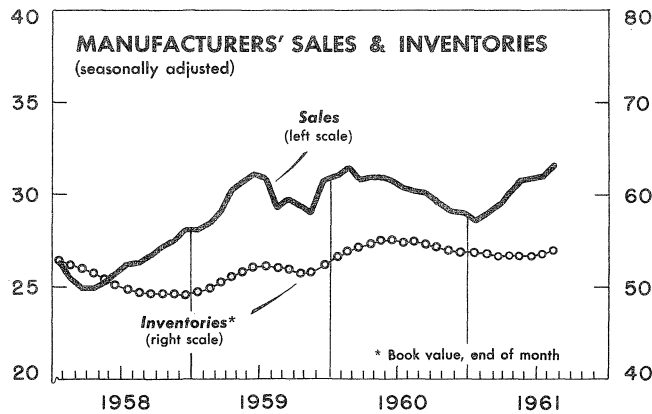
Index, 1957-59=100



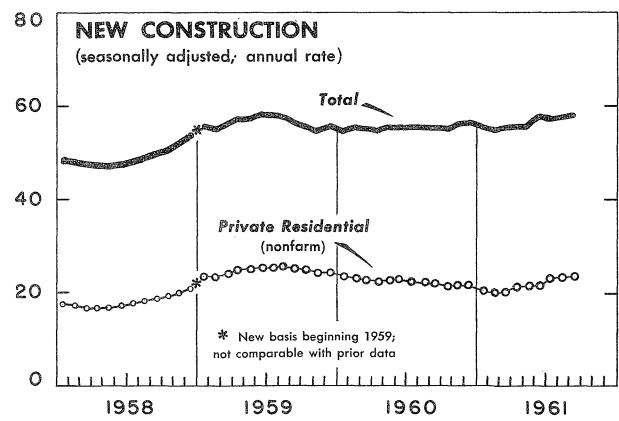

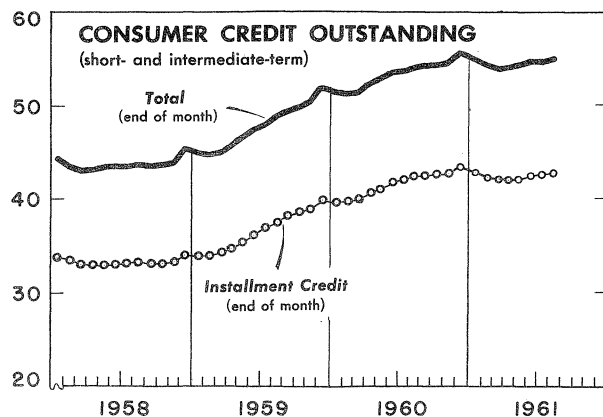

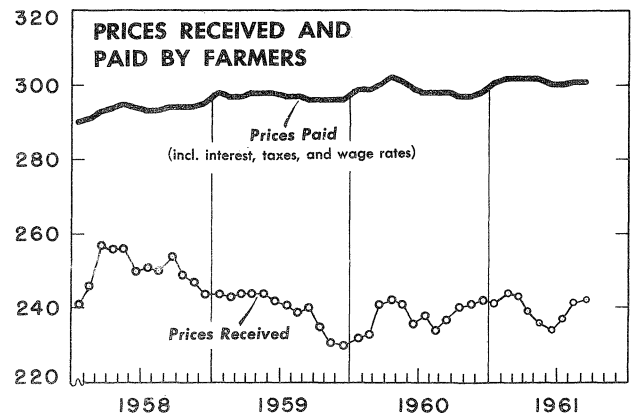
