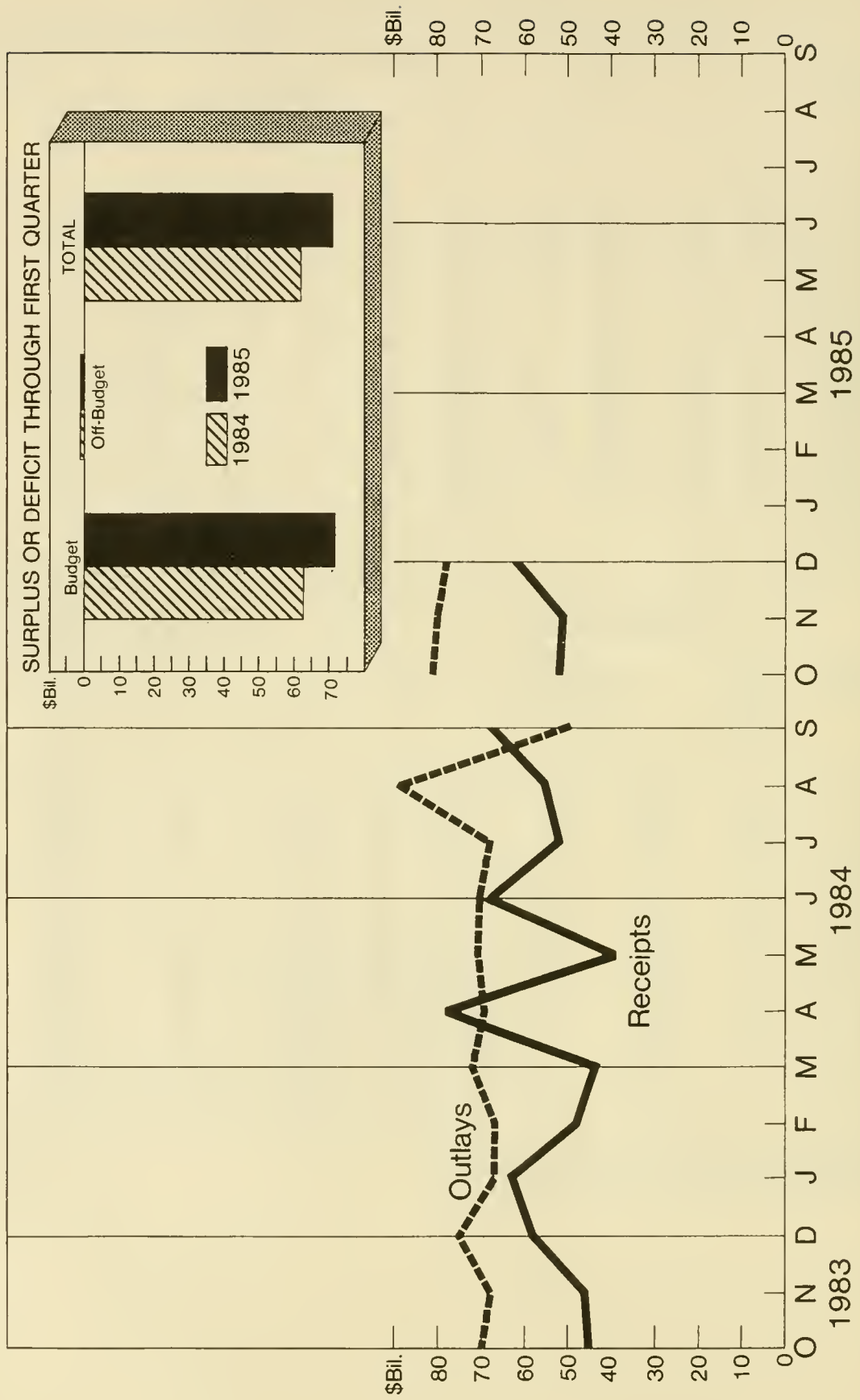

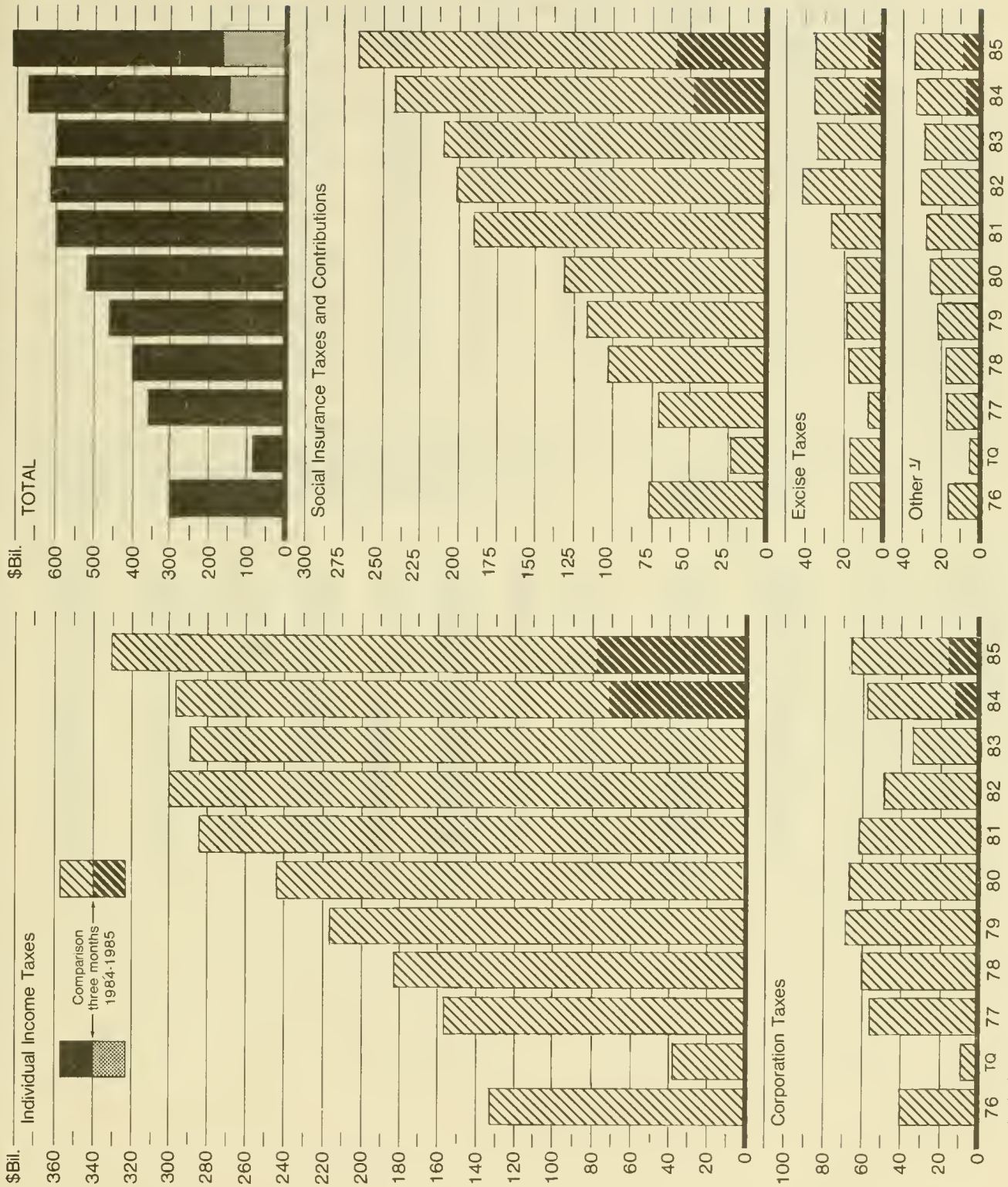

"Obligations" are the basis on which the use of funds is controlled in the Federal Government. They are recorded at the point at which the Government makes a firm commitment to acquire goods or services and are the first of the four key events--order, delivery, payment, and consumption--which characterize the acquisition and use of resources. In general, they consist of orders placed, contracts awarded, services received, and similar transactions requiring the disbursement of money.

The obligational stage of Government transactions is a strategic point in gauging the impact of the Government's operations on the national economy, since it frequently represents for business firms the Government commitment which stimulates business investment, including inventory purchases and employment of labor. Disbursements may not occur for months after the Government places its order, but the order itself usually causes immediate pressure on the private economy.

Obligations are classified according to a uniform set of categories

based upon the nature of the transaction without regard to its ultimate purpose. All payments for salaries and wages, for example, are reported as personnel compensation, whether the personal services are used in current operations or in the construction of capital items.

Federal agencies often do business with one another; in doing so, the "buying" agency records obligations, and the "performing" agency records reimbursements. In table FO-1, obligations incurred within the Government are distinguished from those incurred outside the Government. Table FO-2 shows only those incurred outside.

Obligation data for the administrative budget fund accounts were first published in the September 1967 Treasury Bulletin, and the trust fund accounts were first published in the October 1967 Bulletin. Beginning with the April 1968 Bulletin, the data are on the basis of the budget concepts adopted pursuant to the recommendations of the President's Commission on Budget Concepts.

## ACCOUNT OF THE U.S. TREASURY

## SOURCE AND AVAILABILITY OF THE BALANCE IN THE ACCOUNT OF THE U.S. TREASURY

The operating cash of the Treasury is maintained in Treasury's accounts with the Federal Reserve banks and branches and in tax and loan accounts. Major information sources include the Daily Balance Wire received from the Federal Reserve banks and branches, and electronic transfers through the Treasury Financial Communications System. As the balances in the accounts at the Federal Reserve banks become depleted, they are restored by calling in (withdrawing) funds from thousands of financial institutions throughout the country authorized to maintain tax and loan accounts.

