RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR MARCH 1948

Furniture store sales increased substantially in March, and were 8 per cent larger than a year earlier. Both cash and charge-account sales reflected seasonal gains, but continued below last year's level. Instalment sales showed a larger rise than is expected in Haroh, and exceeded the year-ago volume by about one-fifth.

Inventories increased 3 per cent in March, and were 18 per cent above the level of March 1947. At the end of the month stocks on hand amounted to approximately four and one-half months' supply at the current rate of sale.

Instalment accounts receivable showed little change from the end of February, but were 52 per cent greater than on the corresponding date last year. Collections on instalment accounts, which rose one-tenth during March, were 19 per cent of accounts outstanding on the first of the month, two points higher than in February. The average collection period for instalment accounts outstanding in March was approximately nine and one-half months as compared with seven months in March 1947.
