



The indexes of wage earners and weekly wages (formerly designated employment and pay rolls) are shown on a new base and have been revised to take account of changes in industry definitions and to conform with the levels of the 1939 consus; data for all industries, durable and nondurable goods, and the major groups have been adjusted also to final 1940 and preliminary 1941 social security data. Revised data beginning 1939 will be published in the December Survey.
