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## Treasury Financing Operations

## Note Maturitien Refunded

Following an announcement on July 12,1956 , the Treasury Departrent on July 16 offered in exchange for two 1 ssues of maturing notes new $2-3 / 4$ percent notes to be obated July 16,1956 , and to mature Ausust 1, 1957. The maturing seeurities were the 2 percent notes, Series B-1956, which matured Ausust 15 in the amount of $\$ 12,366 \mathrm{mlll}$ ion, and the $1-1 / 2$ percent notes, Series EO-1356, maturine Octoter 1, 1956, in the amount of 550 million. Cash subscriptions were not invited. The subscription books were closec at the close of business on July 13. A total of 12,056 million was exchanged, leaving föd million to be paid in cash. The financing results are summarized in the table below:
$\$ 10,000, \$ 100,000, \$ 1,000,000, \$ 100,000,000$, and $\$ 500,000,000$.

July Bills Refunded
Four maturities of 91-day Treasury bllis totaling 6.4 billion were refunded in full in July by four new lesues. Each new issue amounted to "1.6 bllifon, the equivalent of the maturing issue. The average rates of discount on the new lssues were 2.409 percent for July $5 ; 2.386$ percent for July 12 ; 2.236 percent for July 19 ; anc 2.303 percent for July 26.

Exchanges were nace par for :ar with an adjustment of interest as of July 16,1956 , with respect to exchanyes of either serles, and accrued interest to that date was paid to subecribers following acceptance of the maturing securities exchanged. The new notes bear interest iron July 16 , 1956, at the rate of $2-3 / 4$ percent per annum, payable on a semiannual basis on February 1 and August 1,1957 . They were $18 s u e d$ in bearer form only, and in denominations of $\$ 1,000, \$ 5,000$,
limitation on the outstanding public debt curing the period beginning on July 1,1956 , and ending on June 30, 1957, was established by Public Law 678, 84th Congress, approved July 9, 1956. The new law lowered the temporary maximum of $\$ 281$ billion, effective since Algugt 28, 1954 , to $\$ 278$ billion. The basic limit in effect since June 26, 1946, had been 275 billion. Earlier statutory limitations on the debt outstancing are summarized in the Annual Report of the Secretary of the Treasury for the fiscal year 1955, in a table on page 433.

United States asings bonds were first offered in March 1935 and began to mature in March 1945. Seriae A-D were sold between Msrch 1935 and the end of Apr11 1942, and geries $E, F$, and $G$ were first offered in May 1941. When Series $E$ began to mature on May 1, 1951, ownera of the matured bonds were offered three options: To redeem the bonds in cash in accordance with the original terma; to retain them with an extended maturity of 10 yeara at specifled rates of interest accrual; or to exchange tham for Serles $G$ bonde. A number of changes becsme effective May 1, 2952. The principal ones were: The rate of Interest accrusl on Series $E$ was incrsased, especially for the near term, with corresponding changes in extendad Serles $E$; and Series $F$ and $G$ were replaced by two new 1saues, Sertes $J$ and $K$, also at higher interestratea. For the exchange offering made to holders of these bonds maturing through December 31, 1953, sae the May 1953 isaue, page A-1. The Treasury invited holders of Series $F$ and $G$ which began to mature in January 1954 to relnveat the proceeds in other series of savinge bonds. In the tables which follow, Series $A-F$ and $J$ sales are inoluded at isaue price and total redamptions and amounts outstanding at ourrent redemption values. Series $G$, $H$, and $K$ are included at face value throughout. Matured bonda whioh have been redeemed are included in redemptions. Matured $F$ and $G$ bonda outstanding are included in the interest-bearing debt until all bonds of the annual series have matured, when they are tranaferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased.

Treasury tax and savinge notes have been lssued as follows: Tax Series A from August 1, 1941, through June 22, 1943; Tax Series B from August 2, 1941, through Septamber 12. 1942; Savings Series C (originally designated Tax Series C) from Soptember 14, 1942, through August 31 , 1948; Savinge series $D$ from Septamber 1,1948 , through May 14, 1951; Savings Series A from May 15, 1951, through May 14, 1953; Savinge Saries B from May 15, 1953, through september 25, 1953; and a new Savinge Serias C from Ootober 1, through Ootober 23, 1953, when sale of these notes was euspended. Detalle concerning tarms and oonditions for purchase and redemption and information on inve日taent yields of savings Series $C$ appear in the October 1953 18sue of the "Treaeury Bulletin," page A-I.

Similar information with respeot to the offering of the earlise serles was published currently in the "Treasury Bulletin" and appears also in the "Annual Report of the Sacretary of the Treasury" for appropriate yeare.

In the following tables sales and redemptions of Treasury savings notes are shown at par value. Matured notes redeemed (either for cash or for tax payment) are included in the ilgures on redemptione. Matured notes outstanding are reflected in the interest-bearing debt until all notes of the annual series have matured, when they are transferred to matured debt upon which interest has ceased.

