## Treasury Financing Operations

## August Certificate Refunding

On August 3, 1953, the Secretary of the Treasury announced the offering on August 5 of an issue of one-year $2-5 / 8$ percent certificates of indebtedness. The new oertificates were offered to holders of the 2 percent oertificates of indebtedness, Series C-1953, which mature August 15, 1953, in the amount of $\$ 2,882$ million. Detalls of the financing were to be announced later.

Treasury 91-Day Bills Again Inoreased
New $1884 e s$ of 9l-day Treasury bills in July totaled 87.5 bllifon. The maturing issues of $\$ 7.0$ billion were refunded and additional new money of $\$ 500$ million was borrowed. The cash was raised in the first three offerings, and as of July 16 new monsy totaling $\$ 2.2$ billion had been eupplied by weekly bill issues eince the initial increase this year on April 23. Each new issue in July amounted to $\$ 1.5$ bililon. The issue of July 2 exceeded the maturity by $\$ 300$ mililion, and the issues of July 9 and 16 exoesded the maturities by $\$ 100$ million each. Average rates of discount on the new $18 s u e s$ were 2.106 percent for July 2, 2.007 percent for July 9, 2.106 percent for July 16, 2.127 percent for July 23 , and 2.157 percent for July 30.

Estimateo of the breakdown are made on a fiecal yoar basis begiming 1952 but are not jot evailable for 1953. United States savings bonda were first offered in March 1935 and began to mature in March 1945. Series A-D were sold between March 1935 and the end of April 1941, and Seriea $E, F$, and $G$ were first offered in May 1941. When Series $E$ began to mature on May 1, 1951, ownera of the matured bonds ware offered three options: To redeem the bonds in cash in accordance with the original terma; to retain them with an extended maturity of 10 yeara at. apecifled ratea of intereat accrual; or to exchange them for Saries $G$ bonds. A number of changea became effective May 1, 1952. The principle ones were: The rate of intereat accrual on Series $E$ was increased, especially for the near term, with correaponding changes in extended Seriea $E$; and Seriea $F$ and $G$ ware replaced by two new icsues, serles $J$ and $K$, also at higher interest rates. A new current-income
bond, Seriee $H$, aimilar in intereat return to Seriea $s$, was offered beginning June 2. For dstalls of these changes aee "Treasury Bulletin" for May 1952, page A-1. Seriea F and $G$ began to mature on May 1, 1953. For the exchange offering made to holders of these bonds maturing through December 31, 1953, eee the May 1953 1saue, page A-1. In the tables which follow, Series $A-F$ and $J$ sales are shown at isaue price and total redemptions and amounts outstanding at current redemption values. Seriea $0, H$, and $K$ are shown at face value throughout. Matured bonds which have been redeemed are included in redemptions. Matured $F$ and $G$ bonds outstanding are included in the intereatbearing debt until all bonds of the annual series have matured, when they are transferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased.

Data were firat publiehed for March 31, 1941, in the May 1941 "Treasury Bulletin".

This information is published regularly in the "Tresaury Bulletin". Supplementary information is publiehed at less frequent intervals. All reports are made initially to the Federal Reserve Banks, which forward coneolldated ilgures to the Treasury.

The term "foreigners" as used in these reports covers all institutions and individuale (including United States citizens) domiciled outside the United States, as well as international organizations, wherever domiciled, created by treaty or convention between sovereign states. "Short-term" refers to original maturities of one year or less, and "long-term" refers to all other maturities. A detalled discussion of the reporting coverage, besis of reporting, and derivation of capital movement s ilgures appeared in the April 1950 18sue of the "Treasury Bulletin", pages 50-52. Revised report forms and regulations became effective with
the data for January 1950. Attention 18 called to the fact that although the grand total ilguree on the revised reporting baele are reasonably comparable with those for preceding monthe, data for individual countries in some instances are not comparable because of certain changes in coverage and geographical classification.

The supplementary information, contained in Section IV, 1s presented in three tables appearing at different times. Table 1 givee data by countries on short-term claims on and liabilities to foreigners as reported quarterly by exporters, importere, and induetrial and commercial concerns in the United States. This information was published for the first time in the October 1949 issue of the "Treasury Bullstin" and begins with data for September 30, 1946. Table 2 supplies information by countries on long-term claime on and liabllities to foreigners as reported by banks and bankere in the United Statee. This table appeared for the first time in the December 1949 issue. Data are for the end of the calendar year beginning with 1942. Table 3 gives information on short-term liabilities to countries not regularly reported separately by banks and bankers. This table appeared for the first time in the April 1950 1eaue. The data have been requested at irregular intervals, the earlieat date being October 1943.
