## Treasury Financing Operations

Results of October 15 and November 1 Refundings
Subscriptions to the $1-7 / 8$ percent Treasury oertificates of indebtedness of Series E-1952, dated October 15,1951 , amounted to $\$ 10,861$ million, leaving $\$ 333$ million of the maturing issues to be paid in cash. Exchanges for the $1-1 / 4$ percent notes, Series F-1951, which matured October 15 in the amount of $\$ 5,941$ million, were $\$ 5,873$ million. Exchanges for the 1-1/4 percent notes, Series G-1951. which matured November 1 in the amount of $\$ 5,253 \mathrm{mil}-$ lion, were $\$ 4,988$ million.

Subscription books for the certificates of geries E-1952 were opensd on October 1 , and were closed at the olose of business on October 4. Excbanges were made par for par in the case of the notse of Series $F-1951$ and at par with an adjustment of interest as of October 15 in the case of the notes of Series G-1951. Cash subscriptions were not received. The certiflcates were issued in bearer form only, in denominations of $\$ 1,000$, $\$ 5,000, \$ 10,000, \$ 100,000$, and $\$ 1,000,000$.

Reports to the Treasury on the ownership of Government securities indicate that on August 31, 1951, about 80 percent of series $F-1951$ notes and 65 percent of series G-1951 notee were owned by reporting commercial banks and tho Federal Reserve Banks. The ownership ilgures for that date are the latest publishad for commercial banks.

Tax Anticipation Bills Offered
In accordance with his announcement on

October 10, 1951, the secretary of the Treasury on the following day invited tenders for $\$ 1,250 \mathrm{mll}$ lion, or thereabouts, of 144-day Treasury bills, Tax Anticipation Series. The offering was for cash, with the bille issued on a discount basis, as in the case of other bill series. The Tax Anticipation Series bills were dated October 23, 1951, and w111 mature March 15, 1952. They w111 be acceptsdin payment of income taxes due on March 15, 1952, and to the extent they are not presented for this purpose the face amount of these bills will be payable without interest at maturity. Tenders were received on October 17, 1951, and were accepted in the amount of $\$ 1,233.8$ million. The average rate of disoount was 1.550 percent.

The Secretary also stated in his October 10 announcement that another offering of Treasury bills would be made within the next few weeke. These bills would mature on June 15,1952 , and would be acceptable in payment of income taxes due on that date. The amount probably would be in the neighborhood of \$1,000 mil110n.

Maturing Treasury Billa Refunded
Treasury bills matured during October in the amount of $\$ 1.2$ billion in each of the four weeks, and new offeringe wers in the sams amount. The average rates of discount on the successive weekly 1.ssues were 1.646 percent, 1.576 percent, 1.615 percent, and 1.593 percent.

Series A-D were sold from March 1935 to April 1941 and Serles E, $F$, and $G$ have been on sale since May 1, 1941. Beginning in May 1951, holders of maturing Sories $E$ bonds have three options: to redeem them in ossh, to retain them with an extended maturity of 10 years at epecifled rates of interest accrual, or to exohange them for Series $G$ bonde. Further information on these options will be found in the "Trassury Bulletin" Lseue for April 1951, page A-1, and information on the terms and conditions of the various series of savings bonds appears in the annual reports of the secretary of the Treasury.

Series $A-F$ sales are shown at lesue price and total rademptions and amounts outstanding at current redemption values. Serles $G 18$ shown at face value throughout. Maturad bonds which have been redasiad are included in redemptions. Matured bonds outstanding of Series $A-D$ were included in the interest-bearing dabt until all bonds of the saries matured, when they were transferrad to matured debt upon which interest has ceased. Savings bonds data by denominations and the amounts of sales by gtates are publiohad on a monthly basis but do not appear in each 188 of the "Treasury Bulletin".

The Treasury Survey of Ownershlp covers efourities lsoued by the United Stateg Govarnment and by Federal agencies. The banks and insurance oompanies inoluded In the Survey account for approximately 95 percent of such securitles held by all banks and insurance oompanies in the United states. Data were first publishod for March 31, 1941, In the May 1941 "Treasury Bulletin".

Information on the distribution of ownership by typss of banks and insurance oompanies is publighed each month. Additional information showing the holdings of commeroial banks distributed acoording to Federal Reserve member bank olasses and nonmember banke 18 publlshed for Juns 30 and December 31.

Data relating to cleime on foreigners and liabilities to foreigners, and capital movements between the United States and forelgn countries, have been collected since 1935, pureuart to Executive Order 6560 of January 15, 1934, and Tressury regulstions thereunder. Information covering the principal typee of data and the principal countries is reported each month by banks and bankers and securities brokere and dealere in the United statee. This information ie publiehed regularly in tbe "Treasury Bulletin". Supplementary information is published at less irequent intervals. All reports are made initially to the Federal Reserve Banks, which forward consolidated ilguree to the Treasury.

The term "Poreignere" as ueed in theee reports covers all institutions and individuale (inoluding United Statee citizens) domiciled outside the United Statee, as well ae international organizations, wherever domiciled, created by treaty or convention between sovereign states. "Short-term" refere to original maturitiee of one year or less, and "long-tern" refere to all other maturities. A detailed disouesion of the reporting coverage, basis of reporting, and derivation of capital movemente figuree appeared in the April 1950 is sue of the "Treasury Bulletin", pages 50-52. Revised report forme and regulatione became effective with
the data for January 1950. Attention 18 called to the fact that although the grand total figures on the revised reporting basie are reasonably comparable with those for preceding months, dsts for individusl countries in some inetances are not comparable becsube of certain changes in coverage and geographical olassification.

The supplementary information, contained in section IV, is presented in three tables appearing at different timee. Table 1 gives data by countries on short-term cladmb on and liabilities to foreigners as reported quarterly by exporters, importere, and induetrial and commercial concerne in the United States. This information was published for the first time in the October 1949 issue of the "Tressury Bulletin" and begine with data for September 30, 1946. Table 2 eupplies information by countries on long-term claims on and liabilities to foreignere as reported by banks and bankere in the United Statee. This tablo appeared for the Iiret time in the December 1949 1esue. Data are for the end of the calendar year beginning with 1942. Table 3 gives information on short-term lisbilities to countries not regularly reported separately by banks and bankere. Thie table appeared for the first time in the April 1950 isaue. The data have been requested at irregular intervale, the earliest date belng Ootober 1943.