The Treasury Survey of Ownership cover securities 1 ssued by the United States Government and by Federal agencles. The banks and insurance companies included in the Survey account for approximately 95 percent of such securlties held by all banks and insurance companies in the United States. Data were flrst published for March 31, 1941, In the May 1941 "Treasury Bulletin."

Data relating to capltal movementa between the United Statea and forelgn countriea have been collected eince 1935, purauant to Executive Order 6560 of January 15. 1934. Execut1ve Order 10033 of February 8, 1949, and Treaury regulations promulgated thereunder. Information covering the principal typea of data and the principal countries ia reported monthly, and la publiahed regularly in the "Treasury Builetin." Supplementary information is publiahed at leas erequent intarvala. Reporta by banka, bankera, aecurltiea brokera and dealera, and industrial and commercial concerna in the United Statea are made Initially to tha Federal Rearve Banke, which forward consolidated P1gures to the Treasury. Beginning April 1954, data reportad by banka in the Territoriea and poasaasiona of the United Statea are included in the publiahed data.

The term "foreigner" as uaed in these reporta covera all institutions and individuala domiciled outaide the United States and lts Territorles and possessions, the official inatitutions of forelgn countriea, wherever such inatitutions may be located, and international organizations. "Short-term" refera to original maturities of one year or leas, and "long-term" refere to all other maturitiea. A detalled diacuasion of the reporting coverage, atatiatical presentation, and deflnitions appeared in the June 1954 Lasue of the "Treasury Bulletin,"
pages 45-47. Aa a reault of changes in precentation introduced in that laaue, not all treakdowns previously published will be exactly comparable to thoae now presented.

The firat three sectiona which follow are published monthly. They provide aummarlea, by perioda and by countrlea, of data on ahort-term banking liabllitiea to and claime on forelgners and tranaactions in long-term securities by forelgners, and present detalled breakdowns of the lateat avallable preliminary data.

Section IV provides aupplementary data in five tatles which appear at less fraquent intervala. Table l, ahortterm Poreign liabllities and clalms reported by nonIInanclal concerna, 1a publiehed quarterly in the January, April, July, and October laauea of the Bulletin. Table 2, long-term forelgn liabllitiea and clalma reported by banka and bankera, and Table 3 , eatimated gold reaervea and dollar holdinge of forelgn countriea and internailonal Inatitutiona, are published quarterly in the March, June, September, and December 1asuea. Table 4, forelgn eredit and deblt balancea in brokerage accounta, appeara sem1annually in the March and September 1aauea. Table 5, short-term liabllitles to forelgners in countries and areaa not regularly reported aeparately by banking inatitutions, 16 presented annually in the Aprll issue.

The Inancial etateaente of businaca-type activities OI : be Unitec states Government which appear in the "Treasury Eulletin" beginning with the Ausust 1956 18sue are based on reporta sub⿴itted to the Treasury under Department Circular No. 966 , 2 saued January $30,15,6$, and reflect its expandec reporting coverage. These statemente take the place of those previously published uncer the caption "Carporations and certain other business-type actlvit1er."

Department Ciroular No. 966 represente anotber etep in the program of comprebensive and Integrated Government accounting and innancial reporting for which authority was provided in the Eudeet and Accounting Procedures Act of 1950. The circular was 188 ued pursuant to gection 114 of that act (? I U.S.C. 66b), and superseces Buctet-Tressury Resulation io. 3. I日evad under Executive Order No. 3512 of A. Eust 13, 1943, as amended by Execuilve Order No. 9084 of Narch ?, 1942.

In coveraze, Department Circular sio. 966 requirea Bubrission of finencisi statements by all wholly ownec and mixed-ownership Government corporations speciricaiiy included in the Government Corporation Control Act, as amended ( 31 U.S.C. 846,356 ); and all cthsr activities of the Government opersting as revolvinz funds for which business-type public enterfrise or intragovernmental fund budgets are required by the Eureau of the Buceet. Other activities and Aeencies whose operatione, servicee, or functione are largely sel:-117uldating or primarily of a revenue-producinz nature, end activitles and arencies whose operetions result in the
acoumulation of aubstantial inventories, inveetments and other recoverable aseets, may be broucht under the regulation as agenoy accounting eyeteme are developed to the point where they are capable of furniohsng the ilnancial reporte required.

Four kinds of Inancial 6 tateaente are called for by Department Circular No. 966. They are Inancial condition, income and expense, gource and application of funds, and long-range commitments and contingencies, to be submitted eeparately by each type of activity. All of theae atatemants wlll be presented in the gulietin. The etatements of condition will be publishec querterly as before, beE2nalng with dsta for March 21, 1956. Income and expense and source of application ol funds wlll continued to be publiehed semiannually, and long-range commitmente and contingencies will be added on a semiannual basis. The statements of concition as of March 31, 1956, which appear in this iseue o: tre Bulletin, are presented in a eeries of tablee as :ollows:

2. Financisi condition of public enterprise funds and intrasovernmental funds;
