Cash Offering of Tax Anticipation Certificates
On July 16, 1954, the Secrotary of the Treasury announced the offering on July 21 for cash subscription of $\$ 3-1 / 2$ bllilon of one percent Tax Anticipation Certificates. The certiflcatos are dated August 2,1954 , and bear interset from that date until their maturity on March 22, 1955. They w111 be recelvable at par plue accrued interest to maturity in payment of income and profits taxas use on March 15, 1955. The seouritise were 18sued In bearer form only, in denominations of $\$ 1,000$, $\$ 5,000, \$ 10,000, \$ 100,000$, and $\$ 1,000,000$. They are designated on percent Treasury Certillaates of Indebtedness, Series C-1955. Tax Anticipation Series.

The subscription books were open for one day only, on July 21. Subscriptions totaled $\$ 9.2$ bililon, and allotmenta amounted to $\$ 3.7$ bllilon. Comercial banks wars allotted elightly over $\$ 2$ blllion and nonbank investors more than $\$ 1.7$ billion on original 1s8ue. Subscriptions were allotted 40 percent but those for $\$ 50,000$ or less were allotted in full. Subscriptions for more than \$50,000 were allotted not less than $\$ 50,000$.

Commeroial banks, which for this purpose are defined as banks accepting demand deposits, were permitted to subscribe for their own account without deposit, but were restriated in each case to an amount not excesding one-half of the combined capital, surplus, and undivided profits of the subecribing bank as of June 30, 1954. A payment of 10 percent of the amount of cortificates subscribed for, not subject to withdrawal until after allotment, was required on all other subscriptions. Comercial banks qualifled as dopoeitaries were permitted to make payment for the new certilicates by oredit in Treasury tax and loan accounts up to 75 percent of the amounts allotted to them for themselves and their customers (up to the amounts for which they were qualifled in excess of exiating deposita).

Commercial banke and other lenders were requested to refrain from making unsecured loans or loans collateralized in whole or in part by the oertificates subscribed for, to cover the 10 percent deposits required to be paid when subscriptions ware entered. A oertification by the subscribing bank that no such loan was made was required on each aubscription antered by it for account of 1 ts customers. A certification that the bank had no beneficial
interest in its oustomers' subscriptions, and that no oustomers had any beneilcial interest in the bank's own subscription, also was required.

In the announcement on July 16, the secretary of the Treasury also stated that near the end of July the Treasury would announce an exchange offering open to halders of the isouss of Treasury certificates of indebtedness maturing August 15 in the amount of $\$ 2,788$ million and September 15 in the amount of $\$ 4,724$ million, on whioh it was planned that the subscription books would open early in August. It was proposed to offer holdors of thesematuring aecurities the choice between a one-year cortificate and a security with a longer maturity, either a long note or a short bond.

Maturing Certificates of Indebtedness Refunded
In accordance with his atatement on July 16 , the Secretary of the Treasury announced on the morning of July 30 an exchange offering on August 3, 1954, of one-year 1-1/g percent certificates of Indebtgdness and 6-year and 3-month 2-1/8 peroent Treasury bonde. Holdars of tho $\$ 7.5$ blllion of certificates of indebtedness maturing August 15 and September 15 were offered the cholce of the two new 18sues. Cash aubecriptions were not invited. Results of the offering will be summarized in the September issua of the "Treasury Bulletin".

The subscription books were opened on August 3 and were closed at the close of business on Auguet 5. The Secretary of the Treasury reserved the right to reject or reduce any subscription and to allat less than the amount of the now securities applied for. Subject to these reservations, subscriptions were allotted in full.

Exchanges of the certificates, Series D-1954, which matured August 15, were made par for par. Exchanges of the cortificatas, Seriea E-1954, maturing Septomber 15, ware made at par, with an adjustment of interest. Tho adjustment consistod of a oredit of the full year's interest at the 2-5/8 percent rato borne by the maturing certificates, a charge of the interest to accrue from August 15 to September 15 at the rate borne by the now securiti es for which holders elected to exohange, and payment to them of the differenos.

The new certificates, designated Sories D-1955, are dated and bsar intereat from August 15, 1954 at the rate of $1-1 / 8$ percent per annum, payable at
maturity on August 15, 1955. The new bonds, designated $2-1 / 8$ percent Treasury bonds of 1960 , are dated and bear interest from August 15, 1954 at the rate of $2-1 / 8$ percent per annum, payable on a semlannual basis on May 15 and November 15, 1955, and thereafter on May 15 and November 15 in each year until the principal amount becomes payable.

