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More than half of South Carolina's WPA cost to supply work for women and white-collar workers.

Slightly more than half of the money for Works Progress Administration projects in South Carolina will be spent giving work to unemployed women, white collar and other professional and technical unemployed persons on educational, clerical, sanitation and health, and sewing and other goods projects, according to an announcement made today by Harry L. Hopkins, Works Progress Administrator.

A listing by types and cost of projects shows that of the total \$9,834,319 to be spent as of December 31, 1935, the following will receive a slight majority of the allotment; educational, professional and clerical, \$802,635 or 8.2 per cent; sewing and other goods projects, \$1,181,572 or 12.0 per cent; sanitation and health, \$1,332,449 or 13.6 per cent and miscellaneous projects, \$1,824,569 or 18.5 per cent.

The balance of the money will be spent on highways, roads and streets, public buildings, both governmental and educational, parks and playgrounds, flood control and other conservation, water supply and sewer systems, electric utilities and transportation.
