JUIY UNEMPLOMEITY 5,600,000 AS EMPLOYMENT GROWS FASTER THAN LABOR FORCE

Unorployment totaled 5,800,000 in July, a decline of 300,000 from June, according to a monthly report of the Work Projects Administration made . public today for the first time by Assistant WPA Comissioner Corrington Gill.

The drop in unerployment was consicorably loss than the rise in employment between the two months. A seasonal expansion in the size of the labor force acted as a partial offsct to an increase of 600,000 in cmployment in July. The total labor force of tho nation in July was placed by the WPA report at $56,000,000$ and ormpoynent at $50,400,000$.

Clearly reflecting the rising tompo of industrial activity during the past 12 months, the WPA report shows a docline of nearly 4,000,000 in unemploynent betweon July, 1940, and July of this year, and a drop of 2,000,000 since January, 1941. The largest changes during any of the past 12 mouths occurred betwocn April and May of this year, when a roduction of neariy $1,000,000$ was reported.

Although a large part of the changes that occurred in employnent, unemployment and the labor force in July were described in the report as "essentially seasonal in cheracter," they serve to illustrate the rapid changes that take place month to month in the nation's labor forcc. Botween March and July of the year, the labor force alono showed an increase of 3,600,000 persons.

Soasonal changes in omploymont, although modified by prosșuro to expand defonso industry, also aro illustrated in the monthly roports. Employment rose 2,700,000 from July, 1940, to July, 1941, or from a total of 47,700,000 to $50,400,000$, but scasonal influences brought a accline in the winter, and a low of $45,200,000$ was reached in January.
"There is only one way of getting an accurate pioturo of the rapidly changing unemployment situation today," Mr. Gill pointed out, "and that is by personal interview with a roprosentative crossmsection of Americals work force. Each month we get a direct roport from the workers themsolves, and therofore our figures aro not affected, as are all other current ostimatos of unemployment, by assumption as to how many workers there arc."

Initiated early in 1940 under the dircetion of Howard B. Myors, Director of tho WPA Division of Research, tho systom was in full oporation by April, 1940, whon the deconnial census was conducted, and omployed the same definitions as tho Burcau of the Consus. Although both the consus and WPA figures on employment and unemployment wore bascd on difforent national samples, the agrocment of rosults was striking. After ropeated tosts rovealed the accuracy of the WPA surveys, publication of tho monthly series was authorized.
