## Treasury Financing Operations

## Treasury B111s Refonded

Weekly maturities of 9l-day Treasury bills in March totaled $\$ 4.9$ billion. They were refunded in equivalent total and weekly amounts. The offering dated March 5 was for $\$ 1.3$ bililon and the offerings dated March 12,19 , and 26 were for $\$ 1.2$ billion each. The average rates of discount on the new 1 ssues were 2.164 percent Por March 5, 2.098 percent for March 12, 2.029 percent for March 19, and 2.036 percent for March 26 .

Eetimatee of the breakown are nade on a fisoal jear basie baginning 1952.

United States aavings bonda were firat offered in March 1935 and began to maturs in March 1945. Serias A-D were sold between March 1935 and the end of April 1941, and Series $E, F$, and $G$ were Pirst offered in May 1941. When Seriea E began to mature on May 1, 1951, ownera of the matured bonds were offerad three optiona: To redaem the bonda in cash in accordance with the original terma; to retain them with an extended maturity of 10 years at apecified rate日 of intereat aocrual; or to exchange them for Seriea $G$ bonda. A number of changes became effective May 1, 1952. The principal onea were: The rate of intereat sccrual on Series E was increased, especially for the near term, with corresponding changes in extonded Serlea E; and Series $F$ and $G$ were replaced by two new isaues, Series J
and $K$, also at higher interest rates. A new current-income bond, Series $H$, aimilar in intereat return to Serias $E$, was offored beginning June 1. For detalls of these ohanges gee "Treasury Bulletin" for May 1952, Dage A-1.

Data relating to claime on foraignara and liabilitlea to foreigners, and capital movementa between the United States and foreign countries, have been collected alnce 1935, purauant to Executive Order 6560 of January 25, 1934, and Treaaury regulationa thereunder. Information covering the principal typer of data and the principal countries $1 \theta$ reported aach montb by banke and bankers and securities brokere and dealere in the United states. This information ie publiahed regularly in the Treasury Bulletin". Supplemantary information is publiahed at lese frequent intervale. All raports are made initially to the Federal Reaerve Banka, which forward consolidated figures to tha Treaaury.

The term "foreignere" as uasd in theas reports oovers all inetitutiona and individuale (inoluding United Btates citizene) domiolled outalde the United Statas, as wall as international organizationa, wheraver domiciled, craated by treaty or convention between soverelgn otatea. "Short-term" refers to original maturities of one year or leas, and "long-term" refere to all other maturitiea. A detalled digouasion of the reporting coverage, basis of reporting, and derivation of capital movemente ilgurea appearad in the April 1950 1esue of the "Treasury Bulletin", pagee 50-52. Revised report forme and ragulatione became affective with
the data for January 2950. Attention 10 called to the lact that although the grand total ligures on the revieed reporting basia are reasonably oomparable with thoae for preceding montha, data for individual countriea in some Inatances are not comparable because of oertain changea in ooverage and geographioal olasailication.

The supplementary information, contalned in Section IV, 1a preaented in three tables appearing at differant timeo. Table I givee data by countries on short-term claima an and llabilities to forelgnere as reported quarterly by exporters, importers, and induetrial and commercial conoerne in the United States. Thle information was publiehed for the ifst time in the Ootober 1949 1saue of the "Treasury Bulietin" and begine with data for September 30, 1946. Table 2 aupplies information by countriea on long-term claime on and liabllitiee to foraigners ae raported by banka and bankera in the United States. Thla table appeared for tha firet time in the December 1949 18aue. Data are for the end of the calendar year beginning with 1942. Table 3 givea information on short-term llabllities to countrles not regularly reported separately by banke and bankere. Thia tabla appeared for the first time in the April 1950 1eeue. The data have been requeated at irregular intervale, the earlieat date being Ootober 1943.

Treasury Statement", which contains greeter detail than the sumarles presented here. Tables 3 and 4 are compiled from reporte of the agenoles, adjusted by the Treesury Department. The latest avallable loan and balanoe aheet data are presented in this lesue of the "Treasury Bulletin", and Tables 3 and 4 for the same date will appear in a eubsequent iselue.
