### PETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR JANUARY 1944

Retail furniture store sales in Jenuary were 42 per cent below December, about the usual sherp seasonal decline, and they were two per cent below the year-ago level. Both cash and credit sales were less in January than in December, but cash as les continued in considerably larger volume than a year ago. Instaiment sales were 10 per cent below those in January 1947, but charge-account sales showed little change from the corresponding with last year.

Inventories were tuilt up slightly for the first time since last March but continued about one-fifth below those of a year ago. At the end of January they amounted to about five and one-half months' supply at the current low rate of sale, compared with slightly less than a seven months' supply at the end of the corresponding month a year ago.

Instalment accounts receivable showed about the usual seasonal decline from the December level and were considerably smaller than at the end of January 1943. The ratio of collections during January to instalment accounts outstending on the first of the month was 20 per cent, three points above that for January of the preceding year. These accounts are now collected in about time months, compared with an average collection period of about ten and one-half months a year ago.
