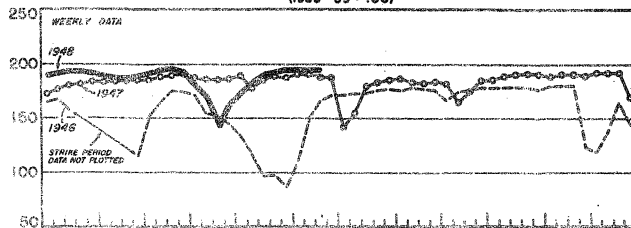

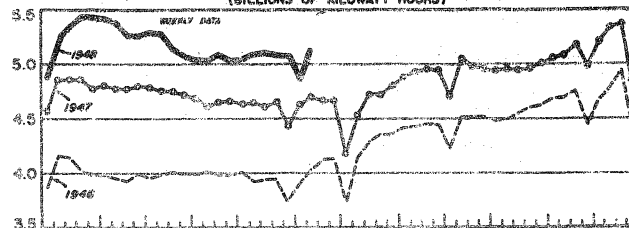

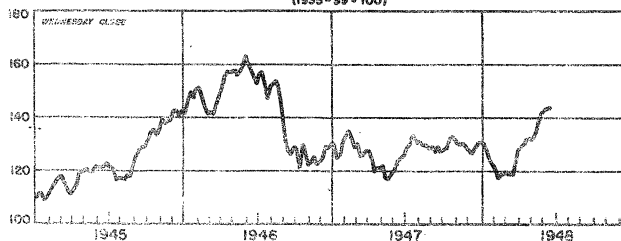
**STEEL INGOT PRODUCTION**  
(1935-39 = 100)



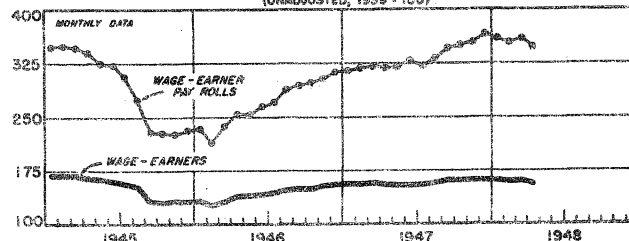
**ELECTRIC POWER PRODUCTION BY UTILITIES**