Under authority of Public Law 95-147, the Treasury implemented a program on Nov. 2, 1978, to invest a portion of its operating cash in obligations of depositaries maintaining tax and loan accounts. Under the Treasury tax and loan investment program, depositary financial institutions select the manner in which they will participate in the program. Depositaries that wish to retain funds deposited in their tax and loan accounts in interest-bearing obligations participate under the Note Option; depositaries that wish to remit the funds to the Treasury's account at Federal Reserve banks participate under the Remittance Option.

Deposits to tax and loan accounts occur in the normal course of business under a uniform procedure applicable to all financial institutions whereby customers of financial institutions deposit with them tax payments and funds for the purchase of Government securities. In most cases the transaction involves merely the transfer of funds from a customer's account to the tax and loan account in the same financial institution. On occasions, to the extent authorized by the Treasury, financial institutions are permitted to deposit in these accounts proceeds from subscriptions to public debt securities entered for their own account as well as for the accounts of their customers.

The tax and loan system permits the Treasury to collect funds through financial institutions and to leave the funds in Note Option depositaries and in the financial communities in which they arise until such time as the Treasury needs the funds for its operations. In this way the Treasury is able to neutralize the effect of its fluctuation operations on Note Option financial institution reserves and the economy.

## OCTOBER

## Auction of 2-Year Notes

On October 10 the Treasury announced that it would auction \$8,800 million of 2-year notes to refund \$7,361 million of notes maturing October 31, 1984, and to raise \$1,450 million new cash. The notes offered were Treasury Notes of Series 2-1986, dated October 31, 1984, due October 31, 1986, with interest payable on April 30 and October 31 in each year until maturity. An interest rate of 11-5/8 percent was set after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis.

Tenders for the notes were received until 1 p.m. EDT, October 17, and totaled \$19,425 million, of which \$8,800 million was accepted at yields ranging from 11.69 percent, price 99.887, up to 11.75 percent, price 99.783. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 11.73 percent, price 99.818. These totaled \$929 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$7,871 million.

In addition to the \$8,800 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$375 million was awarded at the average price to Federal Reserve

banks as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities. An additional \$529 million was accepted at the average price from Government accounts and Federal Reserve banks for their own account in exchange for maturing securities.

## 52-Week Bills

On September 21 tenders were invited for approximately \$8,250 million of 364-day Treasury bills to be dated October 4, 1984, and to mature October 3, 1985. The issue was to refund \$7,767 million of 364-day bills maturing October 4 and to raise about \$483 million new cash. Tenders were opened on September 27. They totaled \$22,401 million, of which \$8,285 million was accepted, including \$411 million of noncompetitive tenders from the public and \$1,975 million of the bills issued at the average price to Federal Reserve banks for themselves and as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities. The average bank discount rate was 10.32 percent.

## NOVEMBER

## November Quarterly Financing

On October 31 the Treasury announced that it would sell to the public at auction, under competitive and noncompetitive bidding, up to \$6,500 million of 3-year notes of Series Q-1987, \$5,750 million of 10-year notes of Series C-1994, and \$5,250 million of 30-year bonds of 2009-14 to refund \$9,178 million of publicly held Treasury securities maturing November 15 and to raise \$8,325 million new cash.

An interest rate of 11 percent was set on the notes of Series Q-1987 after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis. The notes of Series Q-1987 were dated November 15, 1984, due November 15, 1987, with interest payable on May 15 and November 15 in each year until maturity.

Tenders for the notes of Series Q-1987 were received until 1:30 p.m. EST, November 5, and totaled \$18,106 million, of which \$6,502 million was accepted at yields ranging from 11.00 percent, price 100.000, up to 11.03 percent, price 99.925. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 11.01 percent, price 99.975. These totaled \$746 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$5,756 million.

In addition to the \$6,502 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$410 million was accepted at the average price from Federal Reserve banks as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities, and \$1,215 million was accepted at the average price from Government accounts and Federal Reserve banks for their own account in exchange for maturing securities.

An interest rate of 11-5/8 percent was set on the notes of Series C-1994 after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis. The notes of Series C-1994 were dated November 15, 1984, due November 15, 1994, with interest payable on May 15 and November 15 in each year until maturity.

Tenders for the notes of Series C-1994 were received until 1 p.m. EST, November 7, and totaled \$12,050 million, of which \$5,750 million was accepted at yields ranging from 11.64 percent, price 99.913, up to 11.73 percent, price 99.391. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 11.70 percent, price 99.565. These totaled \$345 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$5,405 million.

In addition to the \$5,750 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$850 million was accepted at the average price from Government accounts and Federal Reserve banks for their own account in exchange for maturing securities.

An interest rate of 11-3/4 percent was set on bonds of 2009-14 after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis. The bonds of 2009-14 were dated November 15, 1984, callable November 15, 2009, and due November 15, 2014, with interest payable on May 15 and November 15 in each year until call or maturity.

Tenders for the bonds were received until 1 p.m. EST, November 8, and totaled \$9,740 million, of which \$5,253 million was accepted at yields ranging from 11.79 percent, price 99.672, up to 11.87 percent, price 99.021. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield of 11.83 percent, price 99.345. These totaled \$305 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$4,948 million.

In addition to the \$5,253 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$750 million was accepted at the average price from Government accounts and Federal Reserve banks for their own account in exchange for maturing securities.

## Auction of 2-Year Notes

On November 14 the Treasury announced that it would auction \$9,000 million of 2-year notes to refund \$7,023 million of publicly held notes maturing November 30, 1984, and to raise about \$1,975 million new cash. The notes offered were Treasury Notes of Series A8-1986, dated November 30, 1984, due November 30, 1986, with interest payable on May 31 and November 30 in each year until maturity. An interest rate of 10-3/8 percent was set after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis.

Tenders for the notes were received until 1 p.m. EST, November 21, and totaled \$25,900 million, of which \$9,013 million was accepted at yields ranging from 10.45 percent, price 99.868, up to 10.48 percent, price 99.815. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 10.45 percent, price 99.868. These totaled \$1,046 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$7,967 million.

In addition to the \$9,013 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$380 million was accepted at the average price from Federal Reserve banks as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities. An

additional \$548 million was accepted at the average price from Government accounts and Federal Reserve banks for their own account in exchange for maturing securities.

## Auction of 5-Year 2-Month Notes

On November 15 the Treasury announced that it would auction \$6,750 million of 5-year 2-month domestic notes and \$1,000 million of 5-year 2-month foreign-targeted notes to raise new cash.

The domestic notes were Treasury Notes of Series G-1990, dated December 3, 1984, due February 15, 1990, with interest payable on August 15 and February 15 in each year until maturity. The foreign-targeted notes were Treasury Notes of Series H-1990, dated December 3, 1984, due February 15, 1990, with interest payable on February 15 in each year until maturity. An interest rate of 11 percent was set on both issues after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis.

The foreign-targeted notes were sold, under competitive bidding only, to foreign institutions or to foreign branches of U.S. financial institutions. The notes were issued in book-entry form and were eligible for exchange into registered notes of the companion domestic issue, Series G-1990, or for conversion into registered foreign-targeted notes after January 13, 1985.

Tenders for the domestic notes were received until 1 p.m. EST, November 28, and totaled \$18,977 million, of which \$6,757 million was accepted at yields ranging from 11.00 percent, price 99.887, up to 11.03 percent, price 99.770. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 11.02 percent, price 99.809. These totaled \$479 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$6,278 million.

In addition to the \$6,757 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$170 million was awarded at the average price to Federal Reserve banks as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities.

Tenders for the foreign-targeted notes were received until 1 p.m. EST, November 28, at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, and totaled \$2,145 million, of which \$1,000 million was accepted. The interest rate of 11 percent was established in the auction of the companion domestic issue. Accepted yields, based on an annual interest payment, ranged from 11.15 percent, price 99.305, up to 11.30 percent, price 98.739. The average yield of the accepted competitive tenders was 11.25 percent, price 98.927. Noncompetitive tenders were not accepted.

## 52-Week Bills

On October 19 tenders were invited for approximately \$8,250 million of 364-day Treasury bills to be dated November 1, 1984, and to mature October 31, 1985. The issue was to refund \$7,774 million of 364-day bills maturing November 1 and to provide about \$476 million new cash. Tenders were opened on October 25. They totaled \$18,962 million, of which \$8,256 million was accepted, including \$409 million of noncompetitive tenders from the public and \$1,110 million of the bills issued at the average price to Federal Reserve banks for themselves and as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities. The average bank discount rate was 9.45 percent.

On November 16 tenders were invited for approximately \$8,500 million of 365-day Treasury bills to be dated November 29, 1984, and to mature November 29, 1985. The issue was to refund \$8,006 million of 364-day bills maturing November 29 and to provide about \$494 million new cash. Tenders were opened on November 27. They totaled \$21,519 million, of which \$8,525 million was accepted, including \$351 million of noncompetitive tenders from the public and \$1,760 million of the bills issued at the average price to Federal Reserve banks for themselves and as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities. The average bank discount rate was 8.74 percent.

## Cash Management Bills

On November 23 tenders were invited for approximately \$5,000 million of 17-day bills to be issued December 3, 1984, representing an additional amount of bills dated June 21, 1984, maturing December 20, 1984. The issue was to raise new cash. Tenders were opened on November 29. They totaled \$21,887 million, of which \$5,013 million was accepted. The average bank discount rate was 8.45 percent.

In the same announcement on November 23, tenders were invited for approximately \$5,000 million of 45-day bills to be issued December 3, 1984, representing an additional amount of bills dated July 19, 1984, maturing January 17, 1985. The issue was to raise new cash. Tenders were opened on November 29. They totaled \$21,963 million, of which \$5,007 million was accepted. The average bank discount rate was 8.25 percent.

