RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR MAY 1946

Retail furniture store sales rose 6 per cent in May, reflecting seasonal gains in both cash and credit sales. Cash and charge-account sales were in considerably larger volume than a year earlier, while instalment sales were nearly one-half greater than in the corresponding month of 1945.

Inventories increased 7 per cent during May and were up 22 per cent from the low lavel of last year. At the end of the month they amounted to about three months' supply at the current rate of sale, as compared with nearly four months' supply on May 31, 1945.

Instalment accounts receivedle increased slightly during Mey, but at the end of the month were about one-fifth higher than a year earlier. Collections increased 4 per cent, resulting in a collection ratio of 28 per cent, the came as in the preceding month. These accounts were outstanding approximately six months, a somewhat shorter period than the average for May 1945.
