## Treasury Financing Operations

## Neekly 9l-Day Bills Refunded

Treasury 9l-day bills maturing in October were refunded in full
in the total of 6. billion. The four refunding issues of 91 -day bllls amounted to approximately $\$ 1.5$ blllion each, the equivalent of the weekly maturities. The average rates of diccount on the new issues were 0.966 percent for October 7 and Cotober 14; 1.009 percent for October 21; and 1.206 vercent for October 28.

The cash income and outgo of the Treasury ahown in Table 1 consist of cash deposits and withdrawals in the account of the Treasurer of the United States. This is in ine with the new reporting basis of the "Daily gtatement of the United States Treasury". Effective February 17, 1954, the Daily Treasury Statement show deposits and withdrawals in the account of the Treasurer of the United states. Budget result $s$ and trust account and other transactions are now reported once each month In the "Monthly Statement of Recelpts and Expenditurea of the United States Govermment" (see page A-2 in the April 1954 1ssue of the "Treasury Bulletin").

Figures for previous fiscal years heretofore published have been reviced to the basis of ceposita and withdrawals by eliminating corporation and agency transactions included in the old Dally 3 tatement but not cleared through the Treasurer'a account. The cash borrowing or repayment of borrowing as now shown is likewlee based only on transactions cleared through the Treasurer's account.

In Tablea 2, 3, and 418 given the raconciliation of the cash transactions with the budget and other transactions which formerly appeared in the old Daily Statement and now appear in the new Monthly gtatement. These tables
follow the method ued previously for deriving cach income and outgo from the transactions carried in the old Daily Statement. Some rearrangement has been made in the tabls setup, princlpally to combine all recelpta and all expenditures instead of derlving eeparately the cash budget and trust account transactions.

Reporting bases for the two statemente differ in two reapects. Certain corporation and agenoy transactions in securitiss whioh are not effected through the account $r f$ the Treasurer of the United States are included in the Monthly Statement but excluded from the Dally Statement. Theae are eliminated from the Monthly Statement figures in arriving at the cash transactions shown in the tables which follow. Other differences arise because of the differences in timing, as between checks iseued (Monthly Statement) and checks pald (Dally Statement) for expenditurea or between collectiona (Monthly statement) and clearances (Dally Statement) for recelpts. Thus an individual transaction near the end of a month may be includad during that month in one statement but not until the following month in the other. These differences tend to correct themselves over a perlod of time, but for a given reporting date it is neceseary to include an adjustaent figure to cover them.

United States savings bonds were ilret offered in March 1935 and began to mature in March 1945. Seriee A-D were sold between Maroh 1935 and the end of April 1941, and Serlee $E, F$, and $G$ were f1ret offered in May 1941. When Serles E began to mature on May 1, 1951, owners of the matured bonds were offered three options: To redeem the bonds in caeh in accordance with the original terms; to retain them with an extended maturlty of 10 yeare at specifled rates of interest accrual; or to exohange them for Serles $G$ bonds. A number of changes became effective May 1, 1952. The principal ones wore: The rate of Interest accrual on Series $E$ was Increased, especially for the near term, with corresponding ohanges in sxtended Series $E$; and Series $F$ and, were repleced by two now 18sues, Series $J$ and $X$, also at higher interestrates. A new new current-income bond, Series $H$, similarin intereat return to Series $E$, was offered beginning June 1 . For
detalls of these ohanges eae Treasury Bulletin" for May 1952, page A-1. Series $F$ and $O$ began to mature on May 1, 1953. For the exchange offering made to holdera of these bonds maturing through December 31, 1953, see the May 1953 18sue, page A-1. The Treasury invited holder of Series $F$ and $G$ which began to mature in January 1954 to reinveet the proceeds in other series of savings bonds. In the tables which follow, Series $A-F$ and $J$ sales are inoluded at 1 ssue price and total redsmptions and amounts outstanding at ourrent redemption values. SeriesG, $H$, and $X$ are included at face value throughout. Matured bonds whioh have been redeoned are included in redemptions. Matured $F$ and $a$ bonds outstanding are inoluded in the interest-bearing debt until all bonds of the annual seriss have matured, when they are transferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased.

The Treasury Survey of Ownership covers securlties 1saued by the United States Government and by Federal agencies. The banks and insurance companles included in the Survey account for approximately 95 percent of such securities held by all banks and insurance companies in the United states. Data were first published for March 31, 1941, in the May 1941 "Tresoury Bulletin".

Distribution of ownership by types of banks and insuranoe companies 18 publiahed each month. Holdinge by commerclal benks distributed according to Federal Reserve memberbank olassee and nonmember banks are published for June 30 and December 31. Holdinge by corporate penelon truet funde are publiahed quarterly and first appeared in the March 1954 Bulletin for quarters beginning December 31, 1949.

Data rolating to capltal movements between the United Statee and forelgn countrlee have been collectad alnce 1935, pursuant to Executive Order 6560 of January 15 , 1934, Exeoutive Order 10033 of February 8, 1949, and Treasury regulations promulgated thereunder. Information covering the principal typea of data and the prinoipal countrias is reported monthly, and ie publiehed regularly In the "Treasury Bulletia". Supplementary information ia pubilehed at leas frequent intervals. Reporta by banks, bankers, eourities brokers and dealers, and industrial and commercial concerna in the United Statea are made initially to the Faderal Reserve Banke, whioh forward consolidated 11guree to the Treasury. Beginning April 1954, data reported by banks in the Territories and poseessione of the United Statea are included in the publiebed data.

The term "forelgner" atused in these reporta covers all institutions and individuale domicilad outside the United States and its Territories and posesesione, the official latitutions of foreign countriea, wherever such inetitutions may be locsted, and international organizations. "ghort-term" resere to original maturities of one year or leae, and "long-term" rafera to all other maturitiea. A detalled diecuesion of the reporting coverage, etatistical preaentation, and definitione appeared in the June 1954 isaue of the "Ireasury Bulletin", pages 45-47. As a result of changea in preaentation introduced in that isaue, not all braakdown previoualy publiehed will be exactly comparabla to those now presented.

The firgt three eections which follow are published monthly. They provide euminarles of the principal data
by periods and by countrias and present detalled breakdowne of the latest available praliminary data.