## Auction of 2-Year Notes

On December 12 the Treasury announced that it would auction \$9,000 million of 2-year notes to refund \$5,373 million of publicly held notes maturing December 31, 1984, and to raise about \$1,625 million new cash. The notes offered were Treasury Notes of Series AC-1986, dated December 31, 1984, due December 31, 1986, with interest payable on June 30 and December 31 in each year until maturity. An interest rate of 9-7/8 percent was set after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis.

Tenders for the notes were received until 1 p.m. EST, December 19, and totaled \$21,417 million, of which \$9,009 million was accepted at yields ranging from 9.87 percent, price 100.009, up to 9.93 percent, price 99.902. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 9.92 percent, price 99.920. These totaled \$851 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$8,158 million.

In addition to the \$9,009 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$396 million was accepted at the average price from Federal Reserve banks as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities, and \$600 million was accepted at the average price from Government accounts and Federal Reserve banks for their own account in exchange for maturing securities.

## Auction of 4-Year Notes

On December 18 the Treasury announced that it would auction \$6,200 million of 4-year notes to refund \$3,278 million of publicly held notes maturing December 31, 1984, and to raise about \$2,925 million new cash. The notes offered were Treasury Notes of Series Q-1988, dated December 31, 1984, due December 31, 1988, with interest payable on June 30 and December 31 in each year until maturity. An interest rate of 10-5/8 percent was set after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis.

Tenders for the notes were received until 1 p.m. EST, December 26, and totaled \$14,948 million, of which \$6,206 million was accepted at yields ranging from 10.71 percent, price 99.729, up to 10.74 percent, price 99.634. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 10.72 percent, price 99.697. These totaled \$378 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$5,828 million.

In addition to the \$6,206 million of tenders accepted in the auction process, \$220 million was accepted at the average price from Federal Reserve banks as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities, and \$366 million was accepted at the average price from Government accounts and Federal Reserve banks for their own account in exchange for maturing securities.

## Auctions of 7-Year Notes and 19-Year 10-Month Bonds

On December 24 the Treasury announced that it would sell to the public at auction, under competitive and noncompetitive bidding, up to \$5,750 million of 7-year notes of Series D-1992 and \$4,000 million of 19-year 10-month 11-5/8 percent bonds of 2004 to provide new cash.

An interest rate of 11-5/8 percent was set on the notes of Series D-1992 after the determination as to which tenders were accepted on a yield auction basis. The notes of Series D-1992 were dated January 4, 1985, due January 15, 1992, with interest payable on July 15 and January 15 in each year until maturity.

Tenders for the notes of Series D-1992 were received until 1 p.m. EST, January 2, and totaled \$12,130 million, of which \$5,752 million was accepted at yields ranging from 11.63 percent, price 99.957, up to 11.70 percent, price 99.628. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield of accepted tenders, 11.67 percent, price 99.769. These totaled \$358 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$5,394 million.

The 11-5/8 percent bonds of 2004 were an additional issue of the bonds dated October 30, 1984, due November 15, 2004, with interest payable on May 15 and November 15 in each year until maturity. The bonds were auctioned on a yield auction basis.

Tenders for the bonds were received until 1 p.m. EST, January 3, and totaled \$12,672 million, of which \$4,283 million was accepted at yields ranging from 11.85 percent, price 98.205, up to 11.86 percent, price 98.130. Noncompetitive tenders were accepted in full at the average yield, 11.86 percent, price 98.130. These totaled \$296 million. Competitive tenders accepted from private investors totaled \$3,987 million.

## 52-Week Bills

On December 14 tenders were invited for approximately \$8,500 million of 364-day Treasury bills to be dated December 27, 1984, and to mature December 26, 1985. The issue was to refund \$8,272 million of 364-day bills maturing December 27 and to provide about \$228 million new cash. Tenders were opened on December 20. They totaled \$18,506 million, of which \$8,501 million was accepted, including \$256 million of noncompetitive tenders from the public and \$1,810 million of the bills issued at the average price to Federal Reserve banks for themselves and as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities. An additional \$75 million of the bills was issued to Federal Reserve banks as agents for foreign and international monetary authorities for new cash. The average bank discount rate was 8.38 percent.

## U.S. SAVINGS BONDS AND NOTES

Series EE bonds, on sale since Jan. 1, 1980, are the only savings bonds currently sold. Series HH bonds are issued in exchange for series E and EE savings bonds and savings notes. Series A-D were sold from Mar. 1, 1935, through Apr. 30, 1941. Series E was on sale from May 1, 1941, through Dec. 31, 1979 (through June 1980 to payroll savers only). Series F and G were sold from May 1, 1941, through Apr. 30, 1952. Series H was sold from June 1, 1952, through Dec. 31, 1979. Series HH bonds were sold for cash from Jan. 1, 1980, through Oct. 31, 1982. Series J and K were sold from May 1, 1952, through Apr. 30, 1957.

U.S. savings notes were on sale May 1, 1967, through June 30, 1970. The notes were eligible for purchase by individuals with the simultaneous purchase of series E savings bonds. The principal terms and conditions for purchase and redemption and information on investment yields of savings notes appear in the Treasury Bulletins of March 1967 and June 1968; and the Annual Report of the Secretary of the Treasury for fiscal year 1974.

## MARKET BID YIELDS ON TREASURY SECURITIES

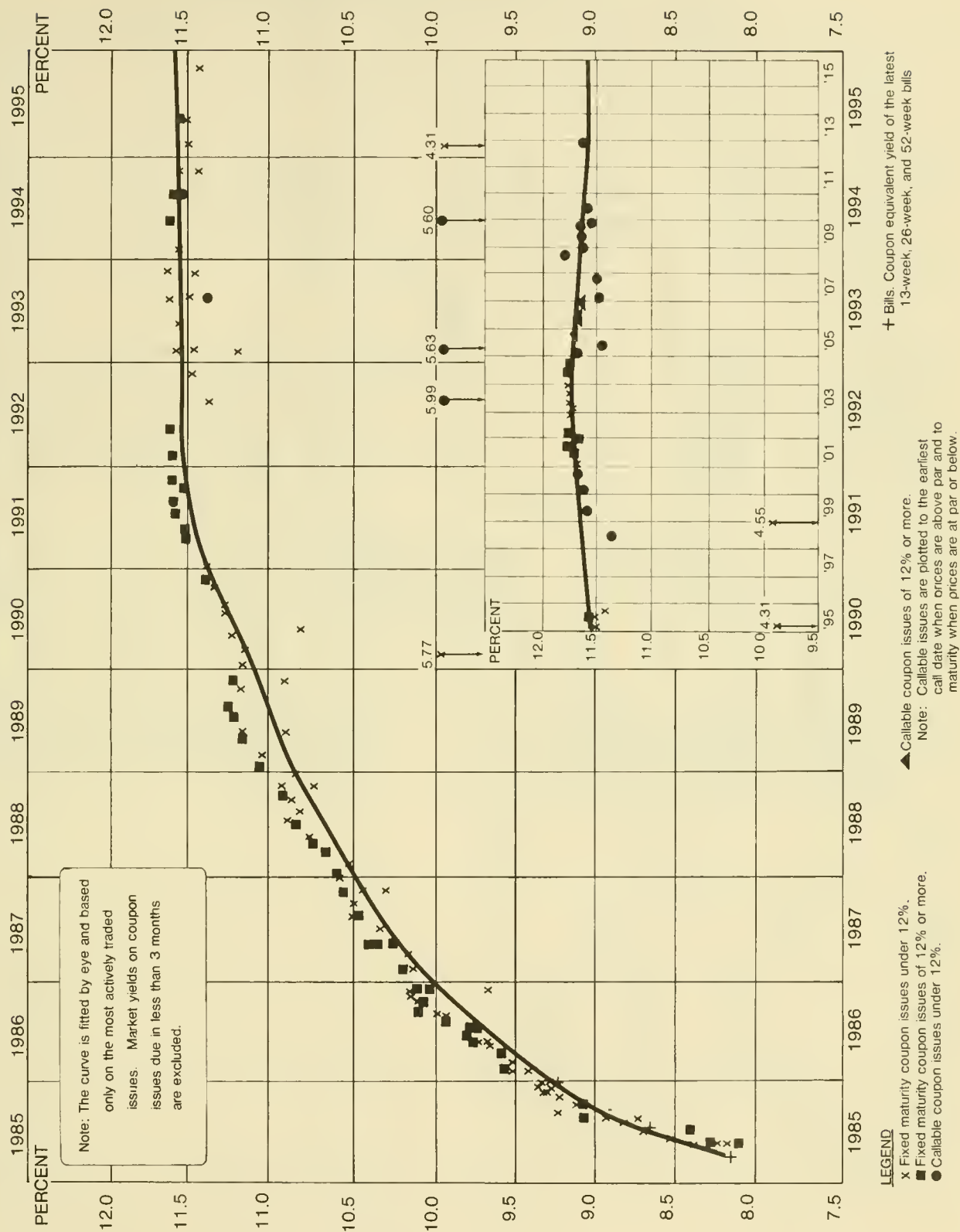
Table MBY-1. — Treasury Market Bid Yields at Constant Maturities, Bills, Notes, and Bonds\*

