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## RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR JUNE 1942

Sales at retail furniture stores declined substantially in June and cons, tinued well below the 1941 level. This was due in large part to the further curtailment in June of sales on instalment. During the past year instalment sales have declined from more than 80 per cent to about 70 per cent of total sales. There was a corresponding rise in the proportion of cash sales. Cash sales showed a small decline from May to June but were 36 per cent above June of last year. Inventories, which are about one and one-half times as large as at this time last year, were slightly below those for May 1942.

Accounts receivable continued to decline while collections showed a further increase over the year ago level. The resultant ratio of collections to outstandings was considerably above that for the corresponding month last year.
