RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER 1950

The volume of total sales at retail furniture stores during September was about the same as in the preceding month but 29 per cent higher than a year earlier. Declines occurred in both cash and charge-account sales during September but these were offset by a further rise in instalment sales. Sales of all types were considerably larger than in the corresponding month of 1949, the increases ranging from 21 per cent for cash sales to 38 per cent for charge-account transactions.

Outstanding indebtedness on instalment accounts rose 3 per cent during September and at the end of the month was 28 per cent larger than on the corresponding date a year earlier. Collections on instalment accounts in September kept pace with the increase in outstanding balances and the collection ratio remained at 11 per cent.

Inventories during September were built up 7 per cent and at the end of the month were 25 per cent larger than those carried a year earlier. At the current rate of sale, stock on hand represents a four months' supply, the same as in September 1949.