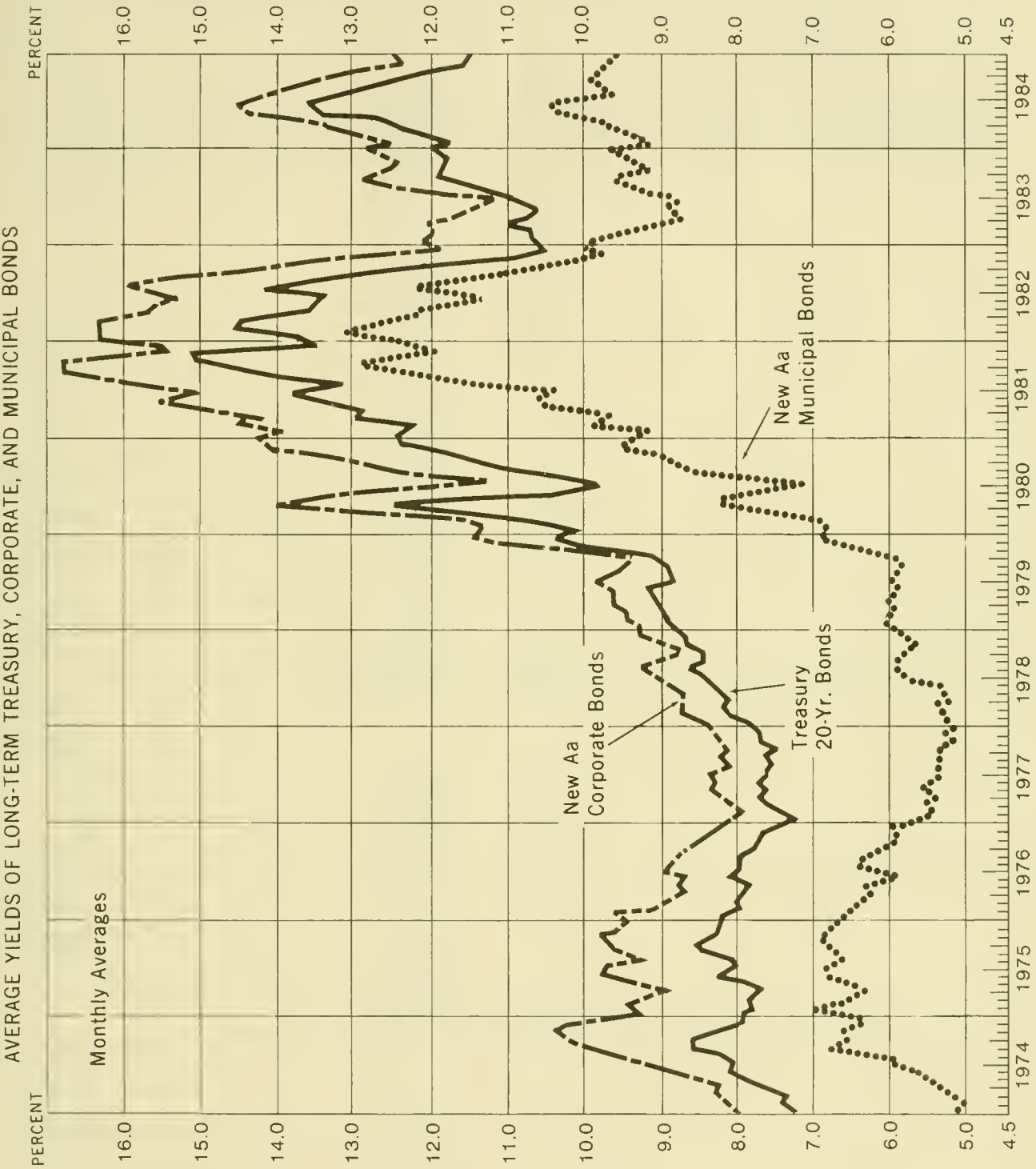

## Government Corporations and Other Business-Type Activities

Treasury Department Circular No. 966, Revised, dated December 20, 1972, and volume 1, part 2, chapter 4100 of the Treasury Financial Manual (Transmittal Letter No. 413) require Government agencies to submit business-type financial statements and related information to the Department of the Treasury for use in compiling financial reports of the U.S. Government. The circular was originally issued in 1956 pursuant to the authority of section 114 of the Budget and Accounting Procedures Act of 1950 (31 U.S.C. 3513) which requires the Secretary of the Treasury to prepare reports on the financial operations of the U.S. Government.

Department Circular No. 966, Revised, requires submission of annual financial statements by all Government corporations specifically subject to the Government Corporation Control Act, as amended (31 U.S.C. 846, 856); any wholly owned and mixed-ownership corporation subsequently brought under the provisions of the act; all activities operating as revolving funds; and any other activities or agencies whose operations, services, or functions are largely self-liquidating or primarily of a revenue-producing nature or whose activities result in the accumulation of substantial inventories, investments, and other recoverable assets.

The Statements of Financial Condition and Statements of Income and Retained Earnings presented in the following tables reflect the position of both business-type and regular governmental activities as of September 30, 1984. These statements are entirely the representation of the agency and have not been compared with any other reports submitted to the Treasury. Transfer appropriations have been included with fund totals of the agency administering the program--the "spending" agency. Blank columns indicate that a financial statement was expected but not received by the Treasury. All amounts are reported in dollars.

Statements of Financial Condition, required for all activities, are published annually in the Treasury Bulletin in table GA-1-1. Statements of Income and Retained Earnings, required for all business-type activities, are also published annually and appear in table GA-1-2. Direct loans held by agencies and loans guaranteed or insured by agencies are published semiannually (winter and summer issues) and appear in table GA-11-1. Tables detailing the status of accounts and loans receivable due from the public, required for all activities, are published annually and appear separately in the "Cash Management/Debt Collection" section of the Treasury Bulletin.

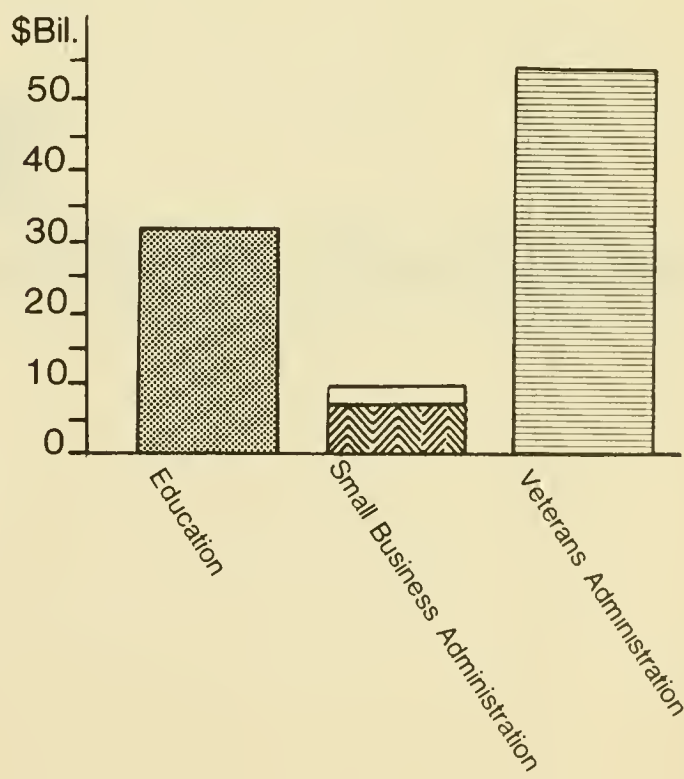

# International Statistics





The tables in this section are designed to provide data on U.S. reserve assets and liabilities and other statistics related to the U.S. balance of payments and international financial position.

Table IFS-1 shows the reserve assets of the United States, including its gold stock, special drawing rights held in the Special Drawing Account in the International Monetary Fund, holdings of convertible foreign currencies, and reserve position in the International Monetary Fund.

Table IFS-2 brings together statistics on liabilities to foreign official institutions, and selected liabilities to all other foreigners, which are used in the U.S. balance of payments statistics.

Table IFS-3 shows U.S. Treasury nonmarketable bonds and notes issued to official institutions and other residents of foreign countries.

Table IFS-4 presents a measure of weighted-average changes in exchange rates between the U.S. dollar and the currencies of certain other countries.

The equations used are as follows:

Equation one is used to calculate a trade-weighted average of changes in the dollar cost of foreign currencies:

Where:  $E_m$  is the weighted average of percentage changes in the dollar cost of individual foreign currencies;

$\Delta S/FC_i$  is the percent change in the dollar cost of foreign currency  $i$ ; and

$M_i/\Sigma M$  is U.S. imports from country  $i$ , as a proportion of total U.S. imports from all countries in the set.

Equation two is used to calculate a trade-weighted average of changes in the foreign exchange cost of dollars:

$$(EQ2) \quad E_x = \Sigma(\Delta FC_i/\$ * X_i/\Sigma X)$$

Where:  $E_x$  is the weighted average of percentage changes in the foreign currency cost of dollars;

$\Delta FC_i/\$$  is the percent change in the foreign currency  $i$  cost of dollars; and

$X_i/\Sigma X$  is U.S. exports to country  $i$ , as a proportion of total U.S. exports to all countries in the set.

Equation three combines the above export-weighted and import-weighted averages to provide an overall measure of exchange rate change:

$$(EQ3) \quad E = [(E_m * m/m+x) * (-1)] + [E_x * x/m+x]$$

Where:  $m/m+x$  is U.S. imports as a proportion of its total trade with all countries in the set; and

$x/m+x$  is U.S. exports as a proportion of its total trade with all countries in the set.

## INTRODUCTION

## Background

Data relating to capital movements between the United States and foreign countries have been collected in some form since 1935. Reports are filed with district Federal Reserve banks by commercial banks, bank holding companies, securities brokers and dealers, and nonbanking enterprises in the United States. Statistics on the principal types of data by country or geographical area are then consolidated and are published in the Treasury Bulletin.

