## Treasury Financing Operations

## December - January Bond and Certificate Maturities

On November 30, 1949, the Seoretary of the Treasury announced that a new 1 seue of $1-3 / 8$ peroent Treasury notes to mature in four and one-quarter yeare would be offered on Deoember 5. The notee were to be offered in exchange for the three series of Treasury bonds, whioh, on Auguet 12, had been called for redemption on December 15, and also for the one-year 1-1/4 percent certificates of indebtednese, Series H-1949, maturing December 15, 1949. The three series of maturing bonds totaled $\$ 4,375$ million and the maturing certificates amounted to $\$ 519$ million, whioh together totaled $\$ 4,894$ million.

The Seoretary aleo announced on November 30 that holders of the one-year $1-1 / 4$ percent certificates of indebtedness, Series A-1950, whiob will mature January 1 , would be offered a one-year 1-1/8 percent certificate in exchange.

Subsoription books for the new Treasury notee, Serles A-1954, were opened on Deoember 5 and were olosed at the olose of business on December 8. The notes were dated December 15, 1949, and bear interest from that date at the rate of $1-3 / 8$ percent, payable on a semiannual basis on September 15, 1950, and thereafter on March 15 and September 15 in eaoh year

[^0]until the prinolpal amount becomes payable on Maroh 15, 1954. The notes wers 1ssued in bearer form only, with interest ooupone attached, in denominations of $\$ 1,000, \$ 5,000, \$ 10,000, \$ 100,000$, and $\$ 1,000,000$.

## Call of 2 Percent Treasury Bonds of 1850-52

On November 14, the Secretary announced that all outstending 2 percent Treasury bonds of 1950-52, dated Ootober 19, 1942, are called for redemption on March 15, 1950. The announoement stated that holdere of these bonde may, in advanoe of the redemption date, be offered the privilege of exohanging all or part of their called bonde for other interest-bearing obligations of the United States, in which event publio notioe will hereafter be given.

## Treasury Bills Refunded

Treasury bills maturing in November were refunded in the full amount of 4.0 billion. Each lesue amounted to $\$ 1,000 \mathrm{mllil}$. The 18 sue of November 25 was the eleventh oonsecutive rollover. The succeselve average rates of discount on the four November offeringe, beginning with that dated November 3, were 1.063 percent, 1.074 percent, 1.056 peroent, and 1.052 percent.

The Treasury Survey of Ownerehip covers securities 1esued by the United States Government and by Federal agenoles. The banke and insurance oompanies inoluded in the Survey aocount for approximately 95 peroent of suoh securities held by all banke and insurance oompanies in the United States. Data were first published for March 31, 1941, in the May 1941 "Treasury Bulletin".

Information on the diatribution of ownershlp by types of banks and insurance companies is published each month. Additional information showing the holdinge of commeroial banks distributed acoording to Federal Reeerve member bank olasees and nonmember banks \(1 s\) publlshed for june 30 and December 31.

Monthly data relating to capital movements between the United states and foreign countries as reported by banks, bankers, and brokers throughout the United States appear in the first four sections of "Capital Movements". Supplementary data are presented at leas frequent intervale in Seotion \(V\). All reports are made initially to the Federal Reserve Banke, which forward consolidated figures to the Treasury.

Section I containe the historical summary of princlpal typee of monthly data on capital movements, beginning with 1935 when the information was first complled Each type 18 then broken down into \(1 t s\) chief component In the same chronological detail. Section II supplies a summary by countries, showing a geographic breakdown for recent months of the same principal series and most of the same components. Foreign debit and credit balances in brokerage accounts also are shown by countrie.

Section III presente data by countries for certain components of total short-term claims and liabilities and total long-term security transactions. This information is given for the latest month for which final figures are avallable. Similar information for the latest month for which preliminary flgures are avallable is presented in Section III A. "Short-term" as used in all tables on capital movements refers to original maturities of oneyear or lese, and "long-term" refers to all other maturities. Section IV contains data for recent months on outstanding contrscts of banks for forward purchsses and sales of forelgn exchange.

Section \(V\) presents in Table information by countries on ehort-term claims on and liabilities to foreigners as reported quarterly by exporters, importers, and industrisl and oommercial concerns in the United States. This information was published for the first time in the October 1949 issue of the "Treasury Bulletin", covering quarterly perlods irom September 30, 1946, through December 31, 1948. An explanstion of the figures appeared In the headnote on page 49 of that 18 sue. Later data will be published in subsequent issues. Table 2 in Section \(V\) supplies information by countries on long-term claims on and liabilities to foreignere as reported by banks and bankers in the United States. These data are collected along with those on short-term balances. However, since the amounts involved represent only a small part of the total long-term investment position of the United States, and the figures exclude by definition the banks' holdings of long-term securities suitsble for trading in public securities markets, they have not been published heretofore, nor are they incorporated in the regular monthly serles on capital movements. Table 2 appears for the first time in the current issue of the "Treasury Bulletin" and gives data for the end of the calendar years 1942 through 1948. Corresponding data w1ll be published for later yeara.

Publication of detalled figures in the monthly series on capital movements was discontinued between the March 1942 and the November 1945 issues of the "Treasury Bulletin", but data omitted during that period were supplied in the November 1945 1ssue and supplement.
