## THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✓ According to the Conference Board, consumer confidence declined for the second consecutive month. In June, consumer confidence measured 97.6 percent (1985=100), down 5.9 percentage points from May. Compared with June 1995, the consumer confidence index has increased 3 percentage points.
- ✓ Advance new orders for manufactured durable goods rose 3.3 percent in May, following a 1.8 percent decrease in April. The May increase was the largest increase since August 1995. New orders for transportation equipment rose 12.2 percent. Excluding transportation equipment, new orders increased 0.7 percent.
- ✓ The National Association of Realtors reported that existing single-family homes in May were at an annual rate of 4,260,000 units, up 1.4 percent from April. The resale pace in May equals the previous record sales rate set in December 1993.



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## **Adjusted Monetary Base**




The adjusted monetary base is the sum of reserve accounts of financial institutions at Federal Reserve banks, currency in circulation (currency held by the public and in the vaults of all depository institutions) and an adjustment for reserve requirement ratio changes. The major source of the adjusted monetary base is Federal Reserve credit. Data are computed by this bank. A detailed description of the adjusted monetary base is available from this bank.


## Money Stock(M1) and Total Checkable Deposits





#### Money Multiplier




#### **Currency Component of M1**





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
#### Money Stock(M2) and Non-M1 Components of M2



M2 is the sum of M1, savings (including money market deposit accounts), small time deposits and retail money funds. Current data appear in the Federal Reserve Board's H.6 release.



Savings deposits and small time deposits are at all depository institutions.


## Large Time Deposits and Retail Money Funds


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#### **Total Borrowings**





#### Bank Loans and Credit



#### Commercial and Industrial Loans