The reporting forms and instructions I/ used in the Treasury International Capital (TIC) Reporting System have been revised a number of times to meet changing conditions and to increase the usefulness of the published statistics. The most recent, general revision of the report forms became effective with the banking reports as of April 30, 1978, and with the nonbanking reports as of December 31, 1978. Revised forms and instructions are developed with the cooperation of other Government agencies and the Federal Reserve System and in consultations with representatives of banks, securities firms, and nonbanking enterprises.

## Basic Definitions

The term "foreigner" as used in the Treasury reports covers all institutions and individuals domiciled outside the United States, including U.S. citizens domiciled abroad, and the foreign branches, subsidiaries, and other affiliates abroad of U.S. banks and business concerns; the central governments, central banks, and other official institutions of foreign countries, wherever located; and international and regional organizations, wherever located. The term "foreigner" also includes persons in the United States to the extent that they are known by reporting institutions to be acting on behalf of foreigners.

In general, data are reported opposite the foreign country or geographical area in which the foreigner is domiciled, as shown on the records of reporting institutions. For a number of reasons, the geographical breakdown of the reported data may not in all cases reflect the ultimate ownership of the assets. Reporting institutions are not expected to go beyond the addresses shown on their records, and so may not be aware of the country of domicile of the ultimate beneficiary. Furthermore, U.S. liabilities arising from deposits of dollars with foreign banks are reported in the Treasury statistics as liabilities to foreign banks, whereas the liability of the foreign bank receiving the deposit may be to foreign official institutions or to residents of another country.

Data pertaining to branches or agencies of foreign official institutions are reported opposite the country to which the official institution belongs. Data pertaining to international and regional organizations are reported opposite the appropriate international or regional classification except for the Bank for International Settlements which is included in the classification "Other Europe."

## Reporting Coverage

Reports are required from banks, bank holding companies, International Banking Facilities (IBF's), securities brokers and dealers, and nonbanking enterprises in the United States, including the branches, agencies, subsidiaries, and other affiliates in the United States of foreign banking and nonbanking firms. Entities that have reportable liabilities, claims, or securities transactions below specified exemption levels are exempt from reporting.

Banks and some brokers and dealers file monthly reports covering their dollar liabilities to, and dollar claims on, foreigners in a number of countries. Twice a year, as of June 30 and December 31, they also report the same liabilities and claims items with respect to foreigners in countries not shown separately on the monthly reports. Beginning with reports due as of June 30, 1978, quarterly reports are filed with respect to liabilities and claims denominated in foreign currencies vis-à-vis foreigners. Effective January 31, 1984, the specified exemption level applicable to the monthly and quarterly banking reports was raised from \$10 million to \$15 million. There is no separate exemption level for the semiannual reports.

Banks, securities brokers and dealers, and in some instances nonbanking enterprises report monthly their transactions in securities with foreigners; the applicable exemption level is \$500,000 on the grand total of purchases and on the grand total of sales during the month covered by the report.

Quarterly reports are filed by exporters, importers, industrial and commercial concerns, financial institutions other than banks and brokers, and other nonbanking enterprises if their liabilities to, or claims on, unaffiliated foreigners exceed a specified exemption level on a two quarter-end average basis. Effective March 31, 1982, this exemption level was set at \$10 million, up from \$2 million. Nonbanking enterprises also report for each month their U.S. dollar-denominated deposit and certificates of deposit claims of \$10 million or more on banks abroad.

## Description of Statistics

Section I presents data on liabilities to foreigners reported by banks, brokers, and dealers in the United States. Beginning April 1978, the fol-

lowing major changes were made in the reporting coverage: Amounts due to banks' own foreign offices are reported separately; a previous distinction between short-term and long-term liabilities was eliminated; a separation was provided of the liabilities of the respondents themselves from their custody liabilities to foreigners; and foreign currency liabilities are only available quarterly. Also, beginning April 1978, the data on liabilities were made more complete by extending to securities brokers and dealers the requirement to report certain of their own liabilities and all of their custody liabilities to foreigners.

Section II presents the claims on foreigners reported by banks in the United States. Beginning with data reported as of the end of April 1978, a distinction was made between banks' claims held for their own account and claims held for their domestic customers. The former are available in a monthly series whereas the latter data are collected on a quarterly basis only. Also, the distinction in reporting of long-term and short-term components of banks' claims was discontinued. Maturity data began to be collected quarterly on a time remaining to maturity basis as opposed to the historic original maturity classification. Foreign currency claims are also collected on a quarterly basis only. Beginning March 1981, this claims coverage was extended to certain items in the hands of brokers and dealers in the United States.

Another important change in the claims reporting, beginning with new quarterly data as of June 30, 1978, was the adoption of a broadened concept of "foreign public borrower," which replaced the previous category of "foreign official institution" to produce more meaningful information on lending to the public sector of foreign countries. The term "foreign public borrower" encompasses central governments and departments of central governments of foreign countries and of their possessions; foreign central banks, stabilization funds, and exchange authorities; corporations and other agencies of central governments, including development banks, development institutions, and other agencies which are majority-owned by the central government or its departments; State, provincial, and local governments of foreign countries and their departments and agencies; and any international or regional organization or subordinate or affiliated agency thereof, created by treaty or convention between sovereign states.

Section III includes supplementary statistics on U.S. banks' liabilities to, and claims on, foreigners. The supplementary data on banks' loans and credits to nonbank foreigners combine selected information from the TIC reports with data from the monthly Federal Reserve 2502 reports submitted for major foreign branches of U.S. banks. Other supplementary data on U.S. banks' dollar liabilities to, and banks' own dollar claims on, countries not regularly reported separately are available semiannually in the May and November issues of the Treasury Bulletin.

Section IV shows the liabilities to, and claims on, unaffiliated foreigners by exporters, importers, industrial and commercial concerns, financial institutions other than banks and brokers, and other nonbanking enterprises in the United States. The data exclude the intercompany accounts of nonbanking enterprises in the United States with their own branches and subsidiaries abroad or with their foreign parent companies. (Such transactions are reported by business enterprises to the Department of Commerce on its direct investment forms.) The data also exclude claims held through banks in the United States. Beginning with data reported as of December 31, 1978, financial liabilities and claims of reporting enterprises are distinct from their commercial liabilities and claims; and items are collected on a time remaining to maturity basis instead of the original maturity basis used previously.

Section V contains data on transactions in all types of long-term domestic and foreign securities by foreigners as reported by banks and brokers in the United States (except nonmarketable U.S. Treasury notes, foreign series; and nonmarketable U.S. Treasury bonds and notes, foreign currency series, which are shown in the "International Financial Statistics" section, table IFS-3). The data cover new issues of securities, transactions in outstanding issues, and redemptions of securities. They include transactions executed in the United States for the account of foreigners, and transactions executed abroad for the account of reporting institutions and their domestic customers. The data include some transactions which are classified as direct investments in the balance of payments accounts.

The geographical breakdown of the data on securities transactions shows the country of domicile of the foreign buyers and sellers of the securities; in the case of outstanding issues, this may differ from the country of the original issuer. The gross figures contain some offsetting transactions between foreigners. The net figures for total transactions represent transactions by foreigners with U.S. residents; but the net figures for transactions of individual countries and areas may include some transactions between foreigners of different countries.

The data published in these sections do not cover all types of reported capital movements between the United States and foreign countries. The principal exclusions are the intercompany capital transactions of nonbanking business enterprises in the United States with their own branches and subsidiaries abroad or with their foreign parent companies, and capital transactions of the U.S. Government. Consolidated data on all types of international capital transactions are published by the Department of Commerce in its regular reports on the U.S. balance of payments.

## INTRODUCTION

## Background

Data have been collected since 1974 on the foreign currency positions of banks and nonbanking firms in the United States, and on those of foreign branches, majority-owned foreign partnerships, and majority-owned foreign subsidiaries of U.S. banks and nonbanking firms. Reports cover five major foreign exchange market currencies and U.S. dollars held abroad. Reporting has been required pursuant to title II of Public Law 93-110, an amendment to the Par Value Modification Act of September 21, 1973, and implementing Treasury regulations. Statistics on the positions have been published since March 1977 beginning with data for December 1975.

The report forms and instructions used in the collection of bank data were revised effective with reports as of March 16, 1983, for the weekly reports. The most recent revision of the nonbank foreign currency forms (see below) became effective as of the last business day of March 1983.

## Common Definitions and Concepts

The term "United States" means the States of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Midway Island, the Virgin Islands, and Wake Island. The term "foreign" means locations other than the "United States." The term "worldwide" is used to describe the sum of "United States" and "foreign" data.

Data for the United States include amounts reported by sole proprietorships, partnerships, and corporations in the United States including the U.S. branches and subsidiaries of foreign nonbanking concerns, in the case of "nonbanking firms' positions," and the agencies, branches, and subsidiaries located in the United States of foreign banks and banking institutions, in the case of the weekly "bank positions."

Data for "foreign branches" and "abroad" include amounts reported by the branches, majority-owned partnerships, and majority-owned subsidiaries of U.S. banking and nonbanking concerns. In general, these data do not reflect the positions of foreign parents or foreign parents' subsidiaries located abroad except through intercompany accounts. The data include the foreign subsidiaries of a few foreign-owned U.S.-based corporations.

Assets, liabilities, and foreign exchange contract data are reported on the basis of time remaining to maturity as of the date of the report, regardless of the original maturity of the instrument involved. "Spot" means due for receipt or delivery within 2 business days from the date of the report. "Short-term" means maturing in 1 year or less from the date of the report.

"Majority-owned foreign partnerships" are those organized under the laws of a foreign country in which one or more nonbanking concerns or nonprofit institutions in the United States, directly or indirectly, own more than 50 percent profit interest. "Majority-owned foreign subsidiaries" are foreign corporations in which one or more nonbanking business concerns or nonprofit institutions located in the United States, directly or indirectly, own stock with more than 50 percent of the total combined voting power of all classes of stock entitled to vote, or more than 50 percent of the total value of all classes of stock.

