and 19, and 1.316 percent for October 26.

Data relating to cleima on forelgners and liabilities to Poreigners, and capital movements between the United Stetes and foreign countrles, have been collected alnce 1935, pursuant to Executive Order 6560 of January 15 , 1934, and Treasury ragulationa thereunder. Information covering the principal typer of data and the principal countries is reported each month by banka and bankera and securitiea brokers and dealera in the United Statea. This information ia publiabed regularly in the "Treasury Bulletin". Supplementary information is published at less irequent intervala. All repcrts are made initially to the Federal Reserve Banks, whlch forward conaolidated figures to the Treasury.

The term "foreigners" as uaed in these raporta covera all inatitutiona and individuals (including United Statea citizens) domiciled outaide the United States, aa well aa international organizationa, wherever domiciled, created by treaty or convention between aovereign atates. "Short-term" refers to original maturitiea of one year or leas, and "long-term" refera to all other maturities. A detalled discussion of the reporting coverage, basia of reporting, and derivation of capital movements figures appeared in the April 1950 1asue of the "Treasury Bulletin", pagea 50-52. Revised report forma and regulations became effective with
the data for January 1950. Attention 1a called to the fact that although the grand total flgures on the reviaed reporting basis are reasonably comparable with those for preceding montha, data for individual countries in aome instancea are not comparable because of certain changes in coveraga and geographical claasification.

The supplementary information, contained in Section IV, 1a presented in three tables appearing at difeerent times. Tabla 1 gives data by countries on ahort-term sladme on and llabilities to foreigners as reported quarterly by exportera, importers, and induatrial and commercial concerna in the United Statea. This information was publiabed for the first tine in the October 1949 1aaue of the "Treaaury Bulletin" and begins with data for September 30, 1946. Table 2 auppliea information by countriea on long-term claima on and liabilitiea to forelgners as reported by banks and bankers in the United States. Thia tabla appeared for the pirat time in the December 1949 18sue. Data are for the end of the calendar year beginning with 1942. Table 3 givea information on short-term liabilitiea to countries not regularly reported aeparately by banka and bankera. This table appeared for the firat time in the April 1950 1saue. The data have been requested at irregular intervala, the earlieat date being October 1943.
