




#### STEEL INGOT PRODUCTION (1935-39=100)




#### ELECTRIC POWER PRODUCTION (BILLIONS OF KILOWATT HOURS)




#### MOTOR VEHICLES PRODUCTION (THOUSANDS OF VEHICLES)