## Reporting Threshold

The exemption level applicable to banks and banking institutions was \$10 million equivalent through January 1982, when it was raised to \$100 million. The exemption level applicable to nonbanking business concerns and nonprofit institutions was \$1 million equivalent on all nonbank forms from March 1975 through November 1976. It was raised to \$2 million equivalent on the monthly reports of positions held in the United States from November 1976 through September 1978. The exemption level was raised to \$3 million on foreign subsidiary positions on June 30, 1977, and for positions held in the United States on September 30, 1978. The exemption level for nonbanking firms was raised to \$100 million on positions in the United States in January 1982 and on foreign branch and subsidiaries positions in March 1982.

Firms must report their entire foreign currency position in a specified foreign currency if a specified U.S. dollar equivalent value is reached in any category of assets, liabilities, exchange contracts bought and sold, or the net position in the currency. In general, exemption levels are applied to the entire firm. In reports on their foreign branches, majority-owned foreign partnerships, and majority-owned foreign subsidiaries, U.S. banks and nonbanks are required to report the U.S. dollar-denominated assets, liabilities, exchange contracts bought and sold, and net positions of those branches, partnerships, and subsidiaries with reportable positions in the specified foreign currencies.

## Description of Statistics

Data collected on the Treasury foreign currency forms are published in the Treasury Bulletin in seven sections. The first section presents a summary of worldwide net positions in all of the currencies reported. Sections II through VI each present data on a specified foreign currency. Section VII presents the U.S. dollar positions of the foreign branches and subsidiaries of U.S. firms which are required to report in one or more of the specified foreign currencies.

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## CASH MANAGEMENT INITIATIVES



## Collection Mechanism Legislation Update

Since the passage of the Deficit Reduction Act of 1984 last July, Treasury has been working to complete the regulations and procedures necessary to implement section 2652 of the act. This section gives the Secretary of the Treasury new authority to prescribe to agencies the timing and mechanisms they will use for the collection and deposit of monies to the Treasury.

Due to the impact on agency cash management activities, it was determined that agency involvement in the writing of the procedures was critical. A Governmentwide task force was formed with representatives from the 20 major Reform '88 agencies. Each participant will work on one of the four identified task areas:

**Task Group #1 Notice of Proposed Rulemaking**

- \* Task group met December 3-21, 1984, to write the notice of proposed rulemaking which will be published in the Federal Register.
- \* Notice is currently in formal clearance process through Treasury.
- \* Target date of October 1, 1985, for full implementation is on track.

**Task Group #2 Monitoring of Agency Cash Management Performance**

- \* Task group met January 15-31, 1985, to develop procedures that will be used to measure agency compliance with the legislation.

- \* Procedures will cover opportunity reports, initiative agreements, tracking of initiatives, notices of deficiency, and the appeal process.

**Task Group #3 Payments Application Procedure**

- \* Task group met January 14-25, 1985, to develop procedures governing the receipt and disbursement of monies in the cash management improvements fund, which was established by the legislation.
- \* Monies in the fund will be used for demonstration projects of new or improved cash management tools with Governmentwide applicability.
- \* Treasury will have responsibility for selecting and approving projects/agencies to receive monies from the fund.

**Task Group #4 Revision of 1 TFRM Chapter 6-8000**

- \* Task group met February 11-22, 1985, to revise the Treasury Financial Manual to reflect new procedures and guidelines developed by Task Groups 1-3.

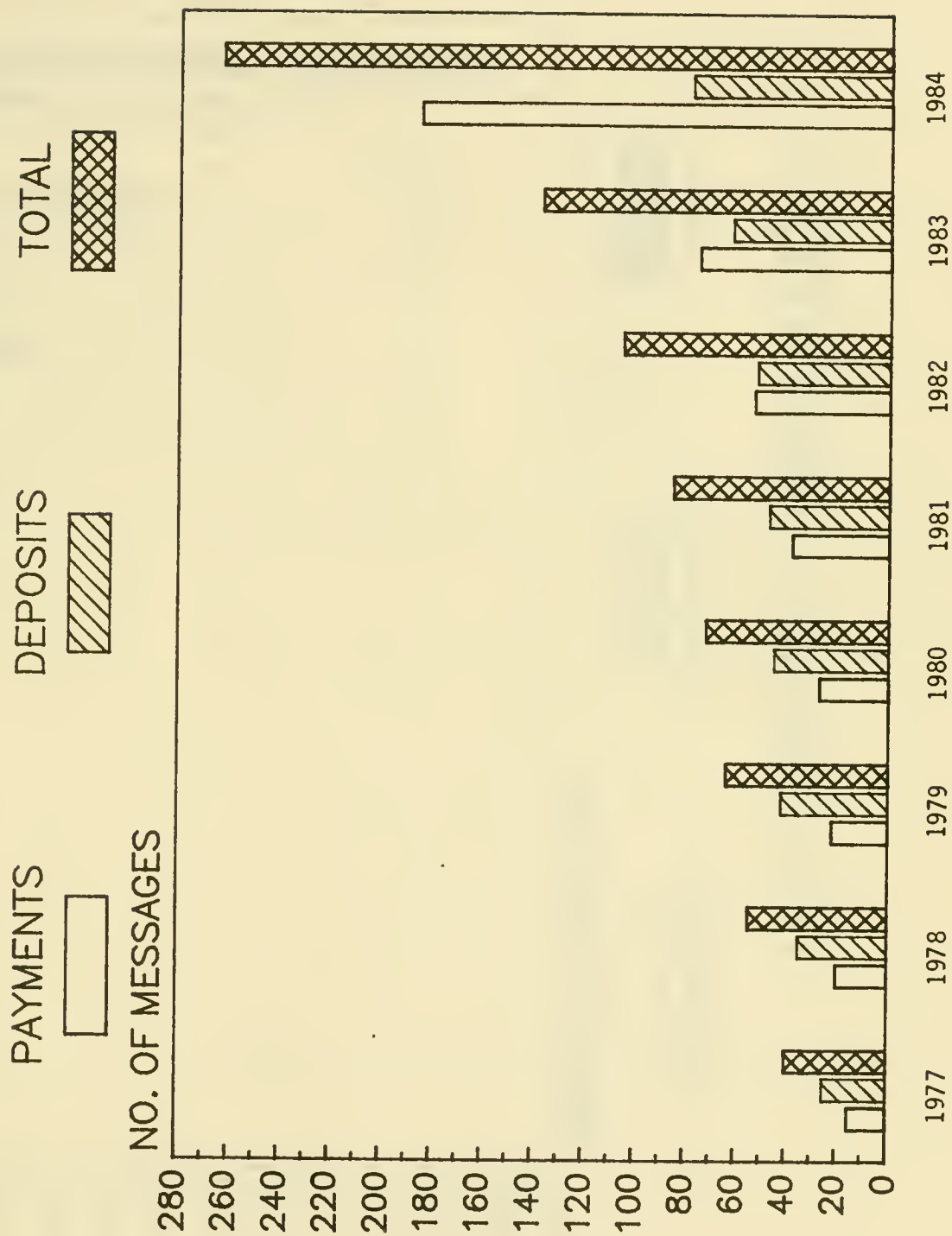
## TFCS—Almost a Decade of Growth

The Treasury Financial Communications System (TFCS) was established in September 1976 as part of an overall initiative to improve cash management and financial reporting in the Federal Government. Under the TFCS, Treasury can electronically send and receive funds transfer messages to and from Federal Reserve banks or financial institutions which have access to the Federal Reserve Communications System. Consequently, Treasury can monitor, perform, and control these monetary functions on a daily basis. The two main benefits are: (1) The flow of large dollar collections can be accelerated to the maximum, and (2) the disbursement of funds due on particular dates can be controlled to insure payment when due.

