

## THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS:

- Producer prices for finished goods rose at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 3.1 percent in May and were up at a 4 percent rate since December. In 1989, such prices rose 5 percent.
- Producer prices for finished goods, excluding food and energy, have risen at a 2.9 percent annual rate since December, down from 4.3 percent in 1989.
- Retail sales declined at an 8.5 percent annual rate in May, after falling at rates of 10.5 percent in April and 4.7 percent in March. This is the first time retail sales have declined for three months in a row since September-December 1981.
- Consumer credit rose at a 1 percent annual rate in April. For the first four months of the year, consumer credit increased at a 1.8 percent rate, compared with 12.6 percent expansion in the previous year.



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






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


