RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR OCTOBER 1943

Retail furniture store sales showed less than the usual seasonal rise from September to October and for the first time since last March were below the year-ago level. Cash and instalment sales showed less than the customary expansion in October but each sales continued in larger volume than a year ago. Charge-account sales remained somewhat above the 1942 level. Cash and charge-account sales comprised a slightly larger percentage of the total in October than in September. Instalment sales now account for around five-eighths of total sales as compared with more than two-thirds a year ago.

Inventories continued to decline at about the same rate as in other recent months and at the end of October amounted to about four months' supply at the current rate of sale, compared with approximately five months' supply at the end of October 19 l 2.

Instalment accounts outstanding at the end of October remained at the level of the preceding month. The ratio of collections during October to instalment accounts receivable on the first of the month rose to 22per cent and was four points above that for October of the previous year. These accounts are now collected in about eight months, compared with an average collection period of about ten months a year ago.