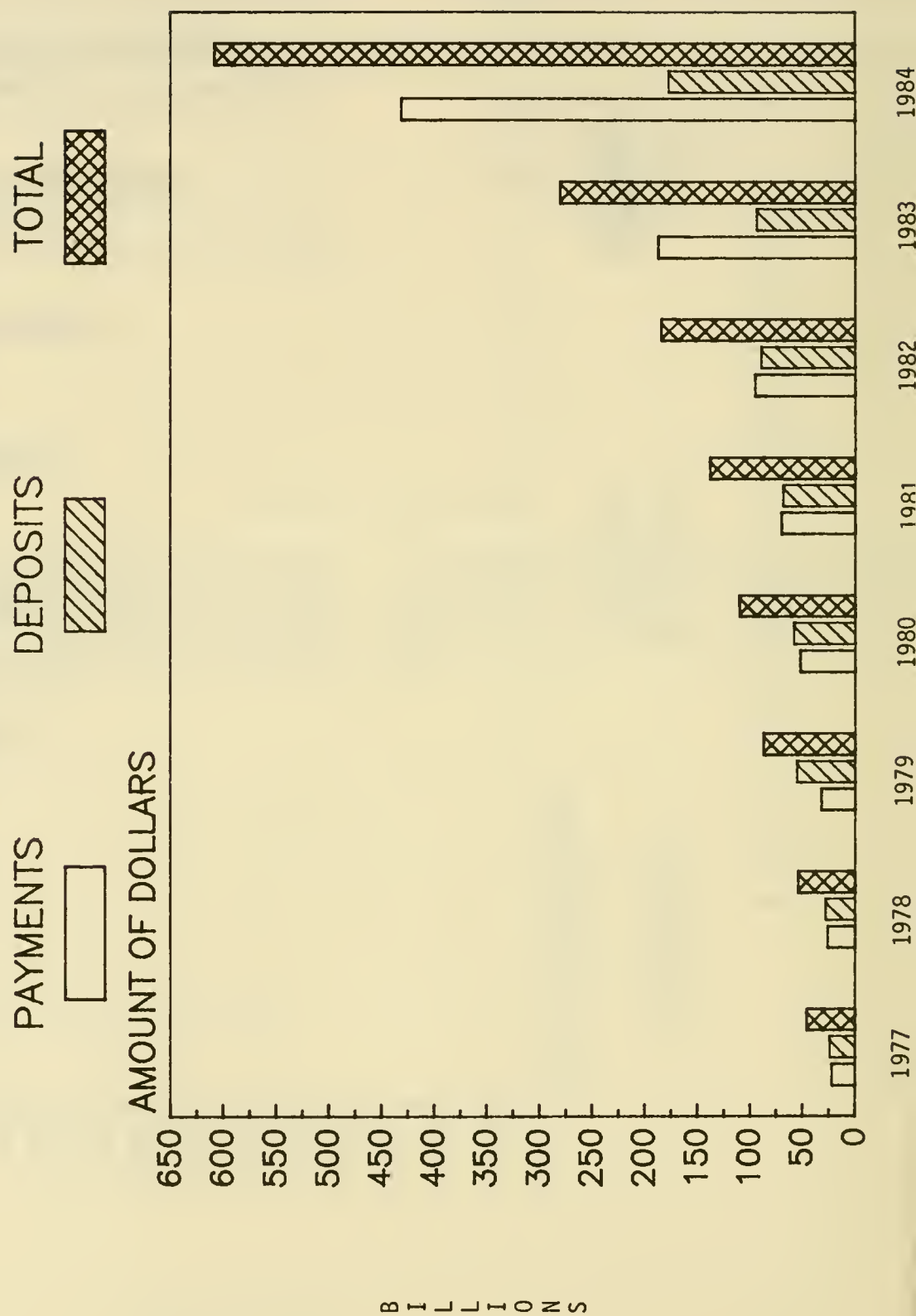
It has been estimated that as a result of Reform '88, the Prompt Payment Act, the Debt Collection Act, and other similar efforts to improve cash management in the Government, the TFCS growth statistics by September 1986 (its 10th birthday) will be in the \$900 billion category for the total amount of monies processed.

The growth rates of TFCS deposits and payments are illustrated in the following graphs. Note the large increase in payments—a direct result of Reform '88.

## Reform '88 Cash Management

Treasury's Financial Management Service/Federal Finance has lead agency responsibility for monitoring and reporting progress on Reform '88 cash management initiatives undertaken by 20 Federal departments and agencies. The overall goal of the project is to improve Government's payments and collections systems, with special attention being directed toward identifying additional applications for state-of-the-art technology and expanding the use of other mechanisms, such as lockboxes, automated clearinghouses, and cash concentration systems.

Agencies are providing monthly reports to Treasury on the status of 415 initiatives. For fiscal 1983, interest savings totaled \$177 million.

Projected and actual figures for fiscal 1984 for each of the participating agencies are shown below.

ACCOUNTS AND LOANS RECEIVABLE DUE FROM THE PUBLIC

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## INTRODUCTION

The Treasury Financial Manual (Transmittal Letter No. 442, June 8, 1984) advised agencies of a continuing reporting requirement to obtain data on the status of accounts and loans receivable due from the public, and on agencies' accounting and debt collection practices.

These receivables and the agencies' methods of collecting them have been discussed at congressional hearings. Under the Debt Collection Act of 1982 and the implementing joint standards issued by the Department of Justice and the General Accounting Office, operating departments and agencies have primary responsibility for collection of amounts arising from their programs.

Transmittal Letter No. 442 required all agencies to prepare a supporting schedule to the Statement of Financial Condition, SF-220, for accounts, loans, or other receivables due from the public as of September 30, 1984. Of the seven sections of the schedule, six sections of the schedule reproduced in the

following tables give data concerning the reconciliation of accounts balances; an aging schedule of amounts due; the disposition of writeoffs and adjustments to allowances; administrative action taken on delinquent amounts; an aging schedule of rescheduled receivables; and a reconciliation of interest, penalties, and administrative costs assessed on delinquencies. The first table gives data about accounts receivable; the second and third tables detail loans receivable and other, or noncurrent, receivables, respectively. The data are shown on a summary basis by agency and are reported in dollars.

The information shown in these tables is based on data submitted to the Treasury, Financial Management Service, per Department of the Treasury Circular No. 966, Revised, dated December 20, 1972, and volume 1, part 2, chapter 4100 of the Treasury Financial Manual. These financial statements appear annually in the Treasury Bulletin.

# Status of Accounts Receivable Due from the Public as of Sept. 30, 1984

STATEMENT OF LIABILITIES  
AND OTHER FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS OF THE  
UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT AS OF SEPT. 30, 1984

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This report is compiled in accordance with 31 U.S.C. 331 (b), for the period ended September 30, 1984.

Liabilities of the Federal Government are shown in section I of this report. Commitments that may or may not become actual liabilities because of future events are shown in sections II, III, and IV. Clearly, there is a vast difference between items in section I--where the liability is certain and the amounts relatively precise--and section IV--where the possible future liability is highly speculative and may never arise. The amounts in section IV, if they can be projected at all, are stated in terms of maximum theoretical risk exposure (the upper limit of the Government's financial commitment) without regard to probability of occurrence and without deduction for existing and contingent assets which would be available to offset potential losses.

Therefore, there is little relationship between the four sections of this report. The liabilities presented in each section deal with dissimilar types of commitments which cannot be summarized. Consequently, each section should be considered individually as a specialized information source.

The "liabilities" in section I represent existing liabilities to pay (1) money borrowed (public debt and agency debt including all public and agency debt issues outstanding), (2) goods and services actually received, and (3) adjudicated claims.

The "undelivered orders" in section II represent the value of goods and services ordered and obligated but which have not been received and other legal commitments against appropriations, all pursuant to section 1311 of the Supplemental Appropriation Act of 1955 (31 U.S.C. 200). These commitments will become an obligation when the goods and services ordered are delivered or when other performance stipulations have been met and the amounts to be paid can be determined.

The "long-term contracts" in section III represent commitments of a general nature that will not be due for a comparatively long time (usually more than one fiscal year). These commitments differ from those in section II insofar as (1) they are not legal commitments against appropriations, (2) a longer period of time will elapse before they become obligations, and (3) they are subject to cancellation or modification and are not a reliable measure of future liabilities.

The "contingencies" in section IV represent conditional commitments that may become actual liabilities due to future events beyond the control of the Government. These commitments share a basic characteristic of uncertainty as to a possible loss and they will be ultimately resolved when one or more future events occur or fail to occur.

The footnotes accompanying the schedules are intended to assist the user in evaluating the data.

Public Law 95-595 requires annual reporting 6 months after the close of the plan year by any plan which provides pension benefits for officers and employees of the Federal Government and its agencies and instrumentalities. Figures in this report are based on the most recent Public Law 95-595 submission.

The Uniformed Services Retirement System covers the military, the U.S. Coast Guard, and the commissioned corps of the Public Health Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. There are no employee contributions or trust funds from which benefits are paid. The Federal Government finances all benefit payments through annual appropriations authorized by Congress. These plans submit Public Law 95-595 reports.

The Federal supplementary medical insurance trust fund has no valuation period as such. Under authority of section 1839 of the Social Security Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services annually determines amounts to be paid by each of supplementary medical insurance enrollees and the Department of the Treasury that are, in total, adequate to fund both benefits incurred through the end of the annual promulgation period and related administrative expenses. Since amounts determined annually make adjustments for actuarial gains and losses, past submissions have used special definitions of assets and liabilities that relate solely to items incurred as of the valuation date.

The present values shown have been computed as of the beginning of the valuation period. The liabilities consist of the sum of all estimated outgo during the valuation period and the value of loans owed to other funds; and the assets consist of the sum of all estimated income during the period, an estimate of trust fund balance at the beginning of the period, and the value of any loans made to other funds. The estimates have been prepared on the basis of the financing method regarded by Congress and the trustees of the trust funds as the appropriate one to use for social insurance programs; namely, that future young workers will be covered by the program as they enter the labor force. If, instead, the estimates were based on the assumption that no workers would be covered in the future other than those who were age 18 and over as of Sept. 30, 1984 (that is contrary to the basis which Congress has adopted for financing these two programs), there would be a deficiency of \$4,207,700 million for the OASDI programs.

Represents estimated total future costs for death benefits, disability compensation, medical and miscellaneous costs for approved compensation cases on the rolls as of Sept. 30, 1984. Assets are derived from appropriations. Under the FEC Act, the appropriations are either direct

or from other Federal agencies via the "chargeback" program whereby agencies reimburse OWCP in accordance with actual compensation costs incurred.

TRUST FUND REPORTS

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# Airport and Airway Trust Fund

The airport and airway trust fund was originally established on the books of the Treasury in fiscal 1971, in accordance with provisions of the Airport and Airway Revenue Act of 1970 (49 U.S.C. 1742(a)). The trust fund has been reestablished in the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C. 9502 and 9602(b)) as a result of the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982 (Public Law 97-248, dated Sept. 3, 1982), effective as of Sept. 1, 1982. Amounts equivalent to the taxes received in the Treasury on aviation fuel, transportation by air, gasoline used in aircraft, and tires and tubes used on aircraft are designated by the act to be appropriated and transferred from the general fund of the Treasury to the trust fund. These transfers are made at least quarterly on the basis of estimates made by the Secretary of the Treasury, subject to adjustments in later transfers to the amount of actual tax receipts. When the provisions of 26 U.S.C. 9602(b) have been met, amounts available in the fund in excess of outlay requirements shall be invested in public debt securities and interest thereon credited to the fund. There are also credited to the fund additional sums from the

general fund, as authorized and made available by law, to meet outlay requirements in excess of available revenues, if necessary.

