

# Treasury Financing Operations

#### April Certificates Refunded

The announcement was made by the Secretary of the Treasury on March 18 that holders of the Treasury 1-1/8 percent certificates of indebtedness maturing on April 1, 1949, would be offered in exchange oneyear 1-1/4 percent certificates of indebtedness. The maturing certificates totaled \$1,055 million. Subscription books for the exchange offering were opened March 21 and were closed at the close of business on March 24. The new certificates, Series D-1950, were dated April 1, 1949, and bear interest from that date at the rate of 1-1/4 percent per annum, payable with the principal at maturity on April 1, 1950. Exchanges were made par for par and cash subscriptions were not received. The certificates were issued in bearer form only, in denominations of \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000, \$100,000, and \$1,000,000.

Reports to the Treasury on the ownership of

Government securities indicate that on January 31, 1949, about 45 percent of the maturing certificates were owned by reporting commercial banks and Federal Reserve Banks. The ownership figures for January 31 are the latest available for holdings of commercial banks.

Subscriptions to the new certificates amounted to \$963 million on the basis of preliminary figures, leaving \$92 million to be paid in cash.

#### Treasury Bills Refunded

Treasury bills maturing in February totaled \$3.4 billion and were refunded in full. The issues dated February 3 and 17 amounted to \$600 million each and those dated February 10 and 24 amounted to \$900 million each. The average rate of discount on the first issue was 1.161 percent and on the remaining three issues, 1.163 percent.

Detaile concerning terms and conditions for purchase and redemption, and investment yields of Series D notes will be found in the "Treasury Bulletin" for October 1948, page A-L. Similar information concerning Series C notes will be found in the "Treasury Bulletin" for October 1945, pages A-4 and A-5. For details concerning terms and conditions, investment yields, and tax payment or redemption values

of Series A and B, see "Annual Report of the Secretary of the Treasury" for 1942, pages 207 and 220, and for sales and redemptions by fiscal years and months, see "Treasury Bulletin" for February 1946, pages 42 and 43.

Matured notes outstanding are reflected in the interest-bearing debt until all notes of the series have matured, when they are transferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased, in accordance with the practice of the Daily Treasury Statement.

The Treasury Survey of Ownership covers securities issued by the United States Government and by Federal agencies. The banks and insurance companies included in the Survey account for approximately 95 percent of such securities held by all banks and insurance companies in the United States. Data were first published for March 31, 1941, in the May 1941 "Treasury Bulletin".

Information on the distribution of ownership by types of banks and insurance companies is published each month. Additional information showing the holdings of commercial banks distributed according to Federal Reserve member - bank classes and nonmember banks is published for June 30 and December 31.





Information relating to capital movements between the United States and foreign countries is presented in four sections. Section I presents first a historical summary of the principal types of data on capital movements, beginning with 1935 when the information was first compiled. Each type of data is then broken down into its chief components in the same chronological detail.

Section II supplies a geographic breakdown by principal countries for recent months. The total net capital movement is given first and then the principal categories are shown separately. In addition, at this point, the total outstanding claims on and liabilities to foreign countries are each presented.

Section III presents details with respect to capital movements and short-term claims and liabilities. These are shown for the latest month for which final data are

available and the latest month for which preliminary data are available.

Section IV contains data for recent months on outstanding contracts of banks for forward purchases and sales of foreign exchange.

The data in these four sections are based on reports filed each month by banks, bankers, and brokers throughout the United States. The reports are collected, checked, and tabulated by the twelve Federal Reserve Banks. The totals are then forwarded to the Treasury Department for consolidation and publication.

Publication of detailed figures on capital movements was discontinued between the March 1942 and the November 1945 issues of the "Treasury Bulletin", but data omitted during that period were supplied in the November 1945 issue and supplement.


