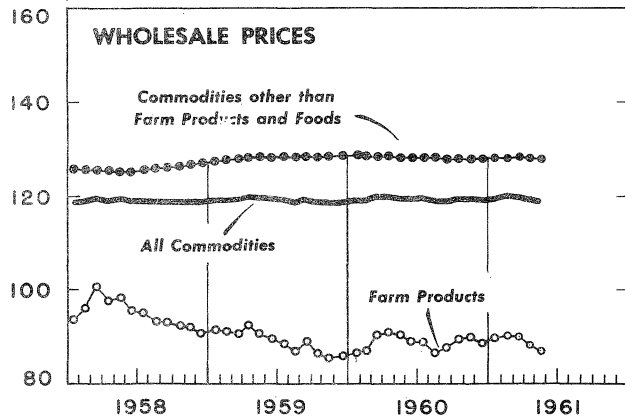

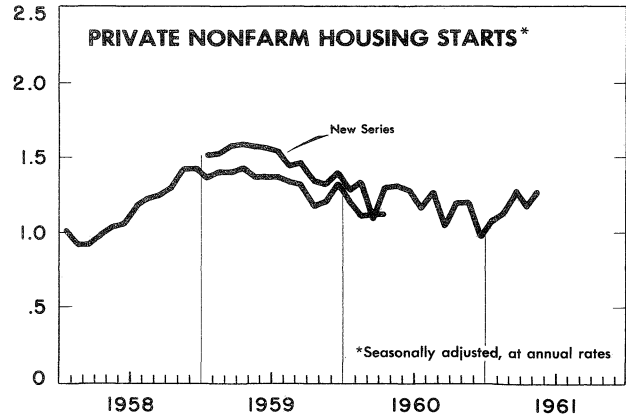
Index, 1957=100



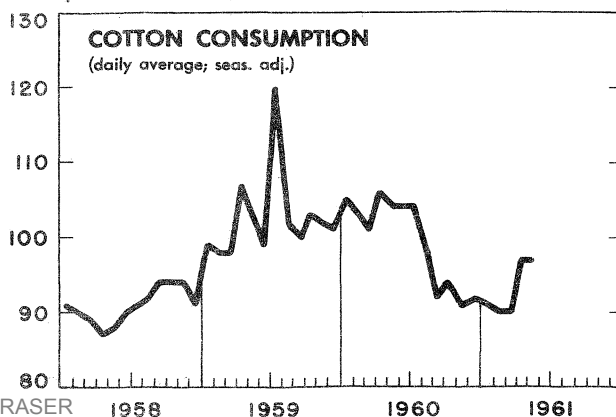
Index, 1947-49=100



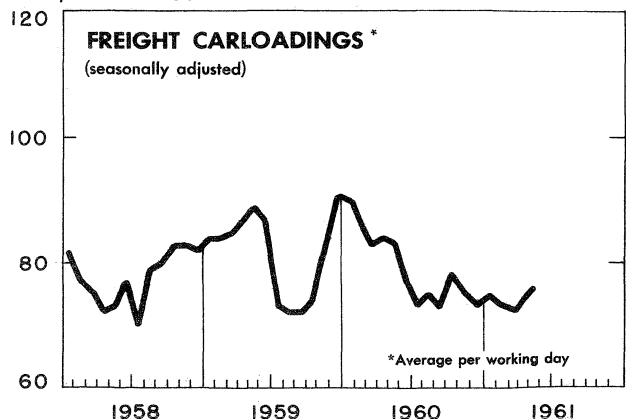
