$ paroent Treasury notes ware openad Septembar 1 and wara ologed at the oloae of buainasa on Septamber 3. subaoriptions ware invitad at par, in exohange for the $1-1 / 2$ parcant Trasury notes maturing Saptamber 15, 1948. The new notes were dated september 15, 1948, and bear interast from that date at the rata of $1-3 / 8$ paroant per annum, payable on a sem1-annual baele on April 1 and October 1 , 1949, and April 1, 1950. They w111 matura April 1, 1950, and w111 not be subject to call for redemption prior to maturity. The notes were issuad in bearer form only in denominations of $\$ 1,000, \$ 5,000$, $\$ 10,000, \$ 100,000$, and $\$ 1,000,000$.

Reporte to the Treasury on the ownership of Government esourities indioate that on July 30 , 1948, about 73 peroent of the $\$ 3.748$ million of the $1-1 / 2$ percent notea maturing soptomber 15 wers owned by Federal Reserve Sanks and reporting commeroial banks, and about 75 percent of the $\$ 451$ million of the $2-1 / 2$ peroent bonde maturing september 15 were owned by reporting commeroial banke. The ownership 11gures for July 30 are the latest which are avallable for holaings of oommarcial banke. Subacriptione for the new 1-3/8 peroent notes totalad $\$ 3,596$ million, laaving $\$ 152$ million to be paid in cash.

## Call of 2 Percent Treasury Bonds of 1948-50

On Auguat 13, the Seoretary annownoed that all outetanding 2 peroent Treasury bonda of 1948-50, dated Deoamber 8, 1939, are oalled for redamption on Deoomber 15, 1948. The announooment atatod that bolders of these bonds may, in advanoa of the redemption date, be offered the privilage of exchanging all or part of their called bonds for other interest-bearing obligations of the Unitad Statos, in whioh evont publio notioe will berbafter be given.

## Treasury Savings Notes, Series D

Detalls of the new Treasury savinge notes, seriea $D$, whioh became arallable for purohase on Saptembar 1, 1948, and the ending of the eale of Treasury eavinge notes, Berios C, at the oloso of businese August 5 , vere announced by the Treasury on Auguat 18.

The new notes of series $D$ will be dated as of the first day of the month in whioh purohased, will mature thres yaare thereaftor, and will be laaued at par. Intarest on the notas will aoorue each month from month of lasue, on a graduated soale, the equivalent field if held to maturity belng approximately 1.40 percent per annum. The amount of aoorual each month on aaoh $\$ 1,000 \mathrm{prin}$ ofpal amount of notes, from month of lssus to month of maturity, follows:

The seoretary also announood that the period during whiok the now notes may not ba aubmitted for oach redemption has been decreased from aix montha to four months from morth of isaus.

Lite saries $C$, the new notes of Serles $D$ will be avallable for uee in peyment of income, astate, and gift taxes imposed by the Internal Revenue Code and aasessed against the owner of the notee or his estate. If not presented in payment of taxea, and except for those in the namea of banks that aocopt demand deposita, the notes of saries D w1ll be redesmable at par and
acorued interest, oither at maturity or during and aftar the fourth oalendar month after the month of issue. If inecribad in the name of a bank that aooepts demand deposite, the notes w1ll be acoepted at par and acomed interest in paymant of taxes, but redeemed for oash at or before maturity only at the purohase price, or par.

Treasury Bill Retirements Continued
Weekly retirements of Treasury bills, whioh

[^0]had been resumed in July, were oontinued in August. The four isaues maturing during tho month totaled $\$ 4.0$ billion and the amount refunded was 3.6 billion. Eaoh new 1seue, beginning with that dated August 5, was 100 million less than the amount of that maturing. The average rate of discount on the first two issues wae 0.997 percent, on the third wae 1.066 peroent, and on the fourth, 1.072 peroent.

Information relating to capital movemente between the United States and foreign countries is presented in four seotiona. Section $I$ contalns the principal typee of data on capitel movemente by yeare from 1935, and ourrently by monthe. Each type of dete is then broken down into ita chief componentein the same chronological detall.

Seotion II suppliee a geogrephic breakdown by principal countries for reoent monthe. The total net capital movement is given first and then the principal categories are shown separately. In addition, at this point, the totel outstanding clalme on and liabilitiea to forelgn oountries are each presented.

Section III presente detalle with respeot to oapital movements and short-term claime and liabilitiee as
of the latest montb for which the data are avallable.

Seotion IV contains data for recent monthe on outatanding contracte of banks for forward purchases and sales of foreign exchange.

The data in these four aections are based on reporte plled each month by banke, bankere, and brokere throughout the United States. The reporte are collected, ohecked, and tabulated by the twelve Federal Reeerve Banks. The totals are then forwarded to the Treasury Department for coneolidation and publication.

Publication of detailed figures on cepital movemente was disoontinued between the Marcb 1942 and the November 1945 1seues of the "Treasury Bulletin", but data omitted during that period were supplied in the November 1945 iefue and aupplement.
