THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS:


- The index of leading economic indicators rose 0.7 percent in November, its largest increase since December 2001. Five of the index's ten components increased in November; the largest increase was the S&P 500 index of stock prices.
- Initial claims for state unemployment benefits averaged 400,750 for the four weeks ending Dec. 14. The four-week moving average rose to its highest level in six weeks.
- In October, the U.S. goods and services trade deficit totaled \$35.1 billion, \$2 billion less than the previous month's deficit and the smallest since March 2002. U.S. exports fell 1 percent in October, while imports of goods and services fell 2.4 percent.
- In November, the consumer price index rose 0.1 percent, or 1.3 percent at an annual rate. Excluding food and energy prices (core CPI), consumer prices rose at a 1.9 percent rate. Through the first 11 months of 2002, the CPI has increased at a 2.6 percent rate and the core CPI has increased at a 2.1 percent rate. In 2001, these prices increased 1.6 and 2.7 percent, respectively.
- The Federal Reserve Board's index of industrial production (output produced by manufacturers, mining, and utilities) rose 0.1 percent, or 1.5 percent at an annual rate. Year-to-date, industrial production has risen at a 2.5 percent rate; over the same period in 2001, production had fallen at a 6 percent rate.






Currency Component of M1












Averages of Daily Figures Seasonally Adjusted


Total Borrowings From Federal Reserve Banks Averages of Daily Figures

All Commercial Banks in the United States *





Commercial and Industrial Loans Seasonally Adjusted