Amounts required for outlays to carry out the airport and airway program are made available to the Federal Aviation Administration, Department of Transportation. Other charges to the trust fund are made by the Secretary of the Treasury for transfers of certain refunds of taxes and certain section 39 credits of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

Annual reports to Congress are required by 26 U.S.C. 9602(a) to be submitted by the Secretary of the Treasury, after consultation with the Secretary of Transportation. These reports are required to cover the financial condition and the results of operations of the fund during the past fiscal year and the expected condition and operations of the fund during the next 5 fiscal years.

# Black Lung Disability Trust Fund

The black lung disability trust fund was established on the books of the Treasury in fiscal 1978 pursuant to the Black Lung Benefits Revenue Act of 1977. Public Law 97-119, Dec. 29, 1981, entitled "Trust Fund Code of 1981" (26 U.S.C. 9501), provides for the continuation of the fund as previously established under section 3 of the act of 1977. The act designates the following receipts to be appropriated and transferred from the general fund of the Treasury to the trust fund: excise taxes on mined coal tonnage; taxable expenditures of private black lung benefit trusts; reimbursements by responsible mine operators; and related fines, penalties, and interest charges. Estimates made by the Secretary of the Treasury determine monthly transfers of amounts for excise taxes to the trust fund, subject to adjustments in later transfers to actual tax receipts.

Amounts available in the fund in excess of current expenditure requirements are invested by the Secretary of the Treasury in interest-bearing public debt securities, and any interest earned is credited to the fund. Also credited to

the fund, if necessary, are repayable advances from the general fund to meet outlay requirements in excess of available revenues.

To carry out the black lung disability program, amounts are made available to the Department of Labor. Other charges to the fund are to pay administrative expenses incurred by the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of the Treasury, and also to repay advances from the general fund and interest on advances.

The act requires the Secretary of the Treasury to submit an annual report to Congress after consultation with the Secretary of Labor and the Secretary of Health and Human Services (26 U.S.C. 9602 (a)). The report must present the financial condition and results of operations of the fund during the past fiscal year and the expected condition and operations of the fund during the next 5 fiscal years.

## Hazardous Substance Response Trust Fund

The hazardous substance response trust fund was established on the books of the Treasury in fiscal 1981, in accordance with provisions of the Hazardous Substance Response Revenue Act of 1980 (42 U.S.C. 9631(a)). Excise taxes are collected on petroleum and certain chemicals by the Internal Revenue Service and appropriated from the general fund to the trust fund. All other receipts are deposited directly to the trust fund.

Amounts available in the fund in excess of current expenditure requirements are invested by the Secretary of the Treasury in interest-bearing public debt securities, and any interest earned is credited to the fund. Also credited to the fund, if necessary, are repayable advances from the general fund to meet outlay requirements in excess of available revenues.

To carry out the hazardous substance response program, amounts are made available to the Environmental Protection Agency. Other charges to the fund are to pay certain administrative expenses incurred and repay advances from the general fund and interest on advances.

An annual report to Congress by the Secretary of the Treasury is required by section 9633(b)(1). These reports must present the financial condition and the results of operations of the fund for the past fiscal year and its expected condition and operations during the next 5 years.

## Highway Trust Fund

The highway trust fund was originally established on the books of the Treasury in accordance with provisions of the Highway Revenue Act of 1957, as amended (23 U.S.C. 12 note). It was reestablished on the books of the Treasury by the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982 and recently modified by the Deficit Reduction Act of 1984 (Public Law 98-369, approved July 18, 1984). Amounts equivalent to taxes on gasoline, diesel fuel, special motor fuels, tires, tubes, tread rubber, commercial motor vehicles, truck use, lubricating oil, and parts and accessories for trucks, buses, etc., are designated by the act to be appropriated and transferred from the general fund of the Treasury to the trust fund. These transfers are made at least monthly on the basis of estimates by the Secretary of the Treasury, subject to adjustments in later transfers to the amount of actual tax receipts. Amounts available in the fund in excess of outlay requirements are invested in public debt securities and interest thereon is credited to the fund. There are also credited to the fund repayable advances from the general fund, as authorized and made available by law, to meet outlay requirements in excess of available revenues during a portion of a fiscal year, if necessary.

The termination date of the fund was extended to Sept. 30, 1988, as a result of the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982 (Public Law 97-424, approved Jan. 6, 1983). The act also established a mass transit account within the trust

fund to be funded by one-ninth of the excise tax collections under sections 4041 and 4081 of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C.) imposed after Mar. 31, 1983. The funds from this account shall be used for expenditures in accordance with section 21(a)(2) of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964. The remaining excise taxes collected shall be included in a highway account within the trust fund, and expenditures for this account shall be made in accordance with the provisions of Public Law 97-424.

Amounts required for outlays to carry out the Federal-aid highway program are made available to the Federal Highway Administration, Department of Transportation. Other charges to the trust fund are made by the Secretary of the Treasury for transfers of certain taxes to the land and water conservation fund and to the aquatic resources trust fund, refunds of certain taxes, repayments of advances from the general fund, and the interest on advances.

Annual reports to Congress are required by 26 U.S.C. 9602 (a), Internal Revenue Code as amended, to be submitted by the Secretary of the Treasury, after consultation with the Secretary of Transportation. These reports cover the financial condition and the results of operations of the fund for the past fiscal year and its expected condition and operations during the next 5 fiscal years.

## Inland Waterways Trust Fund

The inland waterways trust fund was established on the books of the Treasury in fiscal 1981, in accordance with provisions of the Inland Waterways Revenue Act of 1978 (33 U.S.C. 1801(a)). Amounts determined by the Secretary of the Treasury to be equivalent to the amount of taxes received in the Treasury under section 4042 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (relating to tax on fuel used in commercial transportation in inland waterways) shall be appropriated to the trust fund. These amounts shall be transferred at least quarterly from the general fund on the basis of estimates made by the Secretary, subject to adjustments in later transfers to the amounts of actual tax receipts. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Treasury to invest in interest-bearing obligations of the United States that portion of the trust fund in his judgment not required to meet current withdrawals. The interest on, and the proceeds from the sale or

redemption of, any obligation held in the trust fund shall be credited to and form a part of the trust fund.

The act provides that amounts in the trust fund shall be available, by appropriations acts, for making construction and rehabilitation expenditures for navigation on the inland and intracoastal waterways of the United States described in 33 U.S.C. 1804. Expenditures must be otherwise authorized by law.

Annual reports to Congress are required by 33 U.S.C. 1801(c)(1) of the Secretary of the Treasury. These reports are required to cover the financial condition and the results of operations of the fund during the past fiscal year and its expected condition and operations during the next 5 fiscal years.

## Nuclear Waste Fund

The nuclear waste fund was established on the books of the Treasury in fiscal 1983, in accordance with provisions of the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982 (Public Law 97-425). Receipts represent fees collected from public utilities based on electricity generated by nuclear power reactors and spent nuclear fuel. Expenditures from the fund are for purposes of radioactive waste disposal activities.

Amounts available in the fund in excess of current needs may be invested by the Secretary of the Treasury in obligations of the United States (1) having maturities in tandem with the needs of the waste fund, and (2) bearing

interest at rates determined appropriate, taking into consideration the current average market yield on outstanding marketable obligations of the United States with remaining periods to maturity comparable to the maturities of such investments, except that the interest rate on such investments shall not exceed the average interest rate applicable to existing borrowings.

An annual report to Congress by the Secretary of the Treasury, after consultation with the Secretary of Energy, is required by section 302 (e)(1). This report must present the financial condition and the results of operations of the waste fund during the preceding fiscal year.

## Reforestation Trust Fund

The reforestation trust fund was established on the books of the Treasury in fiscal 1981 to continue through Sept. 30, 1985, in accordance with provisions of the 111--Reforestation, of the Recreational Boating Safety and Facilities Improvement Act of 1980 (16 U.S.C. 1606a (a)). The act provides that the Secretary of the Treasury shall transfer to the trust fund tariffs, limited to not more than \$30 million for any fiscal year, received in the Treasury from Oct. 1979, through Sept. 30, 1985, on (1) rough and primary wood products, and wood waste; (2) lumber, flooring, and moldings; and (3) wood veneers, plywood, and other wood-veneer assemblies, and building boards.

Amounts available in the trust fund in excess of current withdrawals are invested in interest-bearing obligations of the United States or in obligations guaranteed as to both principal and interest by the United States. The interest and the proceeds from the sale or redemption of, any obligations are credited to the trust fund.

For each of the first 5 fiscal years beginning after Sept. 30, 1980, there authorized after that date to be appropriated to the Secretary of Agriculture, of any amounts in the trust fund, an amount equal to the sum of the amount by

which the sum estimated by the Secretary of Agriculture for the fiscal year under section 3(d)(2) of the Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. 1601 (d)(2)) to be necessary for reforestation and other treatment of acreage, as set forth in the report transmitted by the Secretary to the Congress under that section for the fiscal year, exceeds the sum of the amounts appropriated for the fiscal year under the authorization contained in section 3(d)(3) of such act and under any other provision of law to carry out the same purpose; and such sums as are determined by the Secretary of Agriculture to be properly allocable to administrative costs of the Federal Government incurred for the fiscal year in connection with the reforestation program carried out under that act.

Annual reports are required by 16 U.S.C. 1606a (c)(1) to be submitted by the Secretary of the Treasury, after consultation with the Secretary of Agriculture, on the financial condition and the results of the operations of the trust fund during the past fiscal year and on its expected condition and operations during the next fiscal year.
