



Treasury Financing Operations

December Certificate Offering

On November 26, 1951, the Acting Secretary of the Treasury announced the offering of an issue of 11-1/2 month 1-7/8 percent certificates of indebtedness to holders of the 2-1/4 percent Treasury bonds of 1951-53, which previously had been called for redemption on December 15, 1951. The called bonds (dated December 22, 1939) were outstanding in the amount of \$1,118 million.

Subscription books for the new certificates, Series F-1952, were opened on December 3, 1951, and were closed at the close of business on December 6. The certificates are dated December 15, 1951, and will bear interest from that date at the rate of 1-7/8 percent per annum payable with the principal at maturity on December 1, 1952. Exchanges were made par for par and cash subscriptions were not received. The certificates were issued in bearer form only, in denominations of \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000, \$100,000, and \$1,000,000.

Announcement on Treasury Bonds Callable March 15, 1952

On November 14, 1951, the Secretary of the Treasury announced that the 2-1/2 percent Treasury bonds of 1952-54, dated March 31, 1941, due March 15, 1954, are called for redemption on March 15, 1952. There are \$1,024 million of this issue outstanding. The announcement stated that in advance of the redemption date holders of these bonds may be offered the privilege of exchanging all or any part of their called bonds for other

interest-bearing obligations of the United States, in which event public notice will be given hereafter.

The announcement stated also that the 2 percent Treasury bonds of 1951-53, which also were callable on March 15, 1952, would not be called for redemption on that date.

Tax Anticipation Bills - Second Offering

On November 14, 1951, the Secretary of the Treasury announced the offering on November 20 of an issue of 201-day Treasury bills in the amount of \$1,250 million. These bills, dated November 27, 1951, to mature on June 15, 1952, were the second offering of the Tax Anticipation Series, which the Secretary in his statement of October 10, 1951, announced would be offered within a few weeks. Tenders were accepted in the amount of \$1,249 million at the average rate of discount of 1.497 percent.

Treasury Bills Refunded

Weekly maturities of Treasury bills in November totaled \$6.1 billion and were refunded in the same amount. Maturities and offerings in the first three weeks were for \$1.3 billion each, and for the last two weeks were for \$1.1 billion each. The average rates of discount on the successive new offerings were 1.617 percent for November 1, 1.610 percent for November 5, 1.619 percent for November 15, 1.585 percent for November 23, and 1.609 percent for November 29.

The Social Security Act Amendments of 1950 (Public Law 734), approved August 28, 1950, change the basis of appropriating social security employment taxes on employers and employees. United States savings bonds were first offered for sale in March 1935 and began to mature in March 1945. Series A-D were sold from March 1935 to April 1941 and Series E, F, and G have been on sale sincs May 1, 1941. Beginning in May 1951, holders of maturing Series E bonds have three options: to redsem them in cash, to retain them with an extended maturity of 10 years at specified rates of interest accrual, or to exchange them for Series G bonds. Further information on these options will be found in the "Treasury Bulletin" issue for April 1951, page A-1, and information on the terms and conditions of the various series of savings bonds appears in the annual reports of the Secretary of the Treasury.

Series A-F sales are shown at leaus price and total redemptions and amounts outstanding at current redemption values. Series G is shown at face value throughout. Matured bonds which have been redeemed are included in redemptions. Matured bonds outstanding of Series A-D were included in the interest-bearing debt until all bonds of the series matured, when they were transferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased. Savings bonds data by denominations and the amounts of sales by States are published on a monthly basis but do not appear in each issue of the "Treasury Bulletin".

The Treasury Survey of Ownership covers securities issued by the United States Government and by Federal agencies. The banks and insurance companies included in the Survey account for approximately 95 percent of such securities held by all banks and insurance companies in the United States. Data were first published for March 31, 1941, in the May 1941 "Treasury Bulletin".

Information on the distribution of ownership by types of banks and insurance companies is published each month. Additional information showing the holdings of commercial banks distributed according to Federal Reserve member - bank classes and nonmember banks is published for June 30 and December 31.







Data relating to claims on foreigners and liabilities to foreigners, and capital movements between the United States and foreign countries, have been collected since 1935, pursuant to Executive Order 6560 of January 15, 1934, and Treasury regulations thereunder. Information covering the principal types of data and the principal countries is reported each month by banks and bankers and securitiae brokers and dealers in the United States. This information is published regularly in the "Treasury Bulletin". Supplementary information is published at less frequent intervals. All reports are made initially to the Federal Reserve Banks, which forward consolidated figures to the Treasury.

The term "foreigners" as used in these reports covere all institutions and individuals (including United States citizene) domiciled outside the United States, as well as international organizations, wherever domiciled, created by treaty or convention between sovereign states. "Short-term" refers to original maturities of one year or less, and "long-term" refers to all other maturities. A detailed discussion of the reporting coverage, basis of reporting, and derivation of capital movements figures appeared in the April 1950 issue of the "Treasury Bulletin", pages 50-52. Revised report forms and regulations became effective with

the data for January 1950. Attention is called to the fact that although the grand total figures on the revised reporting basis are reasonably comparable with those for preceding months, data for individual countries in some instances are not-comparable because of certain changes in coverage and geographical classification.

The supplementary information, contained in Section IV. is presented in three tables appearing at different times. Table 1 gives data by countries on short-term claims on and liabilities to foreigners as reported quarterly by exporters. importere, and industrial and commercial concerns in the United States. This information was published for the first time in the October 1949 issue of the "Treasury Bulletin" and begins with data for September 30, 1946. Table 2 supplies information by countries on long-term claims on and liabilities to foreigners as reported by banks and bankers in the United States. This table appeared for the first time in the December 1949 issue. Data are for the end of the calendar year beginning with 1942. Table 3 gives information on short-term liabilities to countries not regularly reported separately by banks and bankers. This table appeared for the first time in the April 1950 issue. The data have been requested at irregular intervals, the earliest date being October 1943.