The new certificates were isaued in bearer form only, with one interest coupon attached, in denominations of $\$ 1,000, \$ 5,000, \$ 10,000, \$ 100,000$, and $\$ 1,000,000$. The bonds were 1 ssued in those
denominations and also in the denomination of $\$ 500$, and in registered as well as coupon form.

Treasury 91-Day Bllls Refunded
Five 91 -day bill issues matured in July in the total of $\$ 7.5$ billion. They were refunded in equivalent weekly amounts of $\$ 1.5$ billion each. The average rates of discount on the new 1 ssues were 0.646 percent for July $1 ; 0.671$ percent for July 8; 0.701 percent for July 15; 0.731 percent for July 22; and 0.800 percent for July 29.

Effective February 27, 1954, the Dally Treasury Statement ahows deposita and withdrawals in the account of the Treasurer of the United gtates. Budget result a and trust account and other transactions are now reported once each month In the "Monthly Statement of Recelpts and Expenditures of the United States Government" (see pags A-2 in the April 1954 lesue of the "Treasury Bulletin").

Figures for previous flacal yeara heretolore publiehed have been revised to the basis of cieposits and withdrawala by ellminating corporation and agency transactions included In the old Dally Statement but not cleared through the Treasurer's account. The cash borrowing or repayment of borrowing as now shown is likewlee based only on transactions cleared through the Treasurer's account.

In Tables 2,3 , and 4 is given the reconciliation of the cash transactions with the budget and other tranaactions which formerly appeared in the old Dally Statement and now appear in the new Monthly Statement. These tables
follow the method used previously for deriving cash income and outgo from the transactions carried in the old Dally Statement. Some rearrangement has been made in the table setup, principally to combine all reoelpts and all expencitures instead of deriving separately the cash budeet and trust account transactions.

Reporting baaes for the two statements differ in two respects. Certain corporation and agenoy transactions in aecuritles whloh are not effected through the account of the Treasurer of the United States are included in the Monthly Statement but excluded from the Dally Statement. These are eliminated from the Monthly Statement ligures in arriving at the cash transactions shown in the tables which follow. Other differencea ariae because of the differences in timing of the cash reoelpt and expenditure reporta, as between checks 1 saued and checks pald for expenditures or between collections and clearances for receipts. Thus an individual transaction near the end of a month may be included during that month in one statement but not until the following month in the other. These differences tend to correct themselves over a perlod of time, but for a given reporting date it is necessary to include an adjustment figure to cover them.

The Treasury Survey of Ownership covers securities lsaued by the United States Government and by Federal agencies. The banks and insurance companies included in the Survey account for approxinately 95 percent of auch securities held by all banks and insurance companies in the United gtates. Data were first published for March 31, 1941, in the May 1941 "Treasury Bulletin".

Distribution of ownerahip by types of banks and insuranoe companies is published each month. Holdings by commercial banke distributed according to Federal Reserve memberbank olasses and nonmember banks are published for June 30 and Deosmber 3l. Holdings by corporate pension trust funde are publiahed quarterly and first appeared in the March 1954 Bulletin for quartere beginning December 31, 1949.

Data ralating to capltal movements between the United States and forelgn countrles have been collected aince 2935, pursuant to Executive Ordar 6560 of January 15, 1934. Exeoutive Order 10033 of February 8, 1949, and Traasury regulationa promulgated thereunder. Information covering the principal typea of data and tha principal countries 13 reported monthly, and 18 publisbed regularly In the "Treasury Bulletin". Supplementary information is published at leas frequent intervals. Reports by banks, bankers, seourities brokers and dealers, and induatrial and comercial concerns in the United States are made Inltially to the Federal Reaerve Banks, whlch forward conaolidatad figures to the Treasury. Beginning April 2954, data reported by banks in the Territories and poseesaions of the United Statea are includad in the publiahed data.

Tha term "forelgner" as used in these reporta covera all institutions and individuals domiciled outaide the United States and ita Territorios and poseesalons, the official inatitutions of forelgn countries, wheraver auch inetitutlons way be located, and international organizationa. "Short-term" refers to orlginal maturities of one year or leas, and "long-term" refera to all other maturities. A detalled discusalon of the reporting coverage, etatistical presantation, and definitions appeared in the June 1954 1ssue of the "Treasury Bulletin", pages 45-47. Aa a result of changes in presentation introduced in that 1ssue, not all breakcowns previously published wll be exactly comparable to those now presented.

The ilrst three aections which follow are published monthly. Thay provide oumariea of the principal data
by periode and by countries and preaent detalled breakdown of the lateat avallable preliminary data.

Section IV providas supplementary data which appear at lese frequent intervals. The five tables included in thls section, under the revised presentation begun in the June 1954 issue of the Bulletin, and the dates of their publication are as follows:
